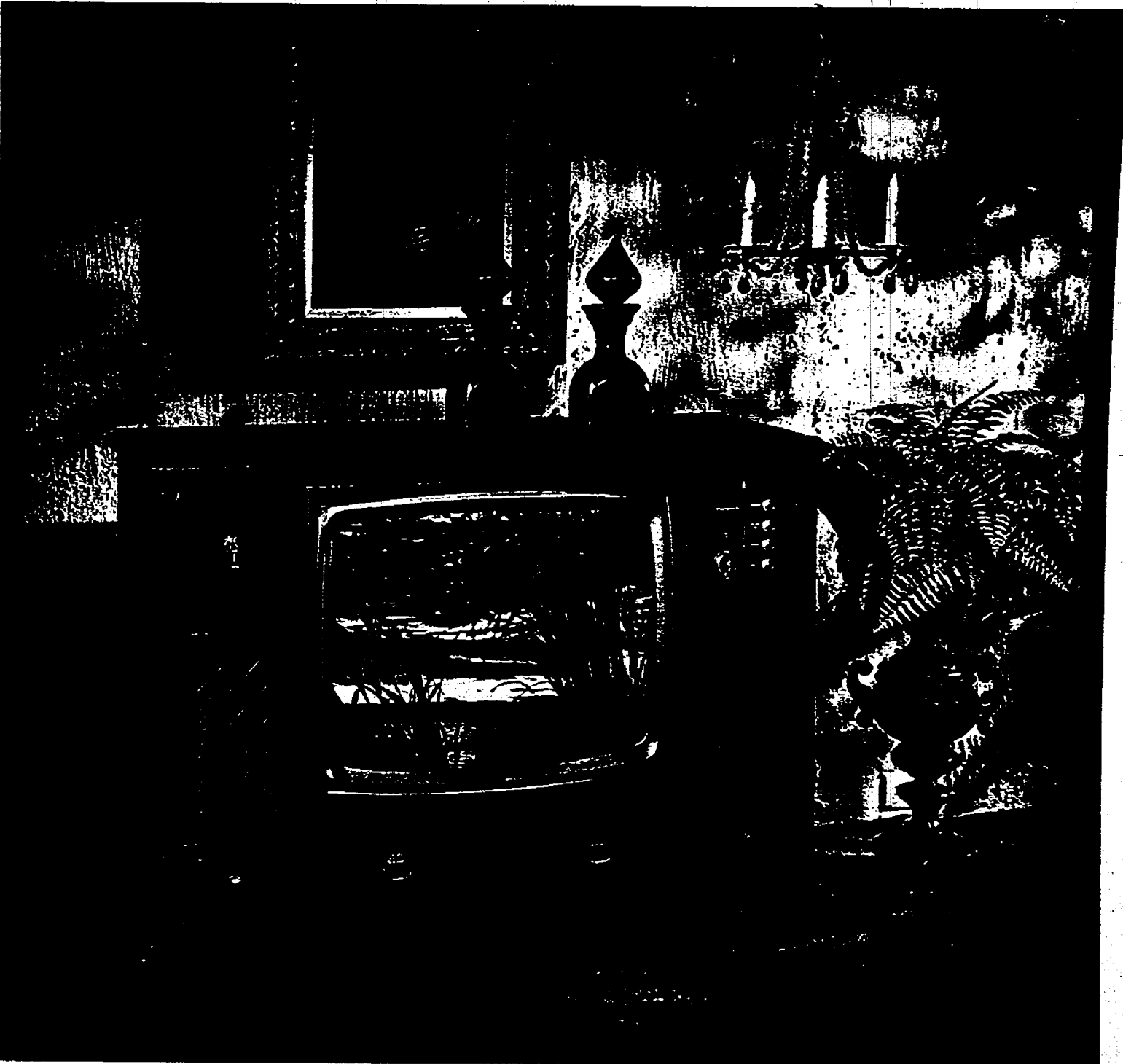
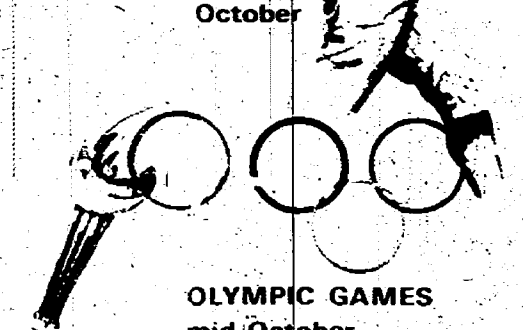

