Chelsea woman's amazing story of tragedy leads her on a mission to save lives

Patty Jo Herndon has met tragedy far too often in her short life. The late-night knock on the door when the news is cold, hard and sudden. Or the hours or days in the hospital watching and praying and knowing in your heart that this is goodbye. Patty's tragedy comes in all shapes and sizes and ages: Her mother. Her father. Her sister. Her brother. Her nephew.

And last year when her 16-year-old niece, whom she helped raise for the past 10 years, was being prepped for life-threatening brain surgery, she had to wonder when will it end. Or will it ever end.

Patty Jo Herndon has witnessed the end too often. Too many funerals. Too many big decisions. Too much suffering. Enough!

Facts you should know about organ and tissue donation

- In Michigan, there are more than 2,500 people currently waiting for a life-saving kidney transplant. Nearly 3,100 people are currently waiting in Michigan for all types of organs.

- In Michigan, 881 organs were transplanted in 2007.

- Organs and tissues that can be transplanted, after a person has died, include kidneys, heart, liver, lungs, pancreas, bones, corneas, skin and other soft tissues.

- Another way of obtaining organs and tissues for transplantation is from people who are still alive. Kidneys, bone marrow, partial liver, lung and pancreas can come from living donors.

- Organ and tissue donation is supported by all major religions.

- There is no charge to you or your family for donation.

- People who receive donated organs are selected on the basis of medical criteria, urgency of need and length of time waiting for a transplant.

- To register your name on the Michigan Organ & Tissue Donor List visit www.gifttolifemichigan.org.

- Registering your name and talking to your family are the most important things you can do to indicate your wish to become an organ donor after your death. Joining the Registry or signing the back of your license are both legally binding and your family cannot overrule your wishes.

She places it on the table, takes a seat and begins to talk about Ellen.

The picture suddenly comes

to life. There are funny stories that go with this picture as the blonde hair glistens brighter. There are lessons learned from this picture as the blue eyes become even more mesmerizing.

Patty talks with great pride and admiration and love for her sister.

"She taught me how to be a good person," says Patty, who

Council tabs contractor for sewer plant upgrade

A Howell-based construction firm was selected Tuesday as general contractor for the upcoming expansion of the city's Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP).

Bids from several firms were opened on July 30, and at \$10,640,000. Irish Construction was approved as the low bidder at a special session of the City Council on Tuesday.

City Director of Utilities Brad Roberts introduced Tom Allbaugh of engineering consulting firm Tetra Tech, who examined the bids and made the recommendation to council on the selection.

The city elected to pre-qualify the 13 bidders, according to Allbaugh. Seven were asked for bids, but one dropped out before replying.

"The city got six bids, and all were excellent," Allbaugh said.

"We have a lot of experience with (Irish Construction); we met with them after the bid opening and went over the provisions of the contract."

"All things considered, we feel pretty confident in recommending them."

Roberts recommended that the council accept \$50,000 in carpentry and equipment add-ons to the base bid, for a total bid of \$10,690,000.

"It's a firm bid, not to exceed that amount," said

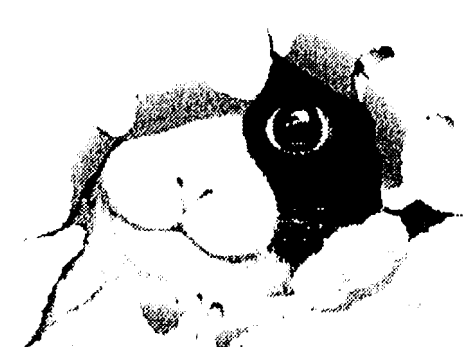

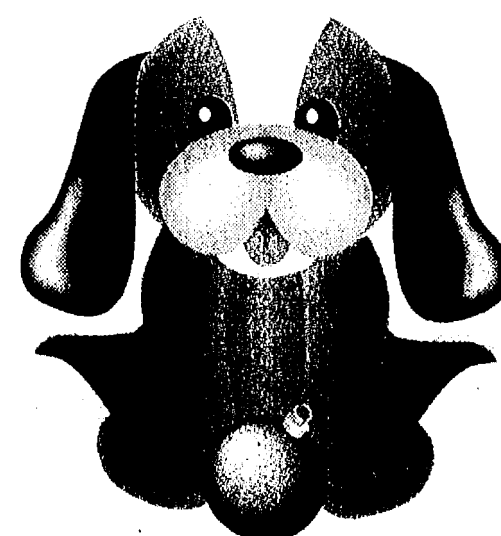

'Voters sent a clear message'

Schauer wins close primary, turns his attention to Walberg

In a close race for Michigan's 7th Congressional District, state Sen. Mark Schauer, D-District 19, defeated fellow Democrat Sharon Renier in Tuesday's primary election.

Schauer finished with 3,398 votes to Renier's 2,192 votes. He will now go on to face Republican incumbent U.S. Rep. Tim Walberg in the general election in November.

"Our campaign is a building process," he said. "I credit our success to the aggressive grassroots work of our supporters. On Tuesday the voters sent a clear message that they want someone who has the proven track record to fight for Michigan."



Mark Schauer garnered 2,076 votes to Sharon Renier's 1,500 votes.

"Tuesday marked the starting gun for our sprint to changing Washington in November. Voters now have a clear choice between someone who will roll up their sleeves to help turn Michigan's economy around, one job at a time. I have a strong record of working with Democrats and Republicans to save

and create jobs. I'll support an energy plan that puts the needs of consumers ahead of record profits for big oil companies, and I'll get started on day one fixing what's broken in Washington."

Schauer said he enjoyed campaigning against Renier and has high regard for his former opponent.

"I always respect my opponents and I have been completely positive from day one in my campaign," he said. "Sharon exhibits the spirit of change we need in Michigan. I wish her the best."

Looking forward to the November election, Schauer said his campaign will immediately begin focusing

on Walberg and his track record in the U.S. House.

"We absolutely will focus on the differences between us," he said. "I have a strong record of fighting to turn Michigan's economy around while Tim Walberg continues to serve as a rubber stamp for the Bush administration in Washington."

Walberg says he's ready for campaign

U.S. Rep. Tim Walberg said he called Senator Mark Schauer on Tuesday and congratulated him on his Democrat primary victory.

"I and urged that the campaign ahead be focused on how to help Michigan families, improve our economy and develop new energy sources," said Walberg, who will face Schauer in November's general election.

"I am working to eliminate wasteful government spending and stop tax increases while Senator Schauer was the deciding vote in favor of the largest tax increase in Michigan history. Senator Schauer even introduced a bill to raise the income tax by 18 percent. I am fighting to increase American energy production and develop renewable alternatives, while Senator Schauer opposes expanding oil drilling."

"The future of Michigan is at stake and I look forward to the discussion on how to bring jobs, hope, and opportunity to the citizens of south central Michigan."

There's a new sheriff in town

Clayton easily defeats incumbent Minzey

After an eight-year tenure, Daniel Minzey will not serve as sheriff of Washtenaw County after November.

Minzey, who was making a bid to run for his third term, was unseated in Tuesday's primary election by retired first lieutenant Jerry Clayton who won the Democratic nod and will face Dwayne Taylor, the lone Republican in the primary, in the November general election.

Clayton, of Ypsilanti Township, over 54 percent of the vote (16,245 votes), while Minzey just under 40 percent (11,910), in a tight race according to unofficial results posted by the Washtenaw County Clerk's Office Tuesday night. Candidate Iva Jo Bielec received just over 6 percent of the vote.

A veteran of the sheriff's department with more than 20 years experience, Clayton said the residents of Washtenaw County agreed with his message that

change was needed in the sheriff's department and they showed that on Tuesday.

"I think that we were able to get across our message to the people," Clayton said. "We need to get back to engaging the community, developing partnerships with various neighborhood groups, and I think the people saw that something needed to change."

Clayton said he hopes to instill the kind of leadership that he learned serving a number of different positions within the sheriff's office from working as a corrections officer, deputy sheriff, shift sergeant and finally first lieutenant, retiring in 2006. Clayton also is a former Special Weapons and Tactics team member and former executive team member of the Washtenaw

County Sheriff Office Administration.

Clayton is currently a part-time instructor at Washtenaw Community College and faculty member of the National Sheriff Association.

During his final four years as sheriff, Minzey experienced a tumultuous span that was overshadowed by lawsuits and jail overcrowding. Despite the public setbacks he experienced, Minzey said in a previous interview that he stands by the actions he took and that it helped keep deputies on the street.

"One of my biggest issues that I will fight for in this county is to make sure that there are enough police officers to keep it safe," he said.

Minzey could not be reached for comments as of press time.

Local churches dealing with economy

When times are tough, prayer can be a powerful tool. But when tough economic times fall on an entire community — or parish — and churchgoers start passing off the collection basket instead of filling it with spare cash, people such as Nancy Hughes have to get creative.

A member of the Waterloo Village United Methodist Church, Hughes said that she and the church's thirty other parishioners have typically been the only source of funding for upkeep and outreach efforts in the past.

So when windows started to creak, the ceiling of their 200-year-old church started to sag and the money to fix everything just wasn't there, Hughes and the other patrons had to come up with a new way to raise money — something

they've never had to worry much about until lately.

"We just had an ice cream social and we had a big rummage sale for the first time this year that we hadn't had before," Hughes said. "But right now we're really starting to kind of hurt a little bit."

Though they managed to raise about \$2,000 between the two fundraisers, that still leaves the church well short of the \$17,000

they need for repairs. To help raise the rest, Hughes said they've also tried to drum up new members by going to nearby neighbors' front doors.

"We've heard from some other churches that people are just going every other Sunday because of gas prices," Hughes said of Waterloo residents who travel to Chelsea or Jackson to worship. "So we're trying to see if they would rather sup-

port a local church and still come every week."

Though it certainly isn't true that giving is on the decline in every local place of worship, and it might just be the case that Hughes' church is more strapped for cash than others, what most pastors and ministers will say, is that the recent economic downturn has certainly taught them how to stretch a buck.

Pastor Mark Porinsky says his church, Faith Lutheran Church, has been "very blessed financially."

"We did lose one Pfizer family last year, and another key family underwent a job change that took them to California the last three or four months of 2007, but now they're back," Porinsky said. "Other members report slow times with their businesses. But our church giving is

usually better quality," Laeder said.

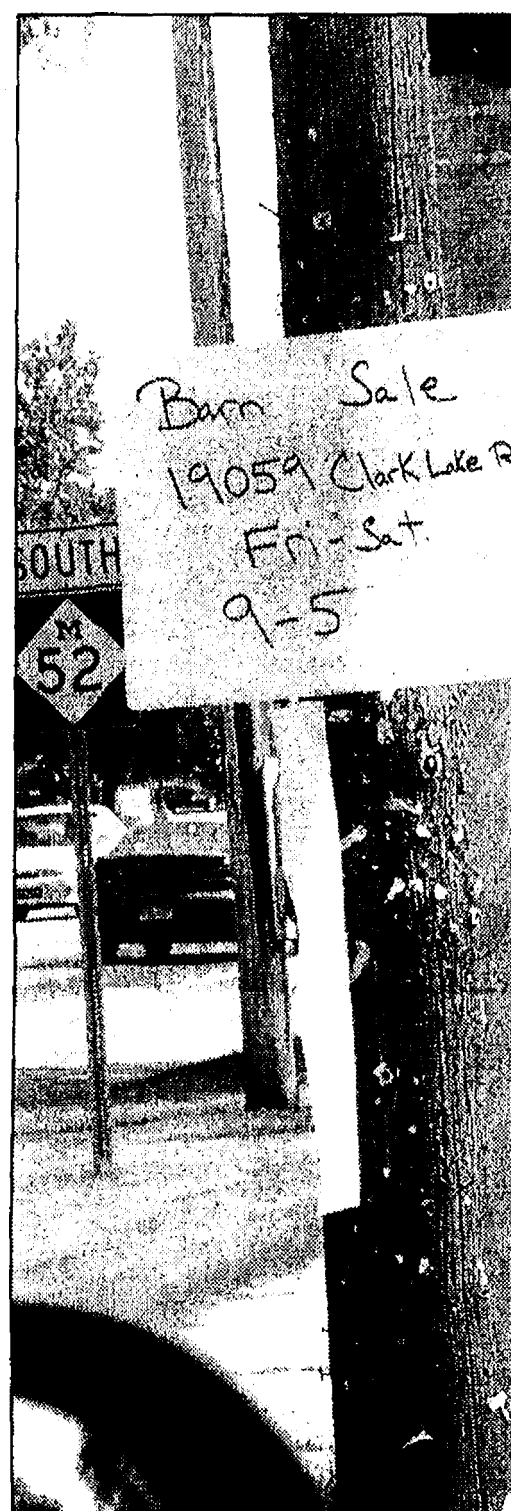
That statement was certainly true of the wagon and tricycle that Laeder picked up at Sandy Peterson's garage sale last Saturday.

ballots was double what I usually get, at about 200."

Election chairwoman Debbie Noye said turnout was high for a primary, at some 26 percent by 7 p.m., an hour before polls closed.

"There has been at least one or two people in here at all times today," Noye said. "We had a busy period mid-morning, about 10 a.m., and again right after lunch."

Voters seemed to represent a cross section of opinions.

"I voted for the Republicans, and I voted for John Francis," said Karen Weldon.

Moments later, a voter with the opposite viewpoint left the township hall.

"I voted for Maryann Noah and the Republicans," said Mary Radu. "I've heard very negative things about John Francis, and I don't want someone like that on the township board."

Radu also reminded people that voting is an important American right.

"It's a privilege to be able to vote, especially with what we see going on in other countries."

On the other hand, there was no fierce contest on the Democratic side of the ballot.

"The biggest race was for Congress," said Mary Ann Schwartz. "(Mark) Schauer is the best candidate. I like his positions, and I think he'll do

a good job."

Added Brad Hewitt: "I voted Democratic. (Sheriff Dan) Minzey was the most important race."

Final turnout was heavy at more than 29 percent of the township's 2,017 registered voters.

Roberts in response to a citizen's inquiry.

The company will honor that price for several weeks, Allbaugh added.

"The bid hold period is 90 days to arrange for financing from the state; they will honor that price until then."

Roberts and Mayor Ann Feeney pointed out the council can choose from several options to repay the bond obligations.

"The good news is that we won't have to start paying it back until 2011," Feeney said.

Roberts concurred: "The (Department of Environmental Quality) has approved the council's three or four options to pay back the bond."

"The state has to have this in their hands by Aug. 8 to give their blessing, but I find it hard to believe they would deny it now."

The council unanimously approved a resolution to award the contract to Irish Construction for \$10,640,000 contingent on successful financial arrangements with the State Revolving Fund program.

The program allows municipalities to borrow large sums of money as 20-year bonds at very low interest, typically around 2 percent.

After contingencies and a number of professional fees, the final amount of the bond was settled at \$11,740,000.

Roberts explained that the city originally applied for a \$12 million bond two years ago to pay for not only the Wastewater Treatment Plant improvements but upgrades to the Veterans Park pumping station as well.

"The state made us separate that project into the two parts," Roberts reminded the council.

At the time, he explained, \$1 million was set aside for the Vets Park project, leaving \$11 million for the WWTP work.

However, the Vets Park project was finished earlier this year at a cost of only \$260,000 so the remaining \$740,000 was returned to the WWTP project budget for a total of \$11,740,000.

Council member Bill Holmberg pointed out that the numbers seemingly contradict earlier council activity.

"My concern is that we appear to be doing something deceptive," he said.

"After last week's town hall meeting, I'm quite sure people were left with the impression that the amount of the project is only \$11 million."

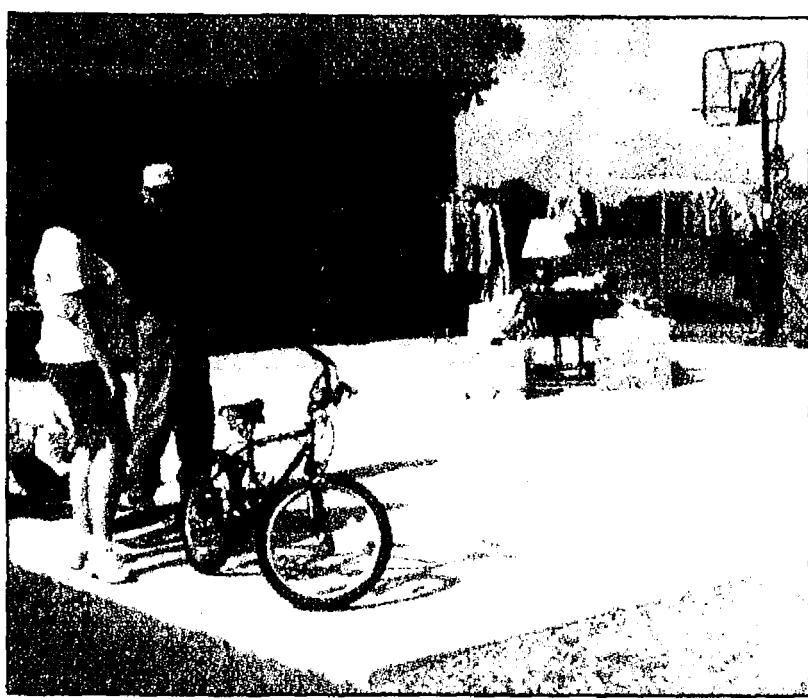

better than last year, and so much higher than expected that last month the Church Council had me offer a prayer of thanksgiving during a worship service, for the Lord's financial blessings in these difficult economic times."

