Brater says 'we're making progress'

Political parties can't agree on existence of budget agreement

This area's state legislators said Tuesday that no deal exists to end the deadlock over the state's budget deficit, despite what a GOP leader announced Monday.

"There is no agreement," Sen. Liz

Brater, D-District 18, said Tuesday from the Senate floor during a break in the session.

"This is a process that's ongoing. We all agreed, I thought, that we need a combination of cuts, revenues and reforms. We're making progress, but I wouldn't say there's an agreement," Brater added.

Senate Majority Leader Mike Bishop, R-Rochester, said Monday that an

agreement was "imminent" to balance the state budget without raising taxes.

"I think he's premature in that statement," state Rep. Pam Byrnes, D-District 52, said Tuesday.

"While we hope there will be an agreement, we think he is jumping the gun."

Byrnes said a conference committee is working diligently to come up with an

City Council hears budget requests from WAVE, CCA

Community organizations requesting funding came before the Chelsea City Council on May 8 and were told, in effect, they would have to wait in line with all the others.

Michaelene Pawlak, executive director of the Washtenaw Area Value Express (The WAVE), presented detailed ridership data for the bus service, and asked that the council consider funding the service in 2007-08 at its current levels of \$10,000 for the community connector bus and \$20,000 for door-to-door service within the city.

The WAVE provided more than 20,000 rides last year,

three-quarters of which were for Chelsea residents, Pawlak said.

"No nonprofit transportation agency can stand alone," she told the council.

"We need the support of the community and individuals. We request funding at the level we received last year."

Cyril White, treasurer of the Chelsea Center for the Arts, requested \$15,000 for programs and operations, less than half of the \$35,000 the center lost due to a moratorium on state arts funding grants.

"We are facing significant funding cuts from the state,"

Jobs safe at Proving Grounds

Jobs at the Chelsea Proving Grounds apparently are secure in the wake of DaimlerChrysler's announcement Monday that it has sold a majority share of its holdings in the Chrysler Group.

"Nothing announced (Monday) will have a direct effect on the Chelsea Proving Grounds, and we will continue to conduct business there," said Kristin Tyll, a public relations spokeswoman for Chrysler.

DaimlerChrysler sold an 80 percent stake of its struggling U.S. unit for \$7.4 billion to Cerberus Capital Management, a New York-based private equity group.

The automaker moved to undo the most expensive and least successful mergers in auto industry history Monday as it decided to remove itself from the money-losing Chrysler unit, for which it paid \$37 billion nine years ago.

That was just part of the bad news announced this week. Chrysler also announced the recall of more than a quarter-million minivans, and posted a \$2 billion loss for the first quarter of this year.

What Daimler gains from the deal is an end to ongoing losses and the liability for an estimated \$18 billion in future health care costs for Chrysler's unionized employees and retirees.

Conservation can net \$2 to \$12 per acre

The Michigan Department of Agriculture (MDA), Michigan Association of Conservation Districts and other agriculture advocates are partnering to reward and encourage conservation by private landowners. The Michigan Conservation and Climate Initiative (MCCI) seeks to sequester or harness carbon dioxide that is released into the atmosphere when certain conservation practices are followed.

Farmers can earn "carbon credits," which can then be sold on the Chicago Climate Exchange, a member-based market. In addition to generating revenue for owners, the measure will improve the state's water quality and wildlife habitat.

"Many Michigan farmers and landowners already incorporate sound conservation practices into daily farm management," said Mitch Irwin, MDA director. "Participating in this program, however, enables landowners to produce an additional and very valuable commodity - carbon credits."

To turn carbon credits into dollars, landowners enrolled in the MCCI program allow Delta Institute, a non-profit organization, to sell the cred-

its on the Chicago Climate Exchange - a market comprised of large companies, municipalities and institutions, including Ford, Dow and Michigan State University. At current market prices, a landowner can typically earn between \$2 and \$12 per acre per year depending upon the conservation practice. Landowners must sign a contract and commit to maintain the conservation practice through 2010.

"The Michigan Conservation and Climate Initiative rewards farmers and landowners for being good stewards of the land," explains Gordon Wenk, director of the Michigan Department of Agriculture Environmental Stewardship Division. "By practicing conservation tillage or planting grasses and trees, farmers and landowners are sequestering or holding carbon dioxide, and in turn, offsetting greenhouse gas emissions."

The 79 Michigan Conservation Districts throughout the state will be the "gateway" for this initiative, providing landowners with information, enrollment assistance, and verification services, according to Lori Phalen, Executive Director

for the Michigan Association of Conservation Districts.

Additionally, the Michigan Department of Agriculture has been instrumental in the development of this initiative.

Landowners can earn revenue from this program while still utilizing government cost share programs such as the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) and the Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program.

agreement that would stave off an estimated \$500 million to \$700 million in deficits.

"We can't make enough cuts to make up for that without severely hampering the effective operation of government," Byrnes said.

"If you continue to make drastic cuts, you're just digging a deeper hole."

The pact Bishop said was reached by House Democrats and Senate Republicans would cut the amount of per-pupil state aid for schools by \$36.

The cuts also include \$40 million in revenue sharing payments to local governments as well as reductions

in community health programs and arts and cultural grants.

Both Brater and Byrnes said much of the impasse comes down to differences in political viewpoints.

"There are some ideological disagreements about how government services should be delivered," Brater said.

"I think it's absolutely crucial to put the welfare of the people of Michigan ahead of partisan politics."

"If there was ever a time to join hands and work together, this is it."

Brater's House counterpart echoed that sentiment.

"I hope they keep in mind the citizens of the state of Michigan and leave partisan politics out of it," Byrnes said.

Some sort of agreement is

needed soon, because the end of the state's fiscal year is now just weeks away. Unlike the federal government, state governments cannot operate on a deficit.

"Some people need that sense of urgency, and maybe that will help," Brater said. "Just for the sake of the people of Michigan and the well-being of the economy, we can't go on this way."

Byrnes said the constant budget-cutting could be seen by others as a "disinvestment" in the state and actually do more harm than good in the long run.

"We need to be progressive and invest and not disinvest," she said. "Additional cuts will strip down to the heart our essential services and what Michigan stands for."

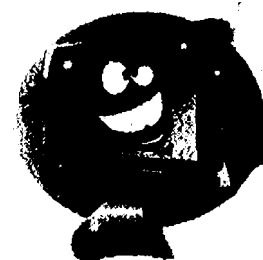

White said. "We provide significant value to the community in a variety of ways, but we're sensitive to your needs as well."

The council listened to the presentations, then Mayor Ann Feeney advised both groups of the council's budgeting procedures.

"We will have budget planning meetings next week, and your requests will go on the pile with the rest," she said.

Councilman Jamie Bollinger was a bit more direct with White.

"Where would you suggest we cut our budget to make this grant to you?" he asked.

"This is the first time the CCA has asked the city for funding," White responded. "If you have the funds, I hope you would consider at least a portion of our request."

In other business, the council approved a wage increase for part-time, non-union police officers that would match the 3 percent that unionized full-time offi-

cers ratified in their most recent contract.

City Administrative Services Director Kim Garland told the council the raise would apply to 17 active part-time officers at a cost to the city of \$7,500; and to five former officers who are no longer active with the department, at a cost of \$300. "These amounts have already been budgeted," she noted.

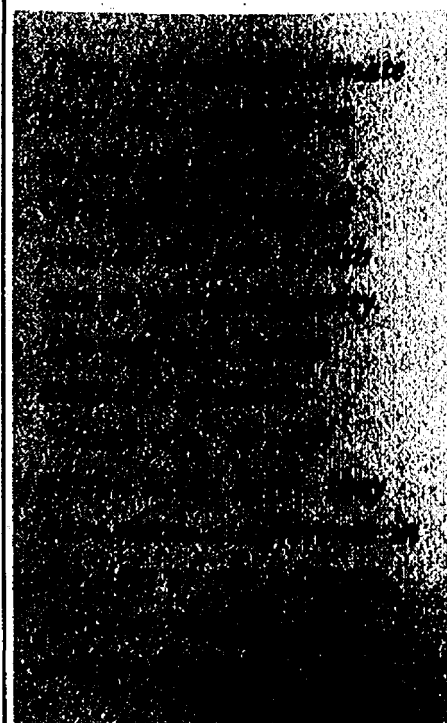

Council looking at options for Wilkinson Street drainage issues

There haven't exactly been a flood of complaints, but a county drain official spoke at the May 8 city council meeting to address concerns about drainage in a wetlands west of Wilkinson Street.

Chief Deputy Drain Commissioner Dennis Wojcik presented the council with two options for handling the problems.

"I'm here to explain the process of creating a new drain if the council decides it wants to pursue it," Wojcik said.

A county drain has existed in the area for a number of years, he said, but what makes this one unique is that county jurisdiction seems to be interrupted within the city limits.

The drain approaches the city from the south, ends at Old U.S. 12, then picks up again at Letts Creek and continues north, Wojcik said.

"The area between seems to have been left to private property owners," he said.

"I can't tell you why the drains start or end, but I suspect at the time they were looking to create drains where problems existed."

Chelsea Department of Public Works chief Craig Maier requested the presentation by the Drain Commission.

"We got several complaints from residents about the maintenance of the drain, and when we checked into it we found out it was up to the individual homeowners," he said.

"So far it's been fine with the homeowners to take care of it but I'd like to see one entity having control over the drain from one end to the other."

Interim City Manager John Hansen said 50 to 60 residents live in the affected area, but only a few came to the May 8 council meeting.

One was Jack Myers, a Wilkinson Street resident and Chelsea's former village manager.

"The village had in the past maintained it to an extent," Myers said. "Now I find out

they are private, which is OK with me."

Myers said he has gotten conflicting answers about which unit of government is responsible for the drain, and usually cleans it out himself because it bisects his property.

"I continually keep the culvert cleared ... I have to keep it clean or my yard floods," he said.

"I don't think the residents up and down the street want to turn it over to the county."

Both options Wojcik presented involved a board of determination that would study any requests to create a drainage district as well as the special assessment rolls that would list the property owners who would pay for the work.

Its three appointed members should have certain qualifications, Wojcik said.

"It's generally made up of three residents of the county but not of the assessment area," he said.

One of the three usually has some kind of construction or engineering background who understands that aspect.

Another is a representative of local government, who is familiar with the political challenges.

The third is usually a pri-

vate citizen who lives in an area roughly similar to the area under consideration, to provide a homeowner's perspective.

County drains are subject to the state Drain Code of 1956, Wojcik said.

One option would utilize Chapters 3 and 4 of the law, but is designed more for creating a new drain.

"The other thing you could do, which I think is easier, is a Chapter 8 process," he said.

"These regulations concern projects on existing drains, and this (project) would be an extension of the Wilkinson Drain."

Wojcik said state law allows the Drain Commission to put together projects on its own but prefers not to.

"Our office can go forward without the input of local residents, but we don't want to work that way," Wojcik said. "We've gone back and asked them."

It likely will be several weeks before the council decides which option to pursue, but whatever the case, Hansen believes city residents should have the final say.

"In my opinion, the most attractive option is for the council to support the citizens and their will on this issue," Hansen said.

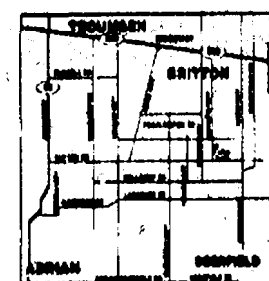

Relay for Life is personal for many

I am not just walking in circles, I swear. That is what a great number of people think when I tell them that I am involved with Relay For Life.

I am the Entertainment Chairperson for the American Cancer Society Relay For Life of Western Washtenaw County. Our 2007 event will take place at the Chelsea Community Fairgrounds from 10 a.m. Saturday until 10 a.m. Sunday. There is so much more to Relay than the walking. It is 24 hours of fun, free activities that support a great cause; an end to cancer.

Relay For Life is the signature fundraising event for the American Cancer Society in which teams and individuals collect donations and sponsorships to help fund programs for better treatment, education, patient services, advocacy and research for a cure. The Relay For Life events make up over 40 percent of the donations, from all sources, to the American Cancer Society. In the United States there are 4,580 separate Relay events and the number keeps growing by nearly 200 each year.

In 1985, Dr. Gordy Klatt, a colorectal surgeon, ran for 24 hours around a track in Tacoma, Wash. and raised \$27,000 to fight cancer and benefit his local American Cancer Society. His friends and family paid \$25 to run or walk with him for 30 minutes during this event. Almost 300 people came out to support Dr. Klatt and he began to envision ways for others to become involved. Shortly after the event he rounded up a committee and organized the City of Destiny Classic 24-hour Run Against Cancer which later became Relay For Life.

Today, communities in 23 countries hold 24-hour events. The 3 million Relay participants raised \$375 million dollars in 2006. This number is even more impressive when you realize it is the work of individuals working on a voluntary basis.

But to limit what Relay is by saying it is just fundraising is to only tell part of a much bigger story. There are onsite fundraisers, live entertainment, games and activities, recognition and support for survivors and caregivers and a luminaria ceremony.

Current cancer statistics show one in three women and one in two men will face some form of cancer in their lifetime. Almost everyone knows someone who has been affected by cancer. And affected by cancer doesn't just mean the person being diagnosed, it becomes the disease of the spouses, children, parents and friends. The ripple effects of diagnosis can touch the lives of everyone you know.

It is this ripple effect that brought me to Relay. Two years ago my friend from high school, Garth, was diagnosed with stage 3 colon cancer. This was surprising diagnosis for someone 33 years old. Garth was a healthy person and the news took everyone who knew him by surprise. As a friend you try to be supportive and do helpful things

but it doesn't feel like enough. A member of the local Relay For Life board asked me if I would like to start a team in Garth's honor. I agreed and at the first meeting I went from being a first-year team cap-

tain to being a team captain and entertainment chairperson.

Each month, from November to May, the Relay For Life committee meets to discuss all aspects of the event. We settle on loca-

tion, date, entertainment, activities, sponsorship, team development, luminaria, the onsite auction and a million other things that make our event come together. We have a good deal of fun and

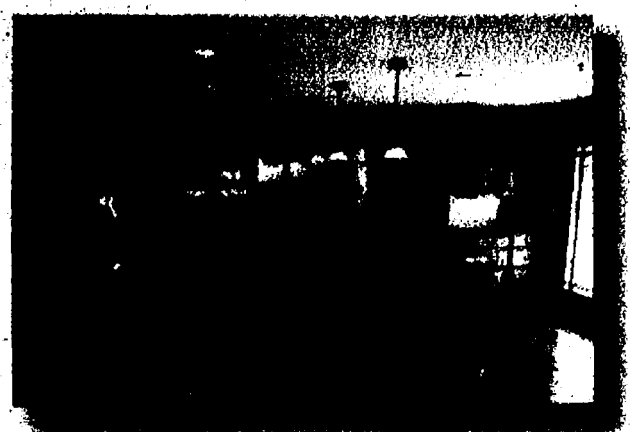

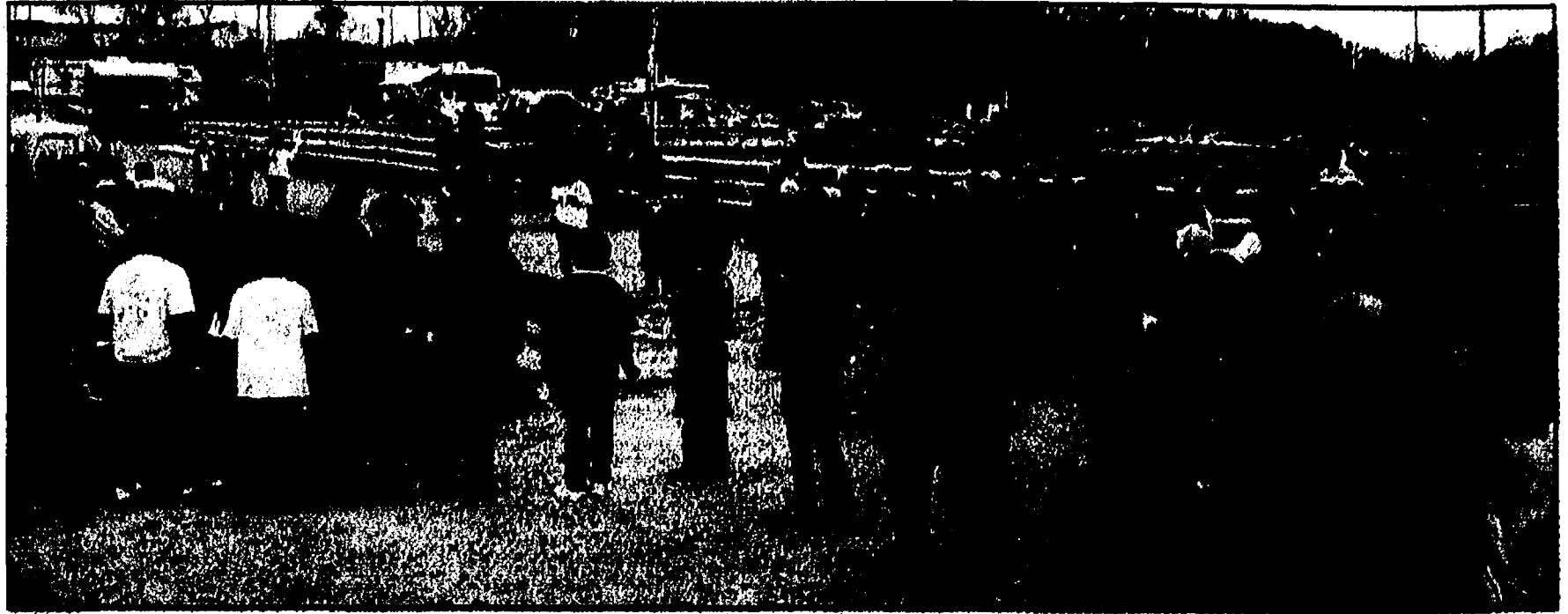

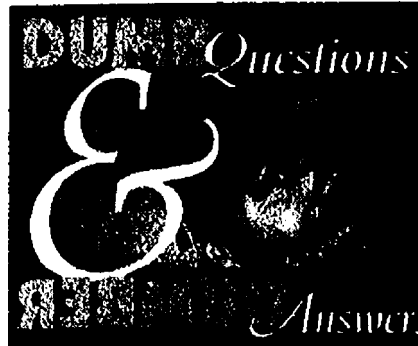

I finally said it and I could hear my father laughing all the way from California.