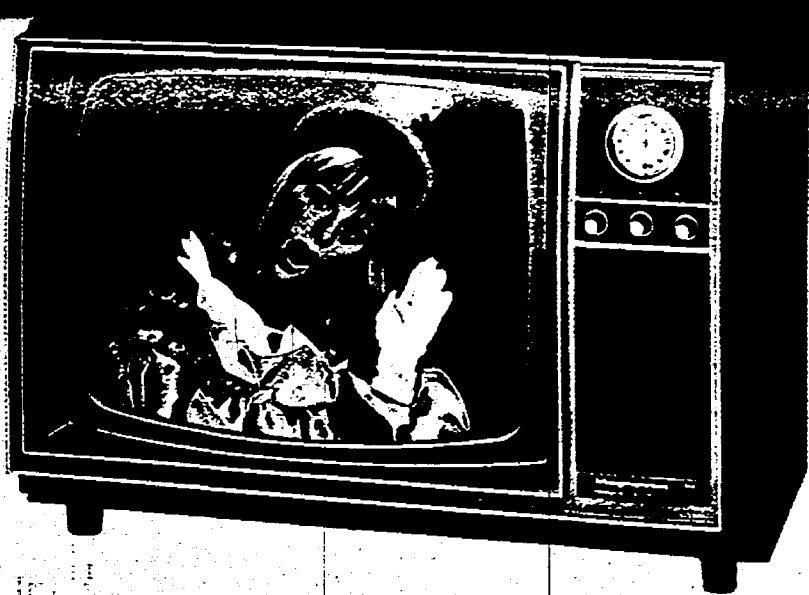

Chrysler Proving Grounds had the highest number of employees donating blood at the annual Chrysler blood bank clinic in October.

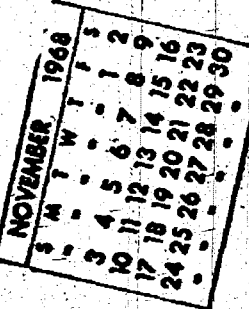
North American Rockwell had the highest percentage of employee donation as 20 percent of their men donated blood.