Porinsky said it's been his practice for most of the 30 years he's been here to preach one financial sermon per year. "And I haven't changed that these past few years," he said.

Joy Barrett, senior pastor at the United Methodist Church of Chelsea, says this rough economic stretch means asking questions such as, "Is this something we really need?" before any major or minor expenditure.

Barrett said the church has seen less money come in during recent months, but said they've made up for the loss by cutting back on utility expenses, evaluating the budget more carefully, and postponing non-essential projects.

As a result, Barrett said the church hasn't had to cut any programs or outreach efforts. She also mentioned that the tough economic times have even made some parishioners get more creative - donating their time and talents, rather than just pulling out their checkbooks every week.

Despite the success of the church as a whole, though,

Barrett said some individual members have been faced with their own set of economic woes.

"We have several families who have moved away as a result of job losses or anticipated job losses," Barrett said. "And we have several members who have lost their employment and are looking for work."

But the employment pinch hasn't just hit members of Barrett's church, and as a result, outreach organizations such as Faith in Action of Chelsea have had to handle more requests for help - from both churchgoers and non-churchgoers alike.

And for Nancy Paul, an increase in need is something she's prepared for. The Faith in Action director said there has been a steady 10 to 20 percent increase in need every year since about 2003.

But even with a 31 percent increase in the number of people asking for food, and more than double the number of families coming in to shop for clothing, Paul

said community generosity has allowed Faith in Action to both maintain and expand all of their programs.

Just this year for example, Paul said Faith in Action had record-breaking attendance at their annual community fundraiser.

"That kind of support makes our job a joy even in these hard times," Paul said.

Matt Hook, pastor at Dexter United Methodist Church, said 25 percent of their Ad Council worked at Pfizer or was a Pfizer spouse.

"It hit us in a big way emotionally," he said. "But the church was very supportive of all the families affected. We were in the middle of a three-year capital campaign when that hit. Our capital campaign was completed this past June. Pledges were \$1.6 million, and we were a bit short, though we were able to complete all the projects we planned."

Hook said more people are looking for work, and

the church's hunger hamper gets emptied most weeks.

"Nevertheless, our giving is actually up this year over last," he said. "People seem to be relying more on the church and our mission to make a difference in the world. Our mission's giving is up, and the number of projects people are attempting keeps us very busy trying to meet people's needs."

Jeff Crowder, pastor at Church of the Nazarene, says they are trying to be proactive by offering financial peace seminars that aim at helping people make good money decisions, starting with getting out of debt.

"We see it as a good time to partner with other groups to help those less fortunate," Crowder said. "We are in a partnership with a group of Lutheran churches in Ann Arbor for Habitat for

Humanity. We have roofed new homes the last three years in a row, hoping to help a few more people own their own homes."

Crowder said several people from their congregation work with their Venture Crew that is sponsored by the United Methodist Church.

"They went to the Cass Corridor and did some renovation work so that people who had been homeless

would have a room and a place to make their own meals," he said.

"Yes, we have seen some people affected by the housing crisis. We have had several who are seeing their benefits reduced, such as increased costs or reduced coverages for health insurance. On a regular basis we keep a small food pantry stocked, and we are in regular communication with Faith in Action."

When the Detroit City

Reports surfaced on July 24 that the mayor was involved in an alleged shoving and shouting match with two officers of the court trying to serve a summons on one of the mayor's friends.

At first the governor's office was not quite sure what transpired, but then the Wayne County sheriff expressed his concerns and the two officers testified in open court on what they saw. As a former federal prosecutor, the governor took notice. The matter was moving from a "he said, she said" text-messaging scandal to something more serious.

Even though the mayor's baristers attempted to downplay the alleged incident, the governor moved her foot carefully toward the accelerator.

That same weekend the two major Detroit newspapers upped the ante by publishing some scathing editorials calling on the mayor to get out of town for the umpteenth time.

It's a good guess that over the weekend, the governor contemplated the ins and outs of moving up the schedule, including reserving the right to hold a hearing on the issue on Sept. 3.

She was careful to indicate the hearing on the mayor's future would be conducted only if it was "warranted" based on the material everyone presented.

However, all this may be moot. It is anticipated that the mayor's legal team will file a flurry of motions, court actions and who knows what all to stall her role.

If the mayor wins, the governor will be off the hook for the time being, making it a win-win for her. She can say she was doing her part to end the nightmare in Motown, but the courts told her to stop. There would be no crying in her office if that happened.

But if the courts give her a green light, what will she do then? Her critics will be waiting for the blond lady to sing.

Serious issues in day care program need to be addressed

In light of the State's recent audits of the Department of Human Services (DHS) Child Day Care program, it has become very clear that there are some serious issues within the department that need to be addressed in order to keep our children safe and ensure that the taxpayers' money is spent wisely.

According to the audit, hundreds of Michigan day care providers have criminal

histories, including convictions for sex offenses and child abuse. A week later, another report was released that showed DHS overpaid at least \$147 million for childcare between October 2003 and March 2006.

Not only are we letting questionable individuals take care of our kids, but taxpayers have been cheated by a system rampant with fraud, and inadequate

checks and balances. The state has even been paying money to the deceased and the incarcerated. It needs to stop now.

Earlier this year, I introduced legislation that can address these problems with the department. Some of the highlights of the plan include:

- Require parent or guardian documentation of work, school or other qualifying activities to prove that paid care hours are, in fact, needed;

- Require DHS to go after money owed to the State due to fraud, and encourage prosecution of those responsible for

defrauding the day care program;

- Restrict day care payments made to people living in the child's home; and,

- Give DHS the authority to perform enhanced background checks on day care providers.

In addition, by cleaning up the system, we can use the funds that are being misspent on fraud to reinvest in our legitimate care providers, which will allow more low income parents who need quality day care to get back to work. These essential reforms will result in safer places for our children, fewer inaccuracies, less fraud and more money saved by the State in the long run.

The fraudulent activities taking place in the child day care program isn't only putting our children at risk, but they are costing taxpayers millions and hurting legitimate day care providers. Most of the day care providers are honest, but the actions of a few are having a negative effect on many. I can't stress to the Senate enough how important it is that they pass this legislation to keep our children safe and save the taxpayers millions of dollars.

Helping veterans should be a priority

This is supporting our troops? We don't think so.

Injured vets, in some cases, are losing their homes and other possessions waiting to receive disability benefits from the government.

Yes, we know the list of men and women needing help is extensive. In fact, each month, about 1,800 veterans seek guidance in applying for benefits from the Department of Veterans Affairs at the Detroit office of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, reports Gary Putinski, a VFW service officer.

In addition, another 7,500 injured veterans or family members go to one of the three Oakland County Veterans' Services offices for help each year. Many served between World War II and the current conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan, said division manager Diana Calvin.

The VFW and other organizations such as the Disabled American Veterans and the Paralyzed Veterans of America help injured veterans and their families work through the bureaucratic maze of paperwork to get monthly financial assistance. But the organizations are barely keeping up.

As an example, the number of veterans needing benefits in Oakland County alone has increased by several percent each year since the Iraq War started in March 2003. Lack of money and manpower to help veterans seek

benefits are primary problems.

"We're not going to get more money," Calvin said of the division that is funded by Oakland County to the tune of \$2 million this year. Because funds are tight, she says Oakland County's Veterans' Services Division is going to close its Walled Lake office and transfer workers to the Pontiac office effective Oct. 1. There's also a third office in Troy.

However, there are only 12 counselors in Calvin's division to help thousands of veterans file paperwork to receive benefits. The system is overwhelmed, local and state veterans officials say.

"We're actually tightening our belt," Calvin said, noting five workers recently took severance offers.

"Unfortunately, when we lose a counselor, the workload has to be absorbed by the remaining counselors. It's a lot more difficult. We're spread out too thin."

Depending upon the case, it takes

the average veteran three months to a year to get benefits for which he has applied. This is absolutely too long. It's easy to see where a veteran can lose his or her home and other possessions with such delays in receiving what they rightfully deserve.

Ironically, money allocated by Congress in recent years to help veterans increased. The current federal VA medical budget is \$39.1 billion and is scheduled to increase next year to more than \$42 billion.

Supporting the troops is more than just sending them care packages when they are overseas and cheering their return. Veterans need to be shown appreciation and given physical, psychological, job placement and financial help when needed once they've returned home and back to their civilian lives.

It's not just the patriotic or compassionate thing to do, but the right thing to do.

Where funds are available, a priority needs to be placed on more efficiently distributing the money. If there's not enough funds to help veterans apply for benefits, then the money needs to be found.

Helping all veterans, particularly disabled veterans once they are home, should be a top priority. If we can't help them after they've returned, then supporting the troops is no more than lip service.

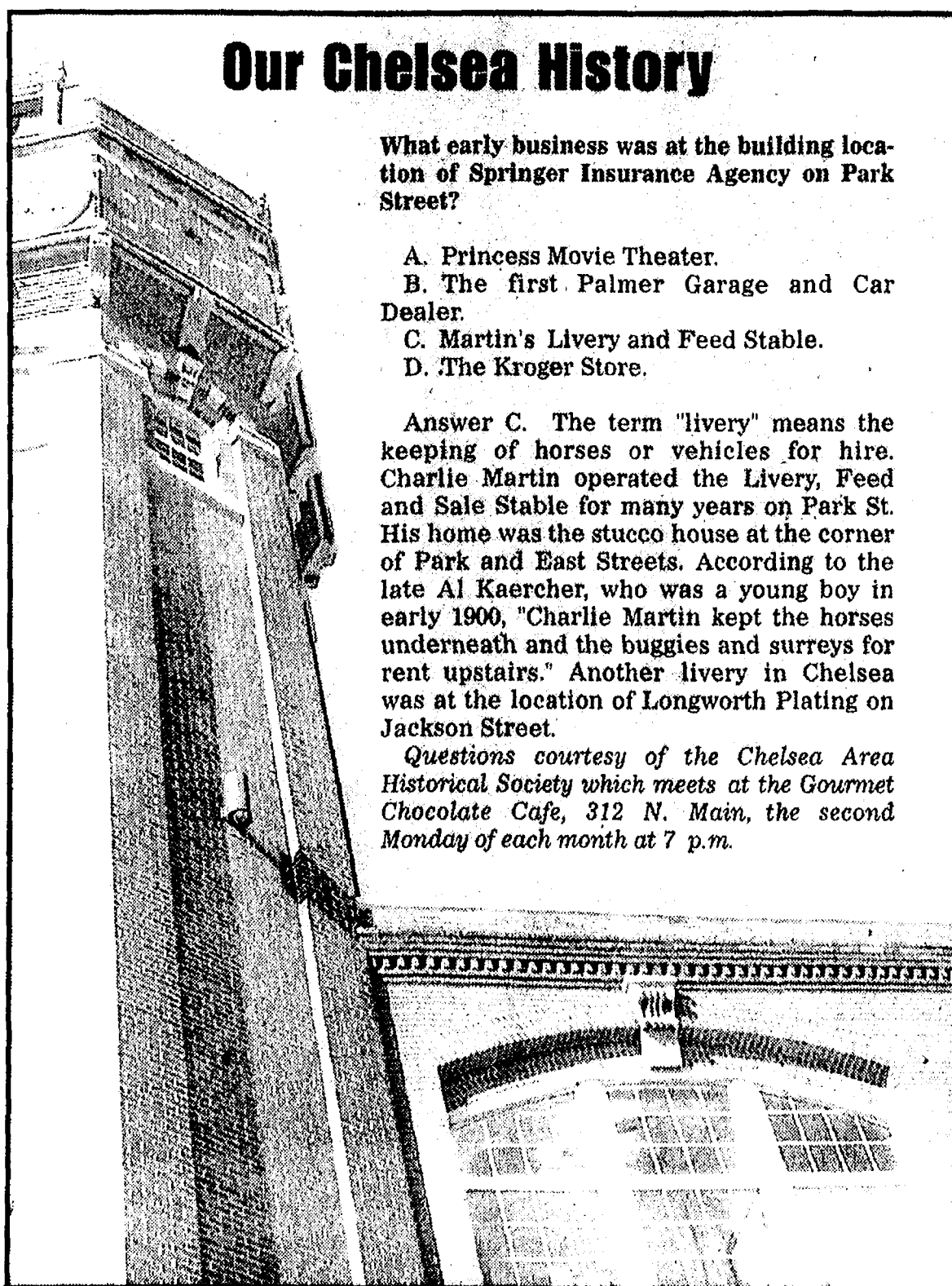

Another livery in Chelsea was at the location of Longworth Plating on Jackson Street.

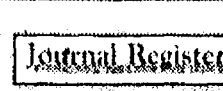
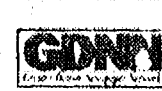

Pelosi 'turns out the lights on energy debate'

With gas prices hovering around \$4, House Speaker Nancy Pelosi moved into action this week. But rather than address energy issues, leadership in the House put forward a motion to adjourn the House until September without debating on or voting on America's current energy crisis.

"I voted against this adjournment resolution, but unfortunately the vote passed 213-212," said Rep. Tim Walberg, R-District 7. "So (last) Friday morning, when the House adjourned, several members of Congress stayed on the floor, hoping to give speeches to the American people about the fact that leadership in this Congress packed its bags and headed off for a five week vacation. Before we could begin speaking, Speaker Pelosi had the lights turned off in the House chamber and forced CSPAN to turn off its cameras."

The blackout, however, didn't stop Walberg and his colleagues from giving speeches calling for a vote on increasing energy production.

"It is unconscionable that Speaker Pelosi would choose vacation over having a debate on energy policy, especially when there are signs that members of Congress, on both sides of the aisle, are coming together to work on real energy solutions," he said.

Last Wednesday, a bi-partisan group of legislators unveiled a new energy plan that would lift most restrictions on offshore drilling and encourage the development of alternative energy sources.

"This is a strong attempt to break through partisanship and work on a comprehensive energy plan," Walberg said. "Yet, Speaker Pelosi and other leaders in Congress are unwilling to

stick around. I believe President Bush should call a special session of Congress and force Speaker Pelosi to address gas prices."

According to Article II, Section 3 of the United States Constitution, the President has the power "on extraordinary occasions" to convene the Congress.

"High gas prices demand action, and right now the American people are being let down by Congressional leadership," Walberg said. "We need to put all energy options on the table. More drilling, more alternatives, more conservation...this Congress needs to get serious and work on a comprehensive plan that includes all of the above and ends our dependence on Middle East oil."

Stabenow praises legislation

U.S. Senator Debbie Stabenow (D-Michigan) last week made the following statement regarding unanimous Senate passage of the Great Lakes Compact resolution, which will establish new rules to protect the Great Lakes from serious threats:

"I am very pleased that all of my Senate colleagues pledged their support of our Great Lakes, which are among our nation's most valuable resources and remain a vital component of the economies of our state, region and country. The Great Lakes Compact will help keep our Great Lakes safe from the dangers of water diversion and invasive species, while making conservation a priority. The Compact puts into writing what we all know - our Great Lakes must be protected and preserved for future generations."



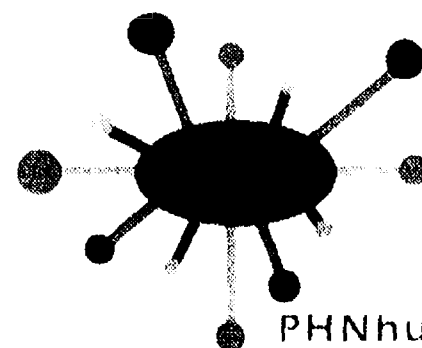

Break away from the restaurant routine at Chelsea's Breakaway

Low lighting and a pleasant aroma welcome anyone who enters the Breakaway Restaurant and Bar, located on the upper level of the Arctic Coliseum.

Customers will find themselves surrounded by televised sports and glass-block walls that glow in alternating shades of green, blue and violet.

Rich Colensky is the general manager of the Breakaway, and has translated his enthusiasm and 30 years of experience into making this icy hangout an important feature in Chelsea.

"We're really trying to be a part of the town," he said. "You'd be surprised how many people don't know we're here."

