At the back are the dining room and a bedroom to the south and north, respectively, with the modern kitchen between. Three bedrooms on the second floor, a complete tiled bath on both floors, a large back porch which is to be glassed in, and a full basement completes the structure. The kitchen equipment includes a new electric stove which is a gift from the congregation to the new pastor. The home is heated by an oil furnace.
