# Possible decline of honey bee worries farm experts



Agricultural Experiment Station researchers at Michigan State College are reminding farmers that the honey bee, so necessary for the development of fruit and seeds, cannot survive without sufficient nectar and pollen resources. Approximately 50 cultivated crops require insect pollination and the job of pollinating fruit blooms is now almost entirely dependent upon honey bees. 