Describing it as an upscale sports bar and family restaurant, Colensky said that since his arrival he and his staff have been brainstorming for new ideas for daily specials, as well as other interesting ways to feed customers.

Some of the most recent ideas and specials include a summer salad and dessert pizza.

Ribs were featured on Father's Day, while on Mother's Day, moms had the chance to eat for free.

One of the attractions at The Breakaway is a kitchen area enclosed by windows so customers can observe cooks tossing pizza and making salads.

Arbor establishment when the Breakaway opened in March. He admits his most popular dishes are his soups.

"You won't find a tortilla soup that's better," he said, finding nothing like it any-

where around.

With one banquet hall which seats 100 people and another seating nearly 60, the Breakaway is ready to serve any occasion or event.

Colensky says they can surely meet their customers' needs, whether for a 60-year high school reunion or a worker just off the night shift looking to take time out for him or herself.

Because of the "fun and pleasant" environment, Sanders says being employed there seems less like work.

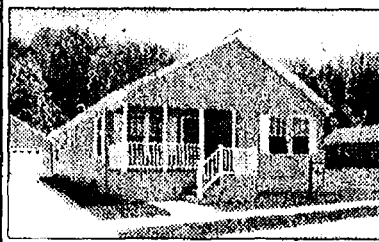

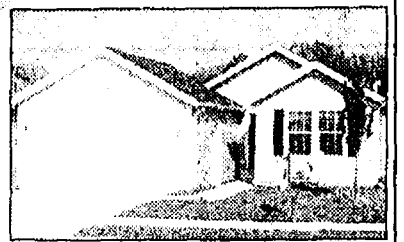

obviously learned that lesson well.

Patty talks about Ellen in the past tense — something else she learned to do well.

While Patty talks about her sister's life and what she meant to her, her eyes begin to well up. It's been more than 10 years since Ellen closed her brilliant blue eyes for the last time, and Patty has told her sister's story countless times, yet the tears still appear.

But with the tears, now comes the smile. Patty's smile lights up the room brighter than the sun sparkling through those back windows.

How, one might ask, can someone who has been introduced to tragedy so many times, still manage to even smile? But this is no ordinary smile. It's bright, filled with hope and promise. It shines, filled with happiness and courage.

And it's forever, leaving a lasting impression.

Patty has somehow, some way learned to mix the tears of tragedy with the joys of her loved ones' lives and what they gave her.

She is all of these people whose lives were cut short and in a way living their lives for them. She brings their memories and personalities to life because even though she has met death too often, Patty Jo is all about life.

Tragedy strikes

"Ellen suffered from headaches and they were getting worse so her husband, Brian, tried to get her to go to the doctors and she didn't," Patty says, beginning a story that she will never feel comfortable telling.

"One day he woke up to go to work and Ellen had gotten up in the middle of the night with a headache and went to lay down on the couch in the living room. He went to wake her up and she raised her hand up like she was OK and for him to go ahead. So he left for work. But when he got to work he had a funny feeling, so he called home and no one answered. So he rushed home and found her unconscious.

"Brian got home and Katie was in her crib and the twins (Michael and Colleen) were in the kitchen making their breakfast because they thought she was just sleeping. He called 911, and my mother, brother Dennis and I got there right after the ambulance and the doctor came out and said she had a brain aneurism and they needed to helicopter her to either U of M or Harper (Hospital in Detroit). My mom and my brother-in-law couldn't speak, so I asked where they could get her to quicker, and he said Harper.

"I remember I asked the doctor if my brother-in-law could go and hold her hand for a minute because she hated hospitals and he said yes. The doctor came back about 15 minutes later and said she had taken a turn for the worse. He said she had no brain activity, and for all intents and purposes, she was dead."

The news was devastating. Tears, cries and screams filled the room, but so did questions about how this could happen so fast and without warning.

But before Patty or her family could ask questions,

the doctor asked them a question that would forever change Patty's life. A question that would turn her tragedy into someone else's lifeline and help Ellen show Patty what it really means to be a "good person."

"The doctor said that he knows this is a difficult time, but asked if we had ever considered organ donation," Patty says. "That was the only time I saw my brother-in-law lift his head up. He said yes.

"She had told him that if anything ever happened to her that he should donate her organs."

Patty takes a deep breath and pauses, a moment to remember her sister. The story will continue with a heroic ending, but not without sacrifice. And Patty

stops briefly to remember the sacrifice that was made. You can't tell the story of what Ellen did after she died without remembering Ellen before she died.

The gift of life

Almost 100,000 people are waiting for an organ transplant in the United States, and in Michigan alone more than 2,500 people are currently waiting for a life-saving kidney transplant.

The numbers are staggering, but it doesn't stop Patty from believing that her wish is not a dream.

"My wish is that no one in the United States will have to die waiting for an organ transplant," she says.

"People die every day in this country waiting for an organ transplant. There is no rea-

son why this should happen."

Because of Ellen Elizabeth Sullivan, three people stopped waiting for transplants and started living their lives again. Ellen's memory and the decision her family made that day — just moments after hearing their loved one was gone — keeps Patty smiling these days.

"When the doctor asked us if we wanted to donate Ellen's organs, we did and Brian was a big reason for that," Patty says. "He made the right decision at a tough time.

"I come from a very large family with 12 children (the Griffins). We all got to the hospital that day with our spouses, and my brother Dennis and I went to get the twins, who were 7 at the time, from school. We went and got Jason, who was a senior at the time, and brought them to the hospital to tell them what had happened. And when we left the hospital room that day the doctor and I will never forget this ... Brian, my son Tim and I were the last three in the room and when we walked out, the doctor grabbed my hand and said, 'You have no idea what gift your sister just gave.'

"And it didn't hit me until later that she saved lives that day and what a generous and unselfish thing it was for her to do in the final moments of her life."

Patty urges families to take some time and talk about organ donation.

"It is such a simple thing to do, but it saves lives," she says. "Your decision to donate your organs can save the lives of eight people, and directly effect the lives of up to 50 people through tissue donation."

Tragedy returns

Jason, who was 17 years old when his mother died, was growing up fast. He was the big brother that the

other three looked up to. Now he had to grow up even faster.

Teenagers usually don't bury their mothers, but he had a large and loving support group to lean on.

The Herndons have always been a close bunch. The 12 children were all grown up and having children of their own. Lots of children.

There were aunts and uncles and nephews and nieces all over the place all the time.

So when Patty and her husband, Walter, volunteered to help raise the kids along with their father, Brian, it was a fairly easy transition.

"They were together all the time anyway so it wasn't like some strangers were now living with us," Patty says.

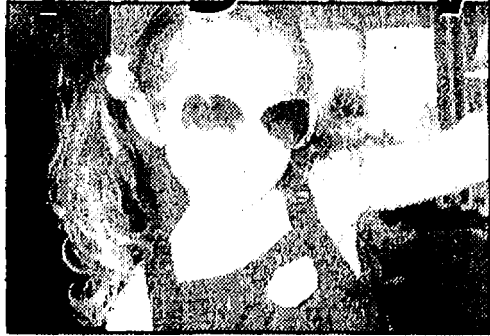
"Brian wanted to raise them on his own and he tried. It was better for everyone that they come live with us. And Brian did move to Chelsea and lives right around the block so he could be close to his kids. He is still their father and a big part of their lives."

Tragedy also was still a part of their lives, however.

Jason, who graduated from Redford High School, had moved to Chelsea and was living with Patty's sister.

Maureen Griffin, when he was killed in an automobile accident three years ago.

"My sister Nancy called me at 3 in the morning and told me to come over right away," Patty says.

"I thought something was wrong with my sister Maureen because her health was bad at the time. We walked in and I saw my sister and asked what was the matter and she told me. I thought, 'How are we going to tell these guys (Ellen's other three children)? They had already been through so much, and now this.'"

Patty said Jason was a wonderful big brother and always looked out for his brother and sisters.

"He loved to cook, was an avid reader, was a huge Red Wings fan," she said. "He loved to play board games and card games with his family and friends, was a great listener and had long-lasting friendships."

The accident came only a year after Patty's mom died suddenly and only months after her brother Richard died on Thanksgiving. A year later, Patty's sister Linda died.

"To say that my family has been through hell in the past 10 years is an understatement," Patty says. "The children have lost so many people in their short lives."

Tragedy returns – again

Almost two years ago, Patty's brother Dennis suffered from a severe brain hemorrhage and was rushed to U-M Hospital and the doctors didn't think he was going to make it.

"We stood there in complete disbelief when the doctors were telling us that they didn't know how this was going to turn out," Patty says. "Dennis survived it and now lives with my sister and has two children."

Two months later, Patty

was out of town when a phone call forced her to return home as soon as possible.

"I was on a business trip in Boston and Colleen usually gets headaches around the same time each month," Patty says.

"My husband called and said Colleen had a headache, but not to worry. The next night he called again and said that she didn't look right to him and was going to run her up to Chelsea Hospital to have her checked out. Neither of us were too worried because we thought it was just a migraine."

Like in Dennis, the doctors discovered a severe brain bleed and rushed Colleen, a Chelsea High School junior at the time, to U-M Hospital in critical condition.

"I landed in Detroit, and on my way from the airport my husband called and said they wanted to do surgery," Patty says. "Then I lost it."

First, Ellen. Then, Jason. And now, Colleen?

Patty couldn't take it. This family had been through enough.

"When I got to the hospital and the elevator doors opened, my whole family was standing there," she says. "The doctor explained what was going on and what they wanted to do. Brian and the rest of the family agreed to have the surgery."

"Before they took her in, Colleen asked me if she was going to die. I said absolutely not. She asked me if she was going to know me when she woke up. I said, absolutely."

As they took Colleen into surgery, the doctor took Patty's hand and made a promise.

"He said to me, 'I will treat her like she's my child until I return her to you,'" Patty said.

The doctor kept his promise.

"When she came to in recovery, they let our entire family into her room so she could see all of us when she opened her eyes," Patty said.

"They had a Wendy's inside the hospital and before she went into surgery she said she wanted a Frosty when she woke up. And her nurse said that when she woke up she would get her a Frosty. She also was worried about her hair not growing back."

"So when she first opened her eyes she looked at me and said, 'Aunt Patty, how's my hair? I need a Frosty. Do I have hair? I need a Frosty.'"

"We were all thrilled because we knew our Colleen was going to be OK."

Lessons

One of the many pictures on the mantle is a recent family photo. There are 10 adults in the shot and numerous children. They all have one thing in common: they're all smiling. Despite the heartache, the smiles never fade.

The reason is simple. Patty and her family make sure the spirits of their loved ones never fade.

"My parents taught us that there is nothing more important in this world than your family," Patty said.

"My brother Richard taught me to live life to the fullest and don't care what other people think about you. My sister Linda was the pure definition of family, she learned my parents' lesson better than anyone."

"Ellen taught me how to be a good person and how to be a good parent. But the most valuable lesson she taught me was in the final moments of her life. I think she knew she wasn't going to make it and that her family would no longer be whole and that her kids were losing their mom..."

Patty has introduced Ellen in this way before. She has said these words many times in speeches about organ donations and how important they are.

Still, the eyes swell with tears. Patty misses her sister. She will always miss her, and talking about her will always bring back the memories of

when she was alive.

The pride Patty feels for what Ellen did at the end will never fully replace the loss of what Ellen could have done had she lived. She had a family to raise and wasn't allowed to finish the job. But it was Ellen's parting gift that helped make getting through this possible, and why today the smile quickly replaces the tears.

"... But she also knew that she was going to make other families whole even when hers couldn't be anymore. To me she is the ultimate, ultimate hero."

Ellen also left Patty another special gift by which to help remember her.

"My sister's children are the light of my life," she says. "It is a blessing even though the circumstances are horrible. My sister would have wanted them to be good, honest kids and they are. They are just incredible kids. People compliment us on what great kids they are, and their mom deserves most of the credit."

Standing ovation

All three of Ellen's kids volunteer for the Gift of Life to promote organ donation.

Patty does public speaking on organ donation and is president of the Michigan Donor Family Council, which encourages people to sign up to become organ donors.

Patty, her daughter Melissa, and Ellen's daughter Katie, traveled to Pittsburgh last month to attend the U.S. Transplant Games, an Olympic-style sporting event for organ donation recipients and donor families.

"Going to the Games is a life-altering experience," Patty says. "To know that people who donate their organs save a lot of lives is one thing, but to be inside an arena where all of the people who are transplant recipients are standing is overwhelming."

The event includes opening and closing ceremonies

and a torch. All the athletes have received a transplant and represent their home states in the Games.

One of the more memorable and emotional moments of the event is when the organ donor families are introduced.

"You have a sign on your back that says 'donor family,' so strangers who have received transplants will walk up to you and start hugging you," Patty says.

"They are crying and thanking you without even knowing your name. It's an incredible experience for the kids and for all of us."

"At the very end of the opening ceremony in this huge arena, the organ donor families are introduced. And everyone stands up and applauds for around 20 minutes. They just don't stop. Because if you look at the athletes, none of them would be alive today if it wasn't for people like my sister. It's just incredible."

The event helps bring strangers together and creates "families."

Connecting

Katie, Ellen's youngest daughter, is now 13. She not only attended the Transplant Games, but even gave a speech to her class about how her mother was a hero for saving so many lives.

Patty says Katie came to her one day and asked if she could meet the people her mom helped save.

"You can meet the people who receive the organs if they want to meet you," Patty says. "You have to request it by letter and go through Gift of Life. A lot of people have and a lot of people don't want to."

"We didn't give it much thought at the time because our attention was all on the children. But Katie wants to write a letter and see if they want to meet us."

The Gift of Life will process the letter and see if the recipient is interested in reading it. If he or she is and want to meet Katie, then they

contact Gift of Life and arrange a meeting.

"Sometimes they don't want to meet you and just want to go on with their lives," Patty says. "But what also happens a lot of times is they become part of your family. The family who lost someone wants to know you're still living in a sense and they're still living because of that person, so there is a very strong connection both ways."

The future

Patty has five children: Debbie, 32; Tim, 31; Christine, 27; Patricia, 26; and Melissa, 23. When Ellen died, four more joined the family: Jason, who would be 27 today, Colleen and Michael, both 18, and Katie, 13.

"We were very lucky to have such great kids," Patty says. "And the whole family helped. We have a huge support system with all my brothers and sisters and aunts and uncles. And Brian's family also love the children and continue to play a big part in their lives."


The family has all been checked out for the hereditary aneurism condition and everyone appears to be fine.

"But if someone in the house says they have a headache, we jump," Patty says.

Just like Walter did with Colleen.


"I don't know if it saved her life; we will never know that, but he certainly saw something that made him take her to the hospital," Patty says. "I might have brushed it off. But he thought there was something different about this headache. My entire family always says, 'Thank God for Walter.'"

And through one's courageous gift and another's crusade for organ donations through Gift of Life, other families can also say, "Thank God for Ellen. And thank God for Patty."

Once in a lifetime

Infantry veteran makes it off the ground, some 60 years later

A little-known program to fly in World War II aircraft and raise money for the Yankee Air Museum is creating valuable memories for those who take part. It's also bringing back memories for those of "The Greatest Generation" who actually took part in that history-making conflict.

One of those is Leonard Quigley of Lima Township who, along with his companion, Janet Stull, took a ride July 30 in the museum's B-17G heavy bomber, the "Yankee Lady."

The museum at Willow Run Airport also has a restored B-25D Mitchell medium bomber.

Both aircraft take passengers on short excursion flights around the metropolitan Detroit area every Wednesday afternoon from April through September.

Quigley's flight was arranged by Lew Major of Manchester, a carpenter by trade and a museum volunteer who helped restore the B-25.

"I found out (Quigley) was a World War II vet and asked him if he'd like to come out and take a ride," Major said.

"We've known each other for a couple of years, but he got more interested in the last six months."

Quigley, who retired from the Chrysler Proving Grounds after 33 years, had hired Major to do some work at an apartment house he manages in Chelsea.