I promised myself I would never say it to my own kids. I would be different. I would be open-minded. I would be hip (is that word still hip?).

I enjoy listening to the DJs on WCSX playing groups such as Journey, Styx, REO Speedwagon and Foreigner and calling them "classic rock." These same DJs used to call them "junk" back in the day. But, somehow, just because they are old, they are classic.

She can whip up a meal for 30 people without breaking a sweat or allowing a frown. She allowed me to hold my wedding reception in her backyard and fed 125 guests as a gift to my husband and I. She didn't go to bed until every guest left (about 4 in the morning) and woke up at the crack of dawn to clean up. My mother helped me put in my first garden at my new home, spending hour upon hour of her free time, hauling dirt and digging holes. She even brought flowers from her own home to plant, including the peonies my grandmother loved so much. She has a great sense of humor and likes to dance to cheesy music from the 90's. When my father died, she was my rock. When both of her parents died within a two-month time span, I witnessed her strength. Mom (Beanie) - you are a miracle to me and I hope that someday I can be half the woman that you are.

DHS counselor sends message

The following is an open letter to Michigan's state legislators.

As an educator of nearly 35 years, I am deeply concerned about the impact of our current governmental gridlock relative to the State's general fund, K-12 education fund and the replacement of the SBT. A resident of Ann Arbor and Scio Township for nearly 40 years, I am a school counselor at Dexter High School and currently the Michigan School Counselor Association (MSCA) High School vice president.

Certainly there has been a great deal of conversation amongst MSCA board members and our lobbyist, Kelley Cawthorne, relative to the impact of Michigan's current budget crisis on Michigan's students. Let me relate the most recent effects of spending reductions on the counseling program in our district. In 2000, we were one of only two Washtenaw County school districts to have K-12 counselors (Saline being the other). Since 2003, our K-2 counseling position has been elimi-

nated and it is proposed that our 3-4 counseling position be cut for 2007-2008.

You can imagine the difficulty imposed upon our K-4 students to address academic, personal and social issues.

Throughout our district, increased and unmanageable student-to-counselor ratios create an additional hardship on those Dexter Community School families in our care who have struggled this year through suicide, suicide attempts, depression, severe mental illness, death, grief, serious physical illness, language barriers, separation and divorce. This is unfair to our students and their families. Ironically, the current economic crisis, which fueled our district's financial dilemma, is now causing a greater need to provide counseling to students and families whose personal lives have been touched by layoffs, cutbacks, loss of their homes, forced relocation, etc.

Again due to budgetary constraints, we have been unable to add a counselor at either our intermediate or middle school, where the student to counselor

ratios exceed 580-1 (there has been no increase in counselor staffing for more than 17 years).

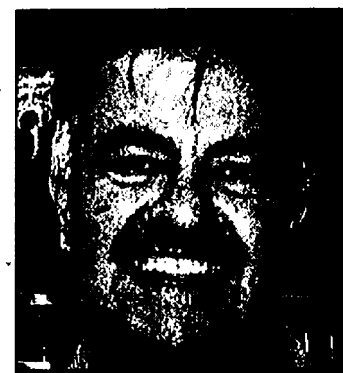
In the past two years at the high school (no increase since 1998, yet our student enrollments have increased substantially - from 800 to 1,150 students), the following Michigan Comprehensive Guidance and Counseling Program content areas have been diminished or eliminated:

- Electronic EDPs
- Families in Transition
- ACT's DISCOVER program
- Teen issues
- Support groups
- Men's (male self esteem) group
- Freshmen and Academic
- Risk program
- Post secondary planning
- Freshmen interviews
- Career Pathways
- New student group
- Classroom guidance

I look to you, your political colleagues, and the entire legislature for leadership and support during these dire economic times. Thank you for your willingness to address tough issues.

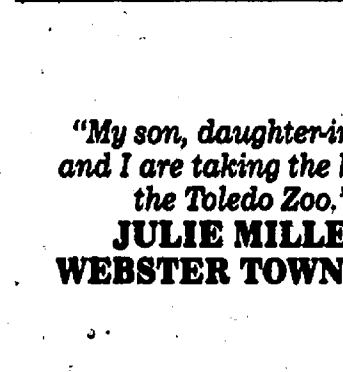

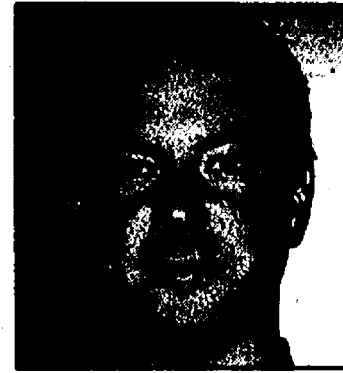

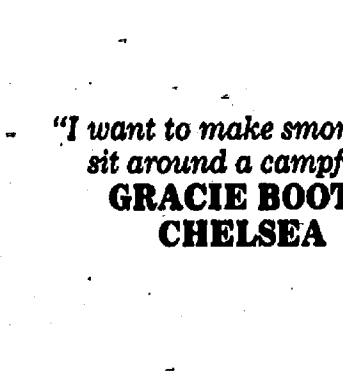

Our Chelsea History

Farmers Supply at 122 Jackson St. occupies a relocated building. What was its original use?

- An apple cider mill.
- A poultry processing store.
- Chelsea's first hotel.
- The home of Civil War soldier Arthur S. Congdon.

Answer C. The building was moved in 1888 from just around the corner on Main Street where it had served for many years as a hotel and restaurant. Later hotels on the same site became Chelsea House, Crescent and Sylvan hotels. It is believed to be Chelsea's very first hotel. In some of the upstairs rooms the walls are still covered with original wallpaper from hotel and rooming house days when owned by Lina Downer and later Mrs. Barrett. Workers at the Glacier Stove Co. from outside of Chelsea roomed there and other rooming houses during the week. It was then remodeled for use as a feed mill and farm supply store owned by Hanson Lewis prior to 1936. Vincent Ives ran it from 1936 until 1944. Anton Nielsen operated Farmers Supply from 1944 until his retirement in early 1990. Greg Raye and Helen Ray Leonard are current owners.

Prior to owning The Lakes Grille, Brent was general manager of Ernesto's in Plymouth and retail director for Lord and Taylor restaurants. Owning his own place was a longtime goal.

The Lakes, on Howell Street just south of M-36 in Pinckney, looks over the village park. While it has a complete bar, the bar is not a sit-down type, to keep the family-friendly atmosphere. Non-drinkers feel perfectly comfortable here.

Fish fries on Friday and Saturday nights all yearlong offer lake perch and beer-battered cod, among other varieties. The breakfasts are huge — the "Country Breakfast" features everything you could fit on a good-sized plate that says "breakfast" — two eggs, hash browns, bacon, sausage. They were still serving it at lunchtime and would till 2 p.m.

Sandwiches named after the lakes around Pinckney head the luncheon list with the signature sandwich being the Portage Club, a combination of cheeseburger and bacon and tomato. Zuckey, Strawberry, Ore and Baseline have their own sandwiches, as well.

And there are lots of salads to choose from. Luoma says he likes most working with people. He has 13 employees to serve the 100-seat restaurant and his kids help out. Day manager Gretchen Groeb has been on board for five years and says summer cottage residents, events in Howell, and "art in the park" bring people in.

Brent is proud that friends meet at The Lakes, moms drop off their kids at school and gather there, route service guys drop in for lunch or a late breakfast, and folks from across the region stop by.

Restaurant hours are 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday, 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. Friday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday and 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Sunday. The Lakes is closed on Monday.

Hell

Heading south, you can't go quite straight to Hell, but it's not that long of a drive. Darwin Road, coming west from Dexter-Pinckney, or Patterson Lake Road, coming east from M-106 on Doyle, gets you to Hell — same roads, different names.

Hell isn't a crossroads; it's one of those wide places and gets its name from Hell Creek running through it. There are a couple of little Hell-related businesses, but the largest is the Dam Site Inn bar and restaurant.

For 50 years, it has been sitting there near the dam that gives it its name.

For the past nine years, Mike Hickey and his wife, Mary Beth, have been the owners. They offer a full menu of made-to-order specials and a full bar.

Fresh pasta dishes and a fresh-catch dinner every night offering shrimp, or talapia or smoked salmon, along with prime rib and big fish fries every Friday night, draw customers from across the region.

In winter, it's mostly locals, but in the summer the clientele comes from the seven area lakes, canoe camps, horse-riding camp, and on Saturday and Sunday, motorcycle enthusiasts on charity rides make the Dam Site their meal destination.

The biggest event at the Dam Site was last summer's "666" event, originally meant to be just a play on numbers because June 6, 2006, came along and it fit the devilish theme of the place. The word got out and it struck everyone's fancy. News media began calling and Mike says he was lucky to get anything done as the phone rang off the hook and he made the radio interview rounds.

The upshot of the party was that about 25,000 people showed up, and everyone was pressed into service, including Mike and Mary Beth's two daughters. The 300 T-shirts Mike had printed sold out and orders were taken. He estimates the sale of T-shirts brought in \$40,000. It was a huge, albeit unexpected success.

Most of the time it's quieter

at the Dam Site. There's live music on the weekends, the motorcycles snuggle in with mini-vans and sedans in the parking lot, and everyone has a real good time. But there's a rumor that there might be another party.

Bridgewater Bank Tavern and Restaurant
Bridgewater

If you are heading south in Washtenaw County and find yourself between Saline and Manchester, you might make a deposit at the Bridgewater Bank Tavern and Restaurant. Susan Sheets, a former Marine, who calls herself the "proprietress," welcomes folks in a building that used to be a bank. The bank opened in 1919, closed in 1944 and then became a restaurant in 1949.

Susan's version, now in her seventh year, bears no resemblance to the topless bar the place was in the late '70s. Her second redecoration of the place is bright with yellow-gold paint and walls filled with old-time pictures of the Bridgewater area, prints and knick-knacks from the past. The sun streams in the win-

dows on two sides as Austin and Boettner roads come together at the site.

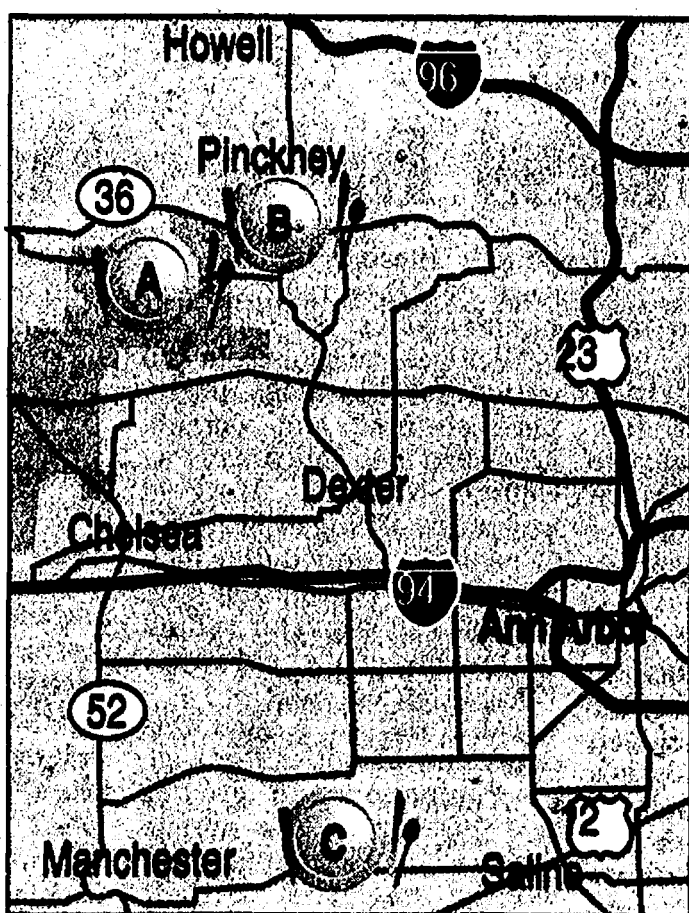
Bridgewater is a hamlet with a population of 102. It's also home to the Bridgewater Lumber yard, now owned by Chelsea Lumber, a tire store where a big tractor was getting fitted, a general store-grocery and several homes. Traffic going from Saline to Manchester, as well as locals and customers of the nearby businesses, stop by from 11 a.m. to 11 p.m. Monday through Saturday, and on Sunday from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., which is devoted to breakfasts.

Byrnes calls Michigan Business Tax 'essential' for economy

In an attempt to help jumpstart Michigan's economy and reward businesses that create jobs in the state, the Michigan House of Representatives passed a comprehensive business tax and incentive package that supporters say will reward investment, protect Michigan-based companies and protect funding for education, health care and police and fire protection.



Byrnes said the Michigan Business Tax is essential to moving Michigan forward because it rewards investment and protects Michigan-based companies, said State Rep. Pam Byrnes (D-Lyndon Township). "This incentive package will help jumpstart our state's economy."

Michigan has to have a new business tax plan before the SBT expires on Dec. 31 while a compromise to resolve the state's budget crisis must be met by June 1.

Under the Michigan Business Tax (MBT) about 75 percent of businesses in Michigan would pay less in taxes. It is the only plan of its kind to address both the Personal Property Tax and the Single Business Tax (SBT) in such a far-reaching manner, supporters say.

The House's solution for replacing the SBT and reforming the Personal Property Tax will:

- Provide \$700 million in new tax credits that reward Michigan businesses for investment, compensation and research and development.

- Reward capital investment by cutting the Personal Property Tax by an average of 73 percent for manufacturers and 48 percent for commercial businesses, while also protecting funding for local

units of government.

- Boost job creation by providing credits for investment in Michigan and for Michigan payroll.

- Help small businesses by exempting companies with less than \$350,000 in gross receipts from taxation. Businesses with up to \$700,000 in gross receipts will pay reduced rates. The plan also enhances existing small-business tax credits.

Legislation would help eliminate voting obstacles

Following last week's local elections, Senate Democrats this week called for action on their legislation to increase voting access in Michigan and allow college students to vote where they live while attending school. Once again, voter turnout was well under 20 percent in many parts of the state for local and school elections. Democrats pointed out that significant obstacles to voting remain for college students,

people who work multiple jobs and many others.

Senators Liz Brater (D - Ann Arbor) and Glenn S. Anderson (D - Westland) announced they plan to reintroduce legislation that will eliminate the requirement that a citizen's voting address must be the same as the permanent address on their driver's license. This requirement disproportionately affects college students. Many college students have experienced difficulty maintaining health insurance coverage as a dependent on their parents' plan if they changed the address on their driver's license, yet newly-registered voters are not permitted to vote absentee.

"Many people have trouble getting to the polls on Election Day because of health or child care issues, or they cannot afford to take time off work," said, lead sponsor of the voting rights package. "This legislation would help ensure everyone has an equal voice in determining the future of our communities, our state, and our country."

