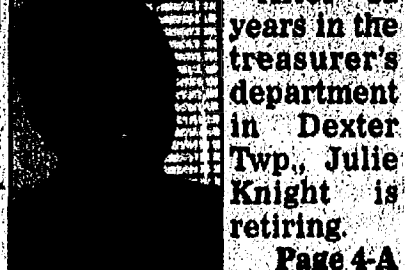

A truck load of ca\$h

Michigan State Police pull over empty semi, find \$1.4 million

Michigan State Police troopers made a stunning discovery of more than \$1.4 million in cash concealed in a truck during a routine traffic stop on Aug. 1.

According to police, troopers with the Second District Hometown Security Team (HTST) stopped a semi-tractor-trailer on westbound I-94 and Kalmbach Road for speeding.

The driver exited the truck immediately, and aroused troopers' suspicions upon questioning him and examining his paperwork.

"Nothing made sense — he had been running empty without a load since he was in New York," said Trp. Steven Temelko, public information officer with the Sylvan Detachment.

"He stated he was in New York, went to Toledo, then to Detroit, and now was on his way to Chicago to look for a load to go back to Arizona."

According to the report, when asked

for consent to search he stated, "Sure, there is nothing illegal in here!"

A Home Depot box in the cab of the truck contained a large sum of money, so additional troopers and the Ypsilanti post's K-9 unit were called to the scene.

The K-9 found another box and a suitcase that were both filled with cash, Temelko said.

The total amount was about

\$1,430,000. The money was seized for forfeiture and the investigation is ongoing.

"Every indication shows he had just delivered a load of unknown narcotics to the Detroit area and was transporting the money back west, toward Mexico," Temelko said.

He added that this kind of scenario is not as rare as one might think.

"This is very common," the trooper said. "The truck will deliver the load, wait around for a few days so the money is collected, then head back towards Mexico with the proceeds."

County presents four local historic road trips

Area residents can now enjoy a little bit of Washtenaw County history and heritage without leaving their cars.

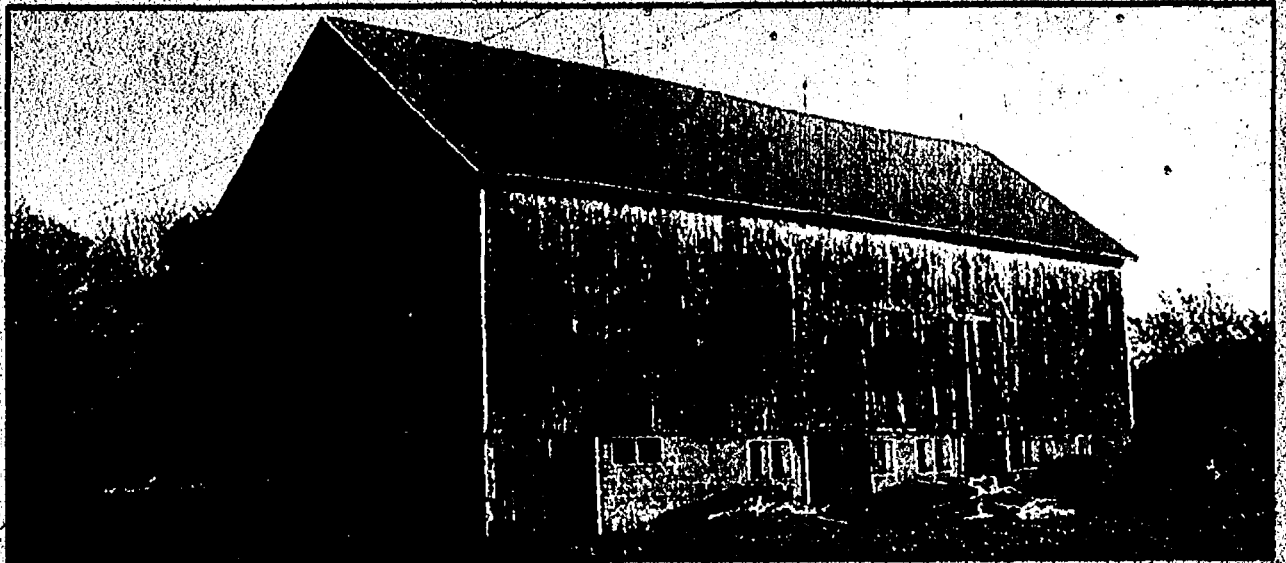
Washtenaw County's Heritage Tours project is a unique celebration of the region's rich heritage and highlights a variety of historic and cultural resources. The program offers four distinct themed driving routes to guide visitors and residents through local cities, villages, and rural areas. Created by the Washtenaw County Department of Planning and Environment, the Heritage Tours project presented brochures to the general public in May in conjunction with National Historic Preservation Month.

"These tours were developed by first examining the records held in Washtenaw County's HistWeb Database, an online resource containing 30-plus years of historic resource surveys conducted by Eastern Michigan University graduate students and staff of the Washtenaw County Department of Planning & Environment," said Melissa Milton-Pung, Washtenaw County Senior Preservation Planner.

"This database was created in 2003 by my department as a way to provide public access to these archives."

The core idea of the Heritage Tours project, according to Milton-Pung, was to take the information out of a database and package it in an interesting and accessible format.

Race is on

Three incumbents matched by three challengers on city council ballot

It looks like we've got a race on our hands.

City Councilmen Jamie Bollinger, Jason Lindauer and Joe Merkel will have to face three challengers to keep their seats in the Nov. 6 election.

By the 4 p.m. Tuesday filing deadline, the incumbents were joined by Rod Anderson, Bill Holmberg and Jim Myles in announcing their intentions to run.

"I turned in my petition and I have all intents to go for it and seek re-election," Bollinger said.

Like Merkel and Lindauer, he took his seat on the council in the same election where residents approved changing Chelsea from a village to a city.

"By number of votes I was in the top three vote-getters, and we all got full three-year terms," Bollinger added.

Merkel has had the most prior experience, first elected to the village council in 1980 and taking a four-year break until being re-elected in the village/city election.

"I want to run again so we can finish the projects we've got going," he said, noting the water and sewer systems and infrastructure repairs as top priorities.

"Second, we have to watch the budget, to keep it tight," Merkel said. "All departments were cut this last (budget cycle); their 'wish lists' were not met."

Lindauer said he considers being on the council "one of the great privileges of my life."

His top two priorities also concern the city budget and infrastructure, but he has an additional concern.

"Chelsea has a lot of things to offer," he said.

"I want to continue to make Chelsea a destination for the citizens of Southeastern Michigan, whether it's for an evening or a lifetime, and we have to continue to work with

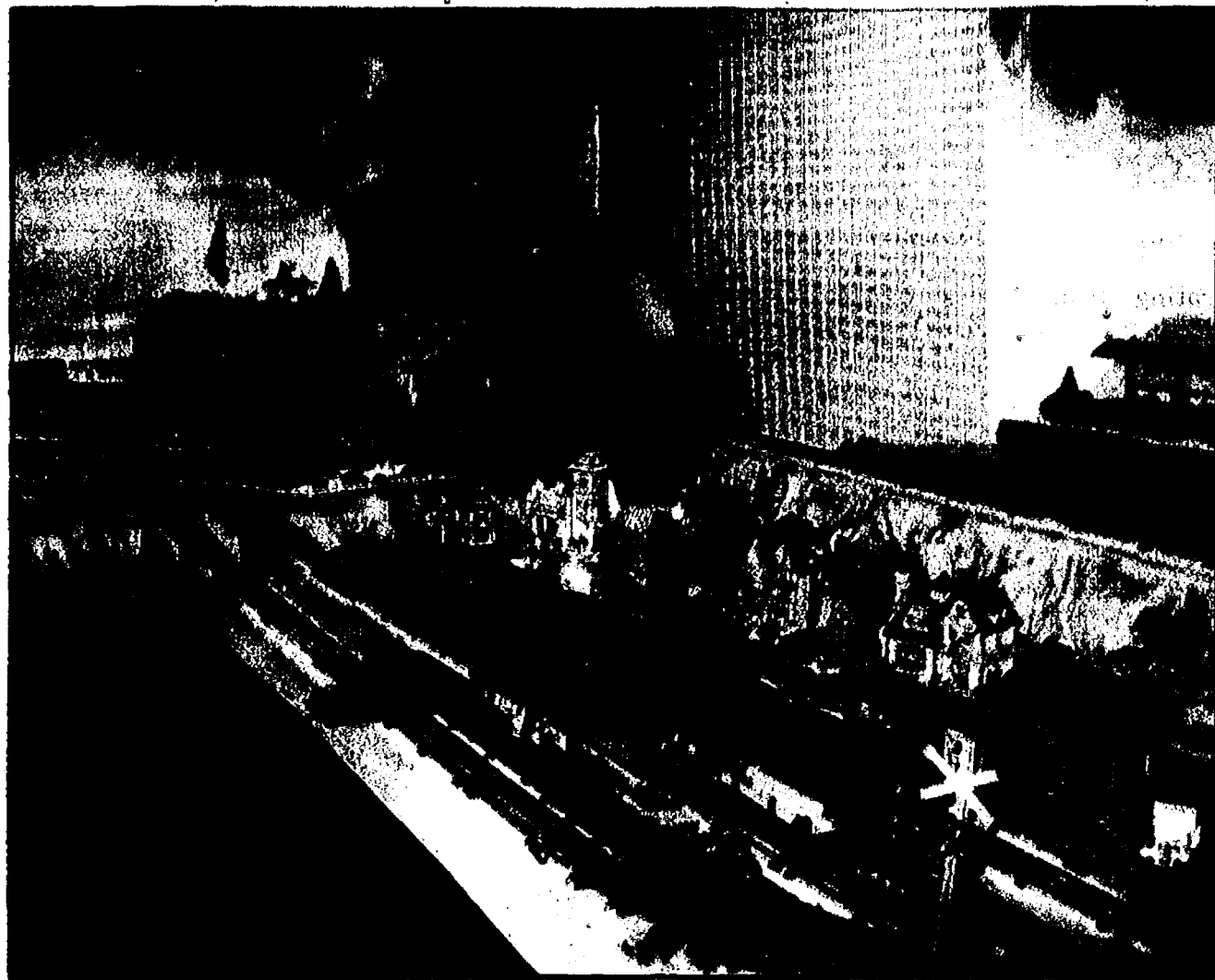

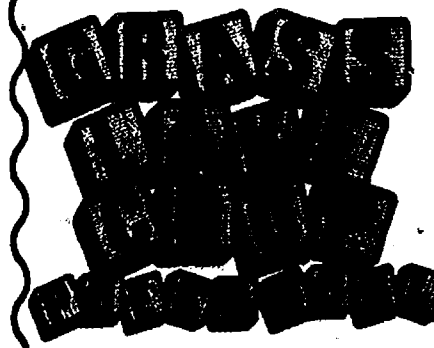

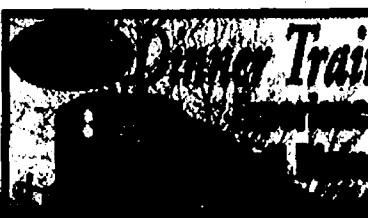

CSB deposits local history

Bank will celebrate 110 years in Chelsea on Sept. 9

Chelsea State Bank marks Dec. 18, 1897 as its actual birth date, when Chelsea's own Reuben Kempf and Charles H. Kempf, who had operated a private bank known as R. Kempf and Brother since 1878, consented to sell their private banking business to a diverse group of Chelsea investors.

