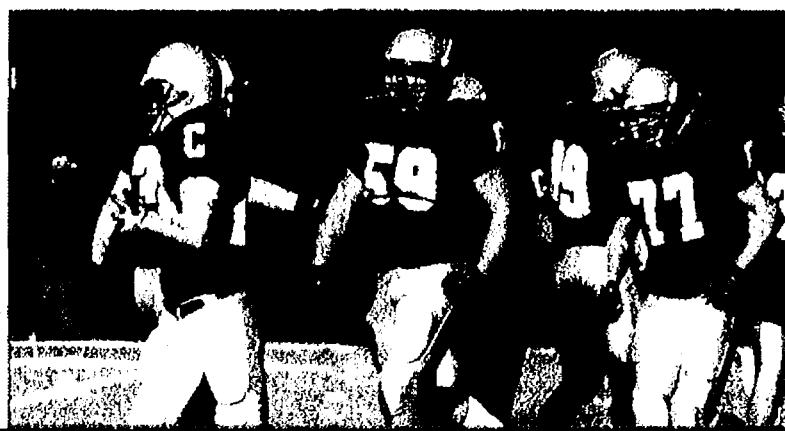

### Sylvan, Lyndon elections a mixed bag

Residents of Sylvan and Lyndon townships are entering a new era of government with a combination of incumbents, newcomers, and the return of some former board members.

The most closely watched and heavily contested races were for

the spots of Sylvan clerk and treasurer, and Lyndon clerk.

Republican Arlene Grau, the incumbent Sylvan treasurer, expressed her gratitude that voters returned her to office for a fourth term.

"I'm grateful that we won, I really am," she said. "Maybe we can get back to working together for

the good of the township now."

Her opponent, Western Washtenaw Democrats Chairman Roy Schmidt, made reference to the township's past and present legal difficulties.

"Even though a Republican slate was elected in Sylvan, my personal goal was met," he said.

### Schauer cleans House with win over Walberg

At 1:40 a.m. on Wednesday, Tim Walberg somberly entered the third floor of Daryl's Downtown in Jackson where his die-hard supporters were still gathered awaiting election results. While those in the room had been chatting and hopeful all evening long, the room

suddenly became quiet as Walberg and his team made their first appearance in hours.

Walberg conceded to the crowd that, although the final numbers were not yet in, Democratic challenger Mark Schauer had won the Michigan District 7 seat in the U.S. House of Representatives.

It turns out Walberg was cor-

rect. When the numbers were finally counted, Schauer had clearly defeated the Republican incumbent 157,189 to 149,766. The Democrat also won in Washtenaw County, 25,037 to 21,909.

Schauer, who hosted his campaign celebration in Battle Creek, addressed the crowd early

## Organization making a difference in county politics

Tuesday night's results at the polls help prove that with a little organization, a few ideas and plenty of commitment, local groups can make a difference.

While members of the Western Washtenaw Democrats could easily add up the final numbers of local, state and national elections, it's hard to figure just how much influence they had in reaching those totals.

But it's easy to assume that they did have some impact — and that alone was reason to celebrate. The group proved that politics and change start not only on Main Street, but Your Street.

"We were a struggling group for a while and we have gone through several muta-

tions," said state Rep. Pam Byrnes of Lyndon Township, who founded the group in 1999.

"The current leadership has broadened our outreach and put in hours and hours into organization," Byrnes said.

"We have — through the leadership of Roy Schmidt, Jane Pacheco, Guerin Wilkerson, Rich Robinson and others been able to become more community-oriented and issue-oriented, not just party-oriented."

Byrnes said discussions about forming a group began following the 1998 elections. Not everyone thought it was a worthwhile endeavor.

"The County Democratic Party always

### Patrias, Dils accept local honors at banquet

The Chelsea community celebrated the good works of two of its shining lights last week.

Sheila Morrison Patrias and Art Dils were honored with the 2008 Citizen of the Year Award and the Lifetime Achievement Award, respectively.

More than 100 friends, family, co-workers and community members marked the occasion with a banquet at the Comfort Inn's Village Conference Center, welcomed by the Master of Ceremonies Steve Olsen, Chamber president.

Cocktails began at 6:30, followed at 7 by a catered meal of beef tenderloin, chicken, mashed redskin potatoes and grilled asparagus.

After dinner, Chelsea Mayor Ann Feeney, County Commissioner Mark Ouimet, R-District 1; and State Rep. Pam Byrnes, D-District 52, presented proclamations from the city, county and state, and Olsen stood in to present for Congressman Tim Walberg, R-District 7.

"The wonder is that this hasn't happened sooner ... It's been a long time coming," Feeney said while presenting Art Dils with a proclamation from the city.

The Citizen of the Year honors a Chelsea-area person who is nominated for their work in the community in the past year.

The Lifetime Achievement award is just that, honoring a person's long-term contributions to the community.

The awards are co-sponsored by the Chelsea Area Chamber of Commerce and the Chelsea Standard.

Laurie Baumer, CEO of Ele's Place, nominated Patrias for her tireless efforts to establish a branch of the Lansing-based children's bereavement and counseling organization in Washtenaw County.

"Because of (Sheila), Ele's Place was inspired to help, and in July 2006, we committed" to opening the counseling center on Zeeb Road, Baumer noted in her remarks.

"She has continued to lead community fund-raising activities such as the annual breakfasts that have raised thousands of dollars in support," Baumer said.

"Without Sheila's hard work, none of this would have been possible."

Jane Shrosbee is a member of the Ele's Place Founder's Council, a group that Patrias recruited almost single-handedly to form the backbone of the local organization, but soon had the need for the bereavement services for her own family.

"When my husband Bill died in 2004, it gave us an even closer bond," Shrosbee said.

"Ele's Place is exactly what we needed in this area."

Patrias took to the podium to comment on the award.

"It's hard to believe it's been 17 years since the death of my husband Rod Morrison, which is what brought me to all of this," she said.

Patrias then thanked her daughters Stacia and Leah who were only 4 and 2 years old at the time of their father's death; and her husband, Dr. Marty Patrias.

"I truly feel that God had a plan for me, and Ele's Place was part of that plan," Patrias said.

"Chelsea has seen so many families affected by the death of a family member."

She went on to tell the story of a family in which the father had died of a heart problem last March while out hunting with his 8-year-old son and others, and the mother was six hours away on a business trip.

One of the Founders Council members told the woman about Ele's Place. Three days later she called Patrias at 4 o'clock in the morning, sobbing.