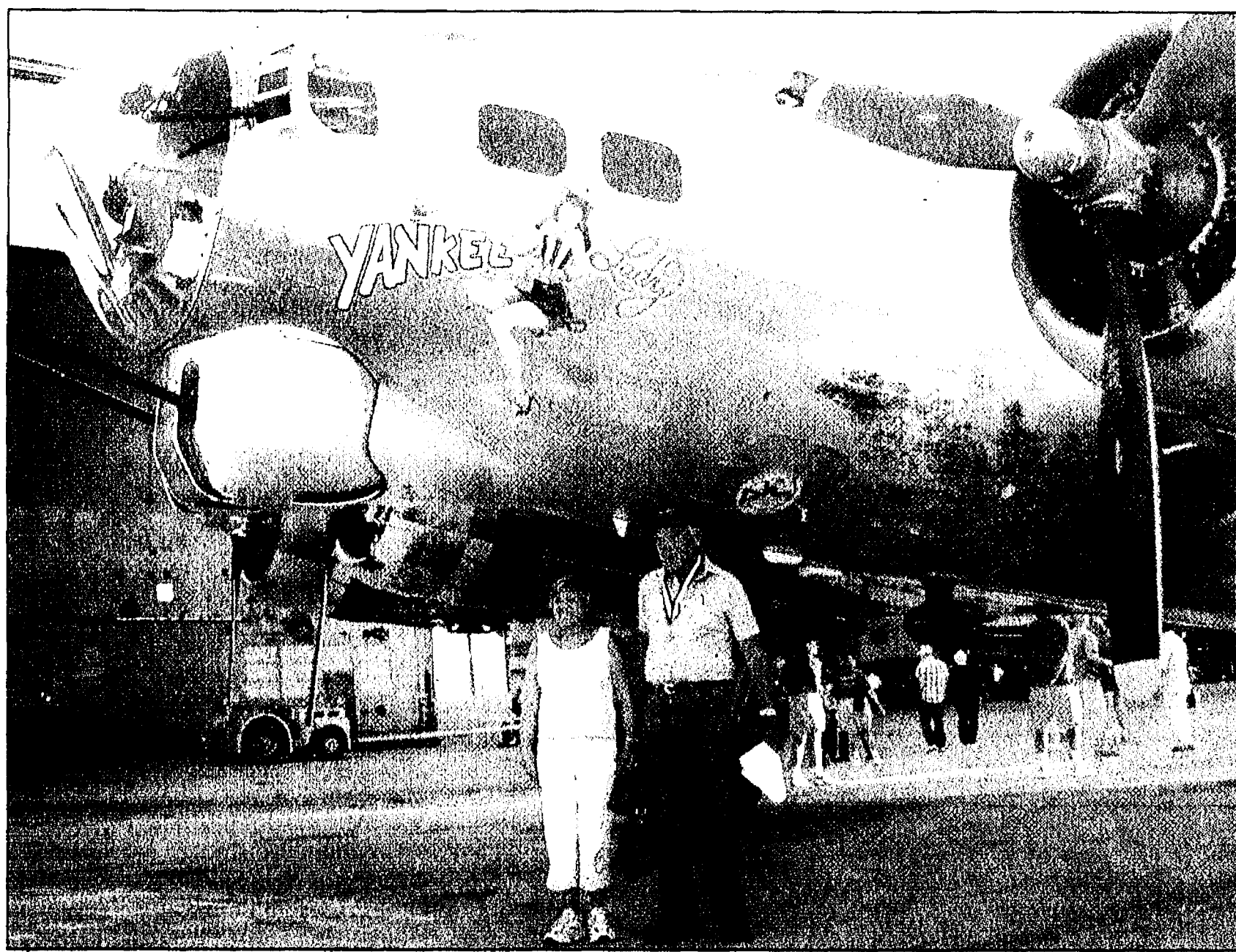
"I'm just excited about all this; I know a couple of the crew members from the Proving Grounds," Quigley said while waiting for his flight.

"I asked Janet if she'd like to go up in a bomber, and she said, 'Sure, that sounds like fun.'"

Stull confessed: "I didn't even know at the time what kind of 'bomber' he was talking about."

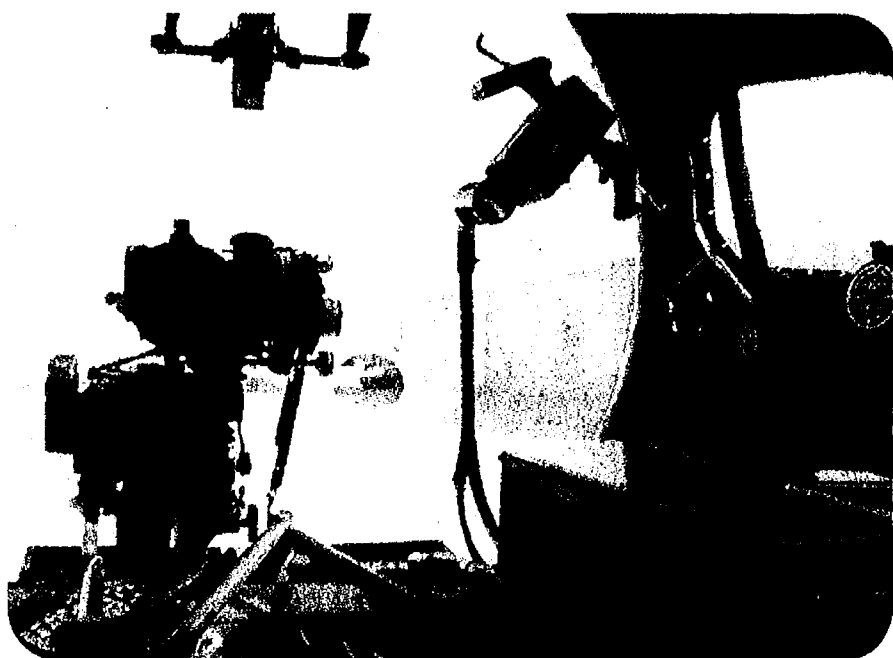
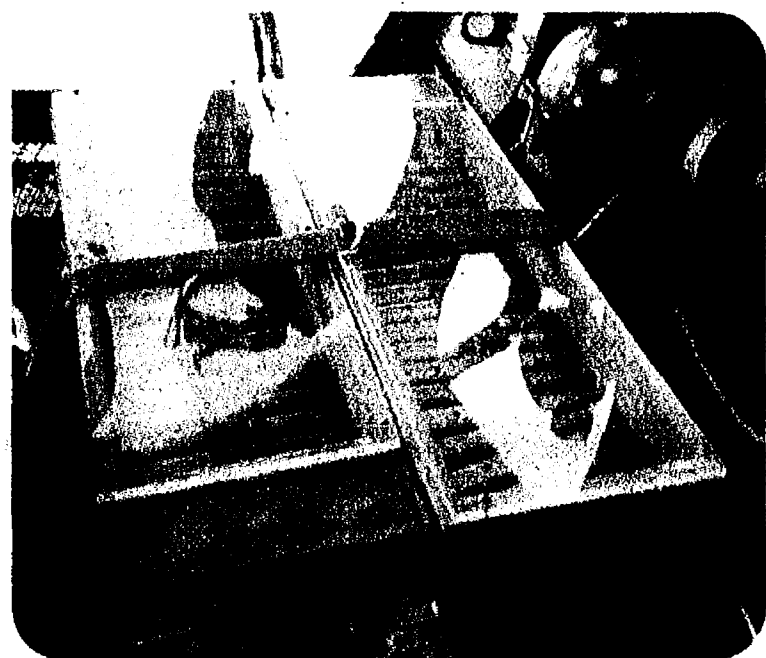
Stull said she's known Quigley for about 12 years. She was born in Ypsilanti and has lived in Manchester and Jackson.

High adventure at the Yankee Air Museum

When offered the chance to visit the Yankee Air Museum at Willow Run

Airport, I just couldn't help myself. Chelsea area resident and World War II Army Veteran Leonard

Quigley was going for a ride in the museum's restored B-17G heavy bomber on July 30, and I was asked if I was interested in the story.

I thought about it for about ... that long, and agreed to go.

The previous couple of weeks had been kind of rough on me, professionally and personally, so when you have the chance to do something like this business, don't question it too much.

After the original museum was destroyed by fire in October 2004, the site was the opposite of what it was until from its rebuild.

The much smaller operation is now in the southwest corner of Willow Run, the former home of now-defunct Zantop Airlines.

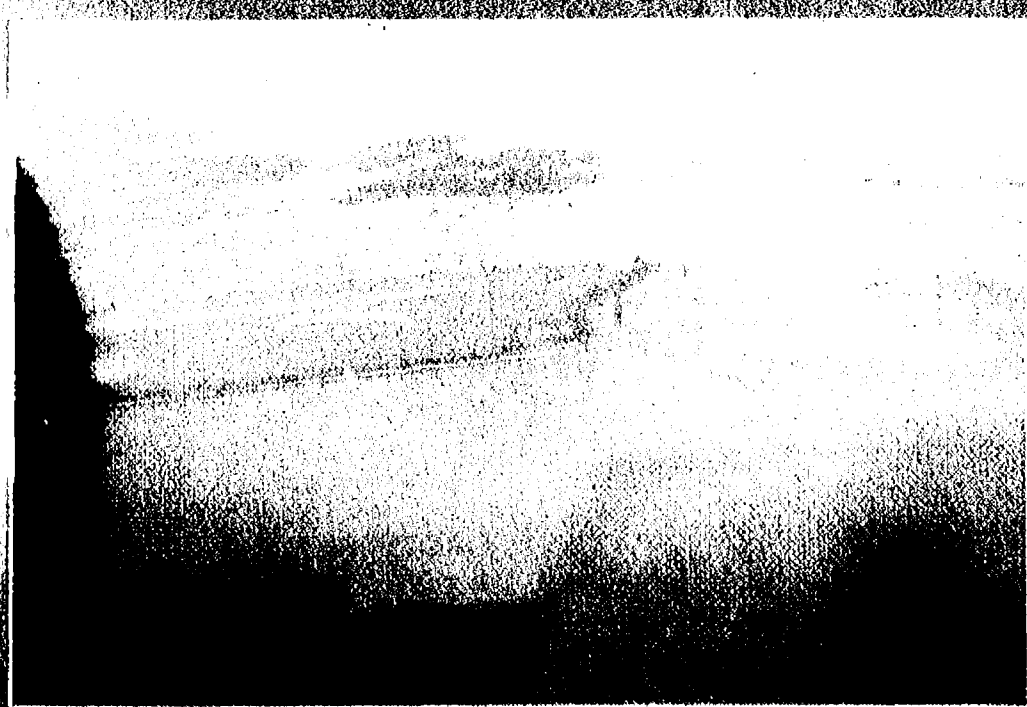
But it affords them enough space to operate two specimens of legendary warplanes: the B-17, named "Yankee Lady," and a B-25 medium

bombardier. "When you're interested in the history of the war, you want to see the real thing, not just a model or a replica. It's a real thing, and it's a real thing."

As a professional writer, I've covered a lot of things, but I've never covered anything like this. I could only think of one thing to say.

Holy cow! And although I use this word only on the rarest occasions, because its overuse has

Donald E. P Smith Chelsea

Donald E. P Smith died July 30 at home. He was 83. Don was a Professor Emeritus of Education at the University of Michigan. He was born in Rochester, N.Y., the youngest son of George and Mary Smith. After serving in World War II in the Psychological Warfare Unit of the 28th Infantry Division, he earned his B.A. at the University of Rochester, and received his Ph.D. in Psychology from Cornell University. He came to Ann Arbor in 1952 to teach at the University of Michigan School of Education. He was Director of the Reading Improvement Service from 1952 to 1970.

His publications include "The Nature of Reading Disability," "Child Management" and "A Technology of Reading and Writing" (with his wife Judith). "Anger Management" (with Carl Semmelroth) and many articles and instructional materials in the area of literacy. He was a gifted teacher and mentor to his countless graduate students.

Shortly after retiring in 1990, he suffered a massive stroke, but confounded the doctors by recovering over the next few years. He focused on recovering his prowess in golf, and finally achieved a 37 on nine holes in 1994. He was a regular at the Chelsea Big Boy, where he especially appreciated the coffee, thin pancakes and pecan rolls.

In 1964 he married Judith Meyer, and she survives. Also surviving are his children, Sandra of Berkeley, Calif., Julia (Jason Larke) of Saline, Zachary (Barbara) of Fredericksburg, Va., Kimberly of Northfield, Minn., and Joshua (Cherie Benoit) of Barre, Mass. He was preceded in death by a daughter, Judith Lynn. His amazing grandchildren include Christopher Martiniak, Jacoby and Davison Smith, Liraly Smith, and Cedulie, Remy and Vivienne Benoit-Smith. Also grieving his death are his sister-in-law, golf partner Sue Meyer, nephew Gordon Mercado, cousins-in-law Jean and Dave Wolter, and too many more to mention.

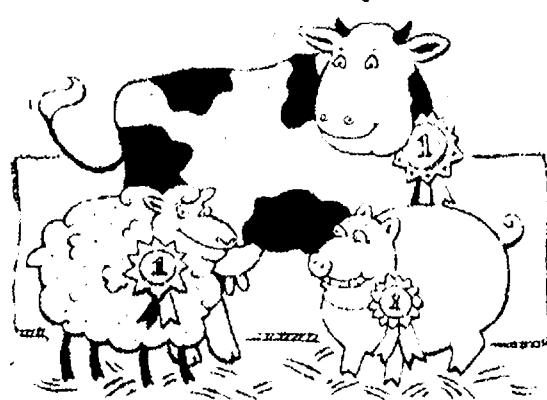

drained it of all meaning, it truly was an awesome sight. The polished aluminum skin of the warbirds shone brilliantly in the full sun, waiting for their next mission: taking passengers on a 30- to 40-minute flight around the metropolitan Detroit area.

It takes a lot of funding to scrounge up antique airplane parts, fix them and maintain them, so the museum offers rides to the public as a way to generate revenue.

However, as in the case of Leonard Quigley and his companion, Janet Stull, veterans can fly at no charge as a token of respect and appreciation for their service to our country.

And I was going with them, with my camera and my notebook ready to record their reactions.

I thought. At least, that's what I had told my co-workers, my wife, my parents, my in-laws, my dog ... you get the idea.

Lew Major of Manchester, who came to me with the story, is a museum volunteer and member of the restoration crew for the B-25, and was our guide for the afternoon.

He broke the news to me as we were walking toward the plane.

"There's only room for 10 passengers. They book these things weeks in advance, but there's sometimes a last-minute cancellation."

Can't you squeeze me in

just for this? (At just over 6 feet tall and 265 pounds, I've "squeezed in" to a lot of places.)

"Do you have 425?" Four dollars and 25 cents? I'm in!

"Umm, no. Four hundred and twenty-five dollars."

Oh.

Hey, Lew, I have a nice, crisp 20-dollar bill that's all yours if you can get me on ...

Still, I was ecstatic just to be there. The weather was warm, and the planes would share the brilliant blue sky with only a few puffy clouds.

The "tourist" flights are offered every Wednesday from April through September, and each plane goes up twice. The B-17 holds 10; the B-25 holds seven.

Leonard and Janet were scheduled for the second B-17 trip.

After a quick pre-flight briefing by Dexter resident and ground crew member Neil Frank, the passengers climbed a short ladder at the rear door of the plane and took their seats.

Unfortunately, not many veterans take the museum up on the offer of a free flight, probably because they are becoming such a rare breed. So for the museum, having a vet as a guest is a big deal.

Due to his status as a veteran, Leonard and Janet were led onto the plane first for their choice of seats.

While not spacious by any stretch, there was room enough to get up and move around, carefully, once they reached a cruising altitude of about 3,000 feet.

The four, 9-cylinder, 1,000-horsepower engines fired

up with a near-deafening roar, and taxied out to the loooooong runway.

Watching it lift off, I was struck by the seeming effortlessness at which something so large could become airborne so gracefully.

All the pilots are professionals, Major told me — commercial airline pilots who do this "as a hobby."

I was also struck by what it must have been like to see, hear (and feel) dozens — sometimes hundreds — of these Flying Fortresses, one after another, leaving their bases in England for bombing runs over Nazi Europe; their crews well aware it might be a one-way trip.

After a cruise down the Detroit River, the B-17 made a wide sweep around the Ambassador Bridge, the Renaissance Center and the remnants of Tiger Stadium before heading back to Willow Run.

The landing was just as graceful as the takeoff, and again, Leonard was the first one off.

Passengers and museum volunteers gathered around while officials placed a medal around Quigley's neck and made a short presentation thanking him for his military service.

Still, the crusty veteran and Chelsea Proving Grounds retiree didn't crack a smile until we posed for photos under the painted figure of the "Yankee Lady" on the nose of the plane.

That's quite all right, Leonard. I was smiling enough for you, Janet, Lew and me combined.

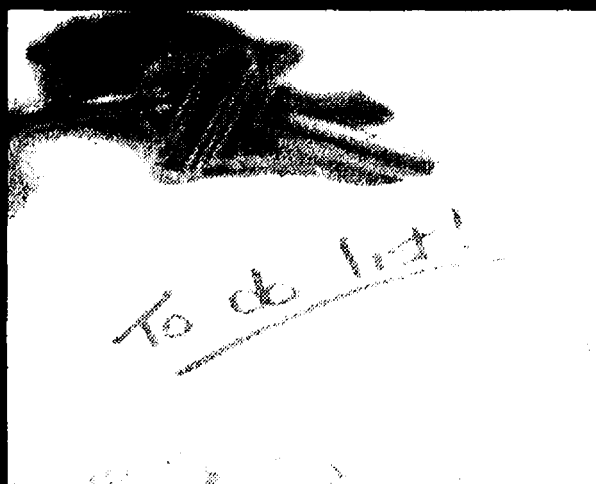

While the ground crew rolled the B-17 out of the hangar, Major gave the couple an idea of what to expect.