In April 1906, another local bank, the Farmers & Merchants Bank of Chelsea was incorporated and granted a charter by the state. As its name implied, this bank was formed by a large group of Chelsea-area farmers and merchants.

Paul G. Schaible Sr. was one of the primary organizers and also served as cashier, one of the only employees in the early years.

The country fell on hard times in the early 1930s and many banks across the nation failed.

Although both Chelsea banks were conservatively managed and healthy, they did decide that operating as one institution would be more practical.

Thus on Feb. 24, 1934 the two banks merged to form the Chelsea State Bank "for the purpose of greater efficiency and economy of management, as well as for the general welfare of said corporation and the community wherein they transact business."

Schaible was named president of the bank and would remain in that position for the next 28 years, when Paul E. Mann succeeded him.

Chelsea State Bank became a member of the newly formed Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation in 1935 with deposits insured to \$5,000.

The bank grew and continued to operate out of the stone Glazier building at South and Main streets until the late 1960s when the need for drive-up banking services and new expanded facilities necessitated a move to the

new building at the southeast corner of Main and Orchard.

The bank opened for business there in February 1968 with total assets of \$15 million. The stone building, which had been the bank's home for 41 years, was given to Washtenaw County to be used as a district court.

In 1980, with total assets at \$48 million, a branch office was opened at Old U.S. 12 and South Main, which in 1993 became the new, 17,000-square-foot headquarters.

In 1995 CSB pioneered image checking technology in this area and converted all of its customers to the latest record-keeping convenience with image statements.

In 1997 the bank finished a complete renovation of its former headquarters at Main and Orchard streets, demonstrating a commitment to a vital and dynamic downtown Chelsea.

It currently leases out a large part of that building for Chelsea municipal offices.

A 100-year anniversary celebration took place in the summer of 1997.

The bank's first branch office outside of Chelsea

came in 2000 when the Dexter Banking Center office opened in Dexter.

In 2003 the bank expanded its image technology into its Internet banking product and made customer check images available 24/7. By June 2007 the assets of the bank had grown to \$200 million.

"We are honored to be able to celebrate this historic event with this community, which has supported us so well the past 110 years," said Mann.

"Many will remember the big party we threw back in 1997 as part of our centennial celebration," he continued. "This is another milestone for the bank that we want to share with everyone in Chelsea, Dexter and the surrounding communities."

Chelsea State Bank is consistently ranked among the safest banks in the nation.

Chelsea City Engineer Christine Linfield announced Tuesday that the Michigan Department of Transportation will use temporary lane closures to complete a chip-seal project on M-52 from Sibley Road to Roepke Road.

Work is set to take place from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Aug. 20 and 21. Two-way traffic will be maintained on M-52 with flag control. In addition, Linfield said the Washtenaw County Road Commission has revised its schedule and will undertake the reconstruction of Old US-12 from M-52 to Wilkinson Street this fall instead of spring 2008.

That project will start the final week of September or first week of October, and is slated to be completed by Nov. 15.

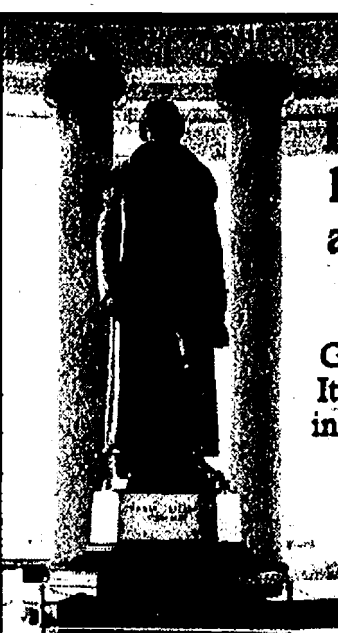

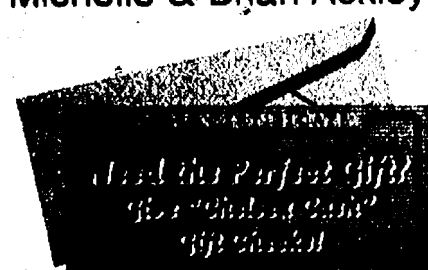

Chelsea News In Brief

Beach Open House

Beach Middle School will host an open house from 5 to 7 p.m. on Wednesday, Aug. 29. Parents and students are invited to meet teachers, get familiar with their schedules and to practice opening their lockers before school begins the following week.

"We want to reduce the anxiety that some students feel about the start of middle school by doing the open house early and creating a relaxed atmosphere for families to get to know our staff," said Principal Patrick Little.

Farmers market OK'd

The Chelsea City Council on July 24 approved a zoning amendment that will allow a farmers market on the grounds of Chelsea Community Hospital to sell to the public.

Since May, the hospital has had a market in the employee parking lot on Wednesdays, but was restricted to selling only to hospital personnel.

"We've been working with the city on this issue for a while, and we certainly appreciate their consideration," said Kerry Colligan, the hospital's director of marketing and planning.

The amendment takes effect 20 days after adoption and publication, which would mean the market should be open to the public Aug. 15.

City OKs new IT position

The Chelsea City Council approved both a job description and posting of a part-time Information Technology Coordinator position at its July 24 meeting.

Formation of the position was one of the recommendations issued by the Washtenaw Community College technology infrastructure assessment in November.

The person in the position will help plan, oversee and implement technology infrastructure improvements and coordinate computers and other technology within and between the various city departments. The wage scale for the IT Coordinator position is \$19.82 to \$25.65 per hour, and was allocated in the 2007-08 budget.

Council grants funding

At its July 24 meeting, the Chelsea City Council approved contracts to fund the for Chelsea Recreation Council, Chelsea Senior Center and Washtenaw Area Value Express for the 2007-08 fiscal year.

Representatives of each group presented funding requests to the council in open session in May, which were considered during the budget formation process.

Such contracts are allowable government expenditures and were allocated in the 2007-08 budget.

The Rec Council will receive \$8,000 in city funding; the Senior Center, \$12,500; and WAVE, \$30,000.

Bomb squad disposes of WWII artillery fuse

Michigan State Police troopers from the Sylvan Detachment responded Aug. 3 to the 6000 block of Conway Road in Sylvan Township for a report of military ordnance found dumped on the side of the road. According to a police report, the item was confirmed as the fuse and nosecone of a World War II-era artillery shell.

Troopers immediately contacted the State Police Bomb

Squad unit out of Northville, which disposed of the device at the scene.

Trip. Steven Temelko, public information officer with the Sylvan Detachment, said it is unknown how the device ended up on the side of the road, but troopers are continuing to investigate. "This is the second military piece found by the individual (who called in the report)," Temelko said.

"He originally found the bottom half of the shell down the

road in the early springtime. He did not know what he had and transported it to the Jackson Post, where the bomb squad was again called and disposed of it."

Temelko said one hypothesis for the occasional appearance of the errant ordnance may have to do with military veterans who returned with dangerous souvenirs. "Most commonly it was a World War II vet who brought it back, passed away recently and the family finds it

and tosses it," he said. "It's strange, but it does happen."

Suspected marijuana found
During the early-morning hours of Aug. 2, Michigan State Police troopers responded to the St. Louis Center on Old U.S. 12 in Sylvan Township for a suspicious vehicle that was spotted in the parking lot by employees, said to be occupied by a male and female.

According to a police report, the vehicle had left the scene

by the time troopers arrived and employees did not obtain a license plate number.

Troopers checked the area where the vehicle was seen parked, and located a small bag containing suspected marijuana hidden under a pine tree.

It is believed the marijuana was left for a prison work crew from the Cassidy Lake Boot Camp that was coming for lawn maintenance in the morning, the report stated.

'Taxman' cashes in

After 32 years of service, Dexter Township treasurer retires

Lapproached Julie Knight after church on a Sunday in 1975 with a proposition. It wasn't about a mission trip or bible study group. But as it turned out, the proposition turned into Knight's life work.

Knight didn't exactly jump at Jede's proposition to become her deputy treasurer for Dexter Township.

