New council pair sworn in

The two newest members of the Chelsea City Council took their oaths of office Tuesday, crossing the boundary from the watchers to the watched.

Red Anderson and Bill Holmberg joined incumbent Jason Lindauer in raising their hands and pledging to do their best to make decisions on behalf of the residents of the city.

The two are key members of Chelsea Citizens For

Accountability, a grassroots group formed in response to the council's approval of a 1-mill tax increase earlier this year.

In the Nov. 6 election Anderson received the highest number of votes, 748, and Holmberg followed with 684.

In a seeming repudiation of council actions over the past three years, they displaced incumbents Joe Merkel and James Bollinger.

Incumbent Jason Lin-



Big changes get the OK from district

Major changes are in the works for the oldest — and youngest — students in the Chelsea School District.

The Chelsea Board of Education on Monday approved switching the high school to a three-trimester yearly schedule rather than the traditional two-semester academic year.

Prompted by a state-mandated increase in the number of required core classes, trimesters have the advantage of offering students additional choices in both core and elective classes over a year's time.

The schedule change will take effect in fall 2008.

The board also approved an all-day, every-day schedule for kindergartners, also

Courage & Cancer

Chelsea cancer survivor addresses her disease in a series of columns.

Alison Marable did all the right things. A vegetarian since her teenage years, she ate healthy foods, she exercised and she saw her doctor regularly.

But there's one thing she didn't have control over — genetics.

Having a father who was diagnosed with breast cancer in his 40s and a grandmother with both breast and ovarian cancer, the chances of Marable getting cancer were higher than for most folks.

In fall 2006, Marable was faced with the possibility that she may have breast cancer, and her diagno-

sis confirmed it the following January.

"It was a shock, to say the least," said her husband, Michael. "The

tests at the hospital maybe took an hour, maybe a little more, but it was the longest hour of my life sitting in the waiting room."

What Marable, 38, and her family went through, coupled with her educational background in English and social work, have prompted her to launch a series of newspaper columns on the topic of cancer and families that will begin appearing on a regular basis in Heritage Newspapers.

"I am hoping that by reading my column, survivors will find support, caregivers, friends and employers can learn about the survivor's perspective, and more individuals will eat healthier and seek medical care," she said.

Even though cancer was something Marable's family went through while she was growing up in Birmingham in the 1970s and early '80s, it wasn't openly discussed.

Mallya, who has always held a passion for portable energy, says the variety of laptop batteries they have is very popular with customers who have trouble locating replacements from the manufacturer and from big box stores.



Coming back home

Bacon family rediscovers its proud Chelsea heritage

Donald H. Bacon is considered to be one of the most admired sons of Chelsea. His story is one of hard work, success and giving. When his only child, Sally, came to visit Chelsea during the 100th anniversary celebration of the Clocktower, it was a magical moment.

It all began more than 130 years ago when William and Jabez Bacon left England for Chelsea in 1871.

They read that there was cheap land in this newly cleared territory, and without hesitation bid adieu to their mother and sisters and sailed to America.

They came to Chelsea at a time when the town was rebuilding from two major fires.

Imagine two major fires in two years wiping out Chelsea's downtown.

The first fire, in 1870, destroyed the west side of Main Street from Middle Street to the railroad tracks, and in 1871 a second fire destroyed the entire east side of Main Street as well.

The new buildings were large and brick and built on land owned by Chelsea's founders, the Congdon family. Most of these buildings still exist.

The Bacons immediately entered into business in the area, in particular the retail trade. They partnered with some of the more prominent names of the time, including Harmon Holmes (Chelsea Milling Co.) and Charles Kempf (Chelsea State Bank).

They were successful in their businesses and quickly elevated their status among the most successful in town.

They also played major roles in local politics, including being elected village president, serving on

the school board and being elected as trustees.

There were 19 children between the two men. One of the children of Jabez Bacon was Donald H. Bacon.

Donald is arguably the most successful of all the Bacons. After graduation from Chelsea High School in 1915 Donald attended Olivet College, class of 1919. During that time he was their star football player.

One of Don Bacon's close high school friends, Jack Dunn, had been playing for the University of Michigan at the time and tried to get Don to come and play for that school. The only problem was that Don would have to beat out a three-time All-American center! Of course Don knew this and declined his best friend's offer. Don worked in his father's hardware store for years and wrote in a letter at the age of 19 that he wasn't sure if he could run the business and that it was very difficult.

Ironically, years later Don Bacon would find himself purchasing the clock tower complex in the late 1930s and establishing the Central Fibre Products Co.

It made wires, springs, paper products and much more. During the war it made ammunition and other products for the military effort.

In the 1960s Bacon sold Central Fibre to other interests, and passed away in 1971.

His generosity and genuine affection for Chelsea have been documented on hundreds of occasions. Examples of his kindness included giving many students free college tuition, helping to pay for numerous community projects and making extraordinary efforts to keep the town working.

It was said that during his

funeral the entire town shut down to pay their final respects to one Chelsea's most admired citizens.

There are still some Bacon descendants in the area but most of them have scattered across the state and country.

On Sept. 29, the Clocktower celebrated its 100th anniversary with a

large celebration. With sheer luck and the help of the Internet I was able to locate Sally Bacon living in Tucson, Ariz.

Sally is the only remaining child of Don Bacon. I made her aware of the centennial event and offered her an invitation because

North Creek gets \$1.4 million

Expansion needed for more kindergartners

North Creek Elementary School will hear the pitter-patter of a lot more little feet come next fall.

Following the Chelsea School Board's action Monday to go to an all-day, every-day kindergarten schedule, Superintendent David Killips presented plans to build a four-classroom, 7,000-square-foot addition to accommodate the increased number of students the new schedule would entail.

The proposed cost of the

work is \$1,275,198 according to estimates prepared by architects Kingscott & Associates and construction management firm Granger Construction.

"We'll have to monitor it, but we anticipate it can be done within that budget," Killips said.

"We'd like to submit the site plans and put in the foundation before the ground freezes," he added.

"We can begin work immediately on this, and get Kingscott and Granger going full throttle."

Killips said the construc-

tion could be complete by the beginning of August, in time for the influx of the new crop of kindergartners.

Unlike other construction projects, the school district is not required to go through the usual regulatory approval process.

"School districts are exempt from local building codes; we follow state guidelines and use state inspectors," Killips explained.

The district will present site plans to "appropriate



Montanges stirring things up with new business

Ron and Nancy Montange's dream of owning a small business as their post-retirement career percolated in their heads until last month, when their Go Brew Coffee Co. opened in Stockbridge.

"Nancy and I always wanted to open a small community place where people could come in and relax," said Ron.

"Nance and I looked into this; we thought about doing this for 10 or 15 years."

Nancy said Ron originally wanted to open a pizza place, but she persuaded him to pursue a different avenue.

"He didn't want to do construction anymore, he wanted to open a pizza parlor, but that would have been all kinds of crazy hours so I suggested the coffee shop," Nancy said.

"We figured, you're going to be married to the business at first anyway, so why be here until midnight every

night?"
"Married to the business" is an apt description; Ron and Nancy take turns for a week at a time, working from about 4:30 in the morning until a couple of hours after closing, six days a week.

"That will change, of course, once we get our staffing set up and we get a feel for how the business is going to go," Ron said.

"If this thing is successful, it's something the entire family can be involved in."

The staff so far includes two adult employees and three high-school students.

"They're all good," Nancy added.

Learning the ropes

The Chelsea couple attended a "coffee school" in Portland, Ore., then a Coffeefest seminar in Atlanta, Ga., where they learned the serious business of coffeeshops.

"We learned all about coffee, cappuccino and espresso," Ron said.

"There are 3,000 coffees out there, and we tried about 150 of them before we chose a Brazilian coffee. It's really smooth - you can brew it as strong as you want and it still tastes good."

Once they settled on the type of business, they had to come up with location, location, location.

"We were looking to get into the drive-through coffee business but there were already a few in the Chelsea area," Ron said, "but nothing here (in the Stockbridge area)."