"She and I talked everything through for about 45 minutes, and they joined Ele's Place three weeks later," Patrias said.

The speakers introducing Art Dils took a much lighter tone, roasting their good friend and causing lots of laughter.

The list of his involvement in the community is long, ranging from the school district, the hospital, Silver Maples, philanthropic foundations, and many behind-the-scenes activities.

Dils and his wife Carol are now semi-retired, and he is president and publisher of Golfing in Michigan magazine.

Jack Merkel nominated his longtime friend for the Lifetime Achievement award.

"We're here to celebrate 30 years of Art giving his time and talent to many important community organizations," Merkel said.

"Chelsea is indeed an outstanding place to live, but it didn't get there by itself — people like Art made it that way."

Will Johnson, the "founding father" of the hospital, spoke of Dils' willingness to get involved in community organizations.

"I worked with Art on Chelsea Community Hospital, Silver Maples of Chelsea and the Chelsea Civic Foundation, which later became the Chelsea Community Foundation," Johnson said.

"In all of these things, Art has been instrumental."

John Bohlender is one of Dils' closest personal friends, bridge partners, and golf and fishing buddies, and told several stories about some of their memorable outings enjoying those activities.

"Art has been my bridge partner for 28 loooong

years," Bohlender said, to hoots of laughter.

"Bridge is not a complicated game; all you have to do is count to 20 — but he could never seem to make it past 14."

Dils himself spoke about his friendship with Fred Mills, one of last year's Lifetime Achievement Award winners, who was his neighbor when he moved to Chelsea in 1975 while Mills was a school district official.

"Anytime one of my daughters was going out with a young man, I'd have Fred give me a complete report," Dils said.

"We got Jack Merkel to run for mayor and Chelsea is better for it; Will Johnson gets the credit for my involvement with the hospital and Silver Maples; and let me tell you about John's golf — he's a really good bridge player."

Dils then gave recognition to his wife Carol and the many family members who attended.

Following the banquet, Bob Pierce, director of the Chelsea Area Chamber of Commerce, said he couldn't be more pleased with the ceremony.

"What a great celebration this was for two of our finest citizens. I don't recall a Citizen of the Year banquet that was filled with more

emotion than this year's event," Pierce said.

"Sheila's touching and poignant talk reminded all of us of the importance of organizations like Ele's Place and the people who establish them. We are so blessed to have Sheila as a member of our community."

"The parade of speakers for Art painted an equally inspiring picture of what it takes to be a person who is committed to making things happen in our town," Pierce added.

"The humor in the presentations didn't overshadow his long list of accomplishments and love for Chelsea. What a night!"

"It was a lovely evening, it was a great tribute to Art, and it was great to have all our family here to see it," she said.

The audience included Ed Hurst, the Dils' longtime friend.

"We retired and moved to Clare, and we were thrilled when Art and Carol asked us to come for this tonight," Hurst said.

"We've known them for 30 years; I first met him on the school board, and he's been a wonderful friend."

## Power outage turns out the lights on football game

A power outage near the end of the second quarter of Friday's Chelsea vs. Milan football playoff game had city and school officials looking for answers as late as Tuesday.

Milan was ahead 14-7 with 9:17 left in the second quarter and Chelsea was preparing to kick off following a touchdown by Chelsea junior Nick Hill when the lights went out — and stayed out for about 90 minutes.

Chelsea Superintendent Dave Killips said Monday

there was no consensus on what caused the outage but evidence suggested a blown fuse in a transformer on the west side of the concession stand. "We don't know why yet, but the bottom line is we don't know what caused it," Killips said.

Tests were done Tuesday to replicate the power load on the line, but results were inconclusive.

"We tested the whole system and found no excessive draw," Killips said Tuesday. "Our best guess is we had a weakened fuse."

Killips explained that the

line comes in from Freer Road and enters the stadium at the ticket booth, and from there splits off toward the concession stand.

"We still had lights in the ticket booth and the Kiwanis trailer, but everything else went dark," he said.

He praised quick action by city electric crews and public safety services to keep the situation from getting out of hand.

"I have to give a lot of credit to the electric department and the police and fire departments, for an hour and a half delay you couldn't have

asked for a smoother situation," Killips said.

The crowd seemed to take it in stride, and the marching band began playing to entertain them.

Killips said Ron Hopp, the contractor who did the electrical work on the stadium renovation, was one of the first to look at the problem when it happened Friday, and was involved in Tuesday's test.

"Our hope is that the team will continue to win and we can try this system again for another home game," Killips said.

## Area Police Briefs

### Restraining order violated

A 30-year-old Chelsea woman came into the police department at about 4 p.m. Oct. 23 to report that her ex-husband had violated a no-contact order by calling and leaving messages on her answering machine.

According to a police report, the woman told police the latest incident occurred at about 7 p.m. the day before when the ex-husband, a 44-year-old Chelsea man, left a message about some missing photos of their daughter.

She added that the man has called a number of times previously but she had ignored it, but now she "is sick of the situation," the report stated.

The court order states that neither party is allowed to contact the other.

The woman and her nephew confirmed that it was her ex-husband's voice on the message.

An officer went to the woman's home in the 200 block of Lincoln Street to make a digital recording of the message and turned it over to the judge who signed the order.

### Warrant arrest transport

At 2:25 a.m. Oct. 22, Calhoun County Sheriff's Deputies notified Chelsea Police they had arrested a woman on several outstanding Chelsea warrants.

A Chelsea officer was given permission to go to Battle Creek to pick up the 31-year-old Chelsea woman, and transported her to the Washtenaw County Jail without incident.

The warrants were for failure to appear in court on embezzlement and drug paraphernalia charges from 2007 and a third-degree retail fraud charge from this year.

### Stalking reported

An officer was dispatched to the 800 block of Moore Drive on Oct. 20 for a stalking complaint. A 20-year-old Chelsea woman told police her ex-boyfriend was harassing and frightening her, and she believed he was electronically tracking or physically following her movements.

According to a police report, the woman said she dated the 23-year-old Whitmore Lake man for eight months prior to breaking up with him on Oct. 8, when she told him she wanted no further contact with him.

She told police she went on a date with a 23-year-old Novi man Oct. 18 in Fowlerville,

and the next day received a text message from the suspect using the Novi man's first name and referring to the location of the date, which frightened and upset the woman.