"Quite often they fly over the Detroit River, Toledo or Flint; I think today they are going over to Detroit," he said. "It's a 30- or 40-minute flight."

The flights cost \$425 per person, Major said, and are often booked weeks in advance.

The B-17 can carry 10 passengers, while the B-25 can handle seven. Each plane goes up twice each Wednesday.

What is especially noteworthy, though, is that World War II veterans and their guests are treated like VIPs.

"He's the only vet today, so we made sure he got to go on the plane first," said ground crew member Keith Jones.

"Usually one or two vets take the flights every week."

The Yankee Air Museum was located in the northeast corner of Willow Run until it was destroyed by fire in 2004.

It is temporarily across the field in the former Zantop Airlines hangar until the new museum complex can be built.

It will take quite a bit of cash to bring that plan to fruition, which is the reason for these "flights of fancy" in the first place.

In the meantime, it also takes money just to keep the planes in the air.

If you think paying \$4 per gallon to fill up your automobile is tough, consider this:

The B-17's four 9-cylinder, 1,200-horsepower turbocharged engines burn about 200 gallons of fuel per hour, and it holds almost 2,800 gallons.

The B-25 has two 14-cylinder, 1,700-horsepower engines that burn 75 gallons an hour with a fuel capacity of 800 gallons.

"The B-17 is our chief source of income because we have no museum that people can tour until it's rebuilt," Major said.

Unlike the dark green or gray usually seen in films, these vintage warbirds are decked out in their original plumage: a highly polished aluminum skin that shines brilliantly in the sun.

It is hard for civilians not to be impressed with the sheer size of the B-17: 74 feet long with a wingspan of 104 feet, and a top turret 19 feet off the ground.

The "Flying Fortress" was aptly named, too: it had a crew of 10, was armed with up to 13 .50-caliber machine guns in six defensive placements and carried up to 8,000 pounds of bombs internally and under the wings.

It is also quite a rarity: Of the more than 12,700 B-17s built, only about 50 remain intact throughout the world.

His own war stories

Quigley and Stull were

scheduled for the second B-17 flight of the day, and he passed the time by recalling some of what he experienced during the war.

First of all, he admitted lying about his age to get into the service, something that was not uncommon in those dark days.

"I was born in the Chelsea area and lived here most of my life," Quigley said.

"I was born in 1928, but my birth certificate says 1926 so I could join the military earlier."

The former infantryman said he had never been up in a plane during the war, yet he showed no signs of apprehension about his impending flight.

"Naw, I don't let this stuff bother me," he said. "I've seen these B-17s knock out German troop trains - man, they put holes all over the place."

Quigley was attached to the 309th Infantry Regiment of the 78th Infantry Division.

"I was a .30-caliber machine gunner, and was a section leader," he said.

"I went in in August of '44. We went through France, Belgium and Germany, and I came out a corporal in September 1946."

Even though he downplayed the event, his most

harrowing ordeal came when he was injured by the blast from a German 88mm cannon.

"That wasn't real bad," he said. "I also had my watch shot right off my arm one time."

It was January 1945 in Germany, near the end of the Battle of the Ardennes, familiarly known as "The Battle of the Bulge."

"There were 24 of us machine gun teams along this side of a field when we spotted German artillery right across from us," he recalled.

"They were firing over our heads but getting closer and closer to our position. I told our captain, 'Hey, we gotta get the heck out of here,' but he said, 'No, don't worry, they can't see us.'"

"About that time I got blown up in the air and when I came to, I saw they'd killed 50 or 100 guys, including that captain."

"There were no medics, so I pulled a piece of shrapnel out of my back by myself. I was kind of dazed, and I guess I had a concussion."

"Me and the other guys who were left wandered around until we could find another unit to join up with; I didn't see a doctor for another two or three days," Quigley said.

He then changed the subject.

Pre-flight

Belching a thick fog of oily smoke, the fearsomely powerful engines roared to life and warmed up while waiting to take the plane on its next mission.

As the flight crew and ground crew went through their checklists, Neil Frank of Dexter gave the group a pre-flight briefing.

"It's a very gentle airplane," said Frank, who is retired from American Airlines and has volunteered with the museum for about seven years.

"Once we get up to altitude, you can move around the cabin," he added. "You're welcome to take pictures - but hang on to your camera!"

Other than Quigley and Stull, all the passengers were middle-aged men; typical for these excursions.

"You'll be flying about 165 mph (a little over half its rated top speed of 300 mph) at an altitude of about 3,000 feet," Frank said, and the route would take them down the Detroit River.

As promised, Quigley and Stull were led aboard the majestic aircraft first, followed by the other passengers.

Quigley sat amidships, while the petite Stull chose the tight quarters but spectacular view in the bombardier's position in the Plexiglas nose of the plane.

Looking like a scene out of any number of World War II movies, the giant plane lifted off gracefully (but hardly quietly) and soon disappeared into the nearly cloudless expanse of blue.

While waiting for the group's return, Major discussed many details of the aircraft, the flight program and the museum.

"These pilots are generally full-time commercial airline pilots; doing this is like their hobby," he said, adding: "Pilots are a pretty unique bunch."

He also noted that the museum has more than 3,500 members worldwide, with about 250 actively volunteering at the airport.

Many of them are retirees, Major pointed out.

"Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays are big volunteer days around here," he said. "There's always something to do on the planes."

While the old Zantop hangar remains a beehive of activity, there is a lot of behind-the-scenes work being done to rebuild the museum. "Bob Lutz of General Motors (Vice Chairman of Global Product Development) is a member; GM donated \$1 million for the reconstruction of the museum," he said.

"The plan calls for 12 buildings on the new Yankee Air Museum campus."

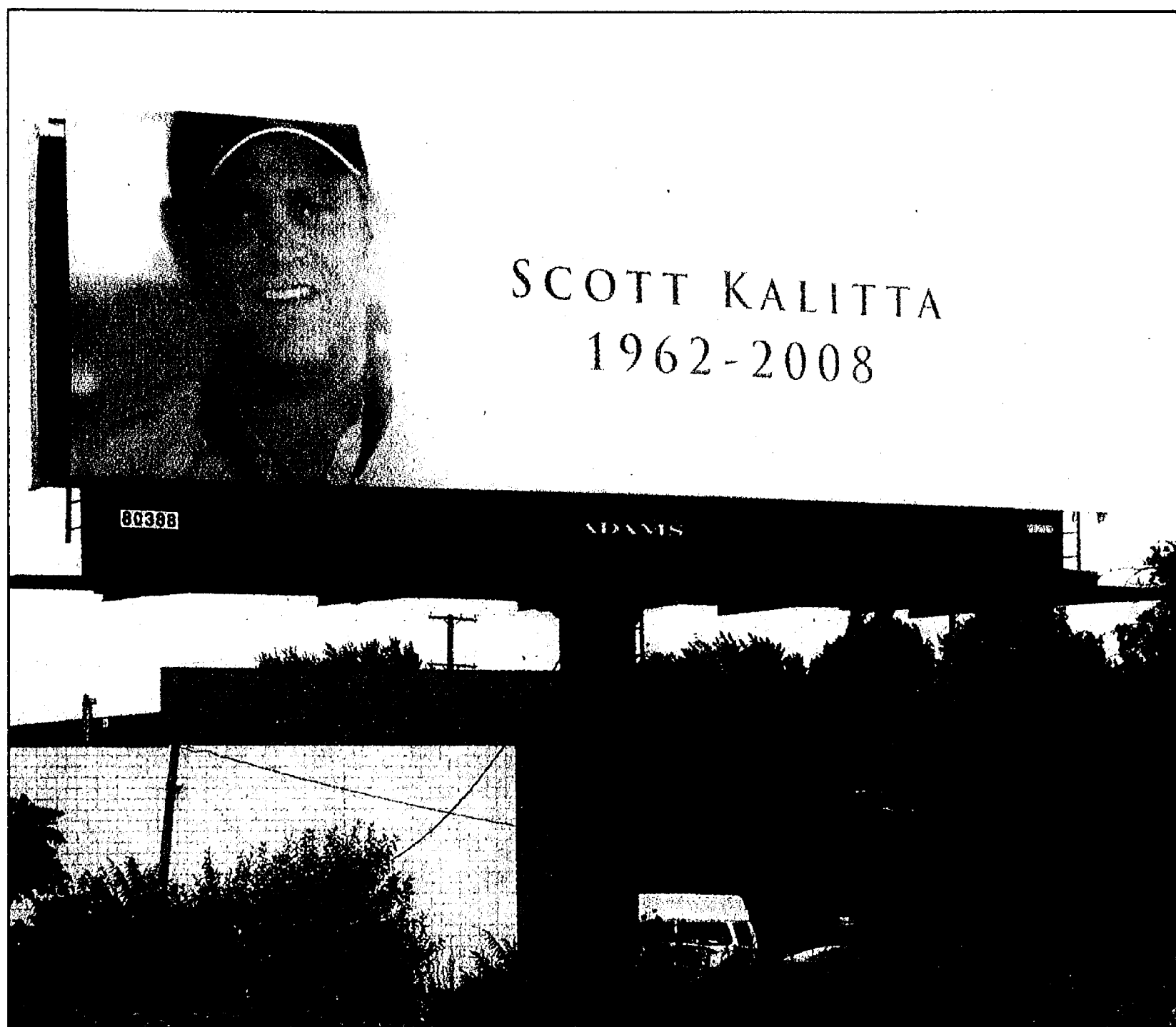

Billboard honors racing legend

When Kalitta Motorsports office manager Tammy Oberhofer sped on I-94 to get to work in Ypsilanti recently, a certain banner caught her eye. Someone had dedicated a billboard to late drag racing legend, Scott Kalitta.

"When we saw it on I-94 our first reaction was just silence until we hit Rawsonville - it just stopped you," she said. "We all asked, 'Who did that?'"

On June 21, Kalitta, whose family has been a longtime staple of Ypsilanti, died in a crash while racing in New Jersey.

This devastated his family, members of his team, and drag racing fans everywhere. Adams Outdoor Advertising, located near the Kalitta Motorsports Ypsilanti office on James L. Hart Parkway, dedicated a banner to the Funny Car driver. Workers at Adams offered their condolences the best way they saw fit.

"The women in the office suggested sending flowers," said Adams construction foreman Bryan Beebe. "You don't send flowers to

a garage full of guys."

When members of Adams first contemplated the idea of a billboard dedication, Beebe felt the company should use its talent and do what it does best. He explained that outdoor advertising is the name of their game.

"We don't bake cakes here," he said. "We bring a message to people."

In order to fund the billboard, Adams operations manager Steve Bronson contacted a parent outfit of the nationwide company in Missouri. While he claims making it cost a reasonable price, he refuses to give out the exact number.

"I don't want people thinking about the figures," he said. "We did this out of respect for our neighbor."

While the billboard first appeared on I-94 between the Belleville and Rawsonville Road exits. It can now be seen on US-23 near Carpenter Rd. in Milan. According to Beebe, the Milan dragway is a popular stomping ground of the Kalittas and their fans.

"We spent many a weekend there," he said. "Scott was racing and I was watching."

Adams tried to maintain anonymity for their dedica-

tion by excluding a phone number or any other contact information on the Kalitta banner. Oberhofer did some research and discovered the benefactor. She felt that it was a kind gesture.

"We kept looking into it and eventually found out that it was Adams," she said. "As hard as this has been, it's nice to know that people care regardless of whether they know you or not."

The KM team is not the only group of people who has shown appreciation. According to Bronson, he received many e-mails from racing fans when it was discovered that Adams dedicated the billboard.

"We got a lot of feedback from fans," he said. "There's one e-mail that says, 'You people are a class act and appreciated by all race fans.'"

While Bronson and Beebe never met Kalitta in person, they both followed drag racing extensively since they were young.

"Some guys like reading books, others like watching races," said Bronson. "We're supposed to get a tour of the shop and see how things work there."

The Kalitta billboard was not the first kind ges-

ture by Adams. When former Michigan football coach Glenn "Bo" Schembechler passed away, they dedicated ad space to his memory near downtown Ann Arbor. Their tributes are not limited to celebrities, however. When a couple of local firefighters recently died in a plane crash in Dexter, Adams paid tribute to them as well.

"When you're well-known as much as these people, you show respect in a certain way," said Bronson.

Bronson explained that he, and other members of Adams, were not looking for praise or reward of any sort for their actions. They simply wanted to display how they felt about Kalitta's death.

"Our achievement was made by paying respect," he said. "We want to show that we care."

Steroids harmful to athletes

According to the Merriam-Webster Dictionary steroids are any of various compounds including numerous hormones (as anabolic steroids) and sugar derivatives.

This might be a fairly simple way of describing something that has no place in sports and maybe only a limited place in society. In more recent national news major league baseball players have had to go before congress to testify about their possible use of steroids.

Ben Johnson of the Canadian Olympic Team was stripped of his gold medal and world record in the 100-meter dash because of testing positive for steroids. It isn't always these big, strong international superstars that use steroids. It can be people who are just trying to look bigger and maybe feel better about their appearance.

One such person like this was Bobby King (2002 graduate of Lincoln Park High School). He wanted to make himself bigger when he was 21 and thought this was the way to do it.

"I wanted to get better results and get stacked," King said. "I was at a certain size (165 pounds) and I thought I would try these."

He said that in two weeks the steroids kicked in.

"It didn't take long to see results," he said. "I got bigger traps, abs and legs."

In all, he took three cycles over a six-week period. King admits he might have taken the last cycle too soon, but he also wants people to know what eventually ended up happening to him.

"I was in a dead sleep and I woke up and felt like I was having a heart attack," he said. "I was wearing baggy shirts so my parents couldn't tell I was using. I was stacked as hell."

He said after that experience he stopped taking the drugs and still is worried about his body to this day. "It kills your liver," he said. "My liver enzymes keep going up and I have to have them checked all the time."

For him, the steroids made him want to work out more and the feeling of working out became more intense.

He did bulk up from 165 to 215 pounds. After graduation from high school he was only 135 pounds.

"You can inject it or you can swallow it," he said. "All kids think about is getting big."

"It cost about \$125 a shot. I don't wish what happened to me on anyone."

Drugs have become more common in sports in the last century. The International Olympic Committee (IOC), the governing body of the Olympic Games refers to the use of steroids as doping. They claim it gives athletes an unfair advantage in the games.

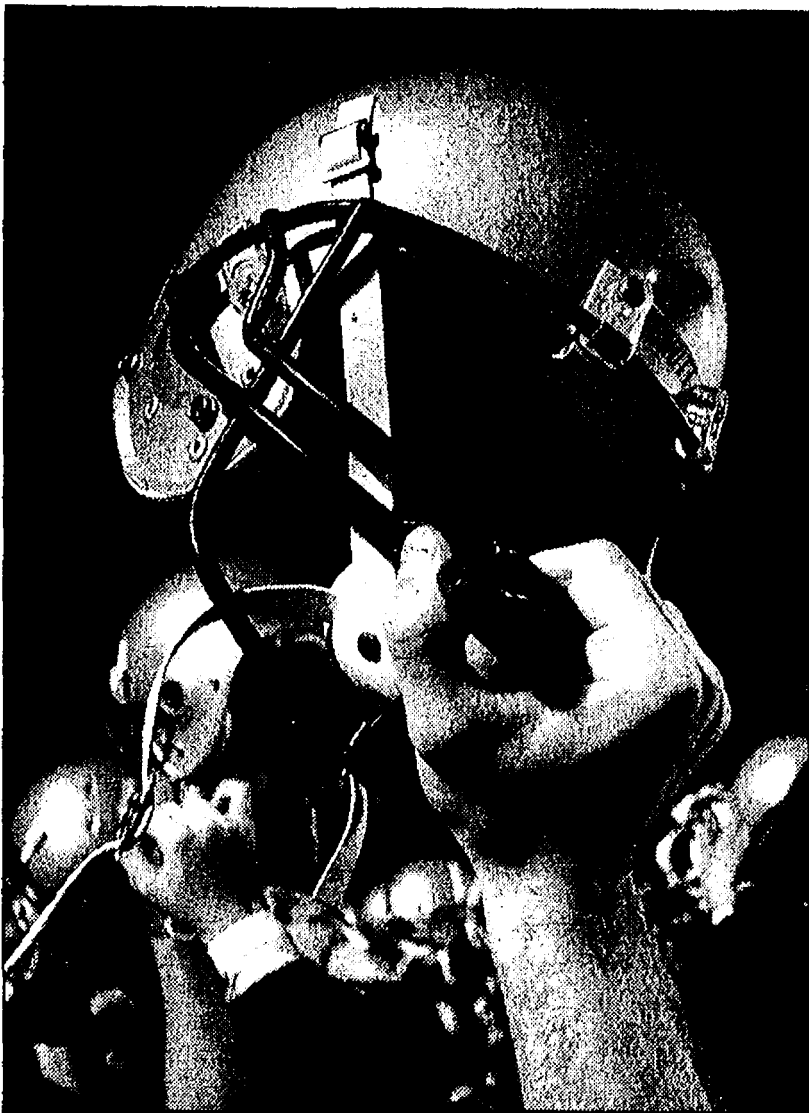

Be careful Bats, skunks not critters to cuddle

I recently had a lady drop off a half-dozen baby bats only a few days old.