Equal pay for equal work

In a move to protect fair wages for all Michigan employees, State Rep. Byrnes recently announced that the House Labor Committee has passed a plan to crack down on wage discrimination and hold employers accountable when they do not provide equal pay for equal work. The package will now go before the full House.

"I believe in protecting all of Michigan's workers and families," said Byrnes, a lead sponsor of the package. "When a corporation or employer discriminates in pay, it hurts us all. This package creates penalties and legal avenues to

punish those who deprive workers of their right to equal pay for equal work."

Michigan ranks 49th in the nation for the wage parity between men and women, according to the Michigan Pay Equity Network. Working women in Michigan are paid 67 cents for every dollar men make - a 33-percent pay gap. This puts Michigan far behind the national gender pay gap of 77 cents per dollar.

The Democratic plan sets down new penalties for wage discrimination and creates new legal avenues to pursue those who discriminate and deprive employees of their right to wage fairness.

Walberg pushes bio-diesel act

U.S. Congressman Tim Walberg (R-District 7) introduced legislation earlier this month in the House that would create a 2 percent national standard for bio-diesel. Walberg issued the following statement about the legislation, the Energy Independence through Bio-Diesel Act:

"As I meet with the men and women of south-central Michigan, they continue to

stress to me the importance of diversifying our nation's energy portfolio and advancing cleaner burning, home-grown, renewable alternative energy sources. One of our greatest national liabilities is our overwhelming dependence on Middle Eastern oil. The Energy Independence through Bio-Diesel Act will continue the process of moving our country towards energy independence.

"Creating a national standard for bio-diesel will encourage the technology and economies of scale necessary to make America the leader in renewable sources of energy."

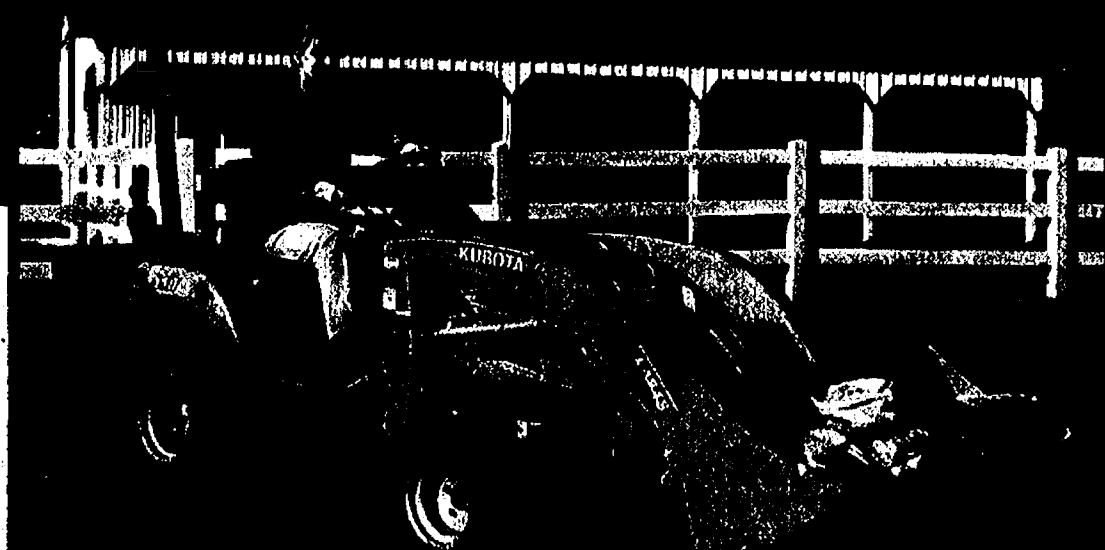

Are higher doses of cholesterol-lowering drugs worth it?

ANN ARBOR — When it comes to cholesterol-lowering drugs, more is better. At least, that's what heart doctors and heart patients have been hearing in recent years. And as a result, more patients are taking higher doses of drugs called statins — leading to lower heart and stroke risk, but higher prescription drug costs and more frequent side effects.

Now, a new study looks at whether those higher doses, and higher costs, are really going to pay off for some patients. For those with a recent heart attack or what doctors call "acute coronary syndrome," the answer is yes, the researchers say.

But the picture is less clear for those patients with known heart blockages who have stable symptoms. For them, the usual dose of their statin may provide adequate heart-protecting benefit, and the higher cost of high-dose statins may provide only marginal benefit at much greater cost, especially if they use generic statins.

The study, from a team at the University of Michigan Cardiovascular Center and the VA Ann Arbor Healthcare System, is published online in the journal *Circulation*, and will be in the May 8 print issue of the journal. It's based on a sophisticated computer analysis of data from thousands of patients.

The team finds that patients with a recent history of acute coronary syndrome (ACS) — either a heart attack or hospital stay for chest pain — get so much benefit from higher doses of statins (over four additional quality-adjusted months of life) that the extra cost of the increased dose is worthwhile, even if the difference is a few

dollars a day.

But for patients with stable coronary artery disease (CAD), whose arteries have been narrowed by plaque but who haven't had a recent heart attack or hospitalization for chest pain, the much smaller gain (about five weeks of quality-adjusted life) from a higher dose of a statin may not be sufficient to outweigh the extra cost.

The researchers also point out that the type of analysis they performed, for this study could be used to assess the cost-effectiveness of other medications and treatments. It could be especially useful when doctors, patients and insurers need to choose between two options that have different costs and benefits to particular patients.

"Clinical trials have effectively demonstrated that high-dose statins reduce cardiovascular endpoints in patients with established coronary artery disease," said Paul Chan, M.D., the study's lead author and a fellow in cardiovascular medicine at the U-M Medical School. "However, we found that whereas high-dose statin therapy reduced mortality in patients with acute coronary syndromes, patients with stable coronary artery disease had no mortality benefit from high-dose statins, but only reductions in stroke and repeat heart attack risk."

"Our study illustrates that simply having a 'positive' clinical trial may not be as informative as reporting what the actual gains in life expectancy and quality of life are with positive trials, and we propose using decision analysis as a way to appreciate the impact of trials that use multiple endpoints that are dissimilar (e.g., death and

rehospitalization)."

The authors point out that one reason for the rapid rise in health care spending is the overuse of new drugs and technologies.

"Many times, clinical trials report a small but statistically significant benefit in an outcome, and this leads to widespread adoption of a treatment, even though the long-term benefits of using that treatment are small. Our methods of analyzing these results begin to address the question of where we really get value from medical care," said Sandeep Vijan, the senior author and an associate professor of general internal medicine at U-M.

"In this study, we found that intensive treatment with statins, a treatment with 'proven' effectiveness, has very different effects depending on who you are. If you are

a very high-risk patient who was just in the hospital for a heart attack, you get lots of benefit from high doses of statins, and treatment is therefore cost-effective."

But if you are a patient who has more stable heart disease, the benefit is much lower — only about one-quarter of that seen in the high-risk group — and the treatment is probably not cost-effective most of the time.

"This is further compounded by the fact that the higher-dose treatments are less well-tolerated, and my clinical experience is that once patients decide the drugs are hard to tolerate, they often won't even take the lower dose drugs, which are enormously beneficial," Vijan adds.

The team based its analysis on data from four very large clinical trials — those whose

results led to recommendations of higher doses of statins for ACS and CAD patients. They combined those data with data on cost and a range of estimates about how long the drug's beneficial effect would last.

In general, statin drugs lower the levels of cholesterol in the blood, which is thought to slow the formation of plaque along artery walls. But they also appear to play a role in reducing inflammation,

which is also a major factor in heart disease. Studies that have compared high and standard doses of statins have shown significant differences in the risk of negative events among the patients taking the higher doses. And that has helped lead to the current recommendations by the federal National Cholesterol Education Program and others, which call for aggressive statin treatment.

CCA plants seeds for growth in funding plan

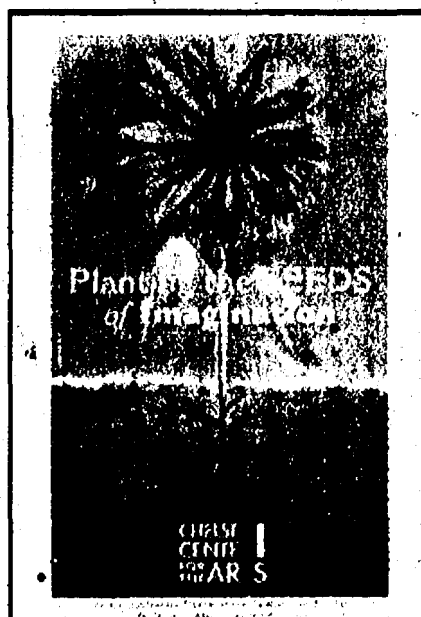
It's hard to imagine what life would be like in Chelsea if not for the contributions of the Chelsea Center for the Arts.

To illustrate that point, the CCA used the theme of "Planting the Seeds of Imagination" for its annual spring luncheon to appeal for increased and continuing funding for the organization.

Attended by nearly 300 people, the event took place May 9 in the Village Conference Center at the Chelsea Comfort Inn.

"I see the CCA planting seeds in kids and adults," said Carol Styles, an artist-in-residence and this year's president of the CCA board of directors.

"That's important for me



both as a board member and as an artist."

CCA students demonstrated their skills during the luncheon, including 9-year-old violinist Maggie Tarasow

accompanied on guitar by her father, Chris Tarasow; and by Kepler Eberle, 5, and his cello instructor, Suzanne Smith.

Executive Director Jennifer Goulet, told the invited guests the CCA "tries to get people to stretch their imagination in every way" through music education, day trips and programs for all ages.

Goulet gave a brief history of the CCA, from its inception in 1994 as the Chelsea Center for the Development of the Arts, to the 1998 donation by Jeff and Kathleen Daniels of a former school building at 400 Congdon St., to the free sidewalk concerts offered during the summers.

"We are planting seeds all over Chelsea - one seed, one artist at a time," Goulet said.

Even though area residents have a "deep appreciation of the arts and culture," she said, funding is becoming more and more tenuous.

"It's a very difficult time for the arts in Michigan, and we are feeling the impact," Goulet said. "There has been a decrease in private and corporate giving, and with a state grant freeze we had to cut our budget by 10 percent."

That means money that already had been approved for desperately needed building repairs and improvements was withdrawn just days before being issued.

Several people spoke about their various associations with the CCA.

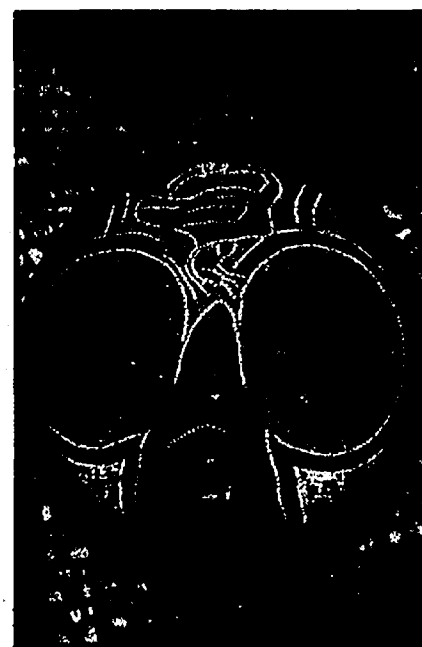
chairwoman Judy Bemis said the art produced by the refugee children tell stories of strife and suffering.

"A volunteer wrote a story about a little girl whose dreams were stolen by the ocean," she said.

"The children were asked to draw pictures of what they thought. Some drew funny pictures and others were more like nightmares. 'Some Sudanese children drew pictures of men shooting guns in their villages and others drew helicopters attacking.'"

The children are from all over the continent — Sudan, Sierra Leone, Togo, Liberia, Chad, Ivory Coast and other West African countries.

The Sunday school children produced their own art in response, as an



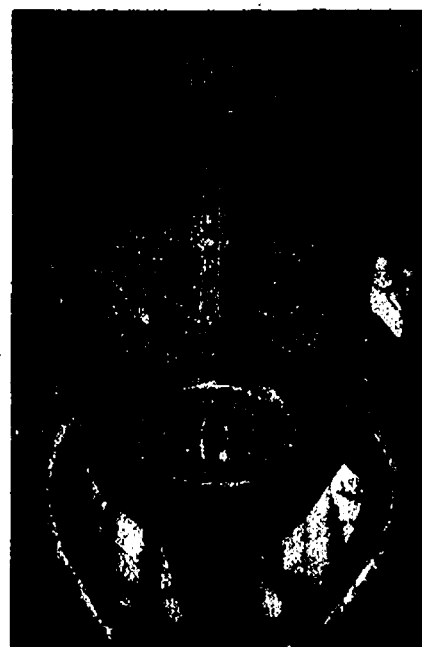
example of communicating across cultures through art, Bemis said.

The art, whether from African children, American children or professionals, will be put up for a silent auction, from which 100 percent of the proceeds will go towards the Webster Scholars scholarship program.

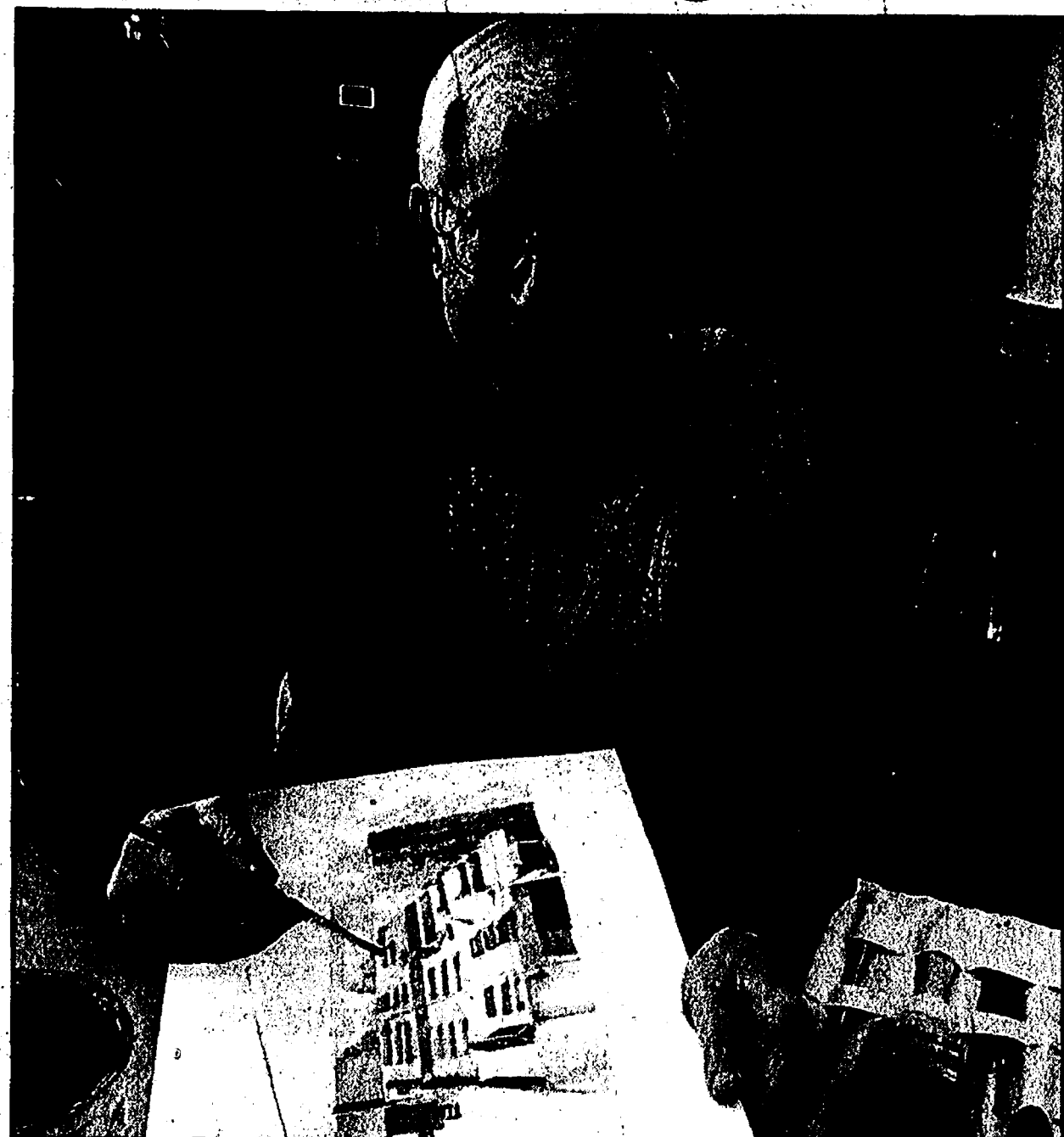

"I live in Dexter but I'm a Chelsea wannabe," said new board member Angie Duncan, whose child is in CCA's preschool program. "It's an incredible resource for us all, and I'm excited to be a part of it."