He also sent a text message demanding the return of her cell phone even though the account is in her name, she sent the message "Don't talk to me," but he sent an additional 15 text messages, the report stated.

The victim's mother told police she was afraid of the suspect, and told the daughter to hide in the basement when he came over to retrieve the phone. The suspect became irate when the mother didn't return the manuals, case and box for the phone, but left quickly when the woman said she had called police and he heard sirens approaching.

When an officer contacted the suspect by phone at about 10 p.m. Oct. 19, he said he "felt very cheated" because he and the victim had looked at wedding rings about a week before the breakup, the report stated.

He said he knew about the date by seeing photos posted on a Facebook Web page.

He also said he had sent text messages to the Novi man once or twice a day to warn him about the girl, but had never met him.

A records check showed the suspect is currently on probation for a domestic assault conviction in Livingston County.

### Cash missing from purse

A 73-year-old woman reported to police that a substantial amount of money had been taken out of her purse on Oct. 14 and 15.

According to a police

report, the Chelsea Retirement Center resident said she discovered \$38 missing from a wallet in her purse when she returned from dinner on Oct. 14.

The wallet had been put back in the purse, which had been returned to a drawer in the nightstand next to her bed.

The next evening she discovered \$310 missing from the purse, but this time the pocket in the purse holding the cash had been ripped open, and like before, the purse had been put back in the nightstand.

There are no witnesses and

no suspects. CRC rooms are not locked in order to monitor the residents' well-being, the report stated.

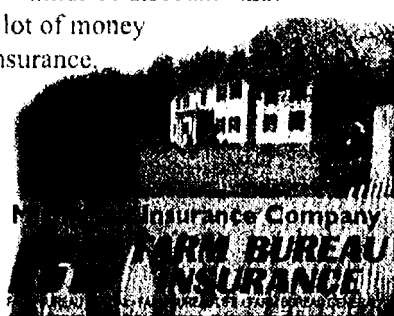

## State House, District 52

# Brynes earns convincing vote of confidence

Voters returned Democrat Pam Brynes to a hard and final term in the state House of Representatives Tuesday on a convincing margin over Republican challenger Eric Liebbriedis.

With 87 percent of the votes counted at 2 a.m. Wednesday, Brynes led Liebbriedis by more than 30 percent, 33,739 votes to 17,581. When the votes were counted later Wednesday morning, Brynes had won with 35,954 to 19,179 votes.

Riding a tidal wave of victories in a vast majority of election contests, Brynes joined other Democrats in an election-night reception at the Breakaway Restaurant in Chelsea's Arctic Coliseum.

But she noted that she

still didn't take her reelection for granted.

"This has been the result of years of hard work and years of working with constituents," Brynes said.

"It's like taking a test - you have to prepare, you can't just cram for it at the end."

As the local returns trickled in, the numerous televisions in the restaurant kept track of Barack Obama's extraordinary march to the presidency over John McCain, and Democratic wins nationwide in Congress.

"We've got a new president, but I'm closely watching the Schauer race," Brynes said.

"I know it's going to be close, it's a very diverse district."

"I'm also looking at what the Democratic Caucus in the (state)

House of Representatives is going to be in the morning," she added.

Roy Schmidt, chairman of the Western Washtenaw Democrats, said that election results across the country were an indication that the nation is ready for a new direction.

"I think it was incredible to be part of this election, it's a positive sign that things like a person's race didn't seem to affect things," Schmidt said.

"Obama is a guy who ran on hope and people got on board with that."

He added that the Democratic Party in general espouses a positive message.

"We don't want to turn the whole country Democrat, that would be boring," he said. "But we certainly want to foster a positive outlook."

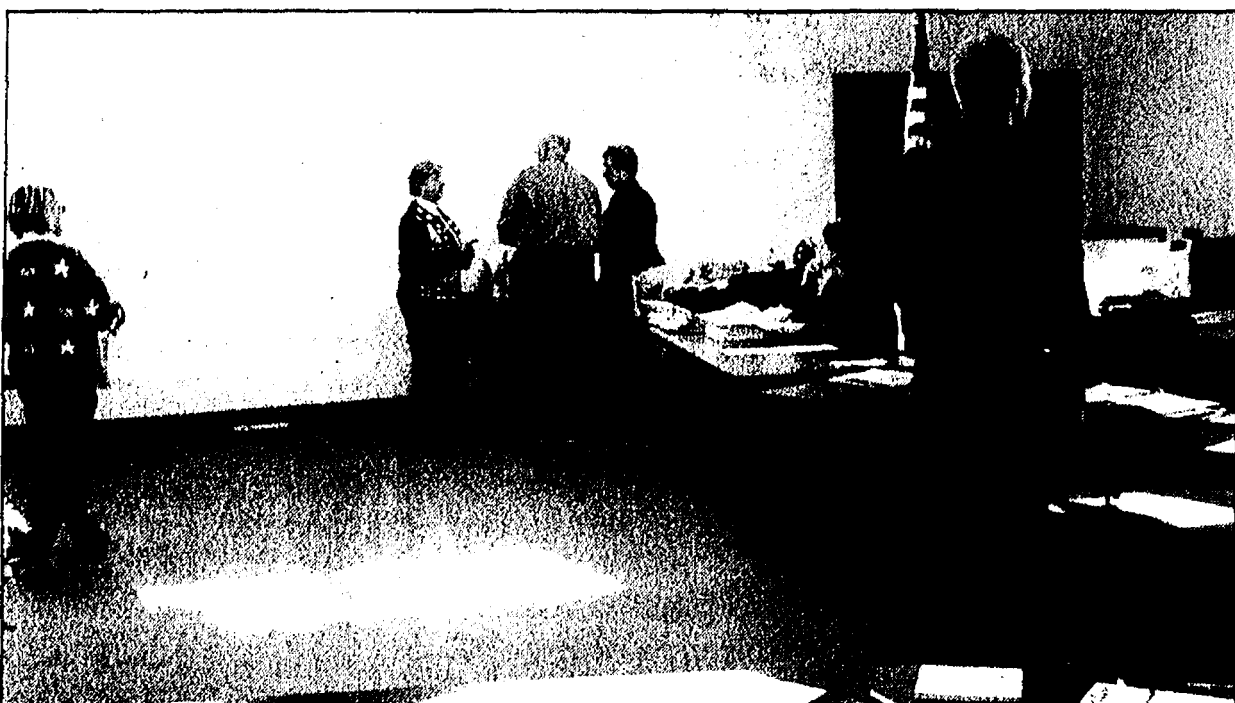

# Ypsilanti Township's Clayton easily defeats Taylor

Ypsilanti Township resident Jerry Clayton is the new sheriff of Washtenaw County.