She said the parent bats had been killed by a rattlesnake that had gotten into her attic where the bats nested.

She seemed more concerned about the welfare of the bats than she was about having a rattlesnake in her attic. (Incidentally as a wildlife rescuer and rehabilitator I do capture and relocate snakes, but that's another story).

A large percentage of bats carry rabies and handling them can be quite hazardous. Most people know that bites from a rabid animal can result in rabies but it is also possible to contract rabies without getting bitten.

Simply by handling an

animal their saliva or blood can give you the disease if it gets into any scratches or cuts.

If a carrier skunk drinks out of your pet's water dish it can pass rabies to other animals drinking out of that dish.

Skunks can carry rabies without being infected themselves. These animals can pass the disease to others without getting it them-

selves.

Wildlife rehabilitators in Arkansas are not required to rescue or rehabilitate bats or skunks because of the high percentage that carry rabies.

Despite the fact some carry rabies, bats are incredibly beneficial. A single bat can catch as many as 2,000 mosquitoes in one night.

I decided that since the babies were so small the chances of saliva contact or a bite was minimal so I took in the little fellers.

I figured if they survived a rattlesnake attack they deserved a second chance.

I made sure I wore gloves and fed them with tweezers once they started eating solid food.

My babies drank formula for the first several weeks before upgrading to insects.

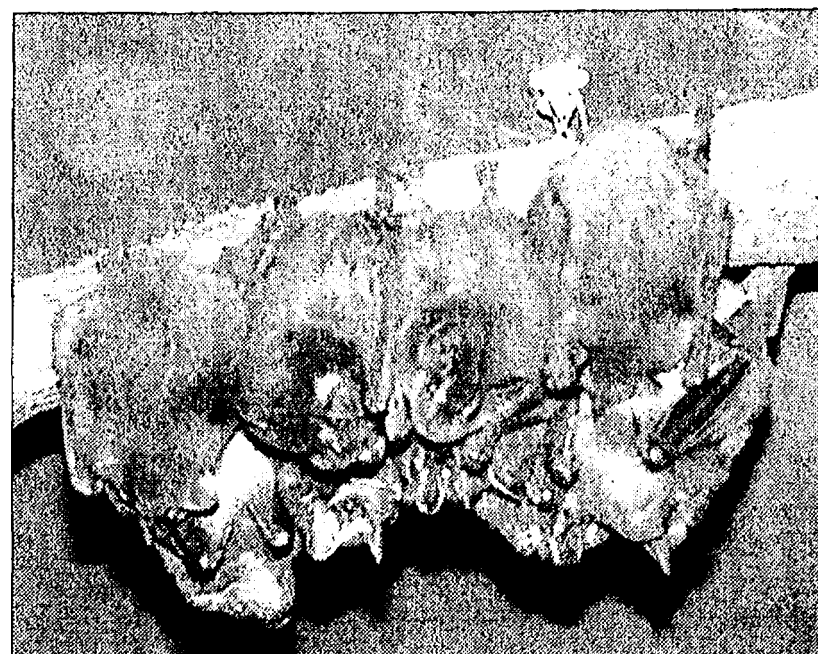
I kept them in a shoe box that I carried with me as they needed to be fed every few hours. The box probably would have got me arrested by Homeland Security as it sounded like a Geiger Counter whenever the babies started testing out their sonar with little clicks and squeals.

Bats like a very warm environment so I had a heating pad taped to the shoe box.

I had an out of town business trip so the bat box went with me to the hotel.

I could not help but wonder what a maid would do if she saw a shoe box plugged into the wall clicking and chirping away. If she called a bomb squad what would be their reaction to finding baby bats?

I considered putting a glass of blood by the night

stand and sprinkling some grave dirt on the bed to make them think they had a vampire on their hands. But on second thought I decided to take the babies to my meeting and not risk terrifying the house cleaning staff or troubling the bomb squad.

Bats fly silently (no feathers to flutter) and with their

sonar can catch insects and evade obstacles even if total blind.

The bats grew up fairly quickly and were released back to the wild.

If a person or a pet is bitten by a bat or skunk you

State investigators go high-tech

The shooting suspect knew investigators were closing in.

The suspect tried to dispose of all the evidence, but when law enforcement officers showed up with a search warrant, they found trace amounts of blood on the suspect's clothing.

Authorities sent a sample to the lab for DNA analysis. After the lab came up with a definite match to samples taken at the crime scene, officers made their arrest.

Sounds like an episode of television's CSI: Crime Scene Investigation doesn't it?

But in this case, the shooting victim was a bull elk and the authorities were Michigan Conservation Officers.

"DNA analysis was even used to identify an eastern box turtle in the state's largest investigation into the illegal trade of protected Michigan reptiles," said Detective Lieutenant Wade Hamilton, supervisor of the Special Investigations Unit for the Michigan Department of Natural Resources.

"An undercover detective spent two years infiltrating a close-knit group of illegal traders, eventually participating in numerous transactions with these dealers who often resold the animals for an instant profit."

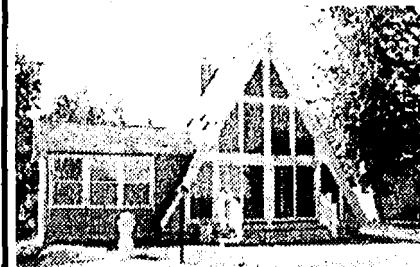
Hamilton said.

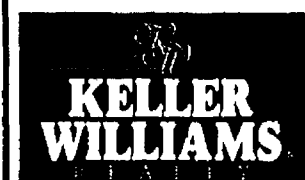

genetic studies to advance wildlife management.

Dwayne Etter, a wildlife research biologist who works at the Rose Lake Wildlife Research Station, said the agency is using DNA to estimate bear populations in the northern Lower Peninsula.

Typically, biologists use mark-and-recapture studies to estimate animal populations.

Individuals are trapped, marked and released. The percentage of marked specimens that subsequently are recaptured helps biologists estimate the population.

"The problem with the traditional studies is when you're talking about a species like black bear, it's difficult; it takes a lot of time and it's dangerous," Etter said. "Getting a DNA sample is the same as marking it, but we can collect the DNA non-invasively."

A Michigan State University researcher devised a way of collecting hair samples by suspending baits off the ground and surrounding the area with barbed wire, so bears have to go over or under the wire to get to the bait.

DNR biologists adapted the technique to estimate the state's bear population.

Typically, the barbed wire snags some hair. DNA samples are taken from the hair follicles.

When bears are harvested by hunters, the DNR pulls a tooth at the check station. The tooth contains DNA, which can be checked against the DNA collected from the hair samples. The harvested bears serve as the "recapture" portion of the study, which can be completed without handling the bears.

"You couldn't possibly set enough traps to capture

the number of animals needed to do a population estimate for the entire northern Lower Peninsula," Etter said. "Setting up 240 hair snares across the region allows you to cover a larger area a lot more efficiently than hauling traps around."

Although the technique works well with black bears — animals that are easily attracted to bait — it hasn't been as effective on other low-density species (say, bobcats) that are more trap-shy.

Similarly, DNA population studies aren't feasible for animals with dense populations, such as deer, because of the expense involved.

"It costs about \$40 to extract and amplify the DNA and that's not including the expense of setting up the hair snares," Etter said.

"With populations of 50 animals per square mile, you could have thousands of samples. It would get very expensive very quickly."

Nonetheless, Etter said he's excited about using DNA for population estimates.

"It's cutting edge," he said. "We're probably the first state that's ever accomplished this on a broad scale. We're actually estimating populations and, in my opinion, they're fairly accurate."

Research biologist Dean Beyer out of Marquette is participating in a DNA study to help determine the taxonomy of Michigan's wolves.

There's an ongoing debate in the scientific community about whether gray wolves and eastern wolves are different subspecies.

One school of thought is that gray wolves are an Old World species, while eastern wolves evolved in North America, diverging from coyotes some 300,000 years ago.

Beyer is sending DNA samples from Michigan wolves to a Canadian university that is attempting to clarify the genetics of gray wolves, eastern wolves and coyotes in the Great Lakes region.

"We're simply trying to see where the wolves in the Upper Peninsula fit in," Beyer said. "It's complicated stuff. We're just in the beginning stages."

Jean Fierke, a lab scientist at the Wildlife Disease Lab, does a lot of the extracting and analyzing of DNA.

She and lab technician Kristine Brown recently completed a study of feather samples taken from woodcock chicks by volunteers who band the hatchlings in the spring.

The idea was to see if the chicks could be sexed from DNA in their feathers. Turns out they can.

And the implications to management are significant.

"This has never been done before," said Al Stewart, the DNR's upland game bird specialist. "We band more woodcock chicks than anywhere else in the world and we use that information to help manage the woodcock population."

"One of the shortfalls of our woodcock banding effort has been the inability to determine the males from the females at the chick stage."

They look alike. We can tell how old chicks are by measuring the bill, but you can't tell the sex."

Although the sex is easily determined when the birds reach adulthood, no one knows if there's disproportionate mortality between the sexes before they reach maturity.

"When you get your band returns, it's important to know what you banded to begin with," Stewart said. "Using DNA to determine a chick's sex is a major breakthrough."

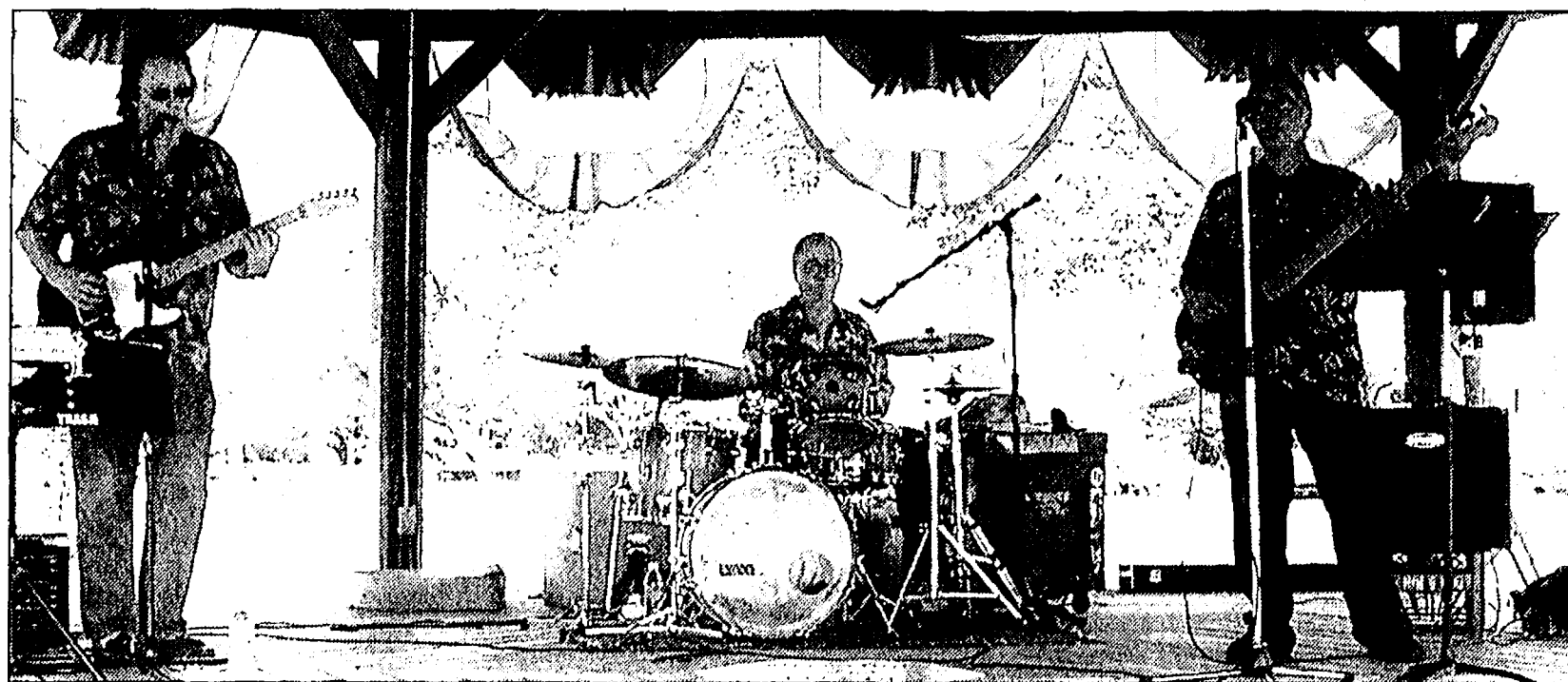
Visitors on Friday night can be seen shopping in local stores, sampling food provided by area businesses, relaxing in the park and, of course, listening to the music.

"We're hoping to grow into (what Chelsea has on Thursday nights) once the bridge and library are done," she said. "We're still pretty green here, but every Friday night we've had a good turnout. There certainly are a lot more people in town on Friday nights."

Tina LaFleur, owner of the Polka Dot Puppy, agreed that there was more activity downtown.

"Compared to other nights I've definitely seen a bigger crowd on Fridays," she said.

I play music throughout Southeast Michigan in Farmington, Grosse Ile and Plymouth. It's growing not just because of Chelsea, but because people in general want a party atmosphere in their town, and they want a pretty downtown. These small communities such as Dexter, Chelsea and Plymouth are making more use of their beauty."

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 154 TO PROVIDE FOR THE CONSTRUCTION, INSTALLATION, FURNISHING AND EQUIPPING OF IMPROVEMENTS TO THE SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM OF THE CITY OF CHELSEA; TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF REVENUE BONDS OF EQUAL STANDING WITH THE CITY'S SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM REVENUE BOND, SERIES 2007, TO PAY THE COST THEREOF; TO PRESCRIBE THE FORM OF THE BONDS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE COLLECTION OF REVENUES FROM THE SYSTEM SUFFICIENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING THE COSTS OF OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE SYSTEM AND TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS; TO PROVIDE FOR SECURITY FOR THE BONDS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE SEGREGATION AND DISTRIBUTION OF THE REVENUES; TO PROVIDE FOR THE RIGHTS OF THE HOLDERS OF THE BONDS IN ENFORCEMENT THEREOF; AND TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATING TO THE BONDS AND THE SYSTEM.

THE CITY OF CHELSEA ORDAINS:

Section 1. Definitions. Whenever used in this Ordinance, except when otherwise indicated by the context, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

(a) "Act 94" means Act 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, as amended.

(b) "Adjusted Net Revenues" means for any operating year the excess of revenues over expenses for the System determined in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, to which shall be added depreciation, amortization, interest expense on Bonds and payments to the City in lieu of taxes, to which may be made the following adjustments:

(i) Revenues may be augmented by the amount of any rate increases adopted prior to the issuance of additional Bonds or to be placed into effect before the time principal or interest on the additional Bonds becomes payable from Revenues as applied to quantities of service furnished during the operating year or portion thereof that the increased rates were not in effect.

(ii) Revenues may be augmented by amounts which may be derived from rates and charges to be paid by new customers of the System.

The adjustment of revenues and expenses by the factors set forth in (i) and (ii) above shall be reported upon by professional engineers or certified public accountants or other experts not in the regular employment of the City.

(c) "Authority" means the Michigan Municipal Bond Authority.

(d) "Authorized Officers" means the Mayor, City Clerk, City Treasurer and the City Manager.

(e) "Bond" and "Bonds" means the Sewage Disposal System Revenue Bond, Series 2008, of the City in the principal amount of not to exceed \$11,000,000 issued pursuant to Section 5 of this Ordinance, together with any additional bonds of equal standing hereafter issued.

(f) "City" means the City of Chelsea, County of Washtenaw, State of Michigan.

(g) "Engineers" means TetraTech, registered engineers of Ann Arbor, Michigan.

(h) "MDEQ" means the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality.

(i) "Ordinance 154" means Ordinance No. 154, adopted by the City on August 14, 2007, authorizing issuance of the Series 2007 Bonds.