Nathan Taylor took voice lessons at CCA as a child, and is now a vocal music major in his junior year at the University of Michigan.

"I knew I was conveying something huge to people; I felt their emotions as a performer," he said.

"I never would have had that opportunity without the center, and I will always carry the 'seed' the center planted in me."

Trinh Pifer, owner of The Garden Mill and another new board member, said the CCA is important to the fabric of the Chelsea community.

"It adds a layer of magic to a small town," said Pifer, whose daughters have taken CCA classes. "It makes (Chelsea) a destination; it makes it a great place to live."

Chelsea Gallery owner Gary Galvin, said the presence of the CCA makes Chelsea different from neighboring communities.

"People visiting see the community art projects, see the friendly people smiling; the CCA is part of the ambience," he said. "It's an elusive thing."

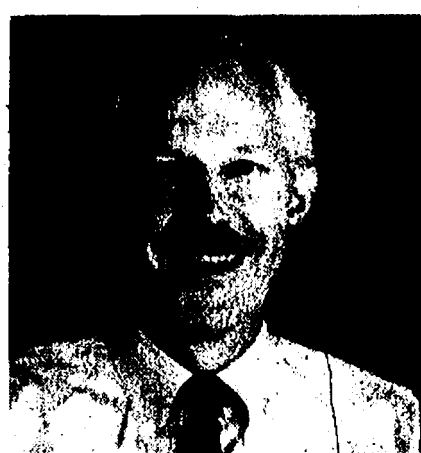

"I certainly really enjoy the Sounds and Sights program that he was very involved in."

Common, who has two best-selling cookbooks to his name - "The Common Grill Cookbook" and "Return to The Common Grill."

"Cookbook" has come a long way since starting in the restaurant business as a dishwasher at the age of 14, and moved up the ranks to the salad bar and pantry

prep before graduating to cooking in his senior year of high school.

He spent two years at a hotel and restaurant program at Northwood Institute in Midland before changing directions and exploring Europe for a few months.

On his return home, he started as a lunch broiler cook at the Hotel Pontchartrain in Detroit, one of the late Chuck Muer's chain of restaurants, where he spent 18 months. He climbed the ladder quickly, being promoted within three years to night kitchen manager, then kitchen manager at Charley's in Northville.

His mentor was chef Larry Pagliara, who provided inspiration and believed in him during his early years. On Pagliara's death, Common inherited his corporate chef hat and went on to oversee 16

restaurants in Michigan, Ohio, Florida, Pennsylvania and Washington, D.C.

At about the same time, Common was getting the urge to strike out on his own. Bob Daniels, owner of Chelsea Lumber, contacted him. In September 1990, the pair met up in Chelsea - Common had to ask for directions to the village - and explored the possibilities of turning a vacant building on Main Street that formerly housed

Dancer's clothing store, into a restaurant.

Common had planned to open a business in Brighton, but was persuaded by Daniels to try Chelsea, a quiet little village back then, but with promises as the Purple Rose Theatre was about to open, and streets and parking amenities were being improved.

Common took the plunge, and opened The Common Grill on July 28, 1991.

Since then Common, his wife Donna, and children Brett and Rachel have become mainstays in the community, and The Common Grill - a nationally known restaurant recognized by Gourmet Magazine - has truly helped to put Chelsea on the map.

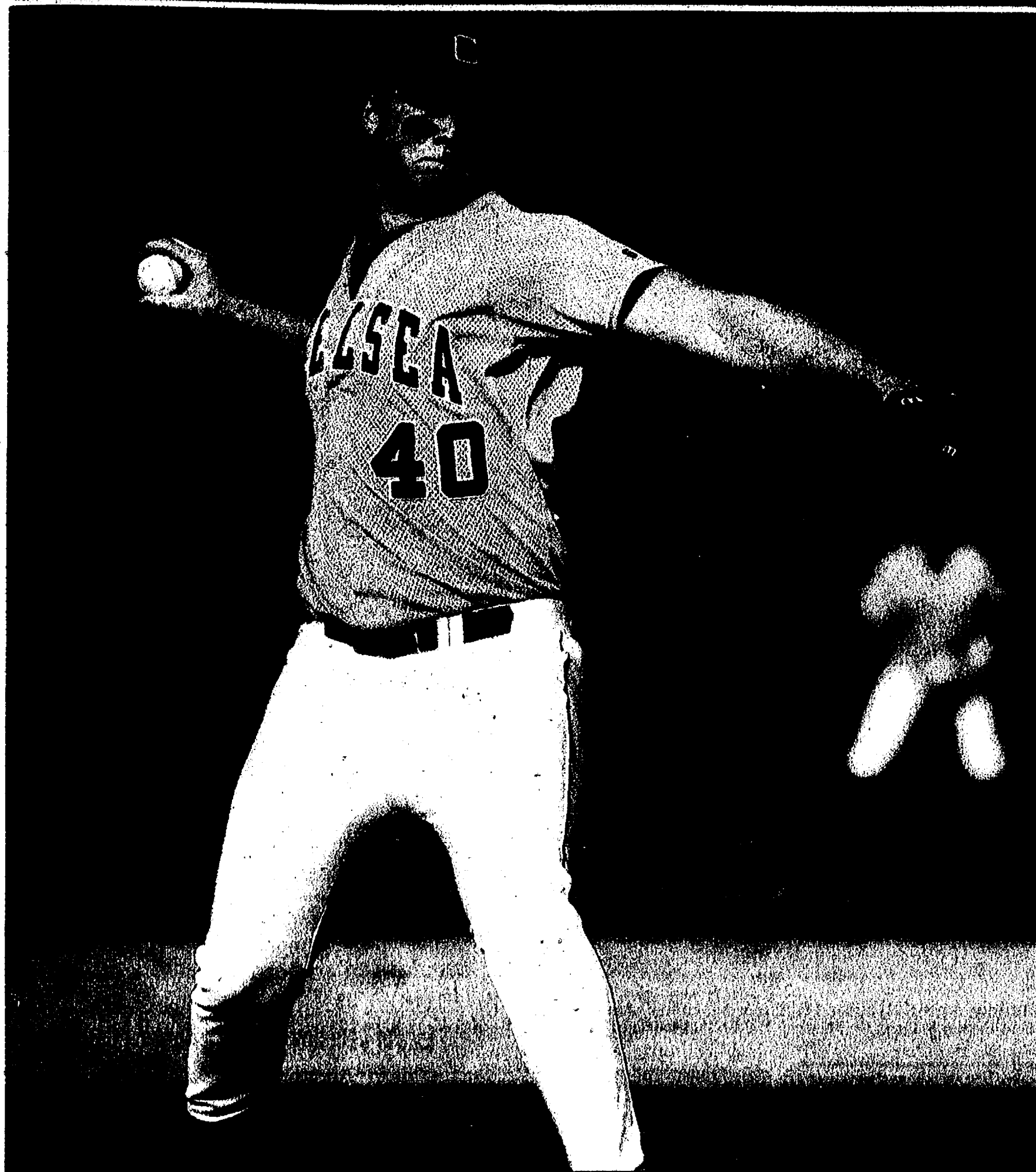

"He pitched very well," said Chelsea coach Wayne Welton. "He was able to get stronger as the game went along."

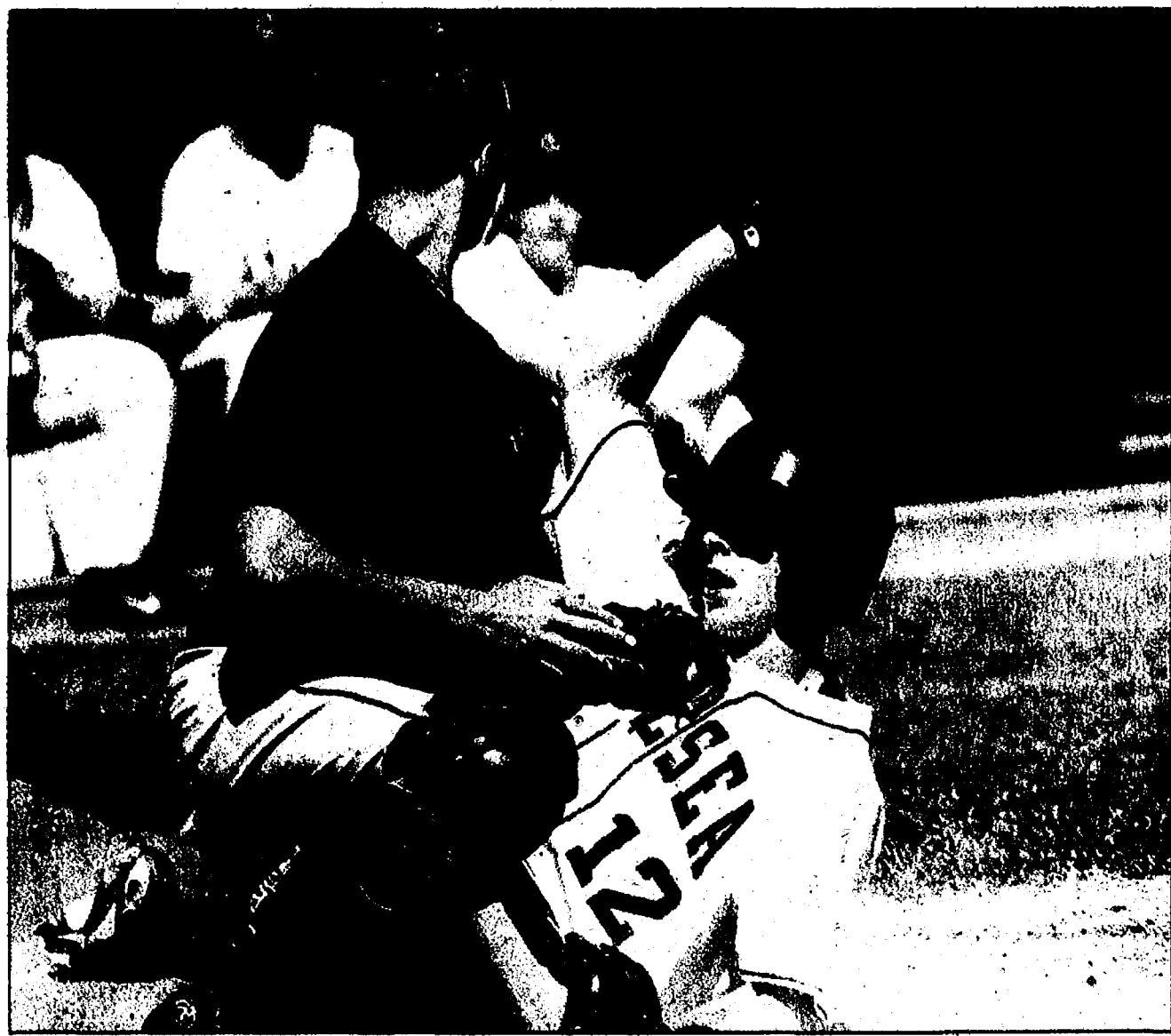

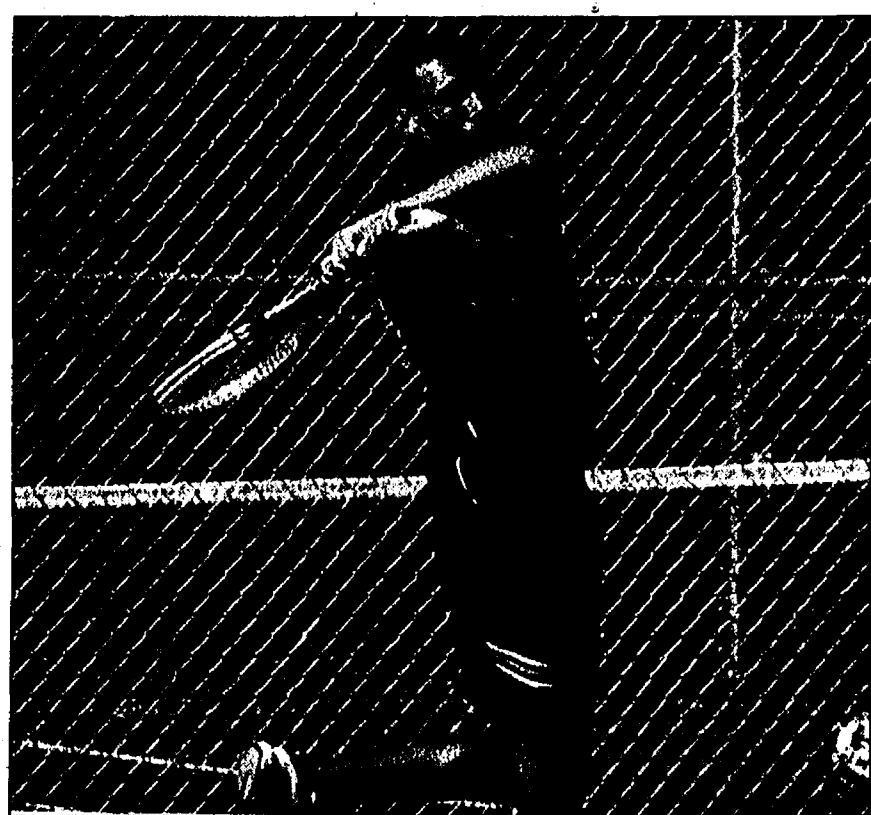

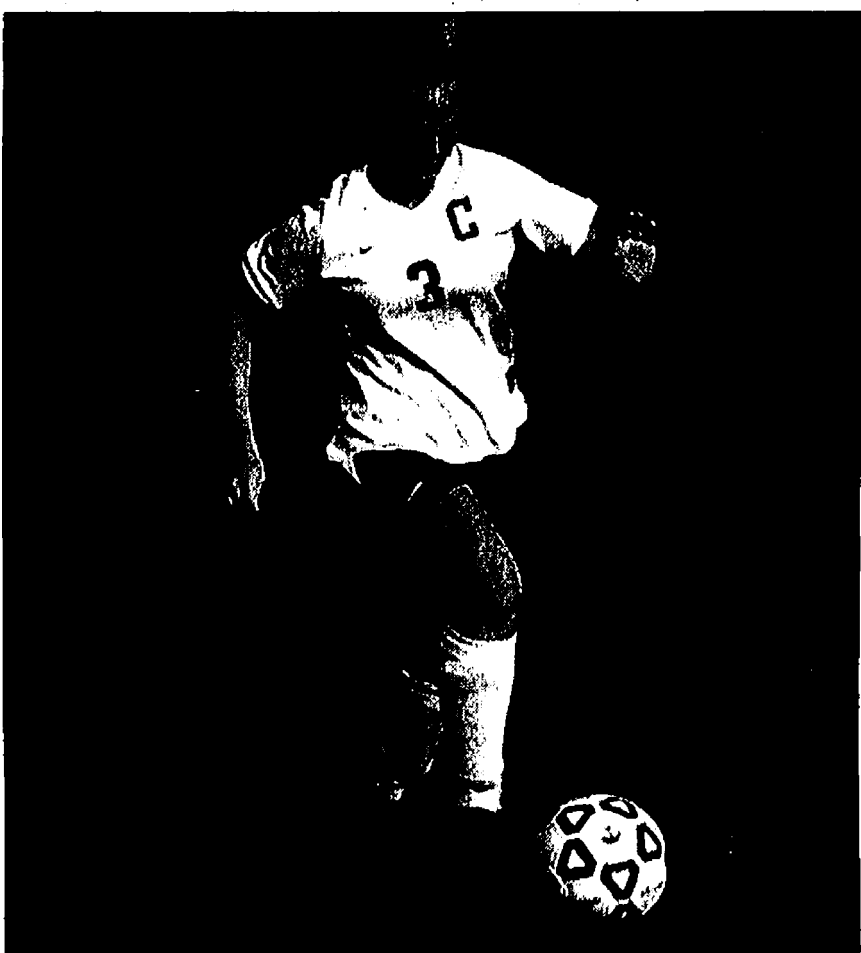

In the 300-meter hurdles, Kingsinger was fourth in 53.2, while Williams was fifth in 53.4 and Oberholtzer sixth in 53.6. All times were personal bests.

Olivia DeTroyer was third in the 100 meters in 12.9 to pace the Bulldogs. She was second in the 200 meters in 27.0.

Kimmi Zimmerman broke the tape first in the 400-meter run in 1:04.2. Christina Coffman was fourth in 1:09.