Defeating Republican challenger Dwayne Taylor 70.97 percent to 28.47 in Tuesday's general election, Clayton heads back to the Washtenaw County Sheriff's Department where he retired in 2006 after attaining the rank of first lieutenant.

"It feels good," Clayton said on Tuesday night. "We are all excited and anxious to get to work."

Clayton upset incumbent sheriff Dan Minzey in August's Democratic primary election. He then continued to trumpet his message of change, renewed leadership and proper accountability at the sheriff's office.

Clayton has a more than 20 year career at the Washtenaw County Sheriff's Department, where he worked a corrections officer, deputy sheriff, shift sergeant and finally first lieutenant.

He also is a former Special

Weapons and Tactics team member and former executive team member of the Washtenaw County Sheriff Office Administration.

Before Clayton gets into developing some of the community oriented partnerships and programs that remained at the forefront of his campaign message throughout the primary and general election campaigns, he said he will begin looking at staff and departments before planning for any major changes after he takes office in January.

"I have already begun looking at some people I would like to put in place, but there will be a feeling out process after January," Clayton said. "I won't make any big changes right away."

One of his first priorities will be negotiating new contracts with more than a dozen Washtenaw County municipalities, which include one school district, that pay for police services. He said that issue lies at the center of the future of public safety in the county.

"We need to take an active leadership role in getting those contracts settled," Clayton said. "I will be pushing for longer term contracts, I don't think we can have these short-term contracts any more."

However, before he gets started with the great number of challenges he will face come January, Clayton took time Tuesday night to celebrate with his wife Sybil and their three sons.

Taylor, an Ypsilanti resident, said that voters will now be stuck with "more of the same," from Clayton and indicated that he will plan on running for sheriff again.

"I'm pretty sure that I will be keeping my eye on what's going on and I will plan on running again," Taylor said. "People will see in four years that (Clayton) is not a good sheriff. I just think there will be more of the same old politics, a lot of 'You scratch my back, I'll scratch yours.'"

Taylor questioned the social pro-

grams that Clayton had suggested developing during the last five to six months of campaigning. He said that he fears the sheriff's office will be spending too much on community engagement programs and not enough on deputy and reservist training.

"My question is: where will the money come from?" Taylor said. "The sheriff's department is already under-funded, where is he going to find all this money?"

"He discussed a program to help curb the recidivism rate. That kind of stuff isn't free."

Taylor has more than 13 years in private security where he has held various positions, and has been involved in the Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti police departments with the Explorer program and Washtenaw County Sheriff's Department as a cadet.

He ran unopposed on the Republican ticket during the August primary.

# Dems gain, retain seats across county

The books on the 2008 election are closed, and it will be remembered as a historic moment on many levels.

Extraordinary levels of voter registration pushed turnout to an unprecedented 69.33 percent, or 188,179 votes cast out of 271,423 voters in Washtenaw County.

## Ouimet survives Democratic headwind

Republican District 1 County Commissioner Mark Ouimet will live to serve his constituents another day – or term, rather.

As of 12:46 a.m. Wednesday with 73.27 percent of precincts reporting across the county, Ouimet had 10,410 votes or 60.26 percent of ballots cast to 6,792 for Democratic challenger Eric Borregard. Write-in candidates received 72 votes.

"The only thing that I haven't seen is a couple of Scio's and Chelsea (precincts) 1 and 2 haven't reported in, but it would be pretty hard to beat me at this point," Ouimet said, pleased as he and his wife drove home from a Republican gathering in downtown Saline.

"I feel very good and appreciative that I'll have the opportunity to represent the first district again," he said. "It was very rewarding. I did a lot of door-to-door and the feedback I was getting as I went through this was very positive."

Whether they were Democrat or Republican, Ouimet says folks on his beat felt very comfortable with the way he was representing them, and he attributes it to a simple formula.

"I always stayed focused on issues and not party politics, and I think people are really responding to that kind of approach to government," he said. "I think everyone realizes the significance of winning like we have won under a huge Democratic landslide."

"To be able to reverse that down-ballot like we did is a pretty big win."

Ouimet says his first priorities are dealing with the budget. "We have a deficit coming for 2009... we need to continue to address that and get it resolved, as it will be a fore-runner for our budget in 2010 and 2011."

He said that was a "critical" priority.  
Ouimet said he will also continue to merge the pension boards and getting better returns for retirees, in addition to getting more affordable road patrol back to the jurisdictions that contract with the Washtenaw County Sheriff's Department.