(j) "Project" means the improvements to the System consisting generally of improvements to the Veterans Park Pump Station, construction of a 12-inch force main at the Veterans Park Pump Station to increase pump station capacity, and improvements to the sewage collection and transmission system, together with all necessary interests in land, rights-of-way and all appurtenances and attachments thereto.

(k) "Purchase Contract" means the Purchase Contract between the City and the Authority providing for sale of the Bond.

(l) "Revenues" and "Net Revenues" means the revenues and net revenues of the System and shall be construed as defined in Section 3 of Act 94, including with respect to "Revenues" the earnings derived from the investment of moneys in the various funds and accounts established by this Ordinance, and other revenues derived from or pledged to operation of the System.

(m) "Series 2007 Bond" means the Sewage Disposal System Revenue Bond, Series 2007, dated September 20, 2007, of the City authorized by Ordinance 154.

(n) "Sufficient Government Obligations" means direct obligations of the United States of America or obligations the principal and interest on which is fully guaranteed by the United States of America, not redeemable at the option of the issuer, the principal and interest payments upon which, without reinvestment of the interest, come due at such times and in such amounts as to be fully sufficient to pay the interest as it comes due on the Bonds and the principal and redemption premium, if any, on the Bonds as it comes due whether on the stated maturity date or upon earlier redemption. Securities representing such obligations shall be placed in trust with a bank or trust company, and if any of the Bonds are to be called for redemption prior to maturity, irrevocable instructions to call the Bonds for redemption shall be given to the paying agent.

(o) "Supplemental Agreement" means the supplemental agreement among the City, the Authority and MDEQ relating to the Bond.

(p) "System" means the sewage disposal system of the City, including such facilities thereof as are now existing, are acquired and constructed as the Project, and all enlargements, extensions, repairs and improvements thereto hereafter made.

Section 2. Necessity; Approval of Plans and Specifications. It is hereby determined to be a necessary public purpose of the City to acquire and construct the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications prepared by the Engineers, which plans and specifications are hereby approved. The Project qualifies for the Clean Water Revolving Fund financing program being administered by the MDEQ and the Authority, whereby bonds of the City are sold to the Authority and bear interest at a fixed rate of two and one-half percent (2.50%) per annum.

Section 3. Costs; Useful Life. The cost of the Project is estimated not to exceed Eleven Million Dollars (\$11,000,000) including the payment of incidental expenses as specified in Section 4 of this Ordinance, which estimate of cost is hereby approved and confirmed, and the period of usefulness of the Project is estimated to be not less than twenty (20) years.

Section 4. Payment of Cost; Bonds Authorized. To pay the cost of acquiring and constructing the Project, including payment of legal, engineering, financial and other expenses incident thereto and incident to the issuance and sale of the Bond, the City shall borrow the sum of not to exceed Eleven Million Dollars (\$11,000,000) and issue the Bond therefor pursuant to the provisions of Act 94. The remaining cost of the Project, if any, shall be defrayed from City funds on hand and legally available for such use.

Section 5. Issuance of Bond; Details. The Bond of the City, to be designated SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM REVENUE BOND, SERIES 2008, is authorized to be issued in the aggregate principal sum of not to exceed Eleven Million Dollars (\$11,000,000) or as otherwise determined by order of the MDEQ for the purpose of paying the cost of the Project, including the costs incidental to the issuance, sale and delivery of the Bond. The Bond shall be payable out of the Net Revenues as set forth more fully in Section 7 hereof. The Bond shall be in the form of a single fully-registered, nonconvertible bond of the denomination of the full principal amount thereof, dated as of the date of delivery of the Bond, payable in principal installments on October 1 of the years 2010 through 2029, inclusive, or such other payment dates as hereinafter provided. Interest on the Bond shall be payable on April 1 and October 1 of each year, commencing April 1, 2009. Final determination of the Principal Amount and the payment dates and amounts of principal installments of the Bond shall be evidenced by execution of a Purchase Contract between the City and the Authority providing for sale of the Bond, and each of the Authorized Officers is authorized and directed to execute and deliver the Purchase Contract when it is in final form and to make the determinations set forth above; provided, however, that the first principal installment shall be due no earlier than October 1, 2010, and the final principal installment shall be due no later than October 1, 2029, and that the total principal amount shall not exceed \$11,000,000.

The Bond shall be issued in fully-registered form and shall not be convertible or exchangeable except as herein provided. So long as the Authority is the owner thereof, the Bond is payable as to principal and interest at the principal corporate trust office of the bank or trust company designated in writing by the Authority, or at such other place as shall be designated in writing to the City by the Authority (the "Authority's Depository"), and the City agrees that it will deposit with the Authority's Depository payments of principal, premium, if any, and interest on the Bond in immediately available funds at least five (5) business days prior to the date on which any such payment is due, whether by maturity, redemption or otherwise.

The Bond shall not be sold to the Authority at less than 100% of its par value.

The Bond shall bear interest at a rate or rates of not to exceed two and one-half percent (2.50%) per annum on the par value thereof or such other lesser rate as evidenced by execution of the Purchase Contract, but in any event not to exceed the rate permitted by law, and the Authorized

Officers shall deliver the Bond in accordance with the delivery instructions of the Authority, provided, however, that the Bond shall also bear "additional interest" on the terms and conditions set forth in the Bond in Section 14 of this Ordinance. The Bond principal amount is expected to be drawn down by the City periodically, and interest on the principal amount shall accrue from the date such principal amount is drawn down by the City.

The Bond or principal installments thereof will be subject to redemption prior to maturity at the option of the City at any time on or after the due date of the first principal installment only with the prior written approval of the Authority on such terms as may be required by the Authority.

The City Treasurer shall record on the registration books payment by the City of each installment of principal or interest or both when made and the cancelled checks or other records evidencing such payments shall be returned to and retained by the City Treasurer.

Upon payment by the City of all outstanding principal of and interest on the Bond, the Authority shall deliver the Bond to the City for cancellation.

Section 6. Execution, Registration and Transfer. The Mayor and the City Clerk are authorized to execute and deliver the Bond in accordance with the delivery instructions of the Authority. The Bond shall be signed with the manual or facsimile signatures of the Mayor and the City Clerk and shall have the City's seal impressed or printed thereon. A Bond bearing the manual signature of either the Mayor or the City Clerk that is sold to the Authority shall require no further authentication.

The Bond may be transferred upon the books required to be kept pursuant to this section by the person in whose name it is registered, in person or by the registered owner's duly authorized attorney, upon surrender of the Bond for cancellation, accompanied by delivery of a duly executed written instrument of transfer in a form approved by the City Treasurer who shall act as transfer agent (the "transfer agent"). Whenever any Bond or Bonds shall be surrendered for transfer, the City shall execute and the transfer agent shall authenticate and deliver a new Bond or Bonds, for like aggregate principal amount. The transfer agent shall require payment by the bondholder requesting the transfer of any tax or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to the transfer. The transfer agent shall not be required (i) to issue, register the transfer of or exchange any Bond during a period beginning at the opening of business 15 days before the day of the giving of a notice of redemption of Bonds selected for redemption as described in the form of Bond contained in Section 14 of this Ordinance and ending at the close of business on the day of that giving of notice, or (ii) to register the transfer of or exchange any Bond so selected for redemption in whole or in part, except the unredeemed portion of Bonds being redeemed in part. The City shall give the transfer agent notice of call for redemption at least 20 days prior to the date notice of redemption is to be given.

The transfer agent shall keep or cause to be kept, at its principal office, sufficient books for the registration and transfer of the Bonds, which shall at all times be open to inspection by the City, and, upon presentation for such purpose, the transfer agent shall, under such reasonable regulations as it may prescribe, transfer or cause to be transferred, on said books, Bonds as hereinbefore provided.

If the Bond shall become mutilated, the City, at the expense of the holder of the Bond, shall execute, and the transfer agent shall authenticate and deliver, a new Bond of like tenor in exchange and substitution for the mutilated Bond, upon surrender to the transfer agent of the mutilated Bond. If any Bond issued under this Ordinance shall be lost, destroyed or stolen, evidence of the loss, destruction or theft may be submitted to the transfer agent and, if this evidence is satisfactory to both and indemnity satisfactory to the transfer agent shall be given, and if all requirements of any applicable law including Act 354, Public Acts of Michigan, 1972, as amended ("Act 354"), being sections 129.131 to 129.135, inclusive, of the Michigan Compiled Laws have been met, the City, at the expense of the owner, shall execute, and the transfer agent shall thereupon authenticate and deliver, a new Bond of like tenor and bearing the statement required by Act 354, or any applicable law hereafter enacted, in lieu of and in substitution for the Bond so lost, destroyed or stolen. If any such Bond shall have matured or shall be about to mature, instead of issuing a substitute Bond the transfer agent may pay the same without surrender thereof.

Section 7. Payment of Bonds; Security. The Bond and the interest thereon shall be payable solely from the Net Revenues, and to secure such payment, there is hereby created a statutory lien upon the whole of the Net Revenues which shall be a first lien that is of equal standing and priority as to Net Revenues with the lien in favor of the Series 2007 Bond to continue until payment in full of the principal of and interest on all bonds payable from the Net Revenues, or, until sufficient cash or Sufficient Government Obligations have been deposited in trust for payment in full of all Bonds of a series then outstanding, principal and interest on such Bonds to maturity, or, if called for redemption, to the date fixed for redemption together with the amount of the redemption premium, if any. Upon deposit of cash or Sufficient Government Obligations, as provided in the previous sentence, the statutory lien shall be terminated with respect to that series of Bonds, the holders of that series shall have no further rights under this Ordinance except for payment from the deposited funds, and the Bonds of that series shall no longer be considered to be outstanding under this Ordinance.

Section 8. Bondholders' Rights; Receiver. The holder or holders of the Bonds representing in the aggregate not less than twenty percent (20%) of the entire principal amount thereof then outstanding, may, by suit, action, mandamus or other proceedings, protect and enforce the statutory lien upon the Net Revenues of the System, and may, by suit, action, mandamus or other proceedings, enforce and compel performance of all duties of the officers of the City, including the fixing of sufficient rates, the collection of Revenues, the proper segregation of the Revenues of the System and the proper application thereof. The statutory lien upon the Net Revenues, however, shall not be construed as to compel the sale of the System or any part thereof.

If there is a default in the payment of the principal of or interest on the Bonds, any court having jurisdiction in any proper action may appoint a receiver to administer and operate the System on behalf of the City and under the direction of the court, and by and with the approval of the court to perform all of the duties of the officers of the City more particularly set forth herein and in Act 94.

The holder or holders of the Bonds shall have all other rights and remedies given by Act 94 and law, for the payment and enforcement of the Bonds and the security therefor.

Section 9. Management; Fiscal Year. The operation, repair and management of the System and the acquiring of the Project shall continue to be under the supervision and control of the City Council. The City Council may employ such person or persons in such capacity or capacities as it deems advisable to carry on the efficient management and operation of the System. The City Council may make such rules and regulations as it deems advisable and necessary to assure the efficient management and operation of the System. The System shall be operated on the basis of an operating year which shall coincide with the City's fiscal year.

Section 10. No Free Service or Use. No free service or use of the System, or service or use of the System at less than cost, shall be furnished by the System to any person, firm or corporation, public or private, or to any public agency or instrumentality, including the City.

Section 11. Fixing and Revising Rates; Rate Covenant. The rates now in effect and the rate adjustments to be placed into effect before the completion of the Project are estimated to be sufficient to provide for the payment of the expenses of administration and operation and such expenses for maintenance of the System as are necessary to preserve the System in good repair and working order, to provide for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds as the same become due and payable, and the maintenance of the reserve therefore, if required, and to provide for all other obligations, expenditures and funds for the System required by law and this Ordinance. The rates shall be fixed and revised from time to time as may be necessary to produce these amounts, and it is hereby covenanted and agreed to fix and maintain rates for services furnished by the System at all times sufficient to provide for the foregoing.

Section 12. Funds and Accounts; Flow of Funds. Commencing upon the adoption of this Ordinance, all funds belonging to the System shall be continued and maintained as provided herein and all Revenues of the System shall continue to be set aside as collected and credited to an account to be designated SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM RECEIVING ACCOUNT (the "Receiving Fund"). The Revenues credited to the Receiving Fund are pledged for the purpose of the following accounts and shall be transferred or debited from the Receiving Fund periodically in the manner and at the times and in the order of priority hereinafter specified:

A. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE ACCOUNT: Out of the Revenues credited to the Receiving Fund there shall be first set aside in, or credited to, a fund designated OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE ACCOUNT (the "Operation and Maintenance Account"), monthly a sum sufficient to provide for the payment of the next month's expenses of administration and operation of the System and such current expenses for the maintenance thereof as may be necessary to preserve the same in good repair and working order.

A budget, showing in detail the estimated costs of administration,

operation and maintenance of the System for the next ensuing operating year, shall be prepared by the City prior to the commencement of each ensuing operating year.

B. BOND AND INTEREST REDEMPTION ACCOUNT: There shall be continued and maintained a separate depository account designated BOND AND INTEREST REDEMPTION ACCOUNT (the "Redemption Account"), the moneys on deposit therein from time to time to be used solely for the purpose of paying the principal of, redemption premiums (if any) and interest on the Bond.

Out of the Revenues remaining in the Receiving Fund, after provision for the Operation and Maintenance Account, there shall be set aside quarterly commencing October 1, 2008 and the first day of each fiscal year quarter thereafter in the Debt Retirement Account an amount proportionately sufficient to provide for the payment when due of the principal installment amount of and interest on the Bond then currently outstanding, less any amount in the Debt Retirement Account representing investment income on amounts on deposit in the Debt Retirement Account. Commencing on the first day of the first fiscal year quarter following the first principal installment payment on the Bond, the amount set aside each quarter for interest on the Bond shall be 1/2 of the total amount of interest next coming due on the Bond and the amount set aside each quarter for principal shall be 1/4 of the amount of principal next coming due by maturity. If there is any deficiency in the amount previously set aside, that deficiency shall be added to the next succeeding quarterly requirements. The amount to be set aside for the payment of principal and interest on any principal payment shall not exceed the amount which, when added to the money on deposit in the Debt Retirement Account including investment income thereon, is necessary to pay principal and interest due on the Bond to the next succeeding principal payment date.

No further payments need be made into the Redemption Account after enough of the principal installments of the Bond have been retired so that the amount then held in the Redemption Account (including the Bond Reserve Account, if any), is equal to the entire amount of principal and interest which will be payable at the time of maturity of all the principal installments of the Bond then remaining outstanding.

The moneys in the Redemption Account shall be invested in accordance with Section 13 of this Ordinance, and profit realized or income earned on such investment shall be used or transferred as provided in Section 13 of this Ordinance.

C. REPLACEMENT AND IMPROVEMENT ACCOUNT: There shall next be continued and maintained an account designated REPLACEMENT AND IMPROVEMENT ACCOUNT (the "Replacement Account"), the money credited thereto to be used solely for the purpose of making repairs, replacements, improvements, enlargements or extensions to the System including any buildings or structures related to the System. Out of the Revenues and moneys of the System remaining in the Receiving Fund each year after provision has been made for the deposit of moneys in the Operation and Maintenance Account and the Redemption Account there may be deposited in the Replacement Account an amount, if any, determined by the City Council.

D. SURPLUS MONEYS: Thereafter, any Revenues in the Receiving Fund after satisfying all the foregoing requirements of this Section may, at the discretion of the City, be used for any of the following purposes:

1. Transferred to the Replacement Account.
2. Transferred to the Redemption Account and used to redeem Bonds prior to maturity pursuant to Section 5 of this Ordinance.
3. Retained in the Receiving Fund.

Section 13. Bond Proceeds. The proceeds of the sale of the Bond as received by the City shall be deposited in an account separate from other money of the City and held in a bank or banks qualified to act as depository of the proceeds of sale under the provisions of Section 15 of Act 94 designated SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM REVENUE BOND, SERIES 2008 PROJECT CONSTRUCTION FUND (the "Construction Fund"). Moneys in the Construction Fund shall be applied solely in payment of the cost of the Project including any engineering, legal and other expenses incident thereto and to the financing thereof, and shall be fully expended on Project costs within three years after the date of delivery of the Bond. Payments for construction, either on account or otherwise, shall not be made unless the registered engineer in charge of such work shall file with the City Council a signed statement to the effect that the work has been completed in accordance with the plans and specifications therefore, that it was done pursuant to and in accordance with the contract therefor (including properly authorized change orders), that such work is satisfactory and that such work has not been previously paid for.

Any unexpended balance of the proceeds of sale of the Bond remaining in the Construction Fund after completion of the Project shall, in the discretion of the City Council, be used either for further improvements, enlargements and extension to the System, if, at the time of such expenditures, such use is approved by the MDEQ or the Michigan Department of Treasury, if such permission is then required by law, or for the purpose of purchasing Bonds on the open market at not more than the fair market value thereof, but not more than the price at which the Bond may next be called for redemption, or used for the purpose of paying principal of the Bond upon maturity or calling Bond for redemption.