Nicole Bougher finished third in the 800-meter run with a clocking of 2:37.5. Cassie Coffman was fifth in 2:48, while Katy Martin was sixth in 2:49.

Bougher was second in the 1,600-meter run in 5:42.3.

"Nicole had her finest day ever on the track," Clarke said.

Julie Beaumont placed third in the 3,200-meter run in 12:48.3. Jessica Farley was fourth in 12:48.7, while Katelyn Ciccio was fifth in 13:00.3.

The Bulldog foursome of Christina Coffman, Erin Benjamin, Zimmerman and DeTroyer finished fourth in the 800-meter relay in 1:55.3.

The Chelsea group of Zimmerman, Bougher, DeTroyer and Kingsinger placed first in the 1,600-meter relay with a time of 4:21.2. Kingsinger ran a personal best 1:05.8 in the anchor leg of the relay.

Cassie Coffman, Nicole Hopp, Bougher and Beaumont ended up third in the 3,200-meter relay in 10:33.4.

"We showed some great

improvement in this meet," Clarke said. "Waverly and East Lansing are two of the best girls' teams in the Lansing area. To be within that close to them is no small feat."

"The girls continue to improve with each meet. They are working hard toward their season's goals. We need to continue our effort."

On May 9, Chelsea finished seventh in the Southeastern Conference Jamboree at Saline. The Bulldogs recorded 427 points.

Winning the meet was Ann Arbor Pioneer with 770 points.

"We had a very tough day," Clarke said. "Three out of our top point scorers were out with injuries and three more girls were sick and not in peak form. The result was a disaster points-wise at a meet like this. It cost us about 120 points."

Leading Chelsea on the day was DeTroyer, a freshman, who finished first in the 400-meter run with a time of 1:00.5.

"Olivia was in fifth place coming off the final turn," Clarke said. "She then ran all the other runners down to win in a photo finish at the line."

DeTroyer was also fifth in the 200 meters in 27.1.

Amanda McKenzie was fifth in the 1,600-meter run with a time of 5:24.5.

Ciccio ended up ninth in the 3,200-meter run in 12:54.

Williams placed 10th in the 110-meter hurdles in 17.7.

Anderson finished third in the shot put with a throw of 32-5. Fischer was fourth with a mark of 30-5 1/2. Anderson was third in the discus with a toss of 100-8 1/2, while Fischer was sixth with a 92-9.

Martin was 10th in the high jump with a 4-6.

Cassie Coffman was 11th in the pole vault with a height of 7-6.

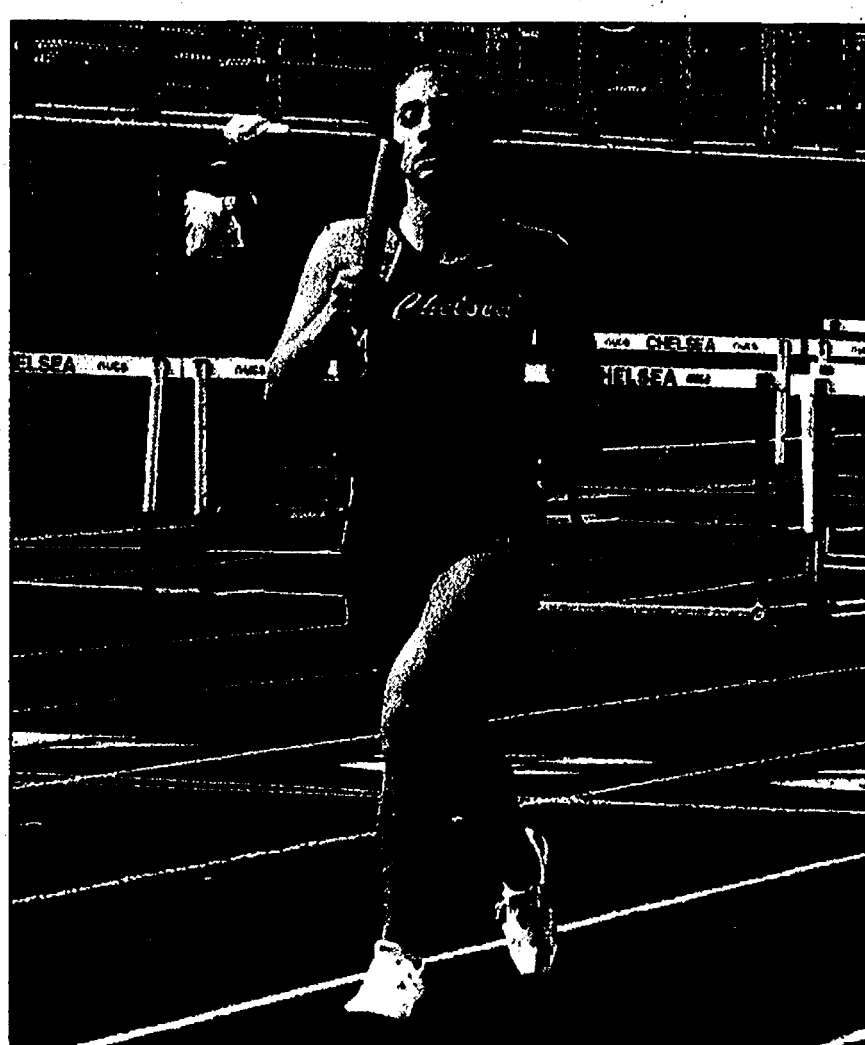

Beaumont, Bougher and McKenzie placed fifth in the 3,200-meter relay in 10:15.4.

"Even depleted, all the girls that ran turned in fine efforts and continue to improve," Clarke said. "We learned quite a bit about quality competition in the face of adversity at this meet and it should help to mature the girls in their approach to the final meets of the season."

Chelsea next travels to Linden to participate in the Division II state regional meet Saturday.

On Wednesday, the Bulldogs host the SEC White Division meet at 3 p.m.

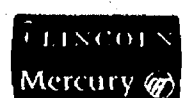

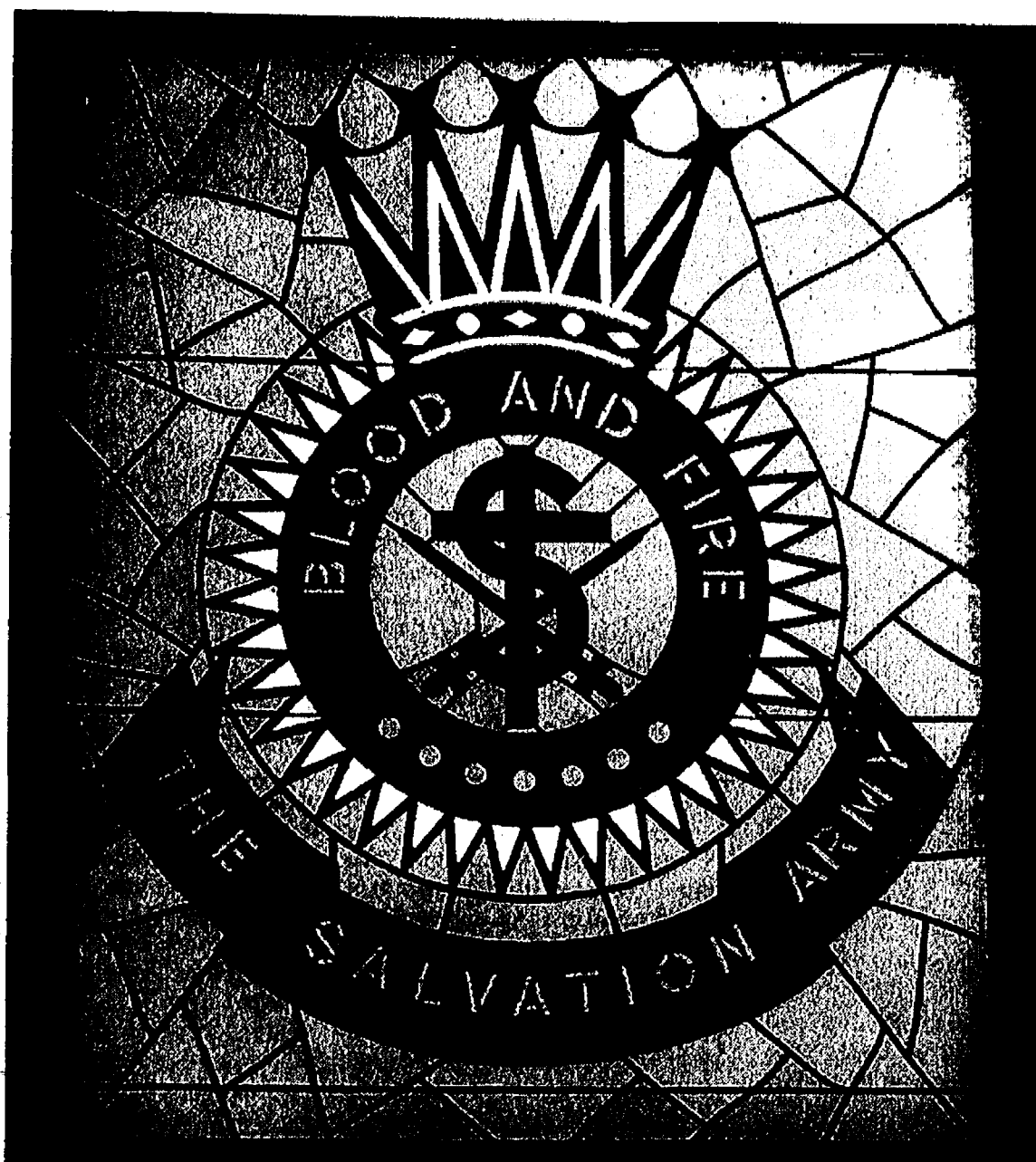

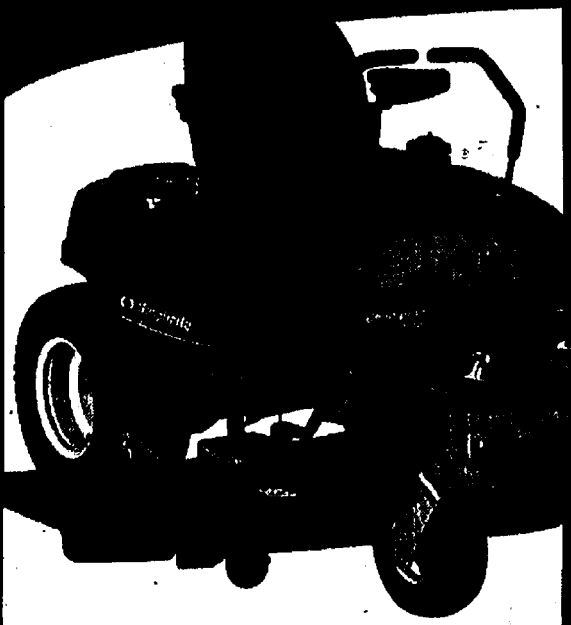

FASHION STATEMENT

There are five basic pieces every woman needs in her wardrobe: a tailored jacket, a tailored skirt, a classic white blouse, a great fitting khaki pant and a trench coat. These pieces are the foundation of a well-fitted, coordinated wardrobe. By adding trendier pieces to these classics, you can keep your look updated without sacrificing fit or style.

A tailored, well-structured jacket is a necessity. It is one of the most versatile pieces you'll own. You can pair it with a skirt or trouser for work, dress it up with a satiny blouse to wear out for an evening event or with a fine gauge sweater and a nice pair of jeans for casual wear. Because you will use it frequently, it needs to be a high quality piece.

Look for classic colors - navy blue, charcoal gray or black. Finding a pin-stripe is a plus - you can match a blouse, skirt or pant to the pin-stripe to expand the jacket's usefulness. For instance, if you find a navy jacket with a charcoal gray pin-stripe, you can pair the jacket with a gray trouser or skirt, and add a red blouse for a pop of color.

Fit is of utmost importance. If you have a large chest, you will need a jacket with a higher stance. This means it needs to button up higher in the front. Many women make the mistake of buying a low stance jacket, which generally

buckles in the front and only makes them look bigger. If you have a smaller chest, you can go for a jacket with a lower stance and fewer buttons.

Regardless of your chest size, make sure the top button and the lapels don't gap - if they do, you need a different size. Look for princess seaming - seams that curve down the front of the jacket. These seams provide a more tailored, custom fit. Look for a jacket that has a waist, or an hourglass shape to it. Avoid jackets that hang straight down from the arm and have no shape or fit to them.

Pay attention to the fit in the back, both across the shoulder and the hip. You should be able to cross your arms in front of you without the jacket binding up across the shoulder. A jacket that is vented or has a flap in the back will always fit nicer and lay better. This allows for variations in hip size, so the jacket doesn't bind up or rest on your hips and bunch up at the waist.

Sleeves should touch your wrist when your arms are held straight out in front of you, and should not bind up on your arms, especially at the shoulder and upper arm. Hem length is important as well - if the jacket is too long, it can make you look shorter. Most women look best in a jacket that falls to the middle of the hip. Remember, sleeve length and hem length are easy alterations to make, so if it fits well everywhere else, don't be afraid to have it altered.

Fabric is important, too. Natural fabrics like wool, cashmere or cottons tend to hang better and can be pressed or steamed back into shape more easily than synthetics. Look for a fabric with about three to five percent spandex in it; the spandex provides a little bit of give without allowing the fabric to stretch out of shape and get baggy.

If you buy an unlined jacket, make sure that the seams are finished and won't fray. Seam finishes can be simply serged, which is a type of machine stitch that slows fraying; turned, which means the seam allowance has been folded under and stitched down; or bound, which means the raw edges of the seam allowance have been encased in bias tape and sewn so the fabric won't fray. Of the three, bound seams are the best quality finish and show attention to detail by the manufacturer.

Steer clear of super wide or narrow lapels, rounded points, or dated finishes. Remember, you want a jacket that will last at least five years or more, and nothing will date a jacket faster than odd sized lapels or other strange finishes.

Investing in well-made classic pieces for your wardrobe is one of the smartest things you can do. With careful attention to fit and quality, they will serve you well for years.

Spring inevitably brings the decorating bug to many people. After a long Michigan winter sprucing up your home feels rejuvenating. There are some decorating questions that I hear from my clients over and over again. I thought I would take the opportunity to address two of the most common questions: how to pick the right paint color and how to mix and match fabric patterns.

I will start with choosing your paint color. The easiest way to insure your room will look pulled together is to begin with your fabric or upholstered pieces. Your paint color will be a neutral background, a color chosen from your fabric or a complimentary color to your fabric.

When you decide which look you are going for, head to your local paint/home improvement store and bring home as many paint cards in that color. There are so many variations on every color so take a wide assortment. Tape them to the wall of the room you are going to paint. If you are working with a certain fabric make sure you have a piece close by.

Most people will see immediately which paint colors will not

work. Remove and toss those cards. Look at the remaining colors at different times of the day, the light will alter the color slightly. Use the process of elimination to continue to remove the colors that do not work. You will be left with the perfect color for your room.

Mixing patterns can be as easy as following a simple formula. Three patterns is the safest bet. Keep in mind that you will be using three different patterns. For example, a stripe, plaid and floral. Or a check, paisley and stripe. Any combination will work if they are three different sizes. For instance, a large check, a medium floral and a small stripe. What will make this work is that each fabric has the same colors. Thankfully, today's fabric designers have done much of the work for you. Your local fabric stores will have coordinating materials displayed together. Mixing patterns will give your room interest and depth.

Hope these tips help you with your decorating projects.

ORDINANCE TO APPROVE, WITH
RESERVATIONS, A UNIFORM VIDEO
SERVICES FRANCHISE AGREEMENT
SUBMITTED BY COMCAST

THE TOWNSHIP OF SYLVAN ORDAINS:

Section 1. **Purpose:** On January 1, 2007, the Uniform Video Services Franchise Act, 2006 P.A. 480, ("Act 480") became effective. Act 480 requires that local units of government approve a uniform video service local franchise agreement once it is considered complete by the municipality. The purpose of this Ordinance is to approve the application submitted by Comcast of the South Inc. doing business as Comcast.

Section 2. **Uniform Video Services Local Franchise Agreement Approved.** The Township approves the Uniform Video Service Local Franchise Agreement submitted by Comcast of the South Inc. doing business as Comcast, attached as Appendix 1 to this Ordinance.

Section 3. **Reservations of Rights.** The Township's approval of this Ordinance is not a waiver of or an acknowledgement that Act 480 meets the requirements of the Michigan Constitution, United States Constitution, or other Federal or Michigan law. If it is later determined by a court of competent jurisdiction, the Michigan Public Service Commission, the Federal Communications Commission, or any other agency or tribunal with jurisdiction that Act 480 or any of its provisions are unconstitutional, unlawful or unenforceable, the Township reserves the right to take any action necessary, including but not limited to repealing this Resolution and Ordinance and reinstating any franchise in effect on January 1, 2007, to comply with any order, judgment or ruling involving Act 480 or any of its provisions.