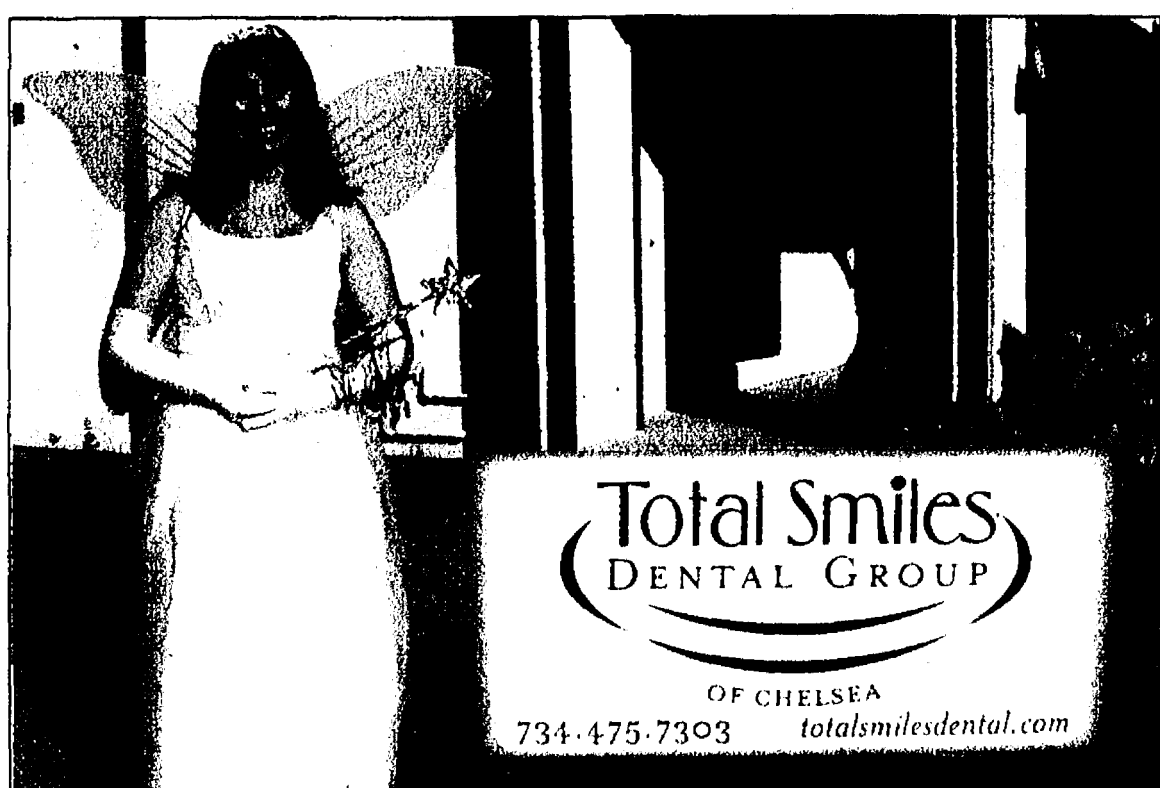

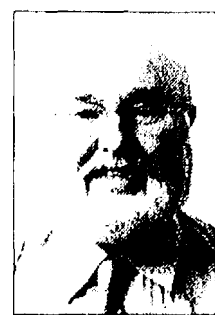

## Diabetic incident is a wake up call

The news that the family of a comatose diabetic is suing Dearborn and Allen Park police over a June 15 driving incident in Dearborn during which he was mistaken for a drunk sent a personal scare through me.

When I got home Monday after receiving the news, I said to my wife, "I need a medical bracelet telling everyone I am a diabetic."

It's a week later, and I've discovered I was not scared enough to put my words into action, but I will.

I do not know where the blame lies for the incident, in which a 59-year-old man was injured during a traffic stop that officers first thought involved an intoxicated or high-on-drugs driver and perhaps someone wanted for a domestic violence charge.

The suit says the Detroit man, Ernest Griglen, suffered a permanent brain injury and has been comatose since.

Perhaps officers need more training. Perhaps individuals like me need to have a better way of letting people know they might be suffering from low blood sugar or insulin shock.

I have spent many hours with police as a reporter and editor. My son-in-law is a police officer in a suburban Chicago town much like Dearborn.

So, I do understand the need to react quickly to threats and the feeling that the need be even more vigorous when reacting to someone apparently attacking a fellow officer.

My son-in-law recently won an award from his department for his efforts in subduing a person who refused to take his hand out of his pocket, which, it turns out, contained a toy, but realistic-looking, gun.

Someone reaching for an object on their belt or near their waist during a struggle with officers presents a clear-and-present danger that can't be ignored.

Technology is advancing. Hopefully, we can come up with a system that allows police officers to subdue someone without having to harm them and something that doesn't have to be pulled from a holster or retrieved from a belt holder.

Until that day, we have to accept that officers might have to resort to the tools available to them — and, in some cases, that will be physical force that might result in injury, sometimes with the deadly force of a handgun.

Having experienced low blood sugar many times, I also know it can be mistaken for intoxication or being under the influence of drugs.

I also know I can become irritated, irrational and even combative. I get focused on doing one single thing to solve my shakes, stomachache and horrible feelings.

Just ask my wife or co-workers.

I can explode at times, in the early stages of lowering blood sugar levels.

My wife has learned not to argue. She just suggests I test my blood sugar or eat a piece of fruit, or she just gets my tester and hands it to me.

But I still get very rigid, and if strangers approach me, I think I would try to shove them away, so I could test, deal with the problem or get to where I could eat something.

While I do not have an insulin pump, I do carry an

## Campaign should spur local tourism

The state's Pure Michigan Campaign plans a nationwide campaign next spring, including cable TV ads in all 50 states to promote tourism.

People throughout the country will see Michigan's woodlands and coastlines next year without having to travel farther than their TV sets and hopefully be intrigued and convinced to plan a vacation here.

The campaign is possible, state officials say, because of an increase in state funding for tourism promotion. Members of Michigan's tourism industry say marketing the state nationally will help boost its slumping economy, and we certainly hope that's the case.

While we believe there are numerous cuts that can be made to the state budget, this appears to be one investment where the return will be greater than the outlay.

The state will spend \$30 million on the campaign in the 2008-09 fiscal year, up 71 percent from \$17.5 million this year.

Tourism, Michigan's third-largest industry behind manufacturing and agriculture, hasn't received the same level of state support as the other two, it was noted by Steven Yencich, president and

chief executive officer of the Michigan Lodging and Tourism Association.

The state should promote tourism as one of the numerous resources Michigan has to pull itself out of this very long economic downturn.

The auto industry has been good to the state, but it is struggling and pulling Michigan down with it. We certainly want to see the industry come back, but this downturn has made it quite obvious that Michigan can no longer be so dependent on just one industry.

That's been a mantra for many state and local officials. More and better promotion of tourism should be one way to make this goal a reality.

According to a state study, for every dollar spent on tourism promotion, Michigan receives a return of \$2 to \$3 in revenue, often within the same year, said George Zimmermann, vice president of Travel Michigan, the state's official tourism promotion agency. This means that a \$30 million investment would yield between \$60 million and \$90 million in new sales tax revenues.

Michigan has had the lowest hotel occupancy in the nation since 2005,

Yencich notes. With our resources and tourist appeal, this should not be happening.

Reportedly, 70 percent of the state's tourism industry comes from its residents, which is good. But it needs to be supplemented with some out-of-state and even international visitors.

Michigan, we believe, has the potential to significantly increase its tourist appeal when you consider not only its natural resources — for instance, the lakes — but also other attractions. These range from the Mackinac Bridge to the north to tourist cities on the west side of the state, from Traverse City down to Holland. And also, we need to include southeast Michigan.

Let's hope the ads work. They're certainly worth a try. More extensive promotion of tourism is something we should have been doing for years. Maybe Michigan residents were too complacent and took the beauty and natural recreational resources for granted.