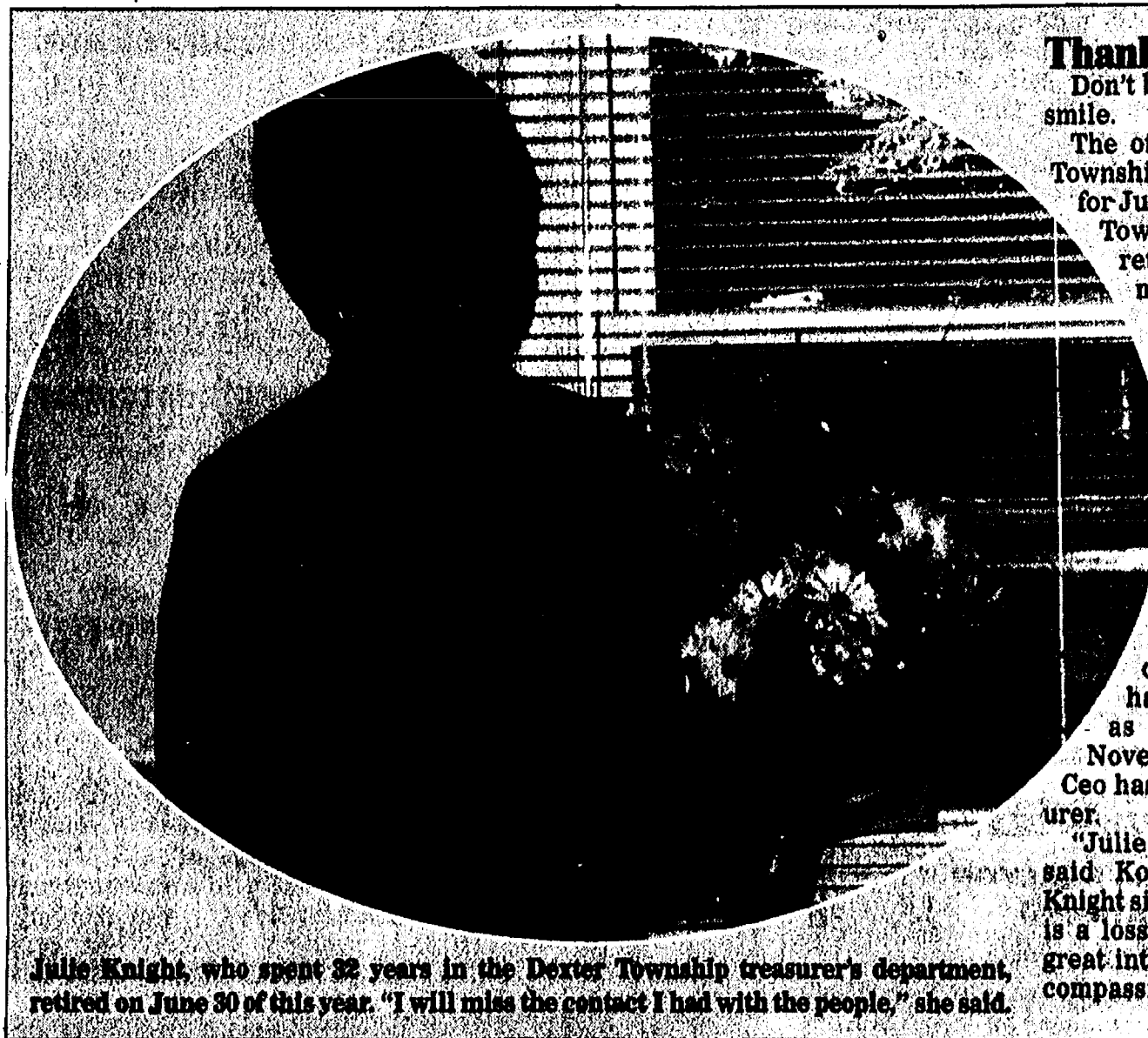
"I was a stay-at-home mom at the time, and when Lorinda asked me to be a deputy treasurer I asked her what that was. As a deputy would I have to carry a gun? But I said no. I liked being at home and raising my kids. She told me to go home and at least think about it, talk to my family and pray about it - remember, she asked me at church."

Knight eventually changed her mind and accepted the offer. Whether her family or a higher power convinced her to take the job, Dexter Township residents are certainly glad she did. On Aug. 12 Dexter Township officials and residents will honor Knight for 32 years of service and thank her for changing her mind and taking the job.

"My family said at the time to take the job and if I didn't like it just quit," Knight said. Guess she liked the job. One of the things she liked in those early days were the hours.

"We were only open a day and a half a week and that was just for property tax collection," she said. "We collected property taxes in those days, but it wasn't just for Dexter Township. We collected them for Washtenaw County and all three local school districts, the (intermediate school districts) and the community college and special assessments. The biggest part of the job at that time was assisting Lorinda with property tax collections."

Collecting taxes is no easy task. Forget all the paperwork involved, Knight also had to deal with the people on the other side of the counter. She had to learn that her usually

friendly neighbors don't like writing checks to the 'taxman.'

"I have learned over the years, and it took me a long time to learn, to keep a stiff upper lip," she said laughing. "At first people were coming in and grumbling about how high their property taxes were and I would be offended. I would take it personally. There were many times I would come home almost crying because so-and-so got really nasty today. But I learned to stiffen up after a few years."

It's only human nature to blame the person you are handing the check to for the reason you are writing the check.

"Sure, they used to blame me, but we were just a collection agency," Knight said. "I used to ask them how they voted in the last election. It was one of the tricks I learned along the way."

Knight spent her first five years as Jede's deputy treasurer. In 1980, she decided to

run for the opening as township treasurer after Jede decided not to run. But Knight lost by 10 votes to Forrest Beggs.

"He asked me if I wanted to continue as deputy treasurer and I said sure," she said. "So I served for him for two years and he resigned after two years."

Knight then took over as treasurer in 1984 and held the position until she retired this year on June 30.

More than just the amount of the taxes have changed during her 32 years in the treasurer's office.

"The number of parcels probably doubled since 1975," she said. "But the biggest change was from doing everything manually to computerized. It helped tremendously. It was a lot easier to just press a button then to add everything up on a calculator."

Knight, 62, has lived in Dexter Township her entire life.

"We've lived here for three

generations," she said. "My grandfather, who bought a farm out here in 1923, moved here with his wife in 1926 from the Wayne-Westland area. My father and mother worked the farm as well. They had 120 acres to farm."

Knight's father, Earl Doletsky, was very active in the community, including in local politics.

"He sat on the township board for a number of years so maybe I inherited those traits from him," said Knight, whose sister and mom still live in the farmhouse on North Territorial Road.

Knight's husband James passed away in June 2006. Together they raised four kids.

"I also have five grandchildren now and they keep me busy," said Knight, who recently returned from a three-day trip to China. "That was wonderful. What a cultural difference."

While traveling and spending time with her kids and

grandkids are at the top of her to-do list, Knight says there are some things she will miss.

"I will miss the contact I had with the people," she said. "Most of them were very nice and didn't complain to me. I only got a chance to see them for a few minutes, but it was always nice to see them."

Knight also will be missed.

"Julie will be missed very much by the many residents who have been greeted by Julie's smile at the counter over her many years of service, and also in the board room," said Dexter Township Supervisor Pat Kelly.

Speaking of the boardroom, there is one thing Knight won't miss.

"The long meetings that sometimes seemed like they would never end," she said.

Knight has come to the end of her professional "meeting." Now it's time to meet other people and spend more time with friends and family.

the schools, the county, the DDA and the other bodies that make Chelsea so vibrant."

Challengers Anderson and Holmberg are members of Chelsea Citizens For Accountability, a grassroots group dedicated to providing more oversight to the council and city administration.

In a statement released to the media, CCFA said it "offi-

cially supports Bill Holmberg and Rod Anderson for City Council," and both candidates cited a need for a fresh perspective on the council.

"I believe a new council perspective is direly needed to guide our community in these turbulent economic times," Anderson said.

"I pledge to consider the needs of our community as a whole when making tough decisions on resource allocation and revenue (tax) increases."

Anderson added that he

would specifically focus on making Chelsea city government more accountable, transparent, prioritized and efficient.

The Baltimore native is employed with General Dynamics Michigan Research and Development Center in Ypsilanti.

He holds a doctorate in experimental astrophysics and is a U.S. Navy and Naval Reserve veteran.

Holmberg, a native of New York, said he has lived in Chelsea for seven years and finds it "interesting to see a smaller town's political landscape."

"I've spoken with some of the older residents; some of those folks don't understand the tax increases and that alarms me," he said. "I hate to see these folks put in a sit-

uation that they're not aware of."

"My feeling was to get someone who has a fresh perspective."

Holmberg is employed as the corporate quality assurance manager for Domino's Pizza in Ann Arbor, working with the company's food supplier base.

The sixth candidate, Jim Myles, is no stranger to Chelsea politics. He was a village council member for seven years, until the 2004 changeover election.

"I want to put my hat back in the ring and take a look at the issues here," he said.

Myles cited a number of concerns, such as the status of city hall and municipal offices, questionable city property purchases, and protecting and maintaining the

"uniqueness" of the community.

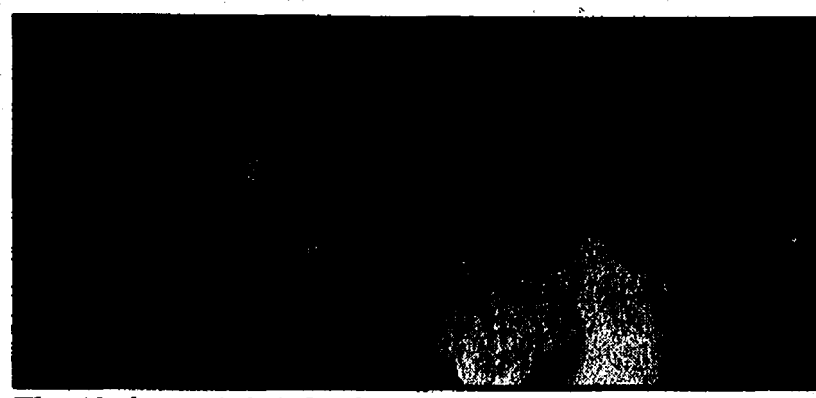
The owner of the Chelsea House Bed & Breakfast is a former restoration contractor, sits on the Downtown Development Authority board, and has worked with the library board.

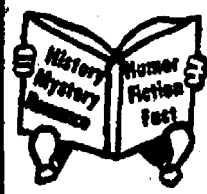

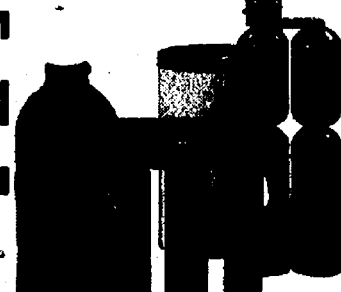

To the Editor: Dear citizens of the village of Dexter and Scio Township:

Next week a very important meeting between the Scio Township Board of Trustees and the Dexter Village Council will take place at 7 p.m. Wednesday, Aug. 15 at the Scio Township Hall.