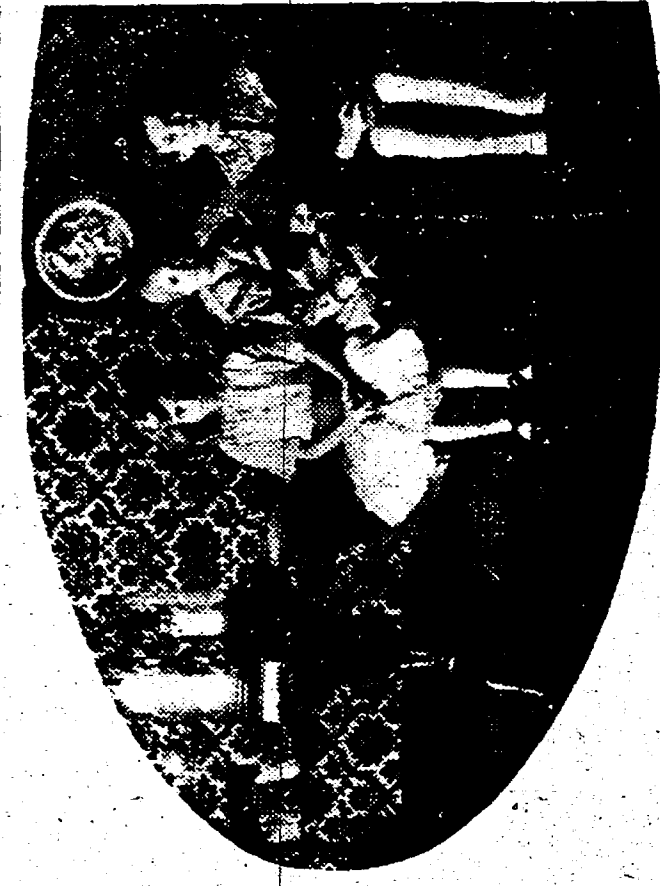

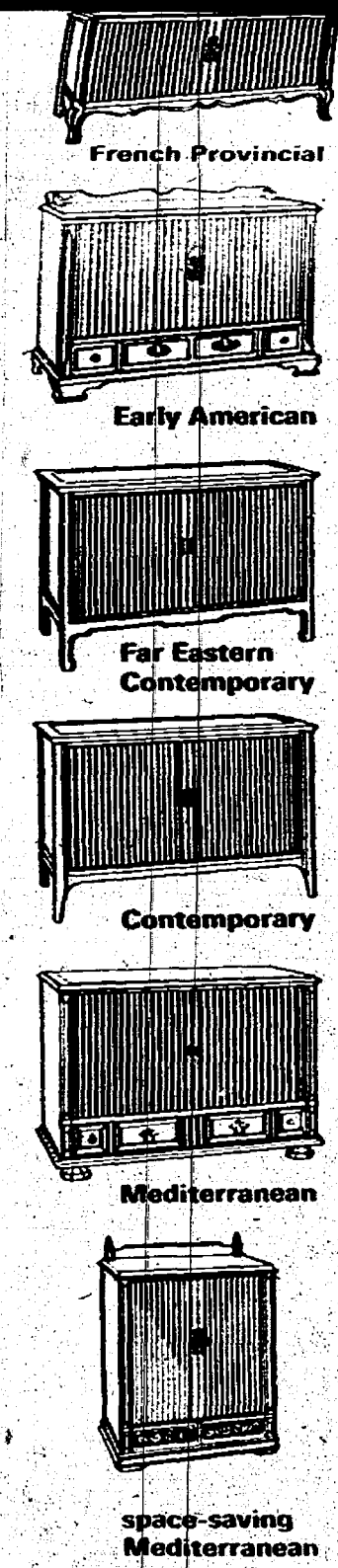
Mrs. Clifford Deering

