

The pedestrian has been mentioned often in this column. It is necessary to continually remind readers of the fact that the pedestrian problem in traffic safety is one of the most acute in this country.

More than forty per cent of the automobile fatalities in 1939 were pedestrians. Why don't we, then, pay more attention to our walking habits?

The pedestrian should cross only at the intersection and in the crosswalk, and not between intersections. Motorists are required to observe due caution in exercising their right-of-way between intersections; so should the pedestrian be required to exercise similar caution in proceeding on his right-of-way in the crosswalk. Keep to the right on crosswalks. Do not meander all over the intersection.

## F. F. A. News

Working with the Michigan cooperative wool marketing association, the Chelsea F. F. A. will handle wool out of Chelsea. This marketing association is a cooperative and has handled wool over a long period of years. The wool payments are made in three separate payments: the first payment when the F. F. A. acting as buying agent, picks up or gets the wool, then about a month later a second payment and about from 1 to 10 months later the third and final payment. Generally the first two payments equal or are over the general payment. Farmers usually receive from private buyers many cartons of wool are shipped from Chelsea each year.