I encourage all citizens who are concerned about the growth in housing in the northwest corner of Scio Township to attend this meeting. At this joint meeting the two governmental bodies plan to discuss a proposed 425 agreement regarding the Sloan-Kingsley property.

As revealed at the July 23 Village Council meeting, the development plan covered by this agreement limits construction to "not exceed 575 homes" and provides a payment to the township of \$1,000 per home constructed.

I have not had the opportunity to review the details of this proposed agreement, but as a citizen I want

to know more about it.

I have learned that the Washtenaw County Planning Department has been involved. Whether this proposed agreement and planned development is good for our communities remains to be seen.

There are many questions to be asked. The details of the costs, short- and long-term, to the taxpayers need to be revealed.

What will be the impact to the water and sewer systems of the village? What will be the impact of expenses for police and fire protection? What will be the impact on traffic flow and volume? What will be the impact on our school system? What will be the impact on the value of our homes? How is this related to the plan to move Dexter toward becoming a city?

I encourage citizens to ask the Village Council and Township Board members these and more questions so we have the opportunity to clearly see whether this plan and agreement have merit. We need to know that these governmental bodies are truly representing the citizens of our communities.

There appears to be a select group of officials from both governmental units that is quietly pushing this agreement forward.

These officials may just be appointed committee members; however, except for the July 23 council meeting mentioned previously, not much has been said about this development and possible agreement at their regular meetings.

I hope that the members of the Scio Township Board remember that they also represent the people who live in the village of Dexter. They should not assume that a few members of the Village Council necessarily represent the true sentiment of the village's residents.

This agreement and the development it pertains to deserve to be openly discussed by both governmental units, as it will affect our communities for many years.

It is a sad thing to witness the worn and tattered woodwork, shabby mini-blinds and poorly designed stamp collections behind dirty glass.

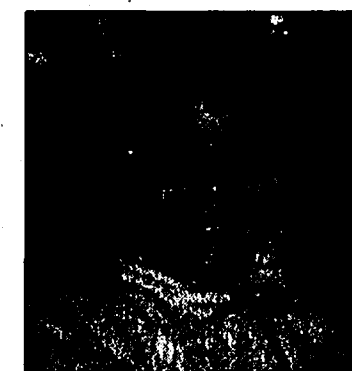
What was once a lovely building with many fine features is now a disgrace - utterly devoid of ordinary cleaning and general maintenance.

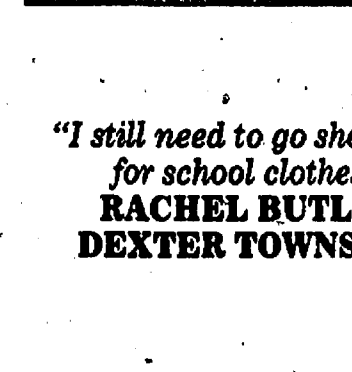

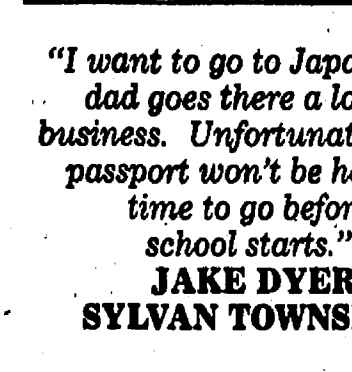

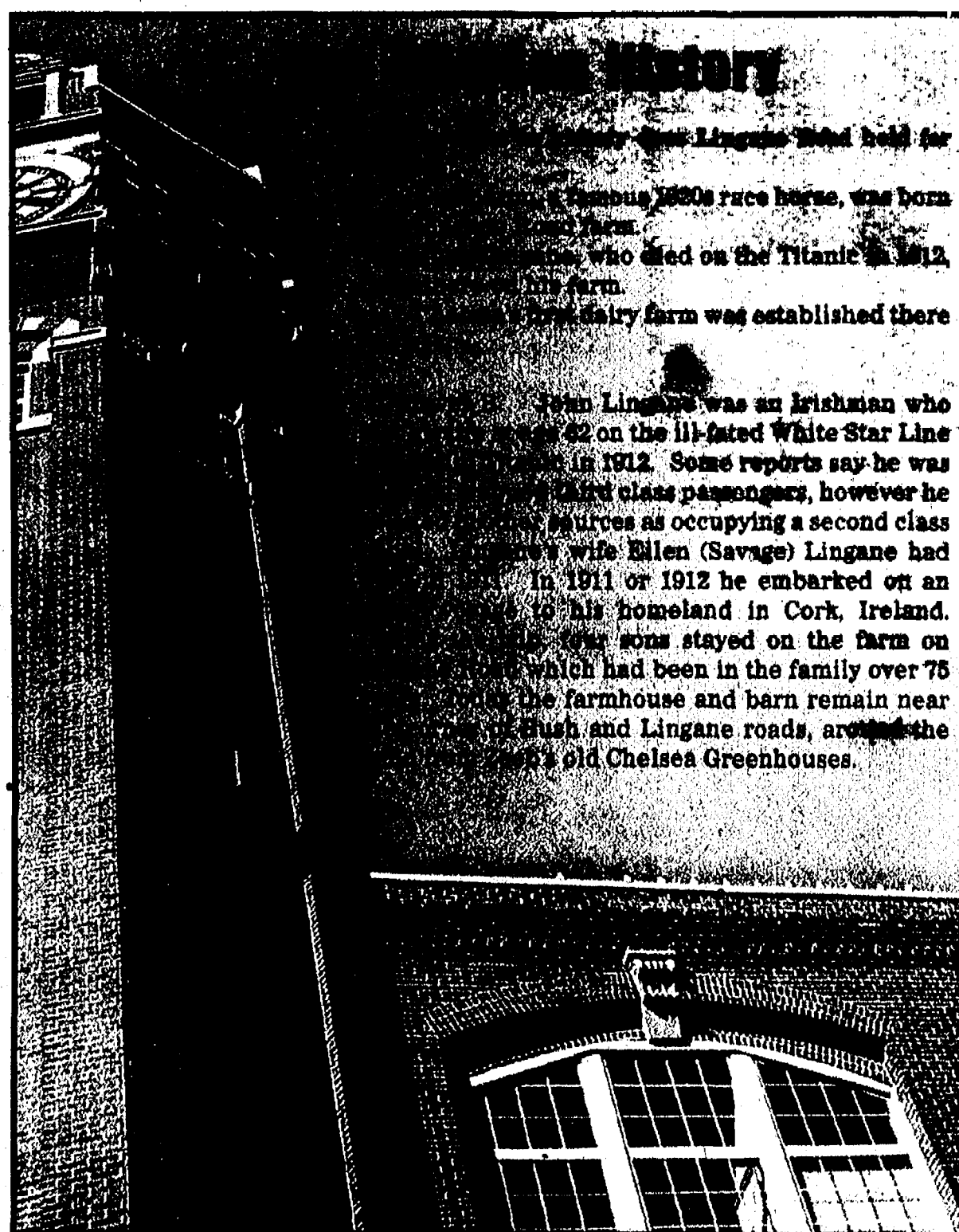

"The second step was to develop themes which highlight the rich historic architecture and culture of Washtenaw County, while complementing and promoting other historical interest groups and cultural projects," Milton-Pung said.

"We then selected properties that are clustered together along a reasonable driving or biking path. We then drove each tour and edited out those sites which were not clearly visible from the roadway to ensure a pleasant tour experience. Finally, we chose several exceptional sites for inclusion highlights from outside the tour area."

The four tours are:

- Local history buffs will enjoy the Esek Pray Trail along Ann Arbor-Plymouth Road in Superior Township. This tour features a variety of exceptional 19th-century residences, one-room schoolhouses and other resources all tied to the family of Esek Pray, a founding leader of the state of Michigan, and his contemporaries.

- Those interested in Greek Revival Architecture may choose from the North Tour, South Tour, or selected stops in Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti to view a diverse collection of building materials, ranging from brick to wood siding to cobblestone; and building forms, from early settlement through the post-Civil War period.

- On the Historic Barns Tour through Bridgewater, Manchester and Sharon townships, tourists will see the storehouses of the 19th century's strongest industry: agriculture.

- The German Heritage Tour invites drivers onto the back roads of Freedom, Lodi, Scio, and Sharon townships to witness a landscape dotted with traditional farmsteads. Additionally, the project is linked to the HistWeb online database, which includes more than 4,000 survey records of historic resources, including paper survey sheets, sketches and images.

"How many times have you driven down a picturesque Washtenaw County back road, and seen a beautiful house or fascinating barn," asked Milton-Pung. "These tours are designed to tell the average reader about the importance of local history and architecture. They give meaning and history to the German farming landscapes remaining in southwest Washtenaw County, names for the detailed parts of Greek Revival homes, the story behind the collection of build-

ings and homes on Ann Arbor-Plymouth Road, and the reason why many barns are painted red."

The Washtenaw County Heritage Tours project is funded in part by a certified local government grant from the

Michigan State Historic Preservation Office and supported by several local partners, including the Ann Arbor Area Convention and Visitors Bureau, Ypsilanti Area Convention and Visitors Bureau, Saline Chamber of

Commerce, Saline Area Historical Society, Washtenaw County Historical Consortium and the Genealogical Society of Washtenaw County.

Milton-Pung said that under the Department of Planning and Environment, Planning Services works to "promote the orderly development of the county."

"This mission is accomplished through comprehensive communitywide planning programs that establish policies and plans to guide economic, physical and social development," she said.

In 2004, the county published "A Comprehensive Plan for Washtenaw County: A Sense of Place, A Sustainable Future," which addressed the issues of land use, infrastructure and natural resources.

"In this publication, the topic of historic preservation is examined along with numerous other relevant topics, and best practices are set forth as part of a united approach to appropriate stewardship of historic, cultural, and environmental resources," Milton-Pung said.

The Comprehensive Plan is supported by the Washtenaw County Historic District

Commission's mission: "To protect the historic buildings, sites, objects, and landscapes of Washtenaw County, and to promote a culture of historic preservation."

While the jurisdiction covers all of Washtenaw County, it does not include the cities of Ann Arbor, Ypsilanti and Saline. These cities have a wealth of historic resources

overseen by their own historic district commissions.