Chelsea baker cited for bread violations

A state inspector's negative report has John Savanna hotter than the oven he uses to make his artisan bread.

"I've never had any complaints from customers and I've been doing this since 1980," said Savanna, head baker for Mill Pond Bread in Lyndon Township.

On Sept. 28 Michigan Department of Agriculture Inspector Beth Howell ordered Savanna to destroy about 500 pounds of bread at the Ann Arbor Farmers Market, costing him hundreds of dollars in lost sales.

Savanna said he was cited for his bread being displayed unwrapped, among other things, exposing it to "flying creatures" in the outdoor market.

"Sparrow's Market is right next to the farmers market and that same bread is unwrapped on racks inside but there are flies and 'bee-like creatures,' as she put it," he said. "Frankly, I don't see the difference."

According to Savanna, Howell ordered him to dump dish soap on the bread to make the bread completely unfit for consumption.

"It only became contaminated when she made me put soap on it," he said. "She wouldn't even let me donate it to a homeless shelter - I told her she should be ashamed of herself."

Ag Department spokesman Kevin Besey said none of the state food-safety laws apply specifically to farmers markets.

city personnel," he added, such as City Engineer Christine Linfield.

"We don't anticipate any problems," Killips said.

"We want to be a good neighbor and keep (the city) apprised of what we're doing."

In other business ...

The board meeting began with Pierce Lake Elementary Principal Lucy Stieber introducing a group of fourth-graders who performed an "anti-bullying pledge" and a song opposing bullying.

"We are expanding what we do in regard to that behavior," Stieber said.

The pledge is recited at noon by different groups of students on a rotating basis.

"It gives us a nice, common vocabulary, which is what we are all working toward," Stieber said.

The school board approved an outlay of \$10,490 to replace the fuel dispensing and control system at the bus maintenance garage.

The cost to replace the electronic controls will be added to the budget for the garage renovation, which had a price tag of approximately \$57,000.

"This is a step we need to take prior to replacing the entire old system," Killips said, assuring board members that the renovation did

not include any work on the underground fuel storage tanks themselves.

Killips also reported that funding in the new state budget will provide a whopping \$89-per-student increase for the Chelsea School District, including \$48 - two-thirds of 1 percent - for the basic foun-

ation grant.

"I don't know what we're going to do with all that extra money, but we'll continue to be good stewards of it," Killips said.

"The good news is, instead of being \$300,000 in deficit we will be a little over \$400,000 in the black."

to take effect next fall.

Reasons to switch from the current half-day, alternate-day format include research that shows children respond better academically and socially to such a schedule.

High School trimesters

"We're trying to make more electives available while maintaining our academic excellence, and we don't want to do one without the other," said Superintendent David Killips. "It's a balancing act."

Julie Deppner, Chelsea High School assistant principal, headed up the faculty team that studied the pros and cons of switching schedules for the past two years.

They looked to the Saline and Spring Lake school districts as models.

"The teaching staff at Chelsea High School is nervously excited about the trimester schedule," Deppner said.

"We see the many benefits for students, such as maximizing opportunities for more classes, allowing for struggling students to re-take classes during the same year; as well as reducing homework load and the amount of stress many students experience when taking six classes at a time."

High school Principal Ron Mead said his staff would have to adapt to the change, but it is a definite benefit for students.

"I think the challenges for staff will be adjusting the current curriculum, to reorganize it and teach it in 60 days rather than 90," Mead said.

"I'm sure we'll find some things that will be stressful for the kids, but by and large it'll be an advantage to them, which is driving this whole thing."

School Board President Laurel McDevitt said the new schedule offers new prospects for all students.

"Whether you're highly academic or just barely hanging on, I think it offers an awful lot of opportunities," McDevitt said.

All-Day Kindergarten

It fell to Marcus Kaeming, principal of North Creek Elementary School, to lead a task force to study the change from a half-day, alternate-day kindergarten program.

The all-day, every-day format provides teachers the necessary time to fulfill a growing list of academic requirements, while at the same time developing a child's social and emotional growth at a vulnerable age.

"In my opinion, and what the task force found, it was much more appropriate for their age - it's actually bet-

ter for children," Kaeming said.

"We should be able to build in developmental time to grow that social and emotional child, as well as the academic child."

Killips said the district hosted public forums to hear the opinions of parents and the public.

"There was a concern by parents that we're pushing academics at an early age, but the overwhelming response - especially among those who read the research - was, 'Can we do this now?'" Killips said.

How important is the sport of rowing to the EMU Community? The sport of rowing is still relatively new at Eastern Michigan University. We are currently in our seventh year as a varsity sport on campus, but if you ask around, most people involved with the University don't even know the team exists.

Last year's tragic death of Laura Dickinson, one of our student-athletes, has been discussed at length on and around campus and many people I've overheard have said the same thing. "I didn't even know EMU had a rowing program."

Obviously when a young vibrant life is lost, it is up to those left behind to pick up the pieces and somehow learn to carry on. Laura's teammates have been struggling with that very life lesson for the last year. They have done amazingly well. The women on this team have come together and bonded in a way that only a tragic loss can force.

It's too bad that the only serious exposure this team has had on campus comes as a result of such a great loss. The sport of rowing, and the women rowing on this team, have always and will always contribute a great deal to Eastern Michigan University. Rowing is the only real opportunity to offer college students the true "well rounded experience" that the university claims to offer with its athletics programs.

The sport of rowing actually offers you the chance to give it a try and get involved without any previous experience. Imagine walking on to a college campus and going to talk with the football, basketball, or softball coaches. . . imagine saying "I've never done this before, and in fact I've never really done anything athletic, but I'd like to try out for your team." In most cases you would get a pleasant smile, a polite few words, then a gentle but firm hand shoving you out the door.

Rowing is different than other sports!

Rowing can be learned by anyone. It's only slightly more difficult than learning to ride a bicycle. Don't let this fool you into thinking it's easy, however. Just because you know how to ride a bicycle doesn't mean you can ride it fast enough to win races.

Just because you know how to swim doesn't mean you can swim fast enough to win races, and the same applies to rowing. Just because you join the team and learn to row doesn't mean you'll get a college scholarship because you might not prove to be fast enough in the long run, but unlike other sports, the possibility to prove yourself is there.

When you join a rowing team in college you have a great deal to learn. You can be tall and thin, or short and overweight. You can have a great deal of athletic experience or none at all. The important thing is that joining this team is an opportunity to become something different.

With enough time and effort you can get yourself into the best physical condition of your life and I've coached enough young women who have made such a transformation to know the positive impact it has on their lives. I've coached hundreds and hundreds of young men and women on various college campuses around the country. Some of them have gone on to eventually row for the national team in international competitions. Many others have rowed through their four years of college and gone on to other great careers. Most of them have only rowed for a single year (the novice year) and then have given up the sport because it is too difficult, or because they are not fast enough to be seriously competitive at the collegiate level. Nine out of every 10 of those student athletes will attest to the positive influence that the sport of rowing has had on their lives. They say it taught them discipline, respect for others, respect for teamwork. They say they learned more about life from rowing than from all of their other classes combined. They say they learned how to push themselves to achieve the things they want in life. Almost all of them say "Thank you for the opportunity to prove myself".

How important is the sport of rowing to the EMU Community? Ask yourself when is the last time you've bothered to thank someone for an "opportunity to prove yourself" and you'll have your answer.

City Council notebook

Firm gives city good grades on audit report

The city of Chelsea received good financial news Tuesday, with an audit report that shows growth in some key funding areas.

David Helisek and Monika Lesinski of Plante & Moran's Ann Arbor office presented the council with its financial report for the fiscal year ending June 30. Major findings of the

audit include:
- Total revenues of \$3.79 million are up 9 percent from the previous year;
- Total expenditures of \$3.72 million are up 10 percent from the previous year;
- The general fund balance of \$321,462 is up about \$68,000, following at least two years of decreases.

Helisek said the increase in revenues can be attributed to a \$50,000 increase in state shared revenues, zero-

increase budgeting and savings in staffing.