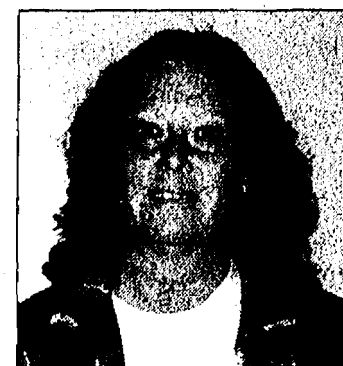
But we don't believe that's the case anymore. Residents can enjoy the wonderful attractions in Michigan, but can and should share them with visitors.

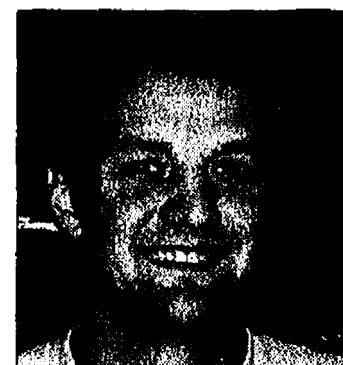

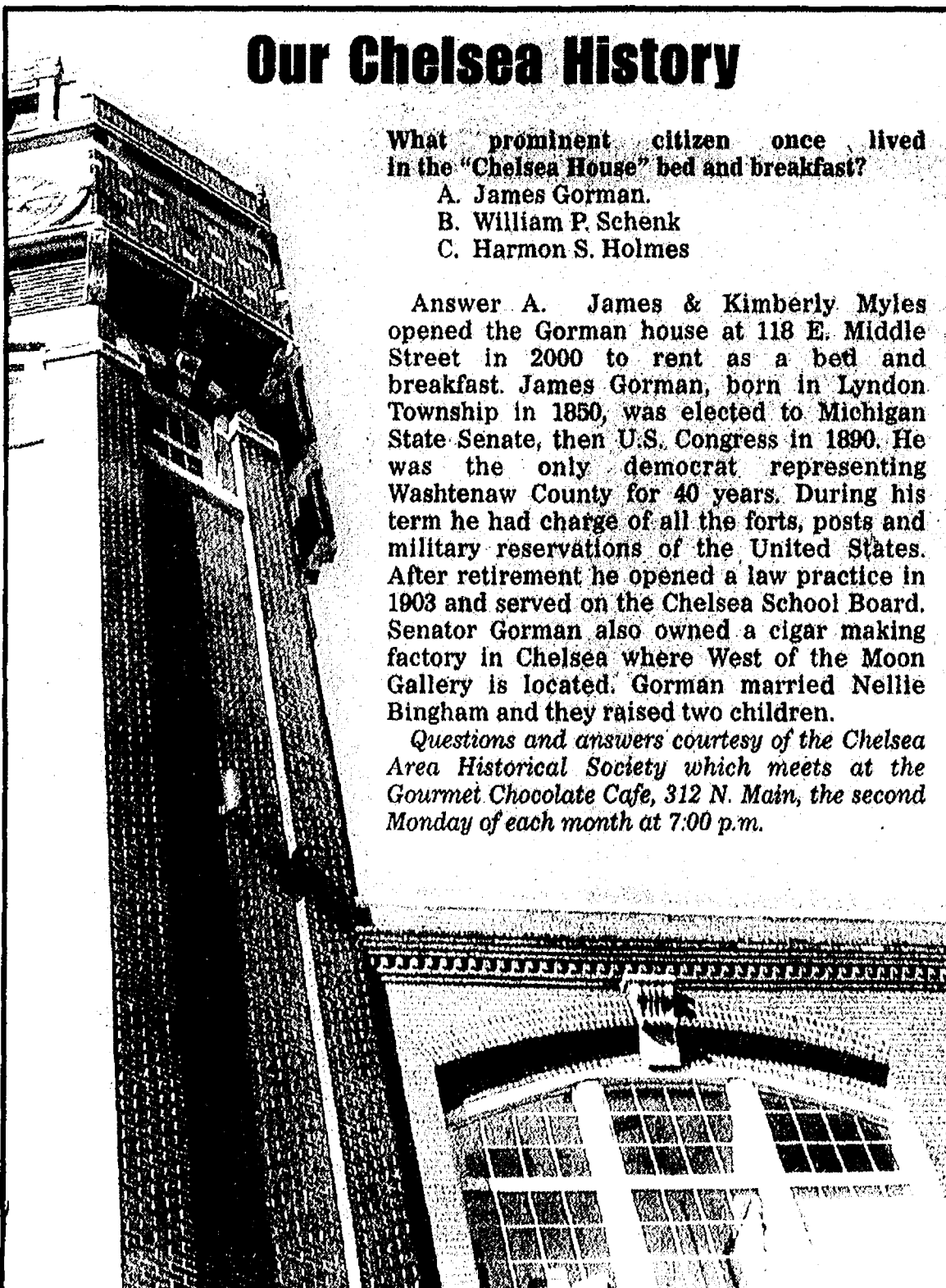
## Our Chelsea History

What prominent citizen once lived in the "Chelsea House" bed and breakfast?

Answer A. James & Kimberly Myles opened the Gorman house at 118 E. Middle Street in 2000 to rent as a bed and breakfast. James Gorman, born in Lyndon Township in 1850, was elected to Michigan State Senate, then U.S. Congress in 1890. He was the only democrat representing Washtenaw County for 40 years. During his term he had charge of all the forts, posts and military reservations of the United States. After retirement he opened a law practice in 1903 and served on the Chelsea School Board. Senator Gorman also owned a cigar making factory in Chelsea where West of the Moon Gallery is located. Gorman married Nellie Bingham and they raised two children.

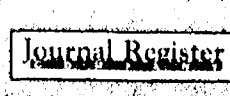

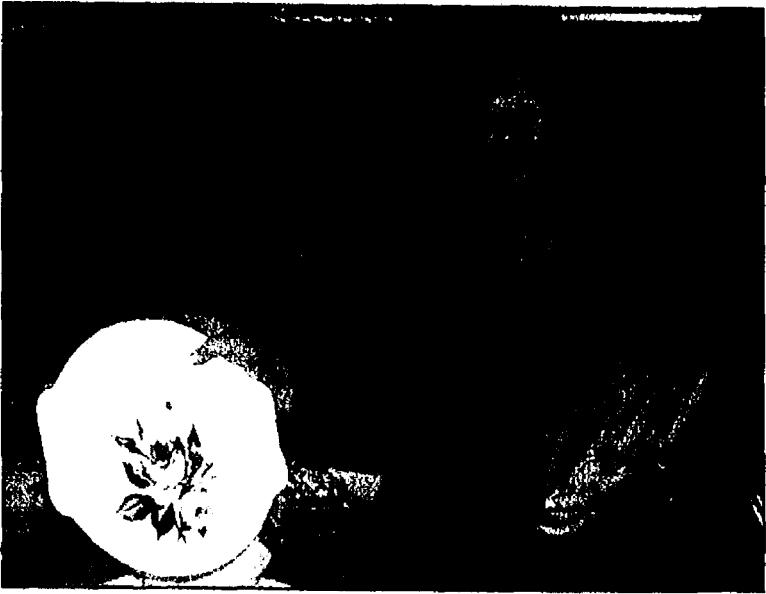

# Walgreens site plan tabled

Action on changing the looks of the northwest corner of Main Street and Old US-12 was delayed by the Chelsea City Planning Commission on Oct. 21.