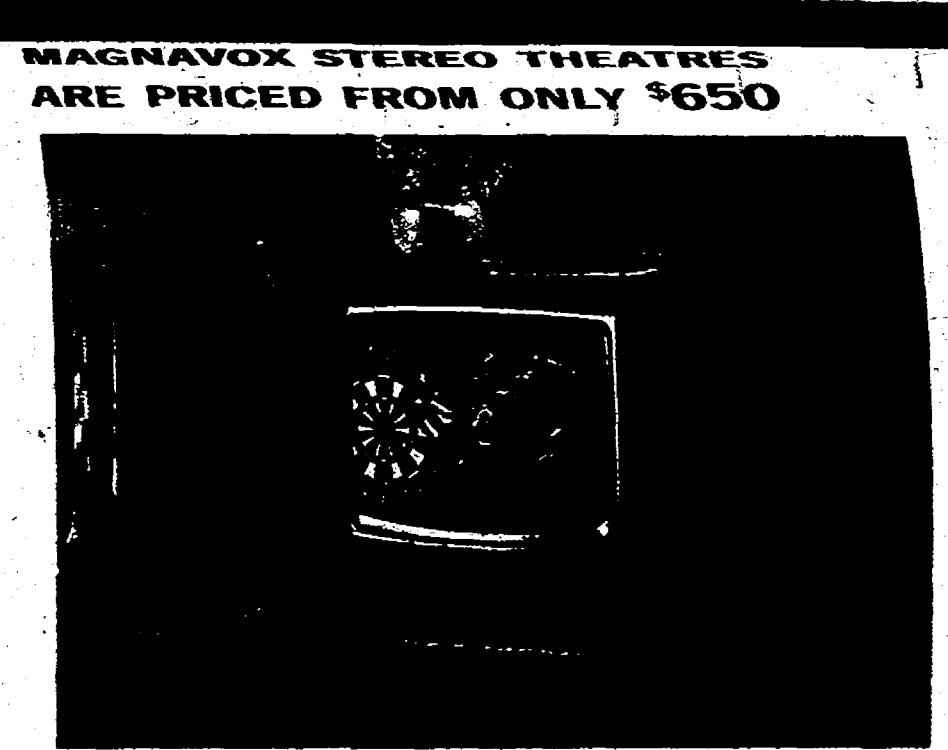

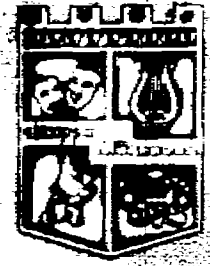

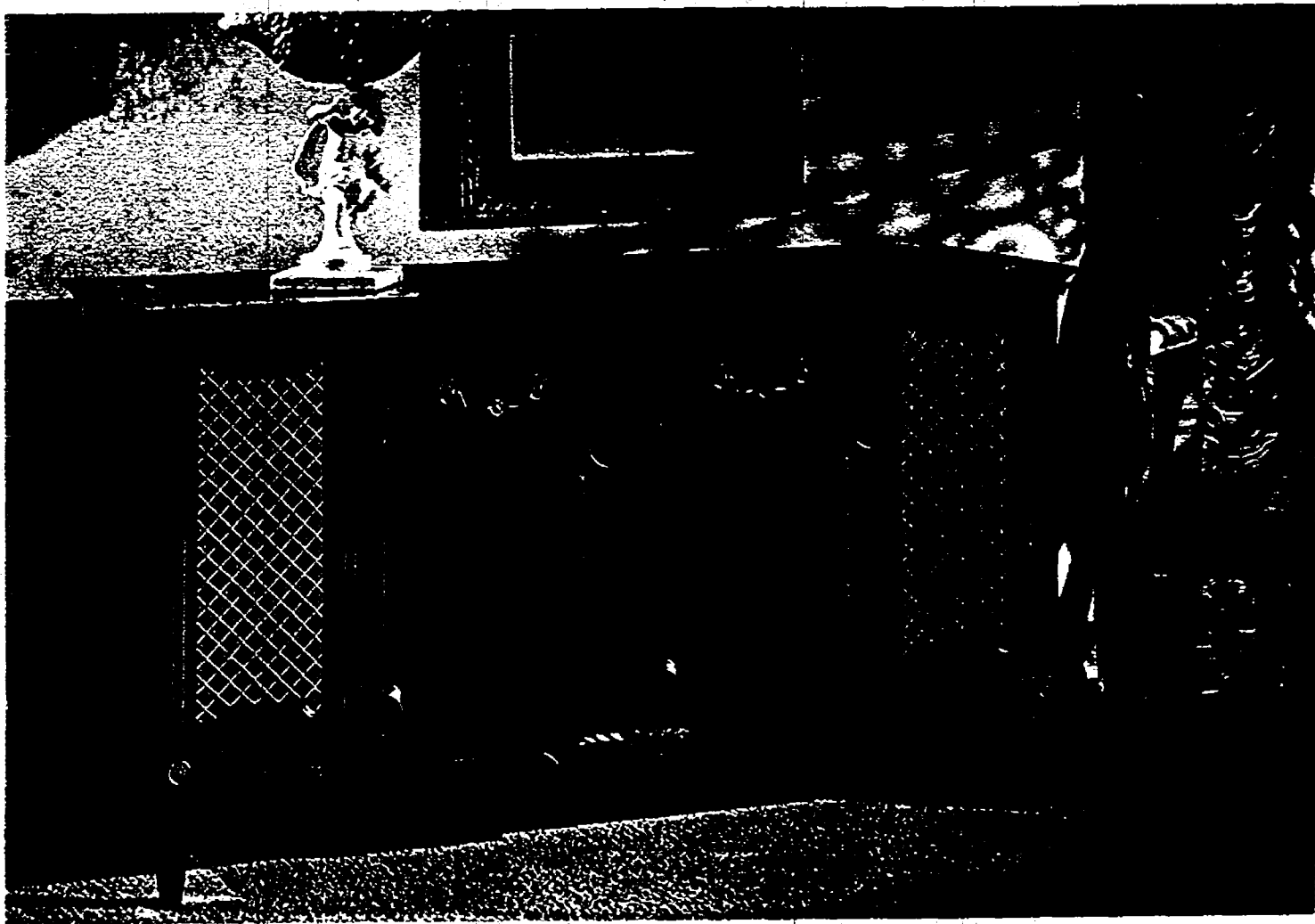