Expenditures were up mainly due to an increase in the police budget to more accurately reflect costs; increases in employee insurance and benefit costs; and unplanned expenses in the severance package for former City Manager Mike Steklac and for a short-term contract with Interim City Manager John Hansen.

Even with the increase

over previous years, the unreserved fund balance of \$321,462 represents only 9 percent of total general fund expenditures, Helisek recommended a target of 15 to 20 percent.

More good news was found in the Electric Department fund, which went from a \$0 cash balance in fiscal 2006 to \$840,513 by instituting a rate increase and discovering and remedying several cases of sig-

nificant underbilling.

The report did point out some shortcomings in internal financial control processes that the city needs to address, Helisek said, but many are required by new accounting standards adopted since the previous audit.

Plante & Moran identified "material weaknesses" in journal entries involving accounts payable, special assessment receivables and deferred revenue, capital assets and accrued interest.

Material weakness was defined as "a significant deficiency that results in a more than remote likelihood that a material misstatement of the financial

statements will not be prevented or detected by the entity's internal control."

In all instances, the report stated, audit adjustments to the journal entries were made prior to June 30 to more accurately reflect the city's financial condition.

Helisek informed the council that the new Michigan Business Tax may create a little more work for city staff.

"Tax rates would rely more on a business's commercial or industrial zoning classification," he said.

Your assessing office might be a little busier during the first part of the year while they get that straightened out."

Rare letter from wife of famous artist discovered

There are many stories passed down in our families from generation to generation, some involving famous people, events or places.

For one example: "Grandpa met Barney Oldfield and he told him his auto racing secrets" - which turned out to be true, even though it took me a while to verify my grandfather's story.

On Sept. 3 this year, I was reminded of such a story that has been passed down in my own family.

My father, Professor F.K. Sparrow, and mother were living in Hanover, N.H., where he was teaching at Dartmouth College in the 1930s, before he came to the University of Michigan.

They were living in a house with another family who shared the left side of the duplex while my parents used the right side.

One late October evening there was a knock at the door at dinner time and their neighbor, renowned Mexican muralist Jose Clemente Orozco and his children were at the door.

"Could Professor Sparrow come and show our father how to carve a pumpkin? Our father doesn't know how," the children asked.

To accommodate this shy, almost introverted man, my father left the dinner table and went out with the family members to buy a gravid ovary (as we were told to call the jack-o-lantern).

My father proceeded to show the famous muralist the proper technique for removing the innards, placing the candle with a wax base to support it, etc.


While watching the "American Masters" PBS series on Sept. 3 I recalled that somewhere in our collection of family memorabilia was a letter written to my mother by Orozco's wife, Margarita.

The location of the letter, which had not seen the light of day for at least 10 years, came to me while sitting in my chair in front of our television: it was in the china cabinet to my immediate right.

Finding it quickly, I tried reading it but my Spanish is limited. I made arrangements to take it to Chelsea High School where my daughter Emily's Spanish teacher, Shane Rodriguez, agreed to translate it for me.

The letter contains many very personal stories such as the death of her father, which she characterizes as almost a suicide; Jose's mother passing away after a long illness; the children having typhus and the like.

The balance of the letter describes the pressures Senator Orozco was under to complete his project in Guadalajara, Mexico.



It occurred to me that Dartmouth might want to see this letter, so I contacted the director of the Hood Museum on campus, Brian Kennedy, and he was very excited to hear what I had

located. The museum had this past spring completed a new brochure on the Orozco mural in their Baker Library and they had tried to collect ephemera

of the Orozco family's time at Dartmouth.

Unfortunately, they had not found a single piece written by Senora Orozco!

We had a true gem, as it was written after they had returned to Mexico sometime after 1935.

Kennedy was very interested in seeing the letter and asked if we be interested in donating it to the museum.

The personal content of the letter made me think that it would be better to offer the letter to the Orozco descendants first, and then if they were not interested, donate it to the museum.

Kennedy had the e-mail address of an Orozco grandson who was adjunct professor at the University of Texas at Austin.

I immediately sent out a

note to Jorge Orozco, explaining what I had and how I came about it, offering it to the family.

I am still waiting for an answer, but in the meantime we are left to wonder at the events that occur to us by chance.

Should I hear from the Orozco descendants in the near future there may be more on this subject about which to write.

Sometimes it's impossible to fathom why lawmakers don't do what they should do. Cutting their benefits and salaries is Exhibit A.

For months, legislators have lectured citizens to sacrifice with two tax hikes, but what about lawmakers?

The House of representatives in May adopted a "sacrifice" resolution that gives the illusion lawmakers are taking action, but when you boil it all down, you

have a piece of paper and not much more.

Anyway, the House passed a resolution calling on the State Officers Compensation Commission to reduce legislative salaries by 5 percent. The thing was sent to the state Senate where it sat quietly and untouched until just recently.

Even if the Senate acted, it would not result in an immediate salary rollback. In the meantime, some lawmakers have taken a voluntary pay cut but there is no list.

Why not? Wouldn't any PR-conscious legislator want his or her constituents to know? Apparently not.

Maybe the guys who aren't taking a pay cut have prevailed on those who are to keep their collective mouths shut?

All of this defies logic. It would make more sense for our elected politicians to lead the parade to reduce their own paychecks? The private sector has been eating one pay cut and benefit rollback after another, and to date the only thing we get from Lansing is a meaningless resolution, aka lip service.

The governor has been taking a regular slice from her take-home pay but she cannot bang on lawmakers too hard, because they don't cotton to executive office interference.

After all, we do have separation of powers, and when it comes to pay, lawmakers feel the more separation, the better.

The inaction, of course, only serves to feed the recall monster out there. To be fair, even if legislative salaries were reduced to nothing, recalls would still be going on, but at least lawmakers could honestly say they are taking a hit along with everyone else.

Senate GOP leader Mike Bishop finally says he'll take a whack at pay and lifetime health care benefits that legislators get after only six years on the job. He intends to improve on the resolution adopted by the House.

But then there is the matter of time off.

Last summer, lawmakers duped citizens into thinking they were coming in to work. But alas, the Fourth of July holiday turned out to be longer than the one-day break.

Likewise for the upcoming Thanksgiving break. Most common slugs get the holiday off and maybe the Friday after. Lawmakers were scheduled to ball out Nov. 8.

November when?

Nov. 9 — because deer hunting season begins before Thanksgiving and some would rather be in the woods than in the capital.

Never mind that there's the business community clamoring for a fix on the service sales tax by Dec. 1. Lawmakers may scoot back into town to take care of it, but even the hint of taking so much time off must rile the public.

In a feeble attempt to justify this, Mr. Bishop explains lawmakers are hard-working and have been here "since day one," and even when they're off, they're on duty back home. Ignorance or arrogance?

Our roots are based on a non-profit organization named Chelsea Community Chest. Each one of the member agencies offers a unique niche in the community assisting people with needs.

Every year we review our member agencies' work, assessing the needs of the community, the number of people each member agency served, and how each member agency helped with the needs of the community. As we evaluate these criteria, we determine the year's financial goal and how to allocate the raised funds to our member agencies.

With the downturn in the Michigan economy, the needs of our community are great. The decision was made this year to focus on agencies that provide the basics of life to community members: agencies that provide food, clothing, shelter, resources to keep people in their homes, help pay bills, and to get community members to and from work.

We are an affiliate of the United Way of America. We are unique in that we raise a comparatively small amount of funds, have no permanent staff, and are not involved in community policy-making.

We are independent of other United Ways, including the larger Washtenaw United Way.

This is why it is very important to us to have you designate the "Chelsea United Way" or "United Way-Chelsea" as the agency to receive your donation when giving, if giving outside of our local Chelsea United Way.

Every year I am touched as we ask our member agencies to report to us on how they impacted the community over the past year. Our base member agency is Faith In Action. They are the backbone for community assistance in Chelsea.

Other member agencies include: the American Red Cross, Catholic Social Services, Chelsea Recreation Council, Chelsea Senior Center, Great Sauk Trail Boy Scout Council, Help Source, Chelsea Hope Clinic, Huron Valley Child Guidance, Huron Valley Girl Scout Council, Parents as Teachers, St. Louis Center, Salvation Army of Washtenaw County, the Washtenaw Association for Community Advocacy, and the Western Washtenaw Area Value Express (WAVE).