The property is being considered by the Walgreens drugstore chain for two new structures: a 14,000-square-foot pharmacy and a 7,200-square-foot building suitable for retail, office or restaurant use.

The site currently is home to the Chelsea Standard and Dexter Leader offices, the Wolverine Food & Spirits, and the Rich gas station, which all face demolition if the plan goes through.

The pharmacy is requesting a drive-through window, which requires a special

land use permit under existing zoning, and architectural firm Ron Jona & Associates presented a site plan reflecting several changes made after discussions with city officials.

"The developer for the Walgreens project brought in revised plans making adjustments requested by the city," said Casey Blair, vice-chairman of the Planning Commission.

Several people spoke during a public hearing on the matter.

Lingane Road resident Bill Harris expressed disappointment that another pharmacy will be built at an intersection that already contained two drugstores - CVS and the Chelsea Pharmacy.

Blair explained that if a

developer meets the requirements of the ordinance, and the use is allowed in that zoning district, the Planning Commission does not have the power to control the number of businesses of a certain type.

"It's our job to make sure the development meets all the requirements of the ordinance; we have no authority on use," Blair said.

Scott Ringlein and Joyce Bradley, residents of the Village Place condominiums abutting the development, also expressed concerns about a detention pond on the property.

City Engineer Christine Linfield assured them that the city requires at least a 25-foot buffer between the

basin and the adjoining property line, and measures will be taken to control mosquitoes and smell at the pond.

Planning commissioners decided to table a decision on the permit application and a review of the preliminary site plan until their next meeting on Nov. 18.

"Most of the issues that the Planning Commission is dealing with right now involve parking, access to M-52 and Old US-12, signs, and landscaping issues for the property that was originally brought to the Planning Commission," Blair said.

"I would expect that the bulk of the issues will be addressed at the next regular meeting of the Planning Commission."

## Fabulous Finds leaving Chelsea for Saline

When Kris Vermilye receives a compliment on how stylish she looks in her latest outfit, she readily shares that she hasn't been to the mall in several years, but has shopped for clothing exclusively at Chelsea's own Fabulous Finds.

Fabulous Finds sells women's and teen girls' clothing and accessories on consignment. Owner Jamie Westcott opened her store in June 2005 at 121 South Main, above the Chelsea Market.

"Business has been pretty good," said Westcott, in spite of the upstairs location. She credits much of that success to a steady stream of return customers.

"I've always loved shopping re-sale. After taking a class for women in small business, I did the research and thought that running a store like this was something I could do. I grew up in Chelsea, and knew there was a need for this in our area."

Westcott said the business has made enough to support her for the last three years, but she did take a part time job in a Chelsea law office over the

winter to supplement her income. Sales in the winter tend to be a little slow, Westcott said.

Torn between wanting to expand her business, yet feeling overwhelmed with the high volume of clothes' processing and bookkeeping, Westcott decided to close the store.

When word of the store closing got out, Westcott said that the public responded by sending her hundreds of emails begging her not to close. Those emails, along with a potential offer to buy the business, made her take stock of the situation and realize that closing was not the best option.

"Instead, I decided to re-vamp the place and do the work differently to make it less overwhelming," Westcott said.

But even as she began to re-model, she heard about space available for rent in Saline.

"I went to see it, and it was too good to pass up," she said. "Ground level with big windows, double the floor space, front and rear entrances, and a parking lot in back - right in downtown Saline for the same price I pay now."

Her plans for the new

store location include changing the name to "The Resale Boutique," and using computerized consignment software.

"The new store will gear more towards upscale clothing, and with the increased space will also include accent furniture pieces, like small benches and lamps," said Westcott, who still has mixed feelings about the move.

As a business owner, getting double the space in a

premium location is a no-brainer, but as one who has called Chelsea home and feels committed to her great customers, the change is emotionally difficult.

"There are girls who walk here to shop regularly because they can get here on their own and they can afford the clothes," she said. "They have already told me they don't know where they will shop now. I feel especially bad for

them."

Westcott admitted that although at this time she needs to focus her energy on one location, she may eventually have a store in each of the two communities.

With the state of the current economy, Westcott foresees the potential for this type of business to grow. More people who would normally buy their clothes retail will begin to buy re-sale; and other people who previously would have given their clothes away will begin to sell them on consignment.

"Even now, I have ladies who bring me their clothes

every single season and then they go out and replace their wardrobes with new items," Westcott said.

Westcott's mission to help women on a budget to look and feel good has succeeded in Chelsea. She hopes the move to Saline will increase the number of women she can serve.

"She's got great taste and sense of style - very hip, shabby chic, vintage," Vermilye said. "And you can't beat the price. I'm bummed that she's leaving Chelsea, but I will definitely be following her to Saline."

Wednesday morning with his wife, Christine, by his side.

"We feel great," said Schauer, the Senate Democratic Leader in Lansing. "Ready to get to work for the people of Michigan."

Pam Byrnes and other Democratic candidates and we feel it was a great overall campaign for Democrats in Western Washtenaw County, and it was a big part of our victory."

By the time Walberg conceded the race, the crowd of supporters had dwindled to about half of the more than 200 supporters, who had come to help the Tipton native celebrate on election night.

"He was like a beacon of light," she said. "He's not your run of the mill politician. He's for fixing government."

Despite the outcome, Walberg maintained a

sense of humor. When a guest in the crowd called out asking what was the reason for the loss, Walberg replied with a smile. "There weren't enough votes."

"Job says, 'The Lord giveth and the Lord taketh away. Blessed be the name of the Lord.' We've been blessed, and we hope we've been a blessing to many. We know that His (the Lord's) plans are best for our life and for this nation..." Walberg said. At this, the crowd gave a rousing round of applause.