Section 4. **Validity and Severability.** Should any portion of this Ordinance be found invalid for any reason, such holding shall not be construed as affecting the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

Section 5. **Repealer Clause.** Any ordinances, resolutions or parts of ordinances or resolutions, including any ordinance or resolution granting a franchise to Comcast of the South, Inc. doing business as Comcast, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force, subject to the Reservations of Rights contained in Section 3.

Section 6. **Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall be effective upon publication.

SUMMARY OF APPENDIX 1 OF THE
ORDINANCE TO APPROVE, WITH
RESERVATIONS, A UNIFORM VIDEO
SERVICES FRANCHISE AGREEMENT
SUBMITTED BY COMCAST

On May 1, 2007, Sylvan Township ("Township") adopted an Ordinance To Approve, With Reservations, A Uniform Video Services Franchise Agreement Submitted By Comcast ("Ordinance"). Attached as Appendix 1 to the Ordinance is the Uniform Video Service Local Franchise Agreement ("Agreement") submitted by Comcast. A complete copy of the approved Agreement is on file at the Township Hall located at 18027 Old US #2, Chelsea, MI 48118 and may be viewed during normal business hours. In addition, a complete copy of a model franchise agreement is located on the State of Michigan website at www.michigan.gov. The following is a summary of provisions of the Agreement.

I. **Definitions.** The Agreement contains definitions of cable operator, cable service, cable system, commission, franchising entity, FCC, Gross revenue, household, incumbent video provider, IPTV, local unit of government, low-income household, METRO Act, open video system, person, public rights-of-way, term, uniform video service franchise agreement, franchise agreement, video programming, video service, video service provider, video service provider fee.

II. **Requirements for provider.** Section II sets forth the requirements of the provider provided in 2006 PA 480 ("Act"). Among the requirements, the provider must obtain a franchise agreement, file all required forms with the FCC, comply with all valid and enforceable (1) federal and state statutes and regulations (2) all local regulations regarding the use and occupation of the public rights-of-way (3) and FCC requirements involving the distribution and notification of emergency messages. The provider shall comply with all public, education and government programming requirements ("PEG") contained in Section 4 of the Act, all applicable FCC and Michigan customer service rules, applicable writing rules of the FCC, and certain Consumer Privacy Requirements. For incumbent providers, they shall comply with the insurance for rights-of-way related activities set forth in the last franchise agreement. The provider must provide a video service footprint of the area to be served and pay fees required under the franchise.

III. **Provider Providing Access.** The provider shall not deny access to any group of potential residential subscribers because of race or income. The Agreement sets forth conditions that will provide a defense to such an allegation and provides for certain standards of access to its video service for those providers using telecommunications facilities to provide such video service. The provider may request a waiver or extension of time to meet the requirements from the Franchising Entity for reasons set forth in the Agreement. The provider may satisfy the requirements of this paragraph through alternative technology.

IV. **Responsibility of the Franchising Entity.** The Agreement grants authority to provide video service and use the public rights-of-way, subject to Michigan law and the local police powers. The Franchising Entity (Township) must notify the provider the application was complete within 15 business days and approve the Agreement within 30 days. The Franchising Entity shall allow a provider to install, construct and maintain a video service or communications network within the public rights-of-way and provide open, comparable, non-discriminatory and neutral access. The Agreement discusses the applicable permit fees. The Franchise Entity shall not require the provider to apply for any other franchise, access or other fees other than those permitted under the Act or require any other mandatory build out or deployment provisions.

V. **Term.** The term shall be 10 years from the date issued. The provider may apply for an additional 10 year term.

VI. **Fees.** If there is an existing franchise, the provider shall pay the amount equal to the percentage of gross revenue paid by the incumbent provider with the largest number of subscribers. After the expiration or if there is no current agreement, the provider shall pay 5% of gross revenues. The term "gross revenue" is defined in the Franchise Agreement. The provider shall receive a credit for METRO fees paid. Claims regarding fees shall be made within 3 years. The provider may collect the franchise fee on the monthly bill of each subscriber.

VII. **Public Educational and Government (PEG) channels:** The provider shall designate capacity for the same number of PEG channels that were in actual use as of January 1, 2007. The PEG channels not used at least 8 hours a day for 3 consecutive months may no longer be made available. The Agreement provides regulations for transmission, content and programming. The provider is not responsible for programming and shall not exercise editorial control. The Franchising Entity shall provide a written request specifying the number of channels in actual use of the system. The provider shall have 90 days to begin providing access.

VIII. **PEG Fees.** The provider is not required to pay PEG fees under Sylvan Township's Agreement.

IX. **Audits.** No more than every 24 months, the Franchising Entity may perform audits.

X. **Termination and Modification.** The Agreement may be terminated or modified as permitted under Section 9 of the Act.

XI. **Transferability.** The Agreement is fully transferable to a successor in interest and provide a notice of transfer within 15 days after completion of the transfer.

XII. **Change of Information.** The provider shall timely notify the Franchising Entity of any changes.

XIII. **Confidentiality.** The Franchise Agreement contains requirements and procedures for terms of a protective order, trade secrets or commercial or financial information to be kept confidential and exempt from the Freedom of Information Act.

XIV. **Complaints/Customer Service.** The provider shall establish and notify customers of its dispute resolution process and maintain local numbers for customer service. The provider is subject to penalties.

XV. **Notice.** The provider and Franchising Entity provide contact information.

XVI. **Miscellaneous.** The Agreement contains provisions regarding governing law, counterparts, power to enter agreements and statements that the provider and Franchising Entity are subject to the provisions of 2006 Public Act 480.

marriage - as beneficiaries. Nonetheless, you can't just assume that all sources of income that your husband receives will automatically roll over to you.

Motion by Merkel, seconded by Solo to table the BS&A Software Internet Services for more information and resolve a conflict with the Enhanced Access Policy. Carried.

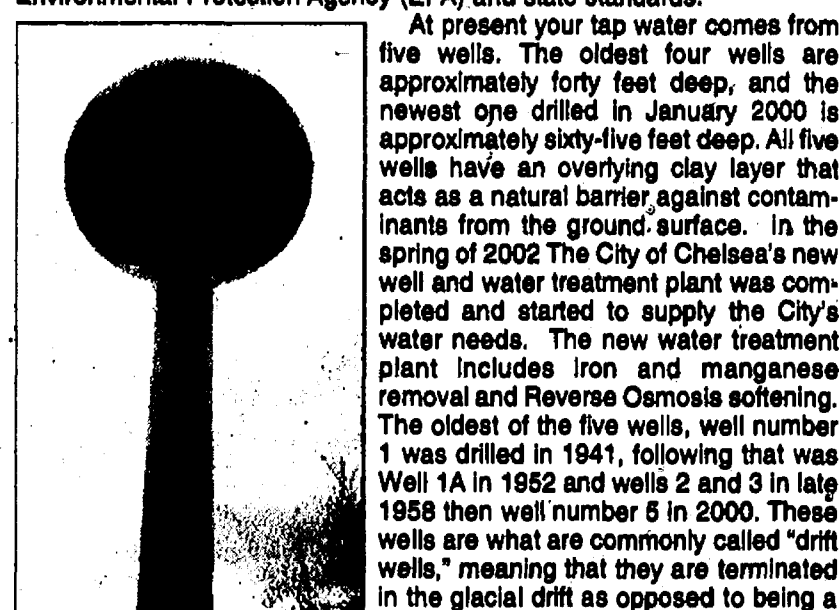

CITY OF CHELSEA 2006 WATER QUALITY REPORT

This report covers the drinking water quality for the City of Chelsea for the 2006 calendar year. This information is a snapshot of the quality of the water that we provided to you in 2006. Included are details about where your water comes from, what it contains, and how it compares to Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and state standards.



below the drift. The wells are in a gravel formation with a well screen to allow water to pass through while keeping the sand and gravel from entering the pump.

The water from the five wells is pumped to the new treatment plant where it moves through the aerators to oxidize the iron and manganese. After some detention time the water passes through the iron/manganese removal filters where the iron and manganese is removed. Once the water has passed through the iron removal filters it enters the membrane softening units. A portion of the iron treated water is diverted past the membrane softening equipment and blended with the softened water to balance the hardness and achieve a goal of 135 to 160 ppm of hardness. The water then travels to the 200,000-gallon concrete ground storage tank at the facility.

On its way to the ground storage tank chlorine is applied. The chlorine is added as a disinfectant to prevent the presence of any bacteria contamination in the ground storage tank. As the water leaves the ground storage tank on its way to the elevated storage tower additional chlorine is added to maintain disinfection within the distribution system.

Approximately 0.8 ppm of fluoride is added for healthier teeth and bones. Also added is an ortho phosphate blend to help prevent the corrosion of residential plumbing and distribution system piping. The water is metered and the chemicals are weighed everyday to ensure proper chemical dosages.

Source Water Vulnerability Assessment:

Your water comes from 5 groundwater wells, each over 40 feet deep. The State performed an assessment of our source water to determine the susceptibility or the relative potential of contamination. The susceptibility rating is on a seven-tiered scale from "very-low" to "very-high" based on geologic sensitivity, well construction, water chemistry and contamination sources. Hydro geologic information from the delineation report has been reviewed to establish a geologic sensitivity for the production wells. The four production wells obtain groundwater from an aquifer that is characterized as "unconfined." Unconfined aquifers possess a "high" geologic sensitivity. The susceptibility of our source is "high." This study was based on wells 1, 1A, 2, and 3. (prior to the drilling and implementation of well 5.)

Potential sources of contamination include groundwater discharge permit sites; several small and large quantity hazardous waste generator sites; several Underground Storage Tank sites; and hazardous waste facilities. Abandoned wells provide a direct conduit for surface runoff and contaminants to easily reach the groundwater and may pose a potential problem. We are making efforts to protect our sources by conducting an active Wellhead Protection Program that supports management of existing or potential sources of contamination in the Wellhead Protection Program Area. Known sources of contamination within the WHPA are being remediated to prevent movement of contamination to the municipal wells.

• Sources of drinking water: The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. Our water comes from wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally-occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity.

• Contaminants that may be present in source water include:

• Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations and wildlife.

• Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally-occurring or result from urban stormwater runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining or farming.

• Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture and residential uses.

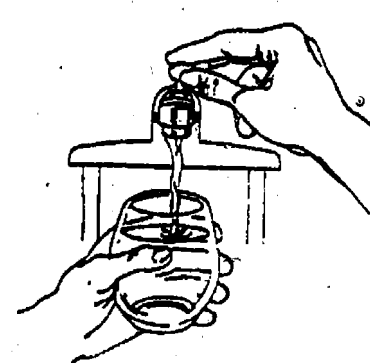
• Radioactive contaminants, which are naturally occurring or be the result of oil and gas production and mining activities.

• Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban stormwater runoff, and septic systems.

• Vulnerability of sub-populations: Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. EPA/CDC guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection

by Cryptosporidium and other microbial contaminants are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA prescribes regulations that limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. Food and Drug Administration regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water which provide the same protection for public health.



Water Quality Data

The table below lists all the drinking water contaminants that we detected during the 2006 calendar year. The presence of these contaminants in the water does not necessarily indicate that the water poses a health risk. Unless otherwise noted, the data presented in this table is from testing done January 1 - December 31, 2006. The State allows us to monitor for certain contaminants less than once per year because the concentrations of these contaminants are not expected to vary significantly from year to year. All of the data is representative of the water quality, but some are more than one year old.

Terms and abbreviations used below:

• Maximum Contaminant Level Goal (MCLG): The level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.

• Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL): The highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.

• Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level (MRDL): means the highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water. There is convincing evidence that addition of a disinfectant is necessary for control of microbial contaminants.

• Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level Goal (MRDLG): means the level of a drinking water disinfectant below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MRDLGs do not reflect the benefits of the use of disinfectants to control microbial contaminants.

• N/A: Not applicable. ND: not detectable at testing limit ppb: parts per billion or micrograms per liter ppm: parts per million or milligrams per liter pCi/L: picocuries per liter (a measure of radioactivity).

• Action Level: The concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements that a water system must follow.

• Treatment Technique (TT): A required process intended to reduce the level of a contaminant in drinking water.

Reminder: The City of Chelsea has enacted a watering restriction/conervation ordinance regarding irrigation water use. This ordinance addresses water irrigation restrictions and conservation to help preserve the adequacy of the city's public water supply. All lawn or landscape irrigation is prohibited between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. This is an effort to reduce demand on the water system during the early morning peak usage times.

Automatic sprinkler systems should be programmed to water on odd-numbered dates for homes and businesses with odd-numbered addresses and on even-numbered dates for even-numbered addresses. The ordinance makes provisions for penalty for person who violate. The first violation would be subject to a civil fine of \$100.00; \$250.00 for second violation; and \$500.00 for the 3rd or subsequent violation.

What does the Bible say about infant baptism?

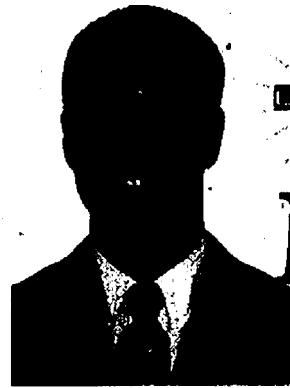
The act of baptism is taught in nearly every church that claims to follow Christ. However, many disagree on what baptism actually is, and what it is for.

We see that a large portion of the churches practice infant baptism. Others strongly oppose baptizing babies. We have churches and pastors in this community on both sides of the issue. Yet instead of discussing topics like these and working out our differences, many decide the best thing to do is ignore them. And so we hear very little Bible teaching about baptism.

What we want to consider is, "What does the Bible say about infant baptism?"

The answer: nothing. That really is the answer. You can't find one verse in the whole Bible that speaks of baptizing babies. There is no command to do such. There is no example of this being practiced in the entire Bible. There is not even an honest implication that we should baptize infants.

What this means is that there is no authority from God to do this thing. Before

we decide to do something in the name of Christ, we need to see if the action is approved of God (Col. 3:17). When we cannot find Scripture to support our positions, then we need to give up the said position.

The great prophet Micah said, "As the LORD liveth, what the LORD saith unto me, that will I speak" (1 Kings 22:14). If all preachers would take this stand there would be no infant baptism.

What do we find in the Bible concerning baptism?

Every account of conversion in the New Testament shows that people who were baptized were able to make that decision on their own (read The Acts of the Apostles). No infant has ever decided to be baptized; they generally don't even appreciate the process at the time. Acts 8:12 says, "They were baptized, both men and women," babies are not included. These were individuals who were accountable for their own actions.

We also find that a person must believe in Jesus before he is a candidate for baptism (Mark 16:16). One must turn from sin (repentance) before baptism (Acts 2:38). He must confess with the mouth that Jesus is Lord before he is baptized (Acts 8:36-37). All of these things are, of course, impossible for infants.

You may be asking yourself, "How then did infant baptism get so popular in religion?"

That is a good question, since it is now

clear that it did not come from the Bible. This practice got its start as a result of the doctrine of inherited sin. People began to believe that babies were born condemned sinners and bound for hell. Does that sound harsh to you? It does to me! But that is what some religious people have believed for a long time. And since they believed an infant was born altogether lost, they thought the thing to do was baptize it to wash away those sins.

The truth is, we are all held accountable for the sins we ourselves commit, not the sins of our parents (Ezek. 18:20; Rom. 3:23). We all need to come to God ourselves through Jesus. If you were sprinkled as an infant (as I was), please consider the Scriptures and make the best decision for the sake of your soul. If you would like to study further on this issue or any Bible topic, we are here to help.

Estate planning with a trust is beneficial

If you're like many investors, the prospect of using something called an intentionally defective irrevocable trust might give you pause. After all, why would anyone create a trust that is designed to be defective?

The fact is, however, that an IDIT can be one of the most effective components of a comprehensive estate planning strategy. IDITs are garnering lots of attention these days. One reason: The IRS last year issued a ruling approving the use of such trusts (2004-64).

Then there's the considerable uncertainty about the future of estate taxes. Although the estate tax currently is set to be repealed in 2010, it will return the following year unless Congress makes the repeal permanent — an increasingly unlikely scenario.

POWERFUL BENEFITS

While there are a number of rules governing IDITs, their essential characteristics boil down to this: As the grantor of an IDIT, you own the trust for income tax purposes (and will pay taxes on the income it generates), but not for estate-tax purposes — enabling you to transfer a significant amount of assets out of your taxable estate.