"These Heritage Tours are a team effort," Milton-Pung said. "Many Washtenaw County staff members assisted in developing the final product."

The four Washtenaw County Heritage Tours brochures are now available online in PDF format at Washtenaw County's Historic Preservation web page, <http://preservation.ewashtenaw.org>. Downloadable and easily printed at home, these free brochures contain local history, illustrations, and a useful area map. A limited number of high-quality color brochures are also available for purchase from Washtenaw County Government.

Let the good times roll

A historical look

Daze gone by

Tracing a line back in time from the Dexter Daze of today to what the festival once was is quite difficult, as even some of its most involved supporters will say.

One thing is clear: what was once a simple promotion for area merchants has grown into something truly special.

It continues the tradition of promoting local commerce, but it has also expanded upon that foundation.

"It's one of those things that no one is absolutely sure about, but we think this is the 31st Dexter Daze," said festival Chairman Arden Schafer, whose involvement began by handling publicity for the event, but became its head in 1997.

Fortunately, there are still plenty of people around who go back even further.

"Dexter Daze was still in its formative years out here (during the 1980s)," said Bud Roberts, founder of the Dexter Area Chamber of Commerce and a Dexter Daze volunteer during the 1990s.

"It was just a street fair in the '70s, and it kind of grew from there."

Aside from the topic of its own history for a moment, the committee that organized and managed Dexter Daze gave birth to the Chamber of Commerce as a natural outgrowth of the event, according to Roberts.

"When the Chamber of Commerce was officially formed, (the festival) had already been a reality," he said.

Loren Yates, now the Dexter Area Fire Department Chief and formerly the Dexter Daze chairman before Schafer, recalls the beginnings of the chamber and the evolution of the festival.

"Dexter Daze developed from a sidewalk sale by a few (local business owners and their families) and some of them got together and tried to come up with other things, like local sponsors for entertainment," Yates said.

From there, the amount and quality of entertainment increased each year, from the occasional local band to some locally famous performers from Ann Arbor, according to Yates.

"Once we got the sponsor-

ships we were able to get some of the more well-known performers and increase our booth sales," Yates said.

Over the span of his involvement, Yates has watched the event's budget go from a few hundred dollars to thousands, through booth sales and business donations.

Like most things that are good, Dexter Daze has at one time or another been touched by tragedy.

On Aug. 13, 1993, a fire started in the kitchen of Sportsman's Bar and damaged Great Lakes Bancorp and spread to several other buildings, according to Yates, who was a lieutenant with the fire department at the time.

"I was down in the park when the call came in," he said. "I went right to the scene, right to the front door and it was full of smoke."

County Commissioner Mark Ouimet, R-District 1, was the president of Bancorp at the time of the fire.

"I remember it vividly ... I had just started to make my way over to Dexter when I got a call," he said.

Being the day before the parade, no one was injured and crowds didn't start showing up in large numbers until the fire extinguished at 5 p.m., according to Yates.

Since then the fire department has been even more diligent with inspections, and firefighters bring a "smoke house" simulator to Central Street to discuss fire safety and how to escape a house fire.

Ouimet will appear at the A&W from noon to 2 p.m. Saturday to thank first responders and allow residents to thank them too.

Firefighters, police and EMS workers are welcome to participate.

"We can't thank the firefighters, all firefighters, enough for what they do," Ouimet said.

Most agree that time has healed that particular wound and the Dexter Daze festival marches onward, getting greater with each year and with each person who gets involved.

"What it boils down to is, you have a handful of people who take this and run with it," Yates said. "Whether it's the parade or the entertainment, the people have all excelled and gotten Dexter Daze to where it is now."

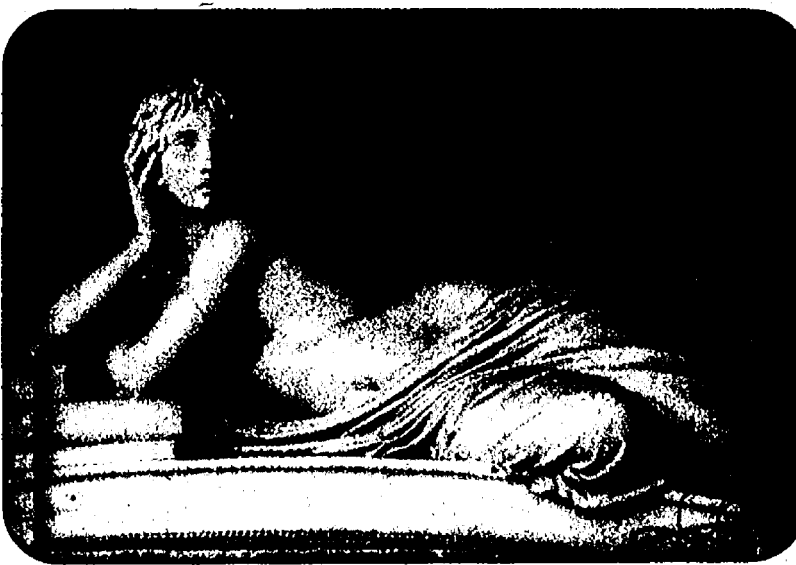

ATHLETICS Make sports more fun for kids

Many children look forward to sports. A chance to play with their friends, sports also represent an opportunity for children to learn many of life's lessons, from working with others to dealing with loss to accepting authority figures. But as much as children love sports, 80 percent of kids end up abandoning them by the age of 16.

Some might think that's a reflection of waning athletic talent, but it also reflects a different notion as well. Oftentimes, kids abandon sports thanks to the pressure of participation. So great is the pressure applied by some parents that nearly every state across the country has horror stories where fights among parents have broken out at children's athletic events. Such behavior by parents is not only unacceptable, but illegal as well.

While such incidents could once correctly be classified as aberrations, they are now becoming more and more common. The National Alliance for Youth Sports (NAYS) has continued to work to make sports more positive for kids, offering programs and services devoted to educating all those involved in sports on the effect sports can have on a child's psychological development.

How a parent behaves at a child's sporting event can play a big role in who that child becomes and what they will get out of sports. That said, consider the following tips before heading to your child's game this season.

Praise effort, not performance. Athletic success for children should mean putting forth the best effort and should have nothing to do with performance. Strong effort typically begets an even stronger performance, so parents should always praise effort over performance.

Respect coaches. Oftentimes, parents run into trouble with youth sports by complaining about coaches and strategies. Coaches are often volunteers who give of their own time and do their best. Parents complaining about coaches instills a disrespect for authority in children. In addition, it takes away from the enjoyment a child will get from sports, as kids will learn to associate sports with their parents complaining or arguing with a coach. If you have any concerns, discuss them with the coach one-on-one, and don't complain in front of kids, either, at the field or at home.

Accept your child's abilities. A recent study conducted by the Northeastern University Center for the Study of Sports determined that high school athletes have a one in 50,000 chance of becoming part of a professional sports team. What those figures illustrate is that it's largely unrealistic for parents to expect their children to become that one athlete out of 50,000 that eventually gets paid to play a game. Parents need to recognize their children's abilities and just how difficult sports can be. Parents who place unrealistic expectations on their children are not only ruining

RECREATION Take a hike, but be careful

Be it spring, summer, fall or winter, hiking has always been a popular hobby for lovers of the outdoors. A great way to see and experience nature while getting some exercise, hiking can be enjoyed just about anywhere, by just about anyone.

While its appeal is almost universal, hiking is not a sport to be taken lightly or looked upon as simply a stroll through the woods. In fact, many people might not realize that hiking is, in fact, a sport, one where fitness and preparedness play an integral role. Those considering a hiking trip should be aware that even a casual hike is not necessarily just a walk in the park and should take the following approach.

Be prepared: Even if your next hike is a spur of the moment idea on a beautiful afternoon, you should still have the tools necessary to be prepared should something go awry. Unforeseen changes in weather, getting lost and injury are just a few of the things that can happen anytime you go out on a hike. Depending on where you're hiking, weather shelters, maps or emergency phones might not be available should of the aforementioned scenarios present themselves.

While dealing with emergency scenarios won't be as easy as it is in civilization, how prepared you are can make all the difference. Bring along a cell phone whenever possible. If you can't get a strong enough phone signal to make a call should you get hurt or lost, a weak signal might enable you to send a text message to someone back home. To make sure you don't get off track, bring a compass every time you go on a hike. And make sure you learn how to read it. Surprisingly, many lost hikers over the years have admitted that while they had a compass, they didn't know how to read it. In anticipation of a possible change in weather, pack a raincoat and something warm as well, regardless of temperature at the time you leave. Should you get lost and the temperature dips, you'll want to stay warm.

Be capable of the hike: Some people see hiking as a leisurely stroll through the woods. Sometimes that's true. But in some parks, a hike can quickly become a nightmare for a person who physically cannot handle it. Those not in the best physical shape don't need to avoid hiking altogether, but should, at least initially, stick to trails that don't feature lots of climbing and are close to civilization should a medical emergency arise. Also, anyone going on a hike should be capable of putting together an emergency shelter in the case of emergency. Such activity can be strenuous, so those not physically able to perform such a task should not venture far from where they parked their vehicle.

Hike with a partner: Hiking alone can be very dangerous and even lethal. Should you get injured and find yourself unable to walk out of the park on your own volition, having no partner could leave you in a very pre-

DNR promoted Adopt-a-Forest program

Northern Michigan is well-known for its vast tracts of forested lands and the countless recreational opportunities they provide.

In the past, the mere thought of hiking a familiar forested trail or canoeing a favorite river conjured pristine memories, but for many these experiences now may be marred by the trash that is being dumped illegally on our public lands.

In some areas, a walk down a forest trail is like a trip down memory lane, with trash piles that highlight the history of dumping. Old rusty couches, wet sloppy tires, piles of shingles, busted up toilets, microwaves without doors, television sets without screens, and the remnants from a recent remodeling job are among the many items that blight our public lands in Michigan.

Fortunately, there is another side to this story.

"Thankfully, there are many corporations and individuals who are being proactive in reducing the existing levels of trash that have been dumped in our forests," said Ada Takacs, coordinator of Michigan's Adopt-a-Forest program. "The selfless donations by more than 10,000 volunteers over the past 16 years have included time, money and resources."