We established a goal of \$120,000 for this year. This is the same goal as the past two years. We would like to exceed this as our agencies have asked for much more. This goal is a more realistic number based on past donations.

Community members may donate by many means. If your employer offers it, payroll deduction can be used. You may contribute directly to us from the mailing we sent to the community a few weeks ago, set up monthly deductions through the Chelsea State Bank, or use a credit card online through our web site at www.chelseau-nitedway.org/donate.html. We are hoping that each and every one of you can help just a little bit. No donation is too small. Should we exceed our stated goal all overages go directly to our member agencies in proportion to their stated needs.

Chelsea United Way's overhead costs are very small, and are pretty much a fixed amount and contain no staffing expenses.

It is especially important this year to widen our contributors, as Pfizer was our largest business donor. When they left the community, we lost over 8 percent of our overall contribution base.

There are many business partners in the community that help us that I will take this opportunity to thank.

First, businesses that hold a fundraiser and offer payroll deduction: Chelsea Lumber, Chelsea Milling Co., Chelsea Community Hospital, Chelsea State Bank, Chelsea School District, and Silver Maples.



What is the name of the mural painted in the Post Office lobby?

Answer A. Detroit artist George Fisher painted the mural of a farm family in 1936. The oil and canvas painting was commissioned by the federal government under a part of the New Deal. The project financed more than 1,100 paintings and sculptures, employing unknown artists, for post offices across the country.

Fisher said in a December 1965 visit to Chelsea that the mural theme is based on work, life and rest. Fisher wanted the mural to indicate that farming was a very important part of our way of life. "Way of Life" comes down from the great Chinese philosopher, Lao Tze, who mentions it repeatedly," he said. Fisher's painting is included in a 1960's book titled, "Post Offices and Public Art in the New Deal."

"A lot of farmers markets are becoming kind of in-between, they are doing more and more diverse things at markets," Besey said.

"If you are a processor of foods, we license those individuals at their base establishment, it didn't really matter that he was at the market."

Mill Pond Bread was inspected and licensed when it opened in the spring, and Savanna said it seems like

the state is "playing by two different sets of rules" when it comes to his bakery.

"I can work with inspectors; I have for 25 years," he said.

"I found it almost funny — if it's a health issue, I've been producing healthy bread for my family and customers for years. To say it's contaminated really cuts to my heart."

Savanna noted Howell's negative report did not stop with his bread.

"She wrote me up for not having a hand sink," he said.

"Does that mean every vendor's booth needs a hand sink? It's a farmers market, not a supermarket."

Savanna also said earlier reports that said he has a history of violations was in error, and those also involved inspections by Howell.

"There's been no 'history of violations' because we're a new business; she's confusing the issue," Savanna said.

"I'm not the owner, and this is not Mill Pond Bakery (a bakery he had owned with locations in Leslie, Munith and Waterloo). I'm head baker, but it's owned by Jessica and George Lemmon."

Besey said the law is clear and unambiguous that food must be protected from con-

tamination by bugs and rain, and must be "handled in a sanitary manner."

"The law in Michigan states that once food is ready to eat we don't touch it with our hands; you have to use paper or tongs to place it in a bag," Besey said.

Savanna said he just wants to bake his bread and sell it, and keep a low profile.

"It's my artistry, I don't treat it as just a job," he said.

"The community has to decide how they want their farmers market."

"Now I'm forced to deal with the state and try to satisfy what they want."

Nancy said they were driving around looking at property, and a trip through Stockbridge changed the course of their business plan.

"We were looking toward Jackson, but everything was so expensive, so we checked into this vacant place in Stockbridge, and the rest is history, I guess," Nancy said.

Staying true to their original concept, the shop features a drive-through that many commuters take advantage of.

"We had to have a drive-through; thousands of cars pass by here a day," Ron said.

Stockbridge is where M-52 coming from Chelsea meets M-106 coming from Jackson, and Interstate-96 to Detroit and Lansing is just a quick hop north of town ... and being on Main Street, all those vehicles pass the Montanges' shop either coming or going.

"I counted cars one morning, and from 5 to 9 a.m. there were more than 1,300 cars heading north," he added. "I did the same thing one evening and there was almost the same number heading south."

They bought the building on West Main Street a year ago, and the exterior decorations reflect the couple's "divided loyalties."

Ron and Nancy both graduated from Michigan State University, and Nancy later graduated from the University of Michigan Nursing School.

Being located roughly halfway between the two schools, the former Burger Barn, Dairy Queen and landscape business was given a new paint job of Spartan green with white trim, and the "Go Brew" name is an obvious play on U-M's "Go Blue" motto.

Ron's lifelong career in the construction business was invaluable in gutting the interior for its reincarnation, and in navigating a maze of government regulations.

"The people in the village, you couldn't believe how happy they were to see us (open); they did anything they

could do to help," Nancy said. "The state, on the other hand - all the red tape we had to go through is criminal; it probably added a month to the time we needed to open."

"It's no wonder businesses are leaving the state," she added.

While Ron took care of the outside and a lot of the mechanical details on the inside, Nancy oversaw the interior décor.

"I had my list of stuff to do to open the shop, and he had his list," she said.

A collection of antique coffee pots and coffee tins lines a ledge running along the ceiling, and there is an inviting, overstuffed leather couch and settee in one corner.

Muralist Nina Kramer of Chelsea painted the walls with scenes of coffee bushes, trees and landscapes of Costa Rica with people harvesting coffee beans.

Another draw is the only wireless Internet service available in town.

"We're the first in Stockbridge to have Wi-Fi," Nancy said. "Any customer who buys anything can get one hour free."

Service with a smile

Neither Ron nor Nancy have food-service experience, but they didn't let that stand in their way.

"For most of my life I was a building contractor," Ron said. "I'm used to swinging a hammer, not standing behind a counter."

Nancy, who is a nurse at the University of Michigan Hospital, added: "We learn new things every day."

The menu includes a vast array of coffees, juices, smoothies, and "the best hot chocolate you've ever had," Nancy said. Their baked goods are supplied by the Grand Traverse Pie Co.

Ron said they were never interested in a franchise operation, preferring to keep it simple.

"We want to do our own thing; we didn't want to get hooked into somebody else's program," he said.

"We're not trying to cover everybody's bases, we'll stick to the things we can do well."

Nancy described her plan for the growth of the business. "What we'd like to do later on is open a drive-through in another area," she said.

"We'd like to open stores, get them going but not run them; we would teach others how to run them."

The coffeeshop is off to a good start, and is picking up steam every day as word spreads. "Once people get to know we're here I anticipate we'll really take off," Ron said.

They opened for business on Oct. 20, and filled more than 220 orders that very first day; and more than 300 people attended a grand opening celebration on Nov. 3.

Cancer & Courage: Part I

Diagnosis: What a shocker!

As a healthy-appearing woman in her 30s, finding out that I had cancer came as a shock. Despite my

wouldn't happen to me.

Deep inside, I feared it; but I lived with the protective thought that my vegetarian diet and physically active lifestyle would render my outcome different from theirs.

I liken the experience of having cancer, or even being told the cancer is

gone, for now, to holding a piece of paper in my hand. I can't set the paper on the table, put it in my purse, or leave it at home on a shelf. The paper simply says "cancer."

I am always holding my hand in a fist, clutching the paper that I cannot let go of, reading it now and then, but knowing what it says without reading it. Once, a friend and I set the tiny piece of paper on fire and sent it up to heaven, but eventually the paper reappeared in my hand. I carry it with me to the grocery store, my children's birthday parties, and to bed at night.

My hand will sometimes cramp from holding onto it too tightly, while at other times I can't remember what I am holding. As soon as I check what I am hold-

ing in my hand, I remember again.


There are small things that comfort me, such as the Christmas tree lit in my bedroom in the heat of summer, a long walk with my husband, or an evening with my kids. I am hoping that more and more often I forget what I am holding in my hand and don't feel the need to read the paper.