Section 14. Bond Form. The Bonds shall be in substantially the following form subject to such changes as may be required by the Authority or the City's bond counsel:

The CITY OF CHELSEA, County of Washtenaw, State of Michigan (the "City"), for value received, hereby promises to pay, but only out of the hereinafter described Net Revenues of the System (hereinafter defined), to the Michigan Municipal Bond Authority (the "Authority"), or registered assigns, the Principal Amount shown above, or such portion thereof as shall have been advanced to the City pursuant to a Purchase Contract between the City and the Authority and a Supplemental Agreement by and among the City, the Authority and the State of Michigan acting through the Department of Environmental Quality, in lawful money of the United States of America, unless prepaid prior thereto as hereinafter provided.

During the time the Principal Amount is being drawn down by the City under this bond, the Authority will periodically provide to the City a statement showing the amount of principal that has been advanced and the date of each advance, which statement shall constitute prima facie evidence of the reported information; provided that no failure on the part of the Authority to provide such a statement or to reflect a disbursement or the correct amount of a disbursement shall relieve the City of its obligation to repay the outstanding Principal Amount actually advanced, all accrued interest thereon, and any other amount payable with respect thereto in accordance with the terms of this bond.

The Principal Amount shall be payable on the dates and in the annual principal installment amounts set forth in the Schedule A attached hereto and made a part hereof, as such Schedule may be adjusted if less than \$11,000,000 is disbursed to the City or if a portion of the Principal Amount is prepaid as provided below, with interest on said principal installments from the date each said installment is delivered to the holder hereof until paid at the rate of two and one-half percent (2.50%) per annum. Interest is first payable on _____ 1, 200_, and semiannually thereafter (principal is payable on the first day of _____ commencing _____ 1, 200_ (as identified in the Purchase Contract) and annually thereafter.

The Bonds are subject to redemption prior to maturity by the City only with the prior written consent of the Authority and on such terms as may be required by the Authority.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this bond, as long as the Authority is the owner of this bond, (a) this bond is payable as to principal, premium, if any, and interest at The Bank of New York Trust Company, N.A., or at such other place as shall be designated in writing to the City by the Authority (the "Authority's Depository"); (b) the City agrees that it will deposit with the Authority's Depository payments of the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on this bond in immediately available funds by 12:00 noon at least five business days prior to the date on which any such payment is due whether by maturity, redemption or otherwise; in the event that the Authority's Depository has not received the City's deposit by 12:00 noon on the scheduled day, the City shall immediately pay to the Authority as invoiced by the Authority an amount to recover the Authority's administrative costs and lost investment earnings attributable to that late payment; and (c) written notice of any redemption of this bond shall be given by the City and received by the Authority's Depository at least 40 days prior to the date on which such redemption is to be made.

Additional Interest

In the event of a default in the payment of principal or interest hereon when due, whether at maturity, by redemption or otherwise, the amount of such default shall bear interest (the "additional interest") at a rate equal to the rate of interest which is two percent above the Authority's cost of

[AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF LIMA TOWNSHIP BY AUTHORITY OF PUBLIC ACT 110 OF 2006, BEING MCL 125.3101 ET. SEQ., AS AMENDED, BY ADDING NEW LANGUAGE TO SECTION 7.11 AND 7.17 WHICH ALLOWS FOR EXTENSIONS OF TIME FOR THE EXPIRATION OF PRELIMINARY AND FINAL SITE PLANS.]

THE TOWNSHIP OF LIMA, WASHTENAW COUNTY, MICHIGAN HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION I. AMENDMENTS TO SECTIONS 7.11 AND 7.17 OF THE ORDINANCE

Section 7.11 of the Zoning Ordinance is amended by adding a new paragraph as follows:

Upon written application from the original applicant or legal representative, the Township may in its discretion, extend the expiration of approval of a preliminary site plan as provided in this Section by an additional 180 days for good cause shown, but shall not extend the expiration of approval for more than two (2) extensions. The Planning Commission shall be responsible for approval of extensions of preliminary site plans under this Section, except that the Township Board shall make such determinations with respect to special use site plans.

Section 7.17 of the Zoning Ordinance is amended by adding a new paragraph as follows:

Upon written application from the original applicant or legal representative, the Township may in its discretion, extend the expiration of a final site plan by an additional 180 days for good cause shown, but shall not extend the expiration of approval for more than two (2) extensions of the final site plan. The Planning Commission shall be responsible for approval of extensions of final site plans under this Section, except that the Township Board shall make such determinations with respect to special use site plans.

SECTION II. SEPERABILITY

Validity of Ordinance: Sections not invalidated. If any section, subsection, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof, or of any other provisions in the Lima Township Zoning Ordinance.

SECTION III. REPEAL

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this are hereby repealed.

SECTION IV. SAVINGS CLAUSE

The balance of the Lima Township Zoning Ordinance, except as herein or heretofore amended, shall remain in full force and effect. The repeal and amendments provided herein shall not abrogate or affect any offense or act committed or done, or any penalty or forfeiture incurred, or any pending fee, assessments, litigation or prosecution of any right established, occurring prior to the effective date hereof.

providing funds (as determined by the Authority) to make payment on the bonds of the Authority issued to provide funds to purchase this bond but in no event in excess of the maximum rate of interest permitted by law. The additional interest shall continue to accrue until the Authority has been fully reimbursed for all costs incurred by the Authority (as determined by the Authority) as a consequence of the City's default. Such additional interest shall be payable on the interest payment date following demand of the Authority. In the event that (for reasons other than the default in the payment of any municipal obligation purchased by the Authority) the investment of amounts in the reserve account established by the Authority for the bonds of the Authority issued to provide funds to purchase this bond fails to provide sufficient available funds (together with any other funds which may be made available for such purpose) to pay the interest on outstanding bonds of the Authority issued to fund such account, the City shall and hereby agrees to pay on demand only the City's pro rata share (as determined by the Authority) of such deficiency as additional interest on this bond.

For prompt payment of principal and interest on this bond, the City has irrevocably pledged the revenues of its Sewage Disposal System, including all appurtenances, extensions and improvements thereto (the "System"), after provision has been made for reasonable and necessary expenses of operation, maintenance and administration (the "Net Revenues"), and a statutory lien thereon is hereby recognized and created that is of equal standing and priority with the lien in favor of the City's Sewage Disposal System Revenue Bond, Series 2007, dated September 20, 2007 (the "Outstanding Bond").

This bond is a single, fully-registered, non-convertible bond in the principal sum indicated above issued pursuant to Ordinance No. 154 and Ordinance No. 157 each duly adopted by the City Council of the City, and under and in full compliance with the Constitution and statutes of the State of Michigan, including specifically Act 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, as amended, for the purpose of paying the cost of acquiring and constructing improvements to the System.

For a complete statement of the revenues from which and the conditions under which this bond is payable, a statement of the conditions under which additional bonds of equal standing may hereafter be issued and the general covenants and provisions pursuant to which this bond is issued, reference is made to the above-described Ordinance No. 157.

This bond is a self-liquidating bond, payable, both as to principal and interest, solely from the Net Revenues of the System. The principal of and interest on this bond are secured by the statutory lien hereinbefore mentioned.

The City has covenanted and agreed, and does hereby covenant and agree, to fix and maintain at all times while any bonds payable from the Net Revenues of the System shall be outstanding, such rates for service furnished by the System as shall be sufficient to provide for payment of the interest upon and the principal of the bonds of this issue, and the Outstanding Bond, as and when the same shall become due and payable, and to maintain a bond redemption fund therefor, to provide for the payment of expenses of administration and operation and such expenses for maintenance of the System as are necessary to preserve the same in good repair and working order, and to provide for such other expenditures and funds for the System as are required by Ordinance No. 157.

This bond is transferable only upon the books of the City by the registered owner in person or the registered owner's attorney duly authorized in writing, upon the surrender of this bond together with a written instrument of transfer satisfactory to the transfer agent, duly executed by the registered owner or the registered owner's attorney duly authorized in writing, and thereupon a new bond or bonds in the same aggregate principal amount and of the same maturity shall be issued to the transferee in exchange therefor as provided in the ordinance authorizing the bonds, and upon payment of the charges, if any, therein prescribed.

Based on the schedule provided below unless revised as provided in this paragraph, repayment of principal of the bond shall be made until the full amount advanced to the City is repaid. In the event the Order of Approval issued by the Department of Environmental Quality (the "Order") approves a principal amount of assistance less than the amount of the Bond delivered to the Authority, the Authority shall only disburse principal up to the amount stated in the Order. In the event (1) that the payment schedule approved by the City and described below provides for payment of a total principal amount greater than the amount of assistance approved by the Order or (2) that less than the principal amount of assistance approved by the Order is disbursed to the City by the Authority, the Authority shall prepare a new payment schedule which shall be effective upon receipt by the City.

Interest on the bond shall accrue on principal disbursed by the Authority to the City from the date principal is disbursed, until paid, at the rate of 2.50% per annum, payable _____ 1, 200, and semi-annually hereafter.

The City agrees that it will deposit with the Authority's Depository, or such other place as shall be designated in writing to the City by the Authority payments of the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on this bond in immediately available funds by 12:00 noon at least five business days prior to the date on which any such payment is due whether by maturity, redemption or otherwise. In the event that the Authority's Depository has not received the City's deposit by 12:00 noon on the scheduled day, the City shall immediately pay to the Authority as invoiced by the Authority an amount to recover the Authority's administrative costs and lost investment earning attributable to that late payment.

Section 15. Additional Bonds. Except as hereinafter provided, the City shall not issue additional Bonds of equal or prior standing with the Bond.

The right is reserved in accordance with the provisions of Act 94, to issue additional bonds payable from the Revenues of the System which shall be of equal standing and priority of lien on the Net Revenues of the System with the Bond but only for the following purposes and under the following terms and conditions.

(a) To complete the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor. Such bonds shall not be authorized unless the engineers in charge of construction shall execute a certificate evidencing the fact that additional funds are needed to complete the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor and stating the amount that will be required to complete the Project. If such certificate shall be so executed and filed with the City, it shall be the duty of the City to provide for and issue additional revenue bonds in the amount stated in said cer-

tificate to be necessary to complete the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications plus an amount necessary to issue such bonds or to provide for part or all of such amount from other sources.

(b) For subsequent repairs, extensions, enlargements and improvements to the System or for the purpose of refunding part of any Bonds then outstanding or for both purposes and paying costs of issuing such additional Bonds including deposits which may be required to be made to a bond reserve account, if any. Bonds for such purposes shall not be issued pursuant to this subparagraph (b) unless the Adjusted Net Revenues of the System for the preceding twelve-month operating year shall be at least equal to the maximum amount of principal and interest thereafter maturing in any operating year on the then outstanding Bonds and on the additional Bonds then being issued. If the additional Bonds are to be issued in whole or in part for refunding outstanding Bonds, the annual principal and interest requirements shall be determined by deducting from the principal and interest requirements for each operating year the annual principal and interest requirements of any Bonds to be refunded from the proceeds of the additional Bonds. For purposes of this subparagraph (b) the City may elect to use as the last preceding operating year any operating year ending not more than sixteen months prior to the date of delivery of the additional Bonds. Determination by the City as to existence of conditions permitting the issuance of additional Bonds shall be conclusive. No additional Bonds of equal standing as to the Net Revenues of the System shall be issued pursuant to the authorization contained in this subparagraph if the City shall then be in default in making its required payments to the Operation and Maintenance Account or the Redemption Account.

(c) For refunding all or a part of the outstanding Bonds and paying costs of issuing such additional Bonds including deposits which may be required to be made to a bond reserve account, if any. No additional Bonds shall be issued pursuant to this subsection unless the maximum amount of principal and interest maturing in any operating year after giving effect to the refunding shall be less than the maximum amount of principal and interest maturing in any operating year prior to giving effect to the refunding.

Section 16. Negotiated Sale; Application to MDEQ and Authority; Execution of Documents. Pursuant to Section 309(1) of Act 34, Public Acts of Michigan, 2001, as amended, the City hereby determines to sell the Bond at a negotiated sale. The City hereby determines that a negotiated sale to the Authority is necessary in order to meet the requirements of MDEQ and the Authority as administrator of the Clean Water Revolving Fund. The Authorized Officers are hereby authorized to make application to the Authority and to the MDEQ for placement of the Bond with the Authority and the actions taken by the Authorized Officers with respect to the Bond prior to the adoption of this ordinance are ratified and confirmed. The Authorized Officers are authorized to approve the forms of and execute and deliver the Purchase Contract and the Supplemental Agreement. Any of the Authorized Officers is further authorized to execute and deliver such contracts, documents and certificates as are necessary or advisable to qualify the Bond for the Clean Water Revolving Fund.

Prior to the delivery of the Bond to the Authority, each Authorized Officer is hereby authorized to make such changes to the form of Bond contained in Section 16 of this ordinance as may be necessary to conform to the requirements of Act 227, Public Acts of Michigan 1985, as amended ("Act 227"), including, but not limited to changes in the principal maturity and interest payment dates and references to additional security required by Act 227.

Section 17. Covenant Regarding Tax Exempt Status of the Bonds. The City shall, to the extent permitted by law, take all actions within its control necessary to maintain the exclusion of the interest on the Bond from gross income for federal income tax purposes under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, (the "Code") including, but not limited to, actions relating to any required rebate of arbitrage earnings and the expenditure and investment of Bond proceeds and moneys deemed to be Bond proceeds, and to prevent the Bonds from being or becoming "private activity bonds" as that term is used in Section 141 of the Code.

Section 18. Approval of Bond Details. The Authorized Officers are each hereby authorized to adjust the final bond details set forth herein to the extent necessary or convenient to complete the transaction authorized herein, and in pursuance of the foregoing is authorized to exercise the authority and make the determinations authorized pursuant to Section 7a(1)(c) of Act 94, including but not limited to determinations regarding interest rates, prices, discounts, maturities, principal amounts, denominations, dates of issuance, interest payment dates, redemption rights, the place of delivery and payment, series designations and other matters, provided that the principal amount of Bond issued shall not exceed the principal amount authorized in this Ordinance, the interest rate per annum on the Bond shall not exceed three percent (3.50%), and the Bond shall mature in not more than twenty (20) annual installments.

Section 19. Appointment of Bond Counsel. The representation of the City by Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone, P.L.C. ("Miller Canfield"), as bond counsel is hereby reconfirmed and re-approved notwithstanding the representation by Miller Canfield of the Authority in connection with the Clean Water Revolving Fund program which may include advising the Authority with respect to this borrowing.

Section 20. Repeal, Savings Clause. All ordinances, resolutions or orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, repealed.

Section 21. Severability; Paragraph Headings; and Conflict. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance. The paragraph headings in this Ordinance are furnished for convenience of reference only and shall not be considered to be part of this Ordinance.

Section 22. Publication and Recording. This Ordinance shall be published in full in The Chelsea Standard, a newspaper of general circulation in the City qualified under State law to publish legal notices, promptly after its adoption, and shall be recorded in the Ordinance Book of the City and such recording authenticated by the signatures of the Mayor and the Clerk.

Section 22. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be effective upon its adoption and publication.

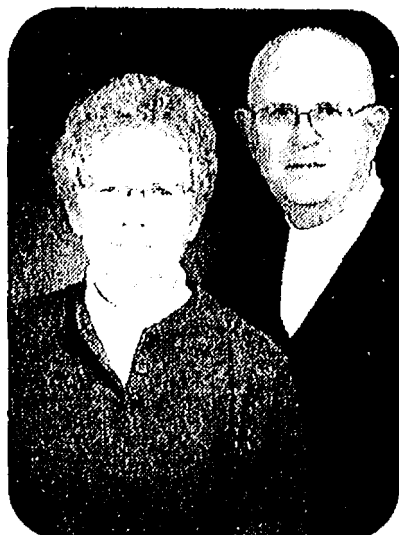

should notify the local health department. It is not uncommon for a cat or dog to get in a fight with a skunk or catch a bat.

If you are bestowed with a dead or injured bat or skunk by your loving pet be very careful handling it as not to come in contact with its body fluids.

Check your pet over to see if it has any cuts. If a pet is bitten it will probably have to be quarantined and observed until the incubation period passes to make sure it does not have rabies. This is often done at your home simply by keeping the animal fenced or caged for the quarantine time.

Offer the bat or skunk carcass, if available, to the health department to check. They can determine if a dead animal had rabies by analyzing fluid samples from its brain. They will tell you how to get it to them and what the time restraint is for testing.

They can also advise you as to how to safely get the carcass to them.

If you leave food or water dishes outside for your pets it is a good idea to wash and sterilize them often.