The result: more money to give to the kids or other heirs, instead of to Uncle Sam. This dual-featured structure provides several compelling benefits, including:

ESTATE FREEZE

An IDIT freezes your assets at their current fair market value — which may be a discounted valuation, depending on the nature of the

assets selected to be sold.

All future appreciation on those assets in excess of the fixed interest rate for the note from the sale is excluded from your estate and transferred to your heirs.

MORE POWERFUL GIFTING

By paying the tax on the trust's income — instead of having the trust or the beneficiaries pay it — you're able to shift more money out of your estate and keep more money in the trust for family members. Additionally, those payments aren't treated by the IRS as taxable gifts to your children.

AVOIDANCE OF IMMEDIATE CAPITAL GAINS

Funding a trust requires that you sell an asset to the trust. Typically, that transaction would trigger a capital gain — but an IDIT sidesteps that tax.

CONTROL

As grantor, you create the mechanisms that will control the assets in the IDIT. Such control is important psychologically to many affluent investors, especially owners of closely held businesses.

POTENTIAL ASSET PROTECTION

The trust also buffers your

beneficiaries by protecting the assets from divorces, creditors and lawsuits.

IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS

That said, IDITs probably aren't for everyone.

For starters, the process of valuing the assets to be sold to the trust and drafting the documents might be costly.

Investors with assets of \$5 million to \$10 million, or more, are usually best suited for IDITs; less-wealthy investors often can achieve their estate planning goals via alternative trusts and strategies. If you decide to use an IDIT, you'll need to consider which assets to sell to the trust. Most assets are fair game, including publicly traded stock, shares of a closely held business and real estate.

The most suitable choices should be high-growth assets, in order to fully leverage the IDIT's ability to remove future appreciation from your estate. Assets that can receive significant valuation discounts (majority interests in a family limited liability company, for example) are especially appealing from an estate tax perspective.

Finally, keep in mind that an IDIT needs to be set up properly — using experienced professionals.

Robert donated a portrait of his ancestors to the Chelsea Historical museum.

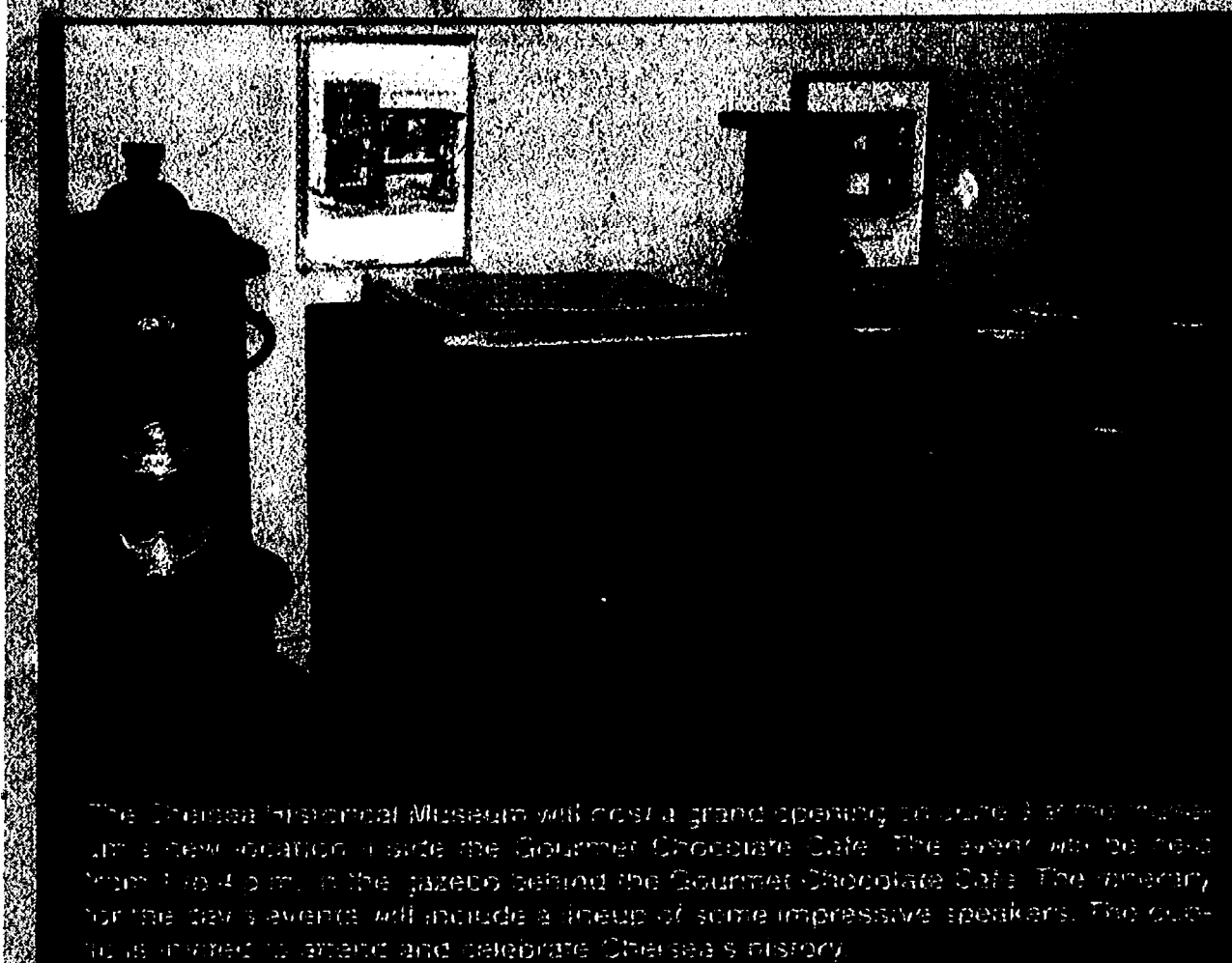

They resided in Unadilla until 1861 when they sold the farm and moved to Chelsea. The reason for the move was that Isaac felt that Chelsea had more opportunity for his family due mostly to the rail line there. He purchased 300 acres of land northeast of Chelsea on the east side of McKinley street. Isaac passed away in 1887 and his wife in 1896 in Chelsea. They are both buried at Oak Grove cemetery in Chelsea along with most of their descendants.

Teddy Bear maker says rewards come in smiles

Susan Moore tells people who tour the Chelsea Teddy Bear Co. factory where she works that she is a teddy bear artist in training. That's because the Chelsea resident has only been making bears since last December.

Her latest creation, a 17-inch jointed plush bear, rivals any other American made teddy bear. It's cute and huggable!

"Bob Turner who owns the Teddy Bear Co. hired me as a sewer, so visitors would see actual production under way during tours," said Moore.

"Even though I had never made a teddy bear before, he asked me to try and gave me free reign to use any of the fabrics on display. Everything but the very expensive mohair."

Now the company is gearing up to produce hundreds of bears to meet the demand for American made products among the colleges and universities that are the major market for Chelsea Teddy Bear Company's parent corporate MCM Group.

The teddy bear maker spent many years making her own and her children's clothing a long time ago. Her only training was sewing class in junior high school and a few adult education classes later on.

"I've always enjoyed sewing because I like pretty clothes and never could afford ready-made. Later on, when I completed my education and went to work, my sewing took a back seat and

shopping became a passion." Moore's latest passion is making teddy bears.

"Every teddy bear has a different personality depending on what eyes you use and where you place them. The nose and mouth make a big difference as does the fabric."

Moore decided early on that all the bears she made would have a smile rather than the traditional melancholy look.

So far she has made bears in four sizes using several fabrics - some short plush and others longer fur like real animals.

Faux fur can be difficult to work with. The cutting process literally has fur flying. A real mess! The fur is slippery and requires pinning and bagging to keep it in place.

Moore also enjoys designing and sewing teddy bear dresses, hats, shorts, and nightshirts. "Even though the store stocks a variety of cute outfits, I've been able to make seasonal things for Valentines' Day, St. Patrick's Day and Easter."

Moore considers teddy bear making to be just her latest career in a long string from bank teller, newspaper reporter, editor, political publicist to spokesperson and special events planner for the U.S. Postal Service.

"I thought I was retiring in 1998 but look where I am now - having a great time learning something new and making other people and myself happy at the same time."

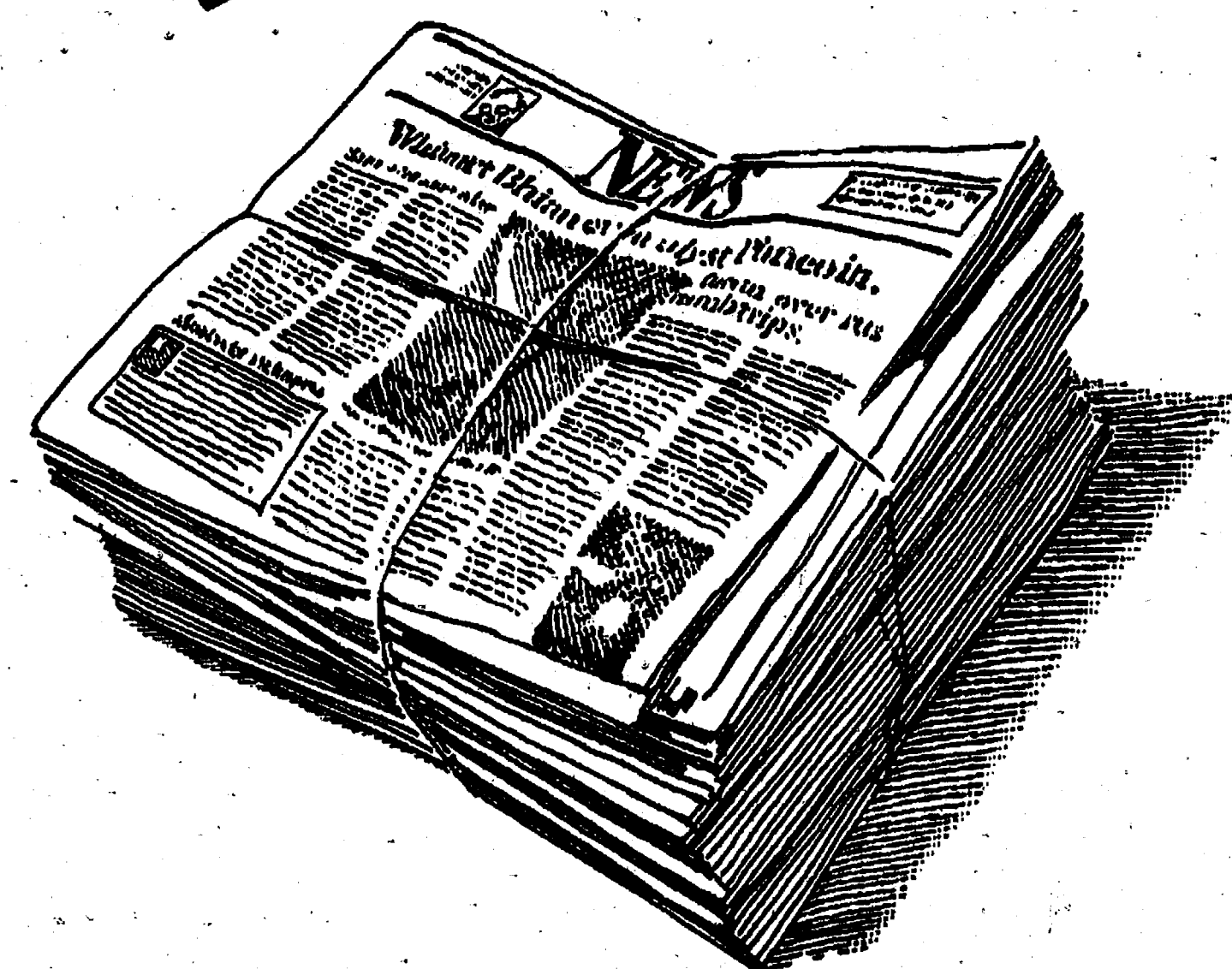

Expert gives helpful tips during the 'mulch season'

Ahh, spring. Robins in the yard, Peepers peeping, turtles on the road, mountains of bagged mulch at nearly every gas station.

Mulch has become ubiquitous in the Michigan landscape, sometimes overused. Organic mulch, meaning mulch that will decompose, serves several uses. It moderates and maintains soil temperatures, slows evaporation, improves soil, blocks weed growth, prevents injury from mowers and trimmers and dresses up the landscape.

Because mulch insulates the soil it minimizes spring freeze/thaw cycles which can injure some plants. It will also slow the emergence of spring bulbs so you may want to rake it back from areas where you have tulip, daffodils and other spring flowering perennials to allow the soil to warm. If you are mulching an area for the first time, wait until the perennials have emerged.

Keep in mind that mulched trees, shrubs and perennials won't need to be watered as often. If you have a sprinkler system try shutting off the zone(s) that water only mulched areas, watering only after extended periods without rain. Reducing the water to woody plants will force them to send their roots deeper, a good thing.

Decomposition can cause nitrogen depletion in the soil, but only temporarily. The decomposed mulch will release the nitrogen and additional nutrients back into the soil, so the more quickly a mulch can decompose, the shorter the

cycle. Wood chips such as available from tree trimmers and in dyed mulches decompose more slowly than the shredded or ground wood and bark mulches.

As for which type you should use, choose whichever you like. If you need to add nitrogen, use a fertilizer low in phosphorous and potassium such as 12-4-4. Using a weed barrier, never plastic, can reduce nutrient depletion as it separates the mulch from the soil, and can also reduce the need for heavy mulching for weed control.

When applying mulch around trees begin near the trunk applying about an inch, increasing the thickness to about three inches at the perimeter. Make sure the mulch is not against the tree. Mulch piled up against the trunk can cause it to break down and lead to death. It also provides a medium for fungi and borers which may attack the tree.

Over mulching can prevent water penetrating to the soil beneath which can cause the plants to send their feeder roots into the mulch for moisture, making them susceptible to drying during drought. Clay soils need less mulch than sand when being used to slow evaporation.

If you're mulching over old mulch it is a good idea to first fluff the old with a fork or rake, then add only enough to cover bare spots and give it a fresh look. This fluffing will also reveal whether the roots have been growing into the mulch. If the old mulch has reached a depth of more than four inches without decomposition, remove some before adding more.

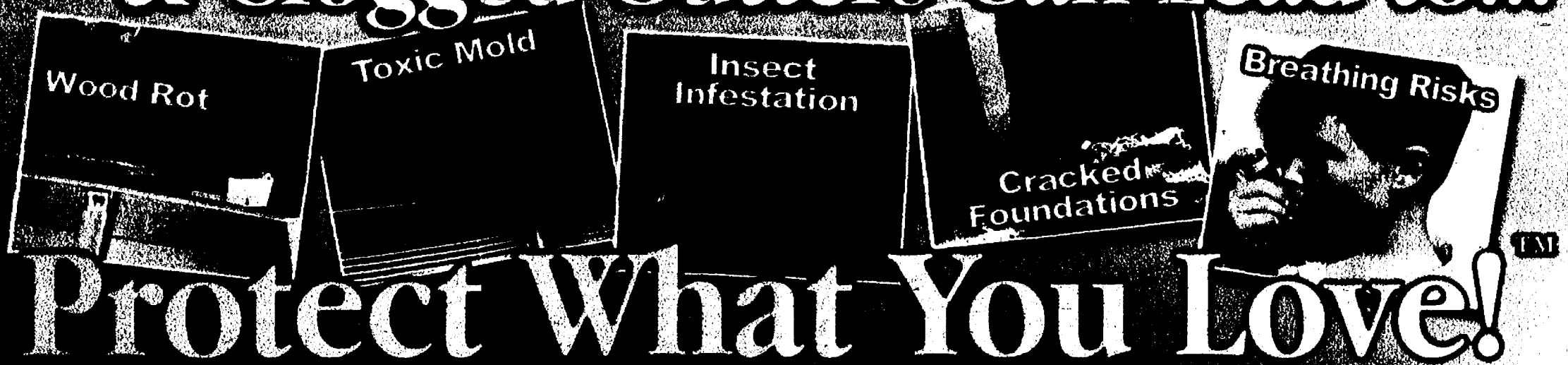

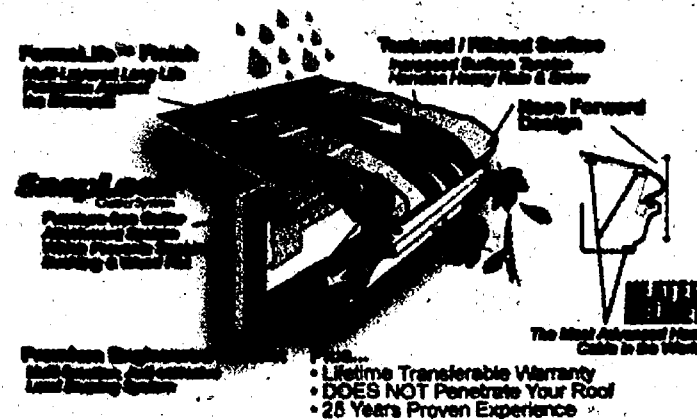

Landscaping on the cheap

The home-improvement industry is as big as it's ever been. Take a casual drive through a typical suburban neighborhood and you're likely to see a fair number of houses undergoing some sort of reclamation project. Be it a new garage door, a fresh coat of paint or the ever-popular add-on, homes across the country are getting more facelifts than an aging Hollywood starlet.