My journey, for now, is to try and find a way to set the paper down permanently, a task that is much harder than one would guess.

"My father told me himself when I was very young, before he told anyone else," she said. "He told me not to tell anyone else in the family. After that, he started treatment and the family knew, but no one ever really said anything verbally. I know he had surgery and probably chemotherapy as he became very thin for a while."

As the stigma surrounding cancer has been chipped away, people have become better educated on the topic, involved in raising money to support research and are actively engaged in supporting those battling the disease. Marable's goal is to facilitate more conversations in the community about cancer so that no one feels embarrassed, ashamed or alone.

"Over the years, cancer has become more acceptable as a topic of conversation, but I think it still has a long way to go," she said. "Cancer survivors and family members should never have to feel ashamed or feel the need to keep quiet about the disease."

"The more that people learn about cancer, the more society will grow as a whole. This includes progress in the areas of insurance coverage, employability, kindness to others, compassionate medical personnel, as well as education and research."

Marable, who was working on her master's degree in social work at Eastern Michigan University when she was diagnosed, said she wants people to feel comfortable discussing cancer and hopes that some of the topics she addresses in her column will serve as conversation starters in families, as well.

"Families should share medical histories and inform their doctors, talk

about healthy lifestyles, and work toward hearing the viewpoints of other people," said the Chelsea resident.

Marable has been very open about her diagnosis with her own children, 15-year-old Madison and 12-year-old Logan.

"We sat down and had an open discussion with the children and allowed them to ask questions," she said. "We realized that this would impact them in a variety of ways, and made sure that they could take part in decisions and could always come to us with questions or concerns."

Logan Marable says he was in shock initially, but appreciated his parents' openness and honesty.

"When they told me, I couldn't even believe it," he said.

"I never thought anything this bad could happen, but it did. Even though it was terrible that she got cancer, I think it made me get closer to my family."

Because his parents included him every step of the way, Logan Marable says he felt as if he were also part of the healing process for his mother and family as a whole.

"The recovery was hard. But after, it felt like we had accomplished something very big," he said.

Among the topics Marable will tackle in her column, which will be written from her personal perspective, will be how to tell your children that you have cancer, how to decide who to tell and who not to, and the importance of still focusing on a future with your family despite your diagnosis.

One thing that stood out for Marable and touched her deeply was her husband's response to the news and his ability to focus on their future together.

"After the diagnosis, my husband bought me a gorgeous ring. Not only is the ring beautiful, but it made me feel like I was still a woman, a woman who would be around a long

time to wear it," she said. "It was romantic and fun — something I needed at the time."

Michael Marable says although family was always his No. 1 priority, his wife's cancer diagnosis made him take a closer look at what was important to him.

"Emotionally, it has been difficult," he said. "It really has forced me to take a look at life and realize just how fragile it is. Knowing that one day Al and I would eventually die, I had comfort in believing that day to be far, far in the future. Cancer has suddenly put that day as potentially being around the corner. This has been a very difficult thing to come to terms with."

Marable says they have become closer as a family and make sure to spend more quality time together.

"The family and our closeness has become the most important thing," she said. "We've had to face possibly losing each other, what it means to die, how would the children face losing their mother, what will my husband face. We've become closer as a family."

It's this wisdom that she would like to share with others. She says the benefits will be two-fold — for readers and herself personally.

"Writing is something that I've always enjoyed, but it's so much more enjoyable when there is a purpose behind it," she said.

Marable is hopeful about her future after having surgery, but, like many cancer survivors, the threat that cancer is looming remains in the back of her mind.

"There is the sense of not wasting time, making the most of things," she said.

The answer is still yes, and the answer is yes because the question includes the time element - "Friday night." On this particular "Friday night" it was raining and wet and nasty, all helping to slow down the great Nick Hill. While it was a detriment to the potent Chelsea offense, it was a bonus to the East

Lansing offense.

Harper is a great running back. But he's even greater in the rain. Aren't there horses that are better in the slop, as they say. Harper is dangerous on cement, but he's equally as dangerous on wet cement because defenders need their footing to bring him down. Harper, a senior, is 5-11, 185 and looks even bigger. Hill, a sophomore, is 5-8 and 170 pounds and looks even smaller.

Harper can beat you with his speed, but also with his power. And when you're slipping and sliding, it's tough to get a hold of this guy. It's even tougher to bring him down.

While East Lansing lives on the ground, Chelsea flew through the air. Quarterback Jeff Adams was solid most games. Spectacular in others. Dependable in all. But with the rain falling and wind blowing, Adams' passes were slightly off the mark. One would sail over the head of a

receiver while another would just miss the target. Several times in the first half, receivers were open, but the ball wasn't there to grab a hold of. That's because the wind had already grabbed a hold of it.

I call to the stand the officials.

Sorry, boys, you are being subpoenaed. And while you're not required to comment - plead the fifth all you want - we are going to layout a pretty strong case against you.

One play shall suffice, your honor.

With the scoreboard still scoreless, East Lansing was driving down the field in the first quarter. The Trojans broke the huddle at Chelsea's

12-yard line. While Chelsea was getting down in its defensive stance, one player was getting out because an official was sending him off the field. It appeared the player may have had an equipment problem and the official excused him from the field.

The problem was the timing of the excuse. The player scrambled to get to the sidelines and the sidelines scrambled to get a player in to replace him. But by the time that had all happened, East Lansing was celebrating in the end zone. The player barely got on the field when the ball was snapped. Of course East Lansing ran a play to the side of the field where the player had just arrived. It was bad timing for

Chelsea. Great timing for East Lansing.

her father had been one of the owners of the clocktower.

Sally was so thrilled that it didn't take her long to book a flight. She arrived with her husband Kelley, one of her sons, Bradley, and her daughter-in-law, Nan.

This being Sally's 80th year made the event all the more special. When they came to Chelsea, members of the Chelsea Area Historical Society gave them the red-carpet treatment.

We first showed them the museum, introduced them to the historical society executive members and reviewed some of the Bacon history and artifacts.

Bradley's attention quickly focused on more than 50 personal letters from the early 1900s written by Jabez Bacon and family. Sally, Kelley and Nan shared what history they had as well.

Next was a trip to the original Bacon home on Middle Street. On the way there we stopped by to meet Marjorie Daniels, whose mother-in-law, Gertrude Daniels, was a great friend to Don Bacon.

When we arrived at the Bacon homestead we were welcomed by current owners Mike Casey and Lauren Gilbert.

Sally walked around and shared memories of her grandfather's home with the owners, who are working

hard to restore the home to its original appearance.

After this visit we returned to the museum to spend a few hours sharing the history of the Bacons.

Great new discoveries were made regarding one of Chelsea's most notable families. After that we attended the dedication party for the clocktower held at the gazebo with the Bacons as the honored guests.

That evening the Bacons were treated to dinner at the Common Grill. In attendance were 14 people who had known either Sally or her father Don.

Over the course of three hours we shared very entertaining stories of Don Bacon and his life in Chelsea.

Sally and Kelley updated us on their family's tremendous efforts in restoring more than 30 of Tuscon's oldest downtown buildings and the struggles they are facing with those that desire to see more modern buildings put in their place.

It was difficult to part after dinner because it was truly a homecoming that we did not want to end.

The Bacons have re-established communication with Chelsea and are planning to bring the next generation here to learn of their Chelsea heritage.

It is hard to describe the feeling you get when you visit the site of your heritage, but the word "magical" does come close.



Jumping through hoops

Mom, daughter introduce new jewelry business

You might say Laurie and Lauren Gravelyn are "all ears" when it comes to business.

The Chelsea mom-daughter duo has started a small business creating hoop earrings called "Hoolas."

L & L Designs - the business monicker is derived from their first names - has its roots four years ago when the pair took a beading class at the Chelsea Center for the Arts.

"We both became hooked on beading as an art, and as quickly as we made our jewelry, friends and family began to want to buy our pieces," Laurie Gravelyn says.

The idea grew legs, and became a small business selling in a few local art fairs and at parties in local homes.