Since 1991, Takacs said

these volunteers have removed more than 18,000 truckloads of trash from Michigan's forests. This includes more than 65,000 scrap tires. Placed end to end, these tires could reach across the Mackinac Bridge five times.

Currently, there are close to 1,100 known illegal dump sites on public land in Michigan.

Although Takacs estimates this represents only 25 percent of what is actually out there, many of the old and very large dump sites have been identified and cleaned up.

"We're also pleased to report that 54 percent of the trash that has been cleaned up by the volunteers has been recycled," Takacs said. "That's a very impressive record."

The Adopt-a-Forest program is sponsored jointly by the Michigan Coalition for Clean Forests, which includes the Department of Natural Resources, U.S. Forest Service, Michigan Forest Resource Alliance, and many caring organizations, corporations and individuals.

The coalition works with law enforcement to eliminate illegal dumping through its educational campaigns, physical cleanup of dump sites and advocating alternative methods of disposal (such as composting,

recycling and annual community-wide cleanups).

Active volunteers are not just individuals, families, scouts and students. Special-interest groups get involved as well, such as the Lovells Hook and Trigger and the Two Trackers 4-Wheel Drive Club of Muskegon County.

In addition, many community groups such as the Springfield Township Parks and Recreation Department and civic organizations like the Harrison Moose Lodge are very active in the program.

There are no special skills required to clean up trash in the woods. Volunteers have the opportunity to see immediate results and often are rewarded with a wonderful sense of accomplishment.

"It's also a great way to meet new people in your community," said Takacs. "In addition, it's an activity for all ages and can serve as

means of reaching across generational lines."

One family, the Tates, who live in Alcona County, even celebrated a 50th wedding anniversary by organizing a family-reunion cleanup. Volunteers and groups, she said, often are able to incorporate their interests into their cleanup efforts.

One group, the northern Michigan chapter of the Michigan Geocaching Association goes high-tech during their cleanups. Using up-to-date software, they enter the coordinates and descriptions of existing dump sites that are generated in reports from DNR Conservation Officers. They can download this information into a global positioning system (GPS) unit within seconds.

On the day of the cleanup, rather than giving the volunteer crews a few sites on a map, the entire cleanup can be uploaded into handheld GPS units that show what

type of trash the volunteers can expect to find and in what type of terrain it may be located.

"Since we started working with Adopt-a-Forest, we haven't been looking for many caches," said Chad Lytle, the group's regional vice president. "We're having just as much fun hunting trash sites as we do finding most caches!"

The coalition also has a "Trash Team," comprised of agency and corporate representatives and organization and community leaders, that meets a few times each year.

"Anyone who is interested in joining is welcome to attend these meetings and share their ideas and resources," Takacs said. The high levels of trash that can be found on our public lands have not accumulated overnight; rather the problem has resulted from a slow accumulation over time.

Fortunately, this can be halted and even reversed.

To eliminate trash as a permanent fixture in our public forests requires edu-

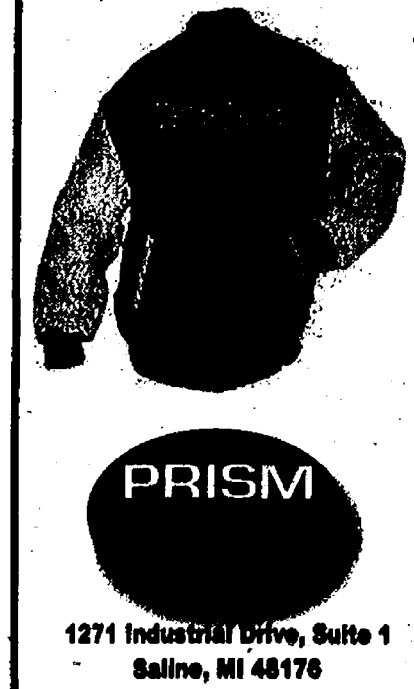
cation and action.

"Now is the time for people to invest in their public lands and the recreational experiences of the future and become a part of the change," Takacs said.

carious position. If you're in a remote area, try to hike in a group of at least four. This way, should one person get injured, two can go for help while one stays behind with the injured person. Three people would be more risky, as the person going for help could get lost and have no way to communicate. Also, if two people go for help, the injured person would be left alone.

Hiking aficionados worldwide are reminded of the dangers of going it alone whenever they think of Aron Ralston. A young American mountain climber, Ralston ventured off alone into the canyons of Utah in 2003. After his right arm became pinned by a boulder while inside a canyon, Ralston was eventually forced to ampu-

tate the arm with a dull multi-purpose knife in order to survive. While Ralston's tale is certainly courageous, it's one nature enthusiasts worldwide point to when trying to illustrate the importance of having a companion whenever venturing into the great outdoors.

Tell friends and loved ones where you're going. For some, the appeal of going out on a hike is the chance to get away from it all and leave the distractions of everyday life behind. But as a safety precaution, anyone planning a hiking trip should let someone staying behind know where they are going and roughly how long it should take. Arrange to call a friend or loved one at a designated time to let them know you're all right. Instruct that friend or loved one to alert the local authorities that you might be lost or hurt if the check-in call doesn't come as scheduled.

the games for their kids, but also fooling themselves as well. Accepting that your child might not be the one doesn't mean you and your children can't enjoy sports.

Work with kids and coaches to set realistic goals. Many coaches have begun the valuable practice of exit meetings once a season ends. Essentially, these meetings

are between player and coach and consist of the coach telling the player what is expected out of him or her in the coming season. Parents can become a part of this process as well. Set realistic expectations with kids that kids can meet if they work hard. Steer clear of individualistic goals, such as making all-star teams or winning scoring titles. Such goals might conflict with a team's goals and will also teach that the individual, and not the team, comes first.

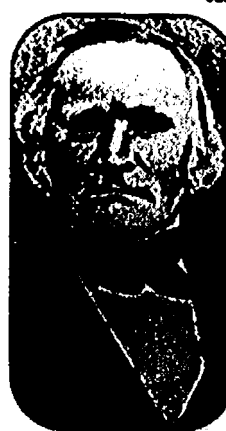

Washtenaw County's Heritage Tours

Esek Pray offers glimpse into settlement of region

Esek Pray was one of thousands of settlers who immigrated west from New York and New England when the Erie Canal was opened in the early-to-mid nineteenth century. Settlers would take the canal to



Esek Pray.

Buffalo, catch a steamer to Detroit, and continue west over land by wagon. The story of Esek Pray and his family provides a glimpse into the early settle-

ment period of southeast Michigan. Pioneers came to Washtenaw County by following a trail that cut through Superior and Ann Arbor townships, known today as Plymouth-Ann Arbor Road.

Esek Pray married Sally Ann Hammond in 1811. Between 1814-1833, they had eight children. In 1825, while their family was still growing, the Prays traveled from New England to settle a farmstead in Superior Township. All but one of the Pray children married members of neighboring families, becoming part of an established farming community in the newly formed state of Michigan. Many of these families' prosperous farms are highlighted on this tour.

Pray was an integral member of the local community as a public tavern keeper, farmer and justice of the peace. He was also a member of the first State Legislature and participated in the "Prostitute Convention" of 1836 in Ann Arbor, where it was decided that Michigan would become a state by trading claim to the port of Toledo to Ohio and accepting the Upper Peninsula in exchange.



The landscape along this trail is filled with historic resources associated with early settlers, including the Pray family. Houses, farms, cemeteries, three school-houses, a store, a church, and the nearby village of Dixboro all served as a focal point for a community tied to Plymouth-Ann Arbor Road.

Featured sites of the Esek Pray Trail

SITE 5. McCormick-Williams Farm
9105 W. Ann Arbor Road, Superior Township.
Designated: 2002

The site is an excellent example of a late 19th and early 20th century farmstead. The farmhouse was constructed by William McCormick, one of the original settlers in the township, in 1838. His daughter married a son of Esek Pray. The site was actively farmed between 1831 and 1858, including general farming (crops, fruit, wool, and livestock), dairy farming, and cider production, as represented by the out-buildings present on the property.

SITE 6. Esek Pray House
8755 W. Ann Arbor Road, Superior Township
Designated: 2000

The landmark 1839 farmhouse was built by Esek Pray, an original farming pioneer of the Township who was active in the local social and political circles. The house replaced an earlier log cabin destroyed by fire. Mr. Pray maintained a tavern in his home from the 1820s to the 1850s. After his death, the property became one of the most prosperous farms in the township under the ownership of son-in-law Watson Geer. The Classical Revival detailing on the five-bay house includes a wrap-around frieze board with cornice returns and lunette window at the gable ends and dentil molding. The house also has an elaborate, extra wide front entry, consisting of a two-panel Greek Revival door and sidelights embedded between four pilasters supporting a wide frieze. Both floors of the house have two rooms on each side of a central hall. The floor plan and exterior form of the house, sometimes referred to as the New England Large House, was

commonly adopted in New England and New York during the early 19th century, but it is unusual for Washtenaw County.

SITE 7. Milton Geer House
8605 W. Ann Arbor Road, Superior Township (photo above)
Designated: 2001

The Geer House is one of the finest examples of Italianate-style architecture in the County. Decorative moldings and iron cresting remain part of a structure that was designed with many characteristic Italianate features, such as segmented window openings, paired and chamfered square porch columns, window hoods, and paired brackets on a wide frieze. The house was built for Milton Geer and his bride, Kitty Kimmel, in 1884. Milton was the son of prosperous farmer and neighbor Watson Geer and the grandson of Esek Pray. Kitty Kimmel was the daughter of pioneer Henry Kimmel, who proposed the name "Superior" for the Township in 1831.

SITE 19. Popkins School
2211 Old Earhart Road,

Ann Arbor Township
Designated: 1981

This site is one of four remaining one-room school houses along the Esek Pray Trail. It is an excellent example of the mid-19th century Italianate-style school building, modified to meet early 20th century needs. Constructed in 1870 for approximately \$1500, it had

three windows on each side elevation, and a door flanked by one window on each side on the front elevation. The 1930s alterations removed the front door to a new side wing containing an entry and restrooms, and added a bank of windows onto the east wall. The building suffered a major fire in 1983, and was extensively rehabilitated in 2001-2002.