That said, many homeowners are left looking for ways to keep up with the Joneses while not breaking the bank. Thankfully, the answer for a lot of people is right outside their windows.

Improving the landscape of a yard doesn't have to be expensive. And such improvements can go a long way to increasing a home's curb appeal, making it more attractive to prospective buyers.

THINK FOLIAGE:

Upon planting flowers, many homeowners are surprised at the impact those flowers have on the look and feel of their home. Flowerbeds around the perimeter of a house add to the color of a home, while also making it feel more welcoming to guests, including prospective buyers.

A good trick is to plant flowers along the edges of a driveway or walkway. This can provide a strong contrast to a drab driveway or walkway. PLANT TREES:

Once a tree begins to sprout, envelop its base in a bed of mulch. Mulch only needs to be replenished once per year, and the look it creates is both beautiful and serene.

In addition, planting trees is inexpensive. Just make sure you consult with neighbors first if you plan on planting near property lines.

WORK ON YOUR WALKWAYS AND SURROUNDING LANDSCAPE:

Unless you have young children, you and your guests will likely spend more time on walkways and patio decks than you will on the lawn. Take advantage of that by further lessening the time you spend on the grass as a means to keeping it in even better shape.

For example, if you have a backyard garden you're especially proud of, install a concrete walkway that leads you and potential visitors to the garden. This will greatly reduce the amount of wear and tear your lawn takes each time you visit the garden.

In addition, a concrete walkway won't be damaged by wheelbarrows full of soil or new plants.

If walkways leading into the home are already lined with foliage, make sure you keep them well-trimmed. Keeping shrubs and bushes well-trimmed doesn't require a lot of effort, but does give the impression of a home that's been well cared for.

On the other hand, unkempt shrubs and bushes are an eyesore, and can imply a homeowner has been lax in other maintenance areas, as well.

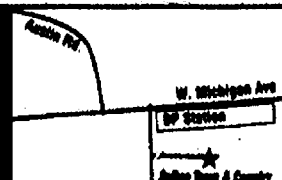

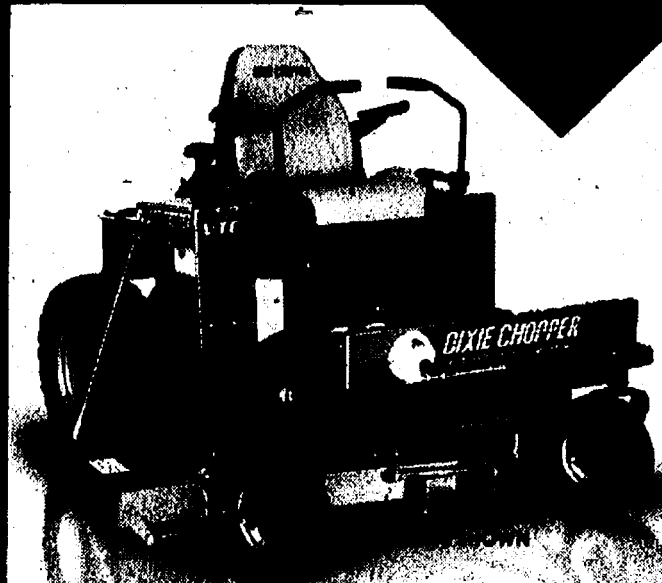

A warm welcome

Entry doors offer homeowners elegant, unique design choices

What better way to welcome your guests and keep the family happy as well than through beautiful, elegant and original front doors?

Two students recently saw their dream designs come to fruition through the Jeld-wen Student Door Design Contest ... and they are beauts.

Taking top honors were Nathan Williams of Virginia Tech and Anna McCorvey of Howard University. Each won \$5,000 scholarships and a trip to the International Builders' Show in Orlando, Fla., where they saw for the first time their doors full-scale.

The second annual competition drew more than 200 entries from 56 colleges and universities.

"Every year, students amaze us with their creativity," said Shane Meisel,

product marketing manager for Jeld-wen. "This year's winning designs perfectly blend today's hottest contemporary looks — modular doors and radius tops — with historic inspiration."

A door that commands attention was designed by Williams and is based on the traditional Dutch door, a style that has a 400-year-old history. These doors were created way back when to help homeowners keep livestock out and let fresh air in.

Originally, they were simply split in half. However, Williams' design splits it six ways with each individual hinged wood and glass panel able to be opened separately. Williams' design was also

heavily influenced by Frank Lloyd Wright's residential designs.

This gives the door modern fun and creative uses. Homeowners can simply open one or two panels for ventilation while the others remain in a locked and stationary position. The bottom section may be opened separately to let the family pet in.

Opening just the middle panel allows for safe delivery of packages or a pizza.

McCorvey's door takes a different turn.

Her design harkens back to the European Art Nouveau movement of the late 19th and early 20th centuries and is inspired by Victor Horta, an

'Bow' makes showering in tight spots easier

If you've ever experienced a cold, clingy shower curtain putting a damper on your daily routine, take note. You get in the shower and the curtain blowing in on you is not only a nuisance, it's just plain irritating.

Well, that's where Patrick Raymond, a former advertising executive, and his ShowerBow come in.

Raymond was standing in the shower one day with the curtain creeping in on him and began thinking of a way to find more knee and elbowroom.

His initial prototype was made out of a wire hanger and a standard office stapler as a counterweight. When he tilted the stapler forward, it pushed out the bow formed by the hanger. This crude design evolved into the ShowerBow.

"This simple device works when you need it and tucks away when you don't," Raymond said. "With ShowerBow, you can trade in the daily wrestling match with the curtain for a more relaxing, spacious shower."

There are a number of explanations as to why the shower curtain does what

it does, but whatever the cause, the effect is annoying to millions of people every day.

Basically, the ShowerBow is like an invisible hand that holds the curtain out and creates up to 25 percent more space inside the stall.

The one-pound pivot weight does all

the work. Tilt it forward, the curtain goes out. When not needed, the pivot weight tilts back into place, making it invisible from the outside.

The weight can be placed at either end of the rod. The bow itself is flexi-

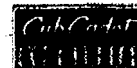

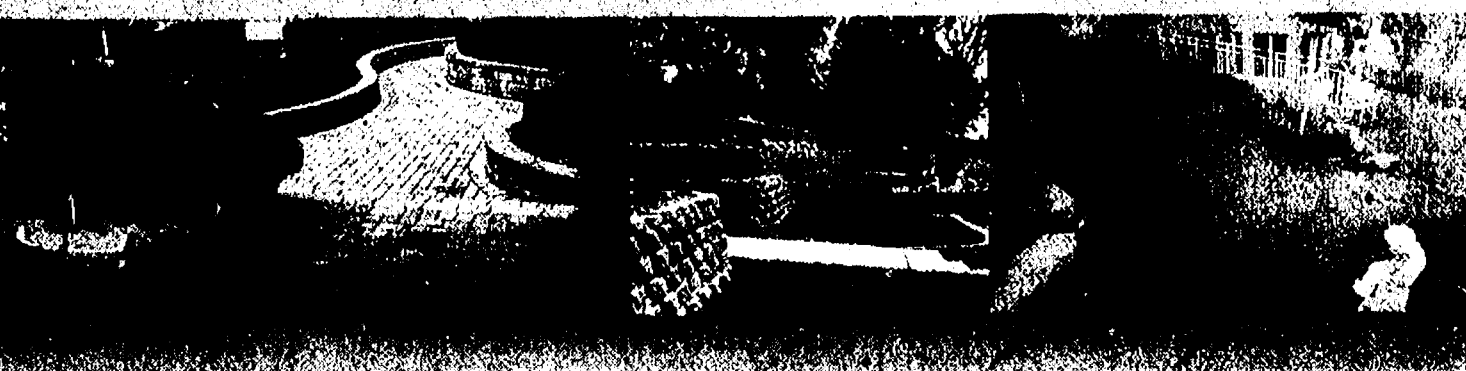

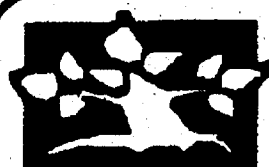

Although the plumbing industry was once characterized by limited choices — galvanized or copper — today there are many viable alternatives that have proven to perform more reliably and hassle-free than their predecessors. To ensure you select the system that's right for you, start by asking a few basic questions:

gutters, remove branches and the like.

ing an interview in her bright, modern home situated on 10 acres south of Chelsea.

Kathy and her husband Don purchased the property and designed their home so that she could have room to garden, an activity she has enjoyed since she was a child helping her parents with a Victory Garden in Dearborn during World War II.

The couple became organic gardeners following some health problems many years ago and find that their diet rich in vegetables, fruits, and herbs makes them feel vigorous and healthy.

Kersten credits her use of natural fertilizer and pest control to her successful vegetable garden. She raises enough to can and freeze for use all year.

Organic gardening isn't difficult. Instead of using the garbage disposal she has a container in her kitchen and dumps everything on a compost pile where it decomposes. She adds manure from a local horse training facility and mixes well.

"One of our garden club members put me onto the use of horse manure because unlike most farm animals these horses don't eat field grass and pass the seeds."

Another gardening tip Kersten offered is the use of nematodes to ward off Japanese Beetles whose larvae cause brown spots on lawns.

"Dawn dish soap is effective to fight off pests. Make a solution of water and liquid soap and spray it onto the plants," she said.

When people repot or put plants in the ground they should make sure the roots are loose. Plants started in pots often are "root bound" and need to be broken apart.

Something new this year is a tip Kersten recently read about - a teabag can be placed in the bottom of a potted plant to help retain moisture and add nutrients. She doesn't know how it will work but offers it as a suggestion for her fellow plant lovers.

Herbs may be preserved by dehydrating or freezing. Usually Kersten uses a dehydrator, a basket-like layered unit, but this year intends to freeze some. "I think frozen herbs will have a fresher taste."

She also advises keeping a journal to record what was planted and how it produced. Some gardeners also take photographs to monitor plant growth in their yards.

Plant sale proceeds are used for a variety of Chelsea area education and civic beautification projects.

Tulips are timeless vision of spring

Cut off at least 1/2 inch of the flower stems before placing your tulips in a vase filled with cool water. It is not necessary to add flower foods or preservatives to cut tulips.

Arranging tulips in a tall vase, as well as placing a penny in the bottom of the vase, will keep your tulips stems standing tall longer. With proper care and handling, your flowers should last between four and seven days.

Ford Fusion is affordable, roomy sedan

One complaint about American car companies has been that they can't design and build reasonably priced, well-equipped vehicles.

While this might have been true in the past, Ford has been working hard to change this image with some new products. One of these products is the Fusion.

TEST DRIVE

THUMBS UP:

Among the long list of standard equipment on the Fusion are air conditioning, power windows and locks, six-way power driver's seat, four-wheel-disc brakes and a tilt/telescoping steering wheel.

The vehicle also comes standard with side air bags to help protect occupants in

case of an accident. And, in case of a breakdown or running out of gas, the Fusion comes with a five-year, 50,000-mile roadside-assistance program.

Interior-wise, the Fusion is more than satisfactory. The seats are comfortable; instrumentation is well placed and easy to read. There are plenty of spaces to store smaller items including a small compartment on the top of the dash. The model came with the optional Audiophile sound system and satellite radio, which I liked.

Nevertheless, those looking to save a few more dollars could leave them off

and save more than \$600 without really hurting ride, comfort or performance.

Rear seat space is such that a pair of average-size adults fit with no problem or complaints.

With 15.8 cubic feet of storage space, the Fusion's trunk is one to the vehicles strong points. One person looking at the large trunk said, "there is enough room in that trunk for an episode of CSI." Of course, if you need more room, the rear seats can be folded flat.

One way to not only save fuel, but to shave some money off the sticker price is to go with a smaller displacement engine. That is what Ford did with the entry

level Fusion, which has a 2.3-liter in-line four cylinder engine under its hood.

However, don't think a buyer will feel short-changed with this engine. It was more than capable of passing slow trucks and merging into heavy traffic, even with three adults on board.

Another way to save some money on a vehicle is to opt for the standard manual transmission, which is what the model tested had. All those who drove the vehicle found no complaint with the clutch, shifting or gear ratio on the five-speed manual transmission.

Should you need more power and don't mind part-

ing with the extra cash, a 221-horsepower, 3.0-liter V-6 is available on Fusions. They also can be had with a six-speed automatic transmission and all-wheel drive.

The Fusion tested came with the optional anti-lock brakes, which adds close to \$600 to the price.

In my opinion, this option is worth the extra money because it adds a certain amount of peace of mind in knowing that you can stop more safely in an emergency situation.

The only other option not mentioned on the car was the appearance package for just under \$400.

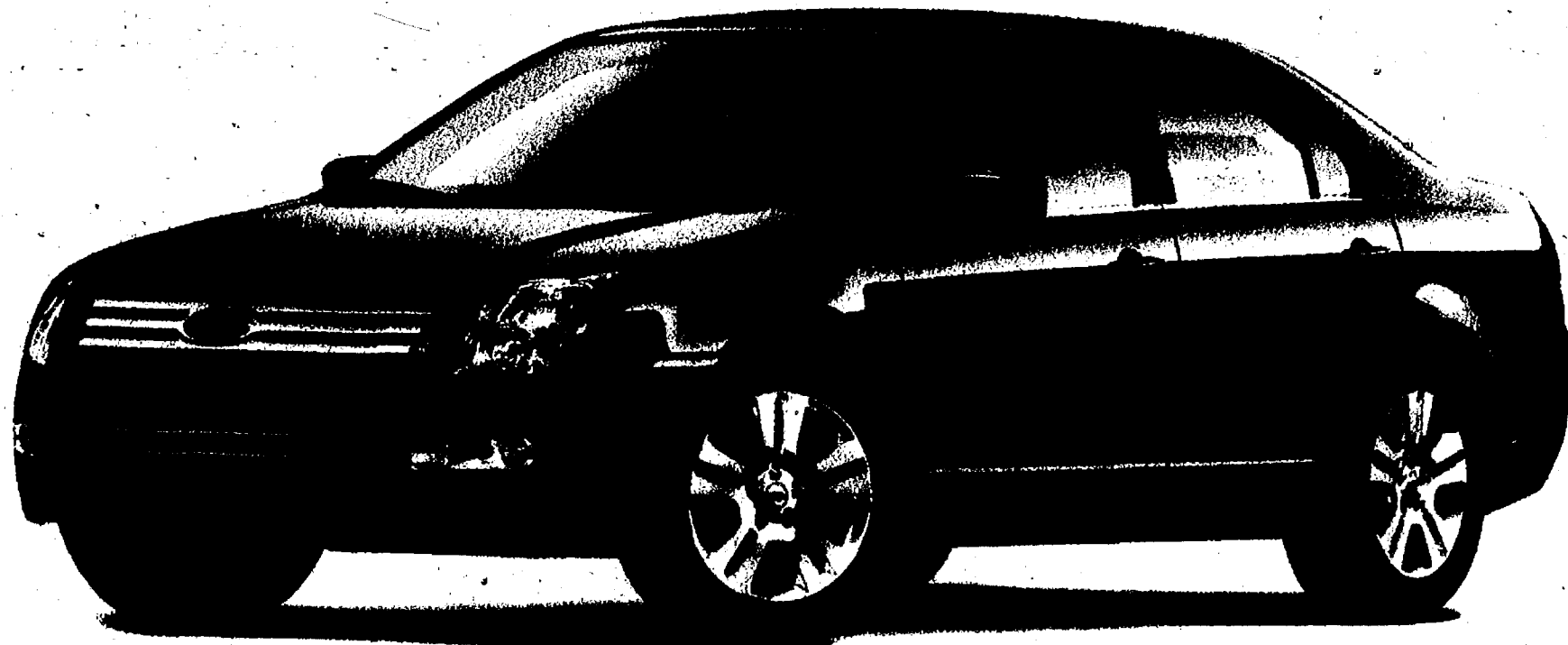