"We quickly learned there are many buyers out there, and began working on something that would make our jewelry special

The pair developed pieces to fit on a hoop earring - hence the name Hoolas.

They currently have over 330 designs and introduce new ones every month, using sterling silver,

"A five-piece set could produce 18 different earrings," Gravelyn says. "They also can become pendants for necklaces or charms for a bracelet."

"The single word that continues to come out of our ladies' mouths is 'Fun.'"

The pair gets inspiration from fashion magazines, TV celebrities, and home shopping networks.

Lauren - an entrepreneur at the tender age of 13 - has had an



interest in art from childhood, and enjoyed art classes from teacher Janet Alford. The Chelsea eighth-grader is creative director for L&L Designs while mom serves as marketing director.

"Lauren started this business with me four years ago, at the ripe old age of 8," Gravelyn says. "She is my creative director and truly is the driving force behind many of our designs."



Meet the teacher: Crystal Heydlauff



Name: Crystal Heydlauff
Age: 39, but I like to tell people I'm 27.

Family: My husband, Steve, our 16 year old son, Michael, and our 14 year old daughter Taylor. Another big part of our family is our yellow lab, Maggie. We are also blessed to have my parents (Ma and Pa) live just two doors down, and our "cousins" Dan, Judy, Evan and Hillary Phillips that live right around the corner.

Education: I'm actually a product of Chelsea Schools! (1986 CHS graduate) I earned my Bachelor's degree in 1990, then my Master's degree in 1992.

Native of: I'm proud to say I was born and raised here in Chelsea. I traveled through North School, Beach, and the Chelsea High School on Washington Street. A few of my all time favorite teachers included: Mrs. Peebles, Mr. Smith, Mr. Clarke, Mrs. Williams, Mrs. Prueas and Mr. Raymond.

Teaching experience: This is my 18th year of teaching in Chelsea. I've taught 3rd and 4th grades, and one year a combined 3rd and 4th grade class. The best 14 of those years have been spent team teaching with my favorite colleague Karen Henry.

School you teach: In the "olden" days, I taught at South, then transferred to North at the time Chelsea opened the new Pierce Lake Elementary. I moved to Pierce Lake when the "reconfiguration" of elementary schools occurred.

Grade/subject you teach: I currently team teach 4th grade. With our team teaching set up, there are two classes of children joined together with two teachers that teach all subjects. Karen Henry and I make all lesson plans together and share the lead teaching throughout the day. Although we decide which ONE of us will lead each lesson, we BOTH end up teaching it together. It's really a fun, energized setting! The 4th graders bring so much joy, laughter, and amazement to our days, I couldn't imagine being in any other profession.

Favorite subject in school: Definitely math.

Something people would be surprised to know about you: I actually own a 1969 John Deere 630 Tractor. My husband and kids have restored an antique tractor for each of us.

Most influential person in your life: My dad because he ALWAYS sees the positive in everything and everyone, especially when it seems impossible to find!

Quote to live by: Tim McGraw, "Live like you were dying." Basically, enjoy each and every minute of each and every day, because as my dad says, you never get it back.

What do you like most about teaching? The gleam in a child's eye when they are enjoying the simplest things in life.

What do you like least about teaching? Those hugs and "goodbyes" on the last day of school. It's definitely an emotional time. After spending 180 days with the children, it's exciting to see them grow and mature into 5th graders, but tough to let them go!

What is the most challenging part of teaching? Keeping students engaged throughout each and every lesson of the day. It's really tough competing with the modern technology that is such a big part of the students' lives!



What are some of the goals you set for students? As a teacher, my goal is to make school a safe, comfortable place to come that is lots of fun. Once these things are in place, a student is sure to learn! For my 4th graders, I'd have to say responsibility is a major goal. Throughout the day, students are in charge of lots of little things: marking his/her own attendance and lunch order, turning homework papers into the basket before the second bell rings, keeping a desk that is neat with papers organized into specific subject folders, and keeping a daily planner that includes homework for the day. Students also have some long term projects from which they learn to manage their time. For example, each student is required to read three books from three different genres and complete three different book projects to share with the class each card marking "budget" their time. In addition to these goals, each student chooses one specific goal of his/her own on which to focus during the marking period. A writing piece is completed in which the student states his/her goal, tells how he/she will work toward the goal, then how his/her family can help achieve the goal, and finally what the teachers can do to assist. It's very effective when the student selects his/her specific goal and thinks through the process of how to attain the goal.

What do you tell parents about being involved in their children's education? Parental involvement is key. Even if the parents aren't IN the classroom, it's important for children to know parents and teachers work together to ensure a great education for them. It's so important for a child to know he/she is believed in by the parents and teachers! We all need to praise the littlest accomplishments; at least with the young students!

Are students feeling more pressure to succeed today? I think students at this age look to their parents and/or teachers to gauge the amount of "pressure." It's important to find the fine line of getting a student to push him/herself to always give just a little more than a best effort, but not to the point of "stressing" over school.

Walk us through a typical day for you? Well, really no two days are the same! Overall, the routine of our classroom is this: Students are greeted at the door as they come in at 7:55. Each student marks his/her attendance, turns in any paperwork to the designated shelf, and gets started with a warm-up activity on the board. After the Pledge and discussing calendar events, we share birthdays and book projects. We also spend 3 minutes each day practicing the speed of math

fact memorization. By this time, it's 8:30 and we hit the academics. A typical day includes about 7 hour on a spelling lesson, 1 hour for Social Studies or Science depending on the day, a little over 1 hour for math, 1 hour for reading, and 7 hour for writing. A fresh fruit or vegetable is always allowed for a healthy snack, and students are encouraged to keep a water bottle on their desks. Sprinkled into our day is 30-40 minutes for "special", which depending on the day is art, music, gym, or media. We also spend 1 hour in the computer lab per week, and an average of 1 hour of laptops in the classroom per week. Lunch break is for 7 hour (including an optional outdoor recess). Our day ends with students recording information into their daily planners, then 7 hour of outdoor recess, and about 25 minutes of the teacher reading to the students on the rug. Our Friday afternoons are celebrated with "Fun Friday" in which the class earns up to 20 minutes to play a whole class group game or have some kind of treat.

How has your job changed over the years? Two things: curriculum and technology. It's amazing to me the curriculum we teach to children at younger and younger ages. There are some math lessons I teach today to my 4th graders that I distinctly remember Pat Clarke teaching me when I was in 7th grade advanced math class! A more recent example is the Chelsea History curriculum moving from 3rd grade down to 2nd. It seems we expect more and more out of children as the years go by. The writing curriculum for 8 and 9 year olds is pretty intense as well. One example of this is having children read two selections, then write to a topic relating to their reading. First, students are required to state their point of view, then they back it up with information cited from each reading selection, and finally conclude their writing in a way that restates their view on the topic. As for technology...WOW! We are so fortunate in Chelsea to have "Smart Boards" in the classroom. Basically, it's a large white screen that is interactive by touch and electronic markers. It's connected to the computer so whatever can be on a computer screen (Internet, scanned papers, educational multi-media, or programs) can appear on a large screen. It's an incredible teaching tool. Very different from the green chalk boards that were in the first classroom in which I taught!

What do you like most about teaching in Chelsea? It's fantastic being able to give back to the community in which I was raised. I am also very fortunate to have my husband working in the same community, AND my children attending school in the same district. As for the students, staff, administration, and families...Chelsea has to be among the best!

What makes the Chelsea school district unique or special? I think the Chelsea school district is so special because of the entire community's support! Families, neighbors, businesses, churches, scouts, Kiwanis, and so many other organizations work together for the benefit of all of our children. The community spirit is endless in supporting the schools; and for that, we are all very fortunate.



Slow start dooms Bulldogs

It's over. Chelsea's dream of a trip to Ford Field and a state championship were dashed last Friday by visiting East Lansing. The Trojans, behind Issac Harper's 248 yards rushing and three touchdowns, defeated the Bulldogs 24-16 in a Division 3 state regional final at Jerry Niehaus Field.