Superior Township and agriculture

Superior Township has been an agricultural community since its establishment in 1831. The first generation of settlers, including Esek Pray and his contemporaries, grew only what they need to survive by practicing subsistence farming while they cleared land, constructed the cabins, and established the political structure. During the course of the next 100 years, three farm types would emerge in the area: the 19th century general farm that became the early 20th-century dairy farm; the 20th-century industrial farm illustrated by Henry Ford's "Cherry Hill Farm" (2734 Gotfredson Road), and the modern 20th-century specialty farm (Site No. 9).

By 1835, the average log cabin complex evolved into a more substantial subsistence farm, including more elegant houses (Site Nos. 6, 12, and 13), timber frame barns (Site Nos. 5, 14), and multiple outbuildings. The barns were built in the style characteristic of those in New England: simple, rectangular boxes with a gable roof, and a main entry in the middle of the side elevation. Barns served as places for grain processing and storage, as well as animal shelter. Types of crops grown on the subsistence farm between 1850 and 1880 included wheat, rye, corn, buckwheat, barley, potatoes, hay, flax, and maple sugar. These early farmers also kept chickens, milk cows, cattle, horses, sheep, swine, bees, and silk cocoons.

The dairy farm became common during the first part of the 20th century. The switch from general subsistence farming to one of dairy and some subsistence farming had a profound impact on the landscape. Nearly every farmstead upgraded their facilities to accommodate the new technology and to meet government regulations. A typical dairying farmstead was changed to include a gambrel roof barn, silo, and milk house (Site No. 10). With time, many farmers and their descendants have elected to not operate a full-scale farm operation.

Legislative roundup

Federal legislation helps assist first-time home buyers

U.S. Senator Debbie Stabenow (D-Michigan), recently introduced the First Time Home Buyers Tax Credit Act of 2007. Under the terms of the legislation, over the next seven

years more than 15 million people, who otherwise might not have a shot at home ownership, could use tax credits to close the deal on their first home.

"Every hardworking man and woman in this country deserves an affordable place to call home," Stabenow said. "This bill turns our families' dreams into realities by helping millions of Americans purchase their own homes and invest in their family's future."

One of the biggest barriers to homeownership for working families is the cost of a down payment and the costs associated with closing a mortgage. Data from the Mortgage Bankers Association has estimated that typical closing costs on an average-sized loan of \$200,000 can approach approximately \$6,000.

The tax credit can either be claimed in the year after the purchase of a first home, or it can be transferred directly to a lender at closing. This is cash on the table at the time of purchase.

To be eligible for the \$3,000 individual credit or the \$6,000 credit for a married couple, taxpayers must be first-time homebuyers who are within the 25 percent tax bracket or lower in the year before they purchase their home. This translates to an eligibility income cap of \$71,950 for single filers, \$102,800 for heads of household, and

\$119,950 for joint returns, with a dollar-for-dollar phase-out of the tax credit beyond the cap.

"Serious defect"

U.S. Congressman Tim Walberg (R-MI) recently made the following statement about House Democrats' refusal to include language in the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act (FISA) that would aid American intelligence personnel in their efforts to listen in on the communications of terrorists plotting potential attacks on the United States.

"Right now there is a serious defect in our law that hinders American intelligence personnel in their efforts to listen in on the communications of terrorists plotting potential attacks on our country," Walberg said.

"The chief responsibility of the United States Congress is to protect the American people, and by refusing to update FISA to ensure our intelligence

community has access to these vital pieces of terrorist communication, House Democrats are leaving open a dangerous loophole in our terrorist surveillance system. With news (recently) that Admiral Mike McConnell, director of National Intelligence, does not support this legislation, the House should amend this bill so our intelligence services can appropriately monitor terrorist communications and activities abroad while maintaining the civil liberties guaranteed under our Constitution."

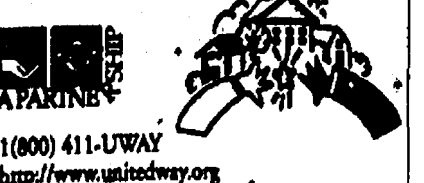

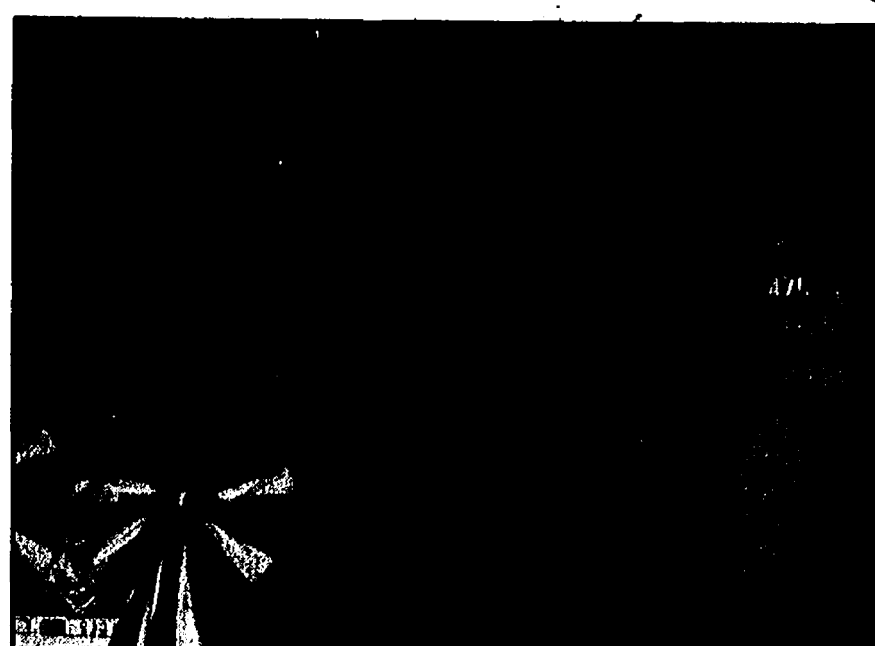

Going the extra mile in the race to beat cancer

When you think of a garage sale, you probably think it's a good way to get rid of some excess household "stuff."

But Heather Stanavich looked at it as a way to help beat cancer.

On Aug. 4 she opened up her home at 610 S. Main St. in Chelsea for a garage sale to help her toward her goal of raising \$4,400, and it succeeded far beyond what she expected.

"It was great — we made a ton of money," said Stanavich, who will be participating in the upcoming Michigan Breast Cancer Three-Day Walk for a second year.

"It was amazing. Some people just stopped by and gave us money for breast cancer without buying anything," she said.

"The people in Chelsea are very generous."

The \$925 she raised with the garage sale puts her within about \$600 of her fund-raising goal, and will be matched by her employer, CVS Pharmacy, through its matching gifts program for charitable contributions to nonprofit organizations.

Just like any other garage sale, Stanavich and her husband, John, put many of their excess personal belongings in Saturday's sale, and took donations from family, friends and co-workers.

And, as with any other sale, the key was location, location, location.

"Being on Main Street helped, and it turned out being more of a social event," Stanavich said. "We were supposed to be open until 5, but we closed at 3 because we started running out of things to sell."

The selection included a leather couch, stereo system, TVs, VCRs, baby clothes and lots of bikes, she said, and instead of pricing items they

simply relied on the kindness of strangers after telling them what the sale was all about.

Her 6-year-old daughter even did her part by setting up a lemonade stand.

"That turned out to be a big hit," Stanavich added.

Known to most participants simply as "The 3-Day," teams of walkers put in 60 miles over three days. Proceeds go to the Susan G. Komen Foundation for breast cancer research.

This year's 3-day is sched-

uled from Sept. 29 to Oct. 1, beginning at Oakland Community College and ending at The Henry Ford museum complex in Dearborn.

This particular fund-raiser is more than just a pet cause for Stanavich. She helped the CVS district team raise more than \$5,000 in the Detroit Race for the Cure, and has participated in the Relay For Life in Belleville.

"My sister had breast cancer, so did my mother in law; it seems like everybody has a

story when it comes to breast cancer," she said.

"This is my mission. I really enjoy trying to make a difference in the fight against breast cancer."

Plainly, the answer is no. Now, before you quit reading this column, let me explain why. The New Testament of Jesus Christ specifically tells us to make music to God by way of singing and making melody in our hearts (Ephesians 5:19).

As you search through the passages concerning music in the New Testament you will find this concept repeated over and over (see: Matthew 26:30; Acts 16:25; Romans 15:9; 1st Corinthians 14:15; Colossians 3:16; Hebrews 2:12; James 5:13).

Some people will resort to Old Testament passages like Psalm 150 and II Chronicles 29:25 to bring in the instru-

ment. The reason someone would use the Old Testament in this case is because they can't find a verse in the New Testament to authorize instrumental praise. The problem is that we don't live under the Old Testament law (see: Romans 7:1-4; 2nd Corinthians 3:5-14; Hebrews

10:9). We find many other items of Old Testament worship which we know we are not to participate in, like the burning of incense and offering of animal sacrifice. We cannot pick and choose what we will and will not do.

What about the argument, "Well, the Bible never specif-

ically says not to use the instruments?"

This statement shows a misunderstanding of the way the Bible authorizes our actions. We are to speak as the oracles of God (I Peter 4:11). The instrument in worship is not within the oracles of God; therefore, it is in the forbidden zone. Consider the worship act we call the Lord's Supper or communion.

The Bible says this is to consist of bread and fruit of the vine (Matthew 26:26-29). The Bible never specifically says not to add peanut butter and jelly onto the bread, does it? Yet we see that there is no authority for doing that. Why? Because God told us what to use. He doesn't have to tell us everything we cannot use. The same reasoning

applies to the issue of instrumental music. God only said, "sing."

Many church goers have had instruments in worship all of their lives. But did you know that instrumental music is a relatively recent innovation for most churches? In the mid-1500's several famous religious leaders stood against its use. John Calvin (Presbyterian Church) said, "Musical instruments in celebrating the praises of God would be no more suitable than the burning of incense, the lighting up of lamps, the restoration of the other shadows of the law.

The Papists, therefore, have foolishly borrowed this, as well as other things, from the Jews." Martin Luther (Lutheran Church) "called the organ the ensign of Baal."

The famous commentator Adam Clarke (Methodist Church) said, "Music as a science, I esteem and admire; but instruments of music in the house of God I abominate and abhor. This is the abuse of music; and here I register my protest against all such corruptions in the worship of the Author of Christianity."

