Now Is Opportune Time To Push For Toll-Free Dexter Telephone Calls

Despite widespread publicity and discussion, there seems to be some misunderstanding in the attempt to secure tollfree telephone service between Dexter and Chelsea.

Some say, "I have never called Dexter so why should ! be asked to pay a higher service rate to benefit those who do make such calls?"

Others who do call occasionally feel they should not try to impose the higher rate on everyone through requesting the extended calling area.

They are both right, and we commend them for their concern in trying to keep costs down whenever they can. But, we believe, they are not fully aware of the heart of the issue, or they wouldn't reach these conclusions.

That basic point is the simple fact that Chelsea is now in the bracket of being able to call more than 30,000 phones, toll-free, though not yet classified that way for rate purposes. Dexter is expected to pass that point in its natural, routine growth by September 1961. (Ann Arbor is now in that bracket and very nearly to surpass the upper limit which could put them in a still higher rate bracket.)

If and when the Michigan Bell Telephone Co. makes a request for a rate hearing before the MPSC, Chelsea customers may be asked to pay the higher rate of the 30,000-60,000 bracket.

If Dexter has at that time entered the higher 30,000 bracket they, too, may be asked to pay the higher rate which is authorized for that grouping.

And this higher rate would be asked without having the Chelsea-Dexter toll-free service offered.