Chelsea (11-1), which entered the game ranked No. 1 in the state in Division 3, fell behind 24-0 before rallying late in the fourth quarter. Despite a furious comeback, the Bulldogs were unable to pull out the victory. It was Chelsea's second straight loss in the regional final. Last year, the Bulldogs fell to Fowlerville 28-25.

"At this time of year, you have to bring your A game," said Chelsea coach Brad Bush. "I don't think we brought our A game tonight. We made a lot of mistakes and got ourselves in a hole. East Lansing is a good team. They played very well."


Indeed. The Trojans have been playing very well since the season's fourth week. At that point in the year, East Lansing was 1-3. Since that period, the Trojans (9-3) have reeled off eight straight wins.

"We keep improving," said East Lansing coach Bill Feraco. "Chelsea defended us well. Our defense played very well. We were able to put great pressure on their quarterback. We were able to get some turnovers and capitalize on them."

Feraco said East Lansing's strategy going into the game was to harass Chelsea quarterback Jeff Adams all night long. "We wanted to put pressure on him," Feraco said. "Our defensive staff did a great job. We were able to stop them. Plus, our running back is pretty good."

Like its high school counterpart, the fall season for college athletics is also beginning to wind down this month.

At Hope College, Chelsea's Ausable Schwiebert helped lead the Flying Dutchmen men's soccer team to a 13-6-1 overall record and a 10-3-1 second-place mark in the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association. The sophomore midfielder finished the year third on the squad with seven goals and two assists for 16 points.

Dexter freshman Sarah Christian scored the game-winning goal in a shootout, giving Albion College's women's soccer team a victory over top-ranked Calvin College in the MIAA soccer tournament earlier this month.

Dexter's Alex Goss placed first in Intermediate Flat leading Albion College's equestrian team to a first-place finish at a meet hosted by the University of Michigan Nov. 3 through 4. The Britons bested the field with 36 points.

Maggie Manville was named to the Mid-American Conference All-Freshman first team as a keeper for Eastern Michigan University. The former Chelsea standout is the first Eagle goalie ever to be selected for the MAC All-Freshman team. Manville started all 19 games this season for EMU. She finished with a 1.04 goals against average, which is second best in school history. She recorded 94 saves and six shutouts this year. Manville logged 1,821 minutes this season, the third-most in EMU women's soccer history.

Dexter freshman Heather Bradshaw led Defiance College's volleyball team with a team-high 479 digs this season. A 5-foot-6 libero, Bradshaw also had 20 aces and 12 assists this year. Defiance finished 8-22 overall and 3-5 in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference.



Chelsea's boys' cross country team concluded a successful season with an eighth-place finish at the Division II state meet Nov. 3 at Michigan International Speedway in Brooklyn.

Last year, the Bulldogs placed 18th at the state meet. Entering this season, Chelsea returned only one of its top five runners from a year ago.

"We had the potential to be merely an average or a poor team," said Chelsea coach Eric Swager. "I really had no expectation that we would be a top 10 team, but we were."

Swager said Chelsea began training for this season's state meet last year.

"We started running consistently and running hard all winter," he said. "Mark Smith, Nick Hewitt and Geoff Smith-Woolams were the most dedicated, braving snowdrifts to build up their strength."

"As spring rolled around, they continued their hard work through the track season."

In the summer, the Bulldogs were joined by freshman August Pappas.

"I was amazed at their dedication and their willingness to push themselves on a daily basis," Swager said. "Although not the most talented squad, they basically

worked themselves into respectability. "Throughout the year, they were joined by several others and as the season progressed, all runners got stronger and more competitive."

Swager said he knew he had a special bunch after the highly competitive Portage Invitational Oct. 6.

"On a 90 degree plus day, the guys ran tough and finished sixth out of 40 schools," he said. "That was a fine effort."

In the state regional meet at Haslett, the Bulldogs began asserting themselves, finishing second out of 15 teams.

"Our regional meet was a thing of beauty," Swager said. "We surprised people with our strategy."

Swager said the key to this past season was Chelsea's focus on strength training and long tempo runs.

"We did less speed work than any other season," he said. "I'm convinced of the benefits of this plan. In every big meet, we dominated the last half of the race. The state meet was almost comical, as we passed people like they were standing still. The top three runners moved up from 100th place at the mile, to all finishing in the top 40."

Selected All-Region for the Bulldogs were Peter Wilke, Eyster and Pappas.


Eyster also earned Academic All-State honors for Chelsea.

The Bulldogs finished second in the Southeastern Conference White Division.


Swager said the success of this past season was due to many factors.

split the uprights and East Lansing led 24-0 with 3:46 remaining in the third quarter.

It's not often the Bulldogs find themselves trailing at Jerry Niehaus Field. And the 24-point second half deficit might have been one of the largest ever in the Bush-led era at home.

In true heroic fashion, however, Chelsea refused to quit. While the Trojans were celebrating on the sidelines, the Bulldogs were tightening their chinstraps and preparing themselves for one final push.

To begin the fourth quarter, Chelsea senior Chris Schmelz brought the faithful to their feet returning an East Lansing punt down to the Trojans' 37-yard line. For the first time all night, the Bulldogs were threatening. Nine plays later, senior tight end Scott Naab caught a four-yard touchdown pass from Adams. Sophomore Nick Hill was wide open in the end zone for the two-point conversion pass trimming East Lansing's lead to 24-8 with 9:34 remaining in the game.

On the following kickoff, Chelsea attempted an onside kick. The Trojans pounced on the ball at the Bulldogs' 47-yard line. On fourth and one, the Bulldog defense stood tall, jamming the line of scrimmage and tackling Harper for no gain.

With momentum clearly on Chelsea's side, the Bulldogs began a 12-play, 62-yard scoring drive. With its season on the line, Chelsea converted two fourth down plays before Hill scored on a two-yard run over right tackle. Again, Hill caught the two-point conversion pass and suddenly East Lansing's lead had shrunk to 24-16 with 4:40 left in the fourth quarter.

The Trojan sideline, which had been boisterous and a little over-confident heading into the fourth quarter, was now quiet.

With the Bulldog crowd rising to a fever pitch, East Lansing took over on its ensuing possession at its own 10-yard line. On a third and four from its own 30-yard line, Chelsea's defense, once again, rose to the occasion stopping the Trojans and forcing a punt.

With 1:32 remaining, the Bulldogs began their last drive of the night at their own 40-yard line, 60 yards away from potentially tying a game which looked hope-



lessly lost entering the fourth quarter.

With their backs to the wall, the Trojans dug in and battled hard. While most teams would have wilted under Chelsea's constant fourth quarter pressure, East Lansing proved its seven-game winning streak entering the regional final was no fluke. The Trojans forced the Bulldogs into a fourth and eight play from their own 42-yard line. With the seconds ticking away, East Lansing forced an incomplete pass regaining possession of the ball and ending the game.

"I was proud of the guys," Feraco said. "The momentum changed in the fourth quarter, but we were able to fight it off."

Adams finished the night 6-of-22 for 65 yards with two interceptions. East Lansing's Cameron Bruce was 5-of-7 for 66 yards.

Hill ended up with 106 yards rushing on 28 attempts with one TD. Senior Donny Riedel had 22 yards on two tries. Besides Harper, senior fullback Eric Couthen had 45 yards on eight carries.

Schmelz had two catches for 27 yards, while Riedel had two receptions for 17 yards and junior Michael Lenneman one catch for 17 yards. Junior Brian Spencer had three receptions for 55 yards to lead the Trojans.

Chelsea finished with 196

yards of total offense. East Lansing had 354 total yards.

The Bulldogs had three turnovers, including two interceptions and one lost fumble. East Lansing also had five sacks.

Senior linebacker Taylor Hopkins led Chelsea with nine tackles. Junior defensive end Dakota Risner had eight stops, while senior defensive back Jake Galarowic and junior defensive back Michael Roberts each had seven tackles for the Bulldogs.

Senior linebacker Eric McDowell paced the Trojans with 10 tackles and two sacks.