U-M gets grant to prepare artificial lung for trial

The University of Michigan Medical School laboratory working to develop an implantable artificial lung that can serve as a bridge to lung transplantation is entering the home stretch.

Thanks to a new \$5 million, five-year grant from the National Institutes of Health designed to fund animal studies that will move the prototype through the final details of readiness for patients, a small clinical trial of the artificial lung may be just three years away.

"A lot of research has been involved with studying the physiology of the heart and then designing a lung device that uses the heart rather than a mechanical pump—that's what we've accomplished in the last five years. Now we need to refine the device into final form," says Robert Bartlett, M.D., U-M professor emeritus of surgery.

Bartlett, a pioneer in the development of artificial organs, is a principle investigator for the new grant. His laboratory, which has been developing an artificial lung for the last 12 years, has had continuous funding from the NIH since 1971 for the development of artificial organs.

Thirty years ago Dr. Bartlett's laboratory developed a temporary artificial lung system known as ECMO which is used in intensive care units throughout the world to treat patients with acute lung failure, but ECMO is not practical as a bridge to lung transplantation.

Currently, there is no mechanical system that can replace lung function well enough and long enough to allow patients months of time while they wait for donor lungs. This device will allow that time.

The implantable artificial lung will not only extend the time to find a donor, but will permit conditioning of the patient.

"People with end-stage lung diseases are often debilitated, and this adds to the difficulty of transplantation and recovery. We know they will do better when they finally get the transplant if they can get into good physi-

cal shape before the operation," Bartlett says. "An implantable artificial lung would permit a patient to be fairly mobile and to live at home, rather than remaining bedridden in an ICU waiting for surgery, as is often the case."

Another advantage of the implantable lung is that the device can be left in place following transplantation until the transplanted lungs are fully functioning. This will permit accepting lungs for transplantation that would otherwise be declined.

The grant will fund research in collaboration with James Grothberg, Ph.D., and Joseph Bull, Ph.D., at the U-M School of Engineering's Department of Bioengineering. The grant comes from a special bioengineering research partnership category within the NIH. It does not cover clinical trials, but it will fund all the steps necessary to get to that point.

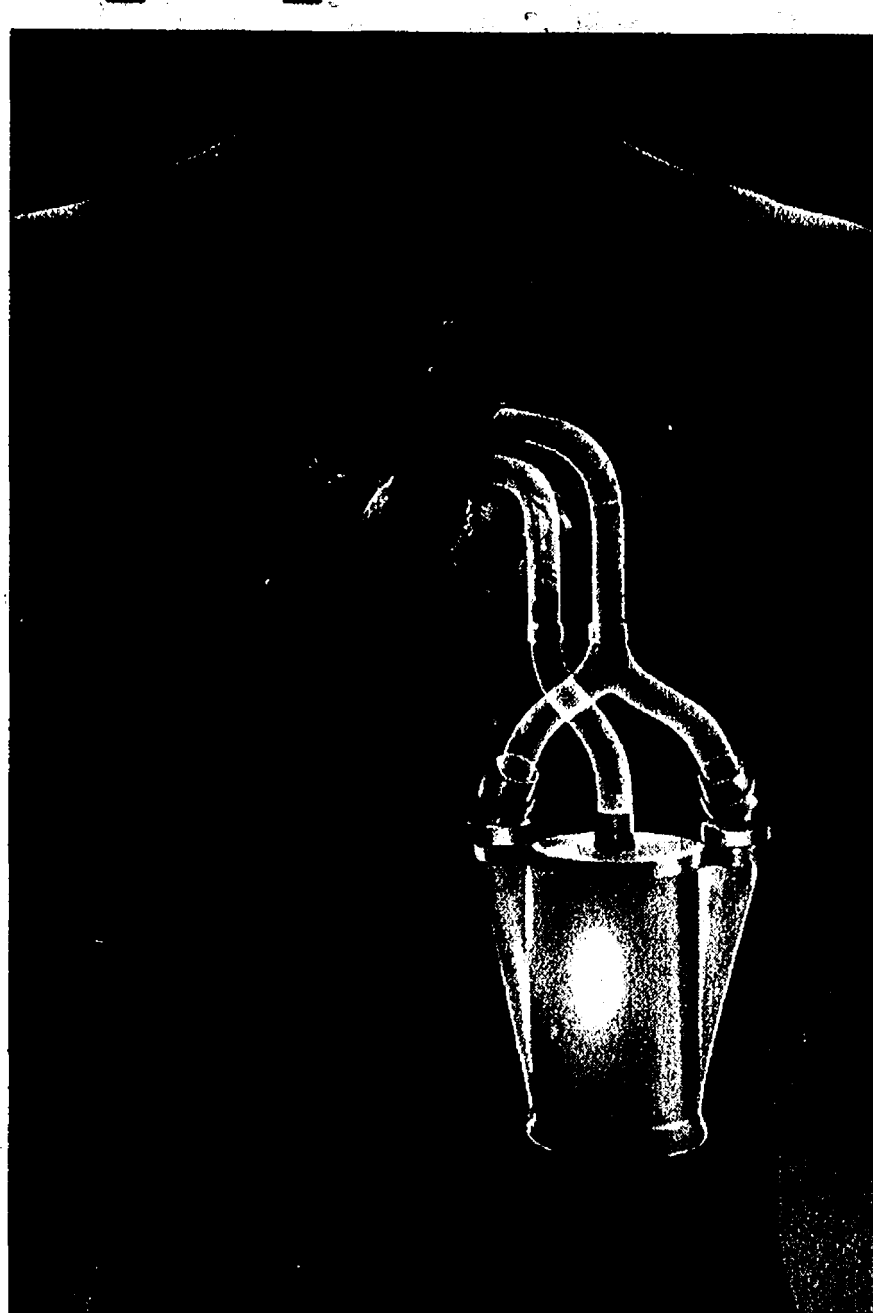
"Because these devices are prototypes, we make them one at a time," Dr. Bartlett explains. "An important part of our research from this point forward is to have a device that satisfies the FDA and can be reproduced commercially so that it can be made exactly the same every time."

There also are some remaining physiology experiments that need to take place, Bartlett says.

In previous testing, the device has had fairly constant blood flow. Researchers still need to understand the effect of variable blood flow, both higher and lower.

When blood flow is lower, clotting can become a factor and the correct use of anticoagulants needs to be defined. When blood flow is higher, the heart has to work harder to pump blood through the device.

Exercise requires high blood flow and corresponding demands on the device to provide oxygen. In both cases, small changes will need to be made to the prototype device to make sure it functions under the same



varying conditions as the lungs it will replace.

Collaboration on the artificial lung is complex. In previous studies, Grothberg and Bull developed the sophisticated computer technology to simulate the artificial lung

in order to predict its performance and fabricate a device to match.

The U-M team collaborates with the four other laboratories in the world working on implantable lungs—the Universities of Maryland,

Kentucky, Pittsburgh and Osaka Japan.

Keith Cook, Ph.D., a U-M research investigator and cardiac physiology expert, is the main bioengineer in this, the final phase of the project.

Because the prototype relies on the patient's own heart to pump blood through the device, Cook's understanding of how the right ventricle, which does the pumping, works, fails, handles stress, and how the device

will perform according to these variables is a complex piece of bioengineering that is vital to the project's success.

The device itself was fabricated and is being made by Michigan Critical Care Consultants, Inc., or MCC3, an Ann Arbor research and development bioengineering firm that Bartlett co-founded 15 years ago with bioengineers Scott Merz, Ph.D., and Patrick Montoya, Ph.D.

LAKE WEED INFORMATIONAL MEETING



Washtenaw County is aware of the concerns many lake community residents have with the nuisance of aquatic lake weeds, especially the non-native species including Eurasian milfoil.

This informational meeting will address the opportunity lake owners have to take control of the lake weeds that affect recreational capabilities and to allow those who benefit to provide equitable support.

The Washtenaw County Board of Public Works is willing to facilitate the creation of special assessment districts for aquatic weed management under Michigan Public Act 185. Aquatic invasive weeds are now successfully being controlled on Whitmore Lake and Sugarloaf Lake. North Lake residents, along with the Townships of Lyndon and Dexter, have recently signed a petition requesting that the County implement a weed management program on North Lake.

If a particular lake community is interested in implementing a program for their lake, the County could also provide a fisheries consultant to coordinate species and habitat plans for that lake. Oftentimes, excessive weed growth is detrimental to fish populations.

Local government officials, lake residents and lake management consultants will discuss the existing lake conditions and how residents can manage this issue.

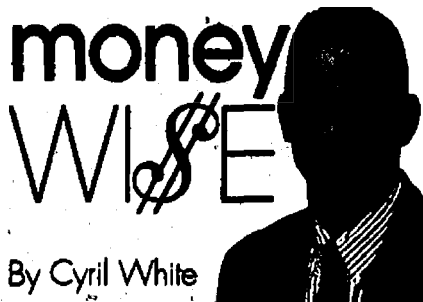

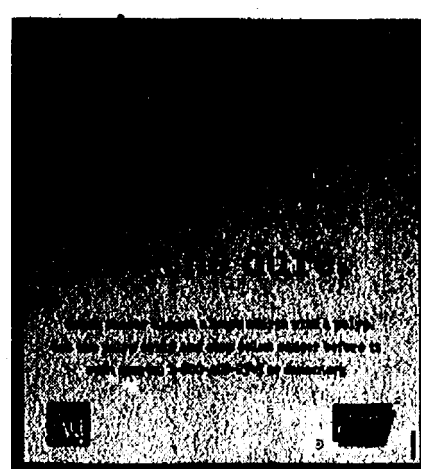

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE PROVISIONS OF ORDINANCE NO. 79, KNOWN AS THE CHELSEA CITY ZONING ORDINANCE AS IT RELATES TO THE MEDICAL CENTER DISTRICT (MC) REGULATIONS OF THE ZONING TEXT

The City of Chelsea Ordains:

SECTION 1. Article IV of the Chelsea City Zoning Ordinance, Ordinance No. 79, as amended, is amended by the addition thereto of the following provisions.

Section 4.18 C16 "Community Outreach Programs dedicated to the health and well being of the community involving limited seasonal retail".