"We did a lot of uncharacteristic things in the first half," Bush said. "Who knows why? For three quarters we couldn't do anything right. I was proud of our guys. We competed to the very end. We gave ourselves a chance. We made some plays in the fourth quarter, but we came up short."

Bush said Chelsea would recover from the regional final disappointment.

"These guys are all champions," he said. "There is no shame in losing. We're all disappointed because I think we all thought we had a chance to take the next step. It's not going to happen this year, but we'll be back."





Chelsea native Louis Dreyer and his wife Jana used to love sailing along the North Carolina shores in their boat, the Serendipity, and later, the Serendipity, Too.

They lived in Tar Heel country for a year, before Dreyer lost his voice to throat cancer.

Dreyer, who uses an external machine to read the resonance in his throat as he talks and mimic his words, said he was not ready to sail off into the sunset. So he decided he

needed a new hobby to fall in love with and opened a bookstore in Chelsea. It's a romantic story that's not about to end anytime soon.

The Serendipity Paperback Book Exchange has been in the exchange business in Chelsea since 1985. Originally housed in a small house near Merkel's, before it was demolished to make way for a parking lot, the bookstore is now located in the Masonic Lodge on Middle Street in Chelsea.

"I was all set to pack it up, when (a member of) the Masonic Lodge told me they had this space, so I jumped

at the chance," said Dreyer, now in his seventies.

The Dreyers began locally with 2,500 volumes that has since grown to more than 18,000 books. All of the wooden bookshelves in the store were made by Dreyer, as were the oil paintings hanging on the wall behind the front desk. What's great about Serendipity is there is always something new. Books come and go each day, so you'll never know what you might find on a particular day.


Dreyer said he enjoys reading all kinds of books, but his favorites are written

You see them on all the CSI shows, all the hospital dramas, on PBS and Discovery Channel, those large, elaborate microscopes which seem capable of peering into the innermost secrets of human life, plants, metals, "trace" material; and some things too yucky to talk about.

These technological wonders are right up Mager Scientific's alley. In fact, Mager's first Dexter facility was in the barn in the alley just off Central across from Monument Park.

Right here in Dexter, at their current location on Baker Road, Mager Scientific assembles those wonders to order.

This is not a microscope shop you might visit before Christmas to purchase one for your budding genius; although there've been those who tried. This is the birthplace of really high tech, really scientific, really specialized, REALLY expensive microscopes for REALLY serious research.

Using Nikon components, Mager Scientific can assemble a microscope that will search out almost anything you can think of. Their business cards list digital cameras and image analysis, Leica EM equipment, metallurgical equipment and supplies, Nikon microscopes; instruments for microscopy, Metallography and ultramicrotomy.

Linda Lutz is owner and president of the firm which employees 16 people currently, evenly divided between sales force and office staff. Peggy Smith is general manager. Employees come from Dexter, west to Jackson and south to Grass Lake.

Although a portion of their business comes from local university and research facilities, they sell to universities all over the country and to hospitals

and health care related research clients as well. Automotive research and anything where close observation is important can and have come to Mager.


Linda Lutz admits that they serve a narrow market, but she likes the small business aspect of the company; the ability to focus on a product and do it extremely well.

In the 1980's Francis Collins of the University of Michigan used equipment designed by Mager for his DNA research findings. 




sophisticated gray cubicle walls which look like small buildings, the colorful framed copies of photos taken through the microscopes of plant cells, the inner workings of the human body, metals, and other wonderful things usually unseen by the human eye.

These works of art are the result of a yearly contest Nikon holds, which recognizes the work of those folks in the lab whose dedicated peering into their microscope lenses produces wonders of science and technology. The 12 best are included in a calendar each year.

Since its founding in 1961, Mager has served the scientific and medical community. They have seen very little turnover among their staff members who seem to like this business, which concentrates on the "small world" revealed through the microscope.

As a company, Mager, participates in community

efforts, which are special to their employees: the three-day Breast Cancer Walk; Big Brothers and Big Sisters; Dexter Family Services and others. They consider themselves "behind the scenes" people in these efforts, although Manager Peggy Smith took part in that the-day walk herself.

Out on the lawn, toward Baker Road, stands a statue created by Ronald Farrington Sharp in 1988 in his Dexter studio. When Mager's new building was planned for this site, Linda Lutz purchased the statue, which had lived in the walkway between Sharp's Studio and the Dexter Bakery. Its title is "La Raza" which translates to "The People."

The figures gaze off to the north, away from the building, looking at the larger world, while Mager serves those who look at the smallest parts of it. Since 1961, they have responded to their customers by asking "What do you need?" Then proceeded to put together the right components to do the job in industry, education and medicine.

Local U-M student part of archeological dig team

A University of Michigan senior spent part of the summer helping to uncover part of Spain's distant past as a member of an archeological team.

Daniel Schauder of Chelsea was on of about a dozen college students from all over the world to participate in ArchaeoSpain's monthlong excavation of a fifth-century B.C. settlement in central Spain in July.

"I've been interested in archeology for about two years," said Schauder.

"Anthropology is my major, and archeology is a part of that," he added. "I always liked history, so it was just natural, I guess."

ArchaeoSpain is an educational archaeological organization based in Connecticut and Madrid, Spain.

Founded in 2000, it is a non-profit organization created by a group of cultural resource specialists.

"Our joint Spanish-international crews have uncovered priceless information about Spain's ancient past," said ArchaeoSpain director Mike Elkin.

According to Elkin, Schauder's tasks included excavation and mapping the site, in addition to extracting and cataloging artifacts.



Schauder's team explored a burial ground outside a previously excavated settlement known as Pintia, near present-day Valladolid.

"Over the past few years, archeologists have uncovered around 100 burials, most of them belonging to warriors and featuring a bounty of war-related artifacts," Elkin said.

"Research in this area of the site is helping investigators to better understand the social organization of these pre-Roman peoples."

According to Schauder, the team unearthed pottery used for various purposes, including the burial of cremated human remains.

"We found a lot of not-so-exciting stuff — lots of pieces of pottery, little fragments — but some of the more interesting stuff was dagger

blades and spear points.

"We did find some completely whole pots that contained the remains of people," he said.

"We also found a lot of personal effects. They will do testing on the jars to see if there were some that held wine or milk."

Schauder, who graduates in May, said he would like to continue this kind of work.

"This was my first time — I think I'd like to do this for a few years after college," he said.

"I knew I wanted to do some field work before I graduated. I didn't do it for class credit, just good experience when I try to get a job."

While Schauder said he found that particular era of interest, he wouldn't mind digging even deeper into history, so to speak.

"Overall it was a good experience," he said, "but there are aspects of prehistorical archeology that I would like to look into."

Since it was not university-sponsored, Schauder had to pay for the privilege of participating in the expedition.

"It was about \$2,000 total," he said. "Meals and lodging was included, but not the airfare."

"I would do it again, the money thing is an issue, I need to be making money

instead of spending it," he added.

It wasn't all digging in the dirt of an ancient civilization, however; Schauder and his colleagues had the opportunity to travel to nearby areas and soak up some modern culture.

"Five days a week we worked out in the field or back at the lab cleaning pottery, but on weekends we could take tours and trips," he said.

"I got a lot out of both, really; I really enjoyed both aspects."

As such, the Rules and Regulations adopted herein must establish procedures for the Authority's Sewer System and accommodate, where applicable, those rules and regulations of the Leoni Sewer Use Ordinance.

The objectives of these Rules and Regulations are: to prevent the introduction of pollutants into the wastewater which will interfere with the normal operation of the systems or contaminate the resulting municipal sludge; to prevent the introduction of the pollutants into the wastewater system which do not receive adequate treatment in the Leoni wastewater treatment plant, and which will pass through the system into receiving waters or the atmosphere or otherwise be incompatible with the system; to improve the opportunity to recycle and reclaim wastewater and sludge from the system. H. No zoning permit, building permit, or certificate of occupancy, or other Permit or certificate may be issued (even if consistent with the ZBA's Decision) until the ZBA certifies its decision in writing or approves the Minutes of its decision, which shall occur no later than the next ZBA meeting after the decision.