The race for the 7th Congressional District includes Branch, Eaton, Hillsdale, Jackson, Lenawee, and parts of Calhoun and Washtenaw counties. Walberg has served one term, after previously serving in the Michigan House of Representatives from 1983 to 1999.

Walberg maintained that his term was not yet over, and that there was still work to be done. He went on to say that he did not plan to retire, but that he will now have more time to spend with his grandchildren.

After Walberg left the room, many supporters broke into tears. Those still present at the late hour commented that it would be hard to imagine a Washington without Walberg representing them.

**EMU men's cross country team makes it four consecutive titles**

YPSILANTI, Mich. - The Eastern Michigan University men's cross country team added another plaque to its trophy case, winning its fourth consecutive Mid-American Conference Championship Saturday, Nov. 1, in front of a home crowd at Eagle Crest Golf Course.

With the victory, the Eagles have now won 14 MAC team titles since 1972 - the most by any league institution during that time frame. They are also tied for second all-time in program wins with Western Michigan University, while Miami University leads with 20.

As a team, the Eagles posted 42 points in the victory followed by Miami in second place with 56 points. Kent State University was third with 61 points followed by Central Michigan University (103), Ohio University (122), the University at Buffalo (169), the University of Akron (179), the University of Toledo (186) and Bowling Green State University (270).

Veteran head coach **John Goodridge** was named the MAC Men's Coach of the Year, as voted on by the leagues' head coaches. This is the fifth MAC title for the Eagles with Goodridge at the helm.

Senior **Josh Karanja** (Ottawa, Canada-Nepean) led nearly the entire race on his way to taking home the individual MAC title, crossing the finish line in 24:18.7 to collect first-team All-MAC honors. This is the fourth year in-a-row that Karanja has earned first-team All-MAC honors and he is now the 13th runner to win the program's 17th individual title, the most of any conference school.

The Eagles had one more runner in the top-seven as junior **Curtis Vollmar** (Grand Blanc, Mich.-Grand Blanc) finished sixth with a time of 24:45 to earn All-MAC honors for the third time in his career.

EMU had two runners earn second-team All-MAC honors, as senior **David Brent** (Monroe, Mich.-St. Mary's Catholic) finished ninth on his way to running 24:57.2, while senior **Josh Perrin** (Hillsdale, Mich.-Hillsdale) was 11th with a time of 25:06.

Rounding out the top-five for the Eagles was senior **Kyle Mena** (Portage, Mich.-Portage), who finished 15th with a time of 25:06.9.

The final EMU finishers included seniors **Neal Naughton** (Walled Lake, Mich.-Western), **R.P. White** (Hillsdale, Mich.-Hillsdale), redshirt freshman **Cole Sanseverino** (Monroe, Mich.-Monroe) and sophomore **Matt Hammersmith** (Wolcottville, Mich.-Prairie Heights).

The Eagles will be in action again, Nov. 15, when they travel to West Lafayette, Ind. to run in the 2008 NCAA Great Lakes Regional Championship, where they hope to earn a bid to the 2008 NCAA Championships in Terre Haute, Ind., Nov. 24.

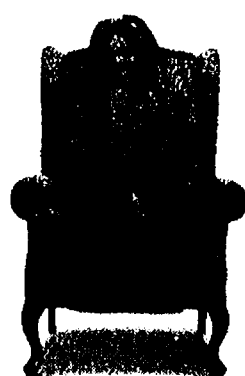

# 'Apartment 3A' furnished with plenty of laughs

"You haven't really lived until you've waltzed with the one you love."

That metaphoric sentiment is behind "Apartment 3A," the current offering at the Purple Rose Theatre.

It is the revival of a show penned more than a dozen years ago by theater founder Jeff Daniels, but its themes of love and redemption competing with infidelity and self-absorption are just as relevant today.

Act I introduces us to Annie (Rhiannon Ragland), a young woman who is trying unsuccessfully to keep from spilling her personal life's turmoil all over her professional obligations as director of fund-raising at a public broadcasting TV station during a pledge drive.

To escape an unfaithful husband, Annie moves out and finds a new apartment in a less-than-desirable part of town, where apartment manager Dal (Will David Young) seems a little too eager to sell Annie on the place.

Almost immediately a neighbor, Donald (Michael Brian Ogden), invites himself into Annie's life during a moment of deep despair.

The action moves to her office at the WPRK studios, where we meet co-worker Elliot (Matthew David) — a polite, unthreatening person with a quirk: a fascina-

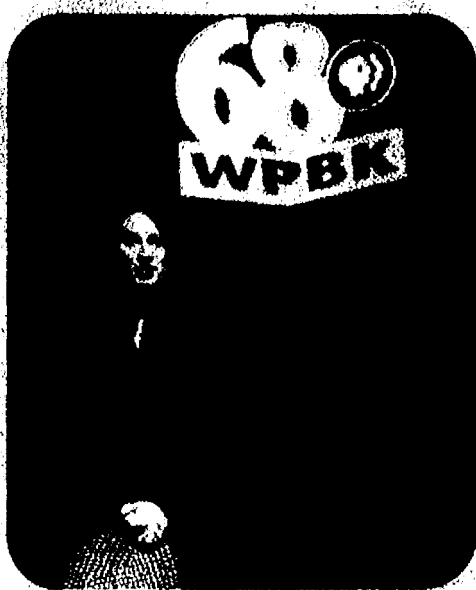

Annie takes herself far too seriously, and her near-meltdowns during on-air pledge breaks result in some of the biggest laughs of the show, particularly when she has to explain to the station manager that she "did not threaten to kill Big Bird" to get children to

donate to the station.

Elliot is obviously smitten with Annie, to the point he is willing to step directly into the station manager's wrath to protect her.

The way Donald continues to insinuate himself into Annie's life is at first obnoxious but ultimately endearing when he assumes the role of a Greek chorus of sorts, with Annie's inner dialogue with him off to the side woven cleverly into her interaction with Elliot at

center stage.

The relationship between the three sets itself up as an almost unholy love triangle until its resolution in the final scene.

The audience is challenged to use its collective imagination as the scenes shift between the apartment, to the WPRK studio and office, to a restaurant, to Elliot's kitchen, back to the studio and finally, back to Apartment 3A, where Act II culminates in a redemptive revelation that should leave the audience at first puzzled but ultimately pleased.

For all the complex issues the script touches on, the set is deceptively simple: a worn wooden table, two wooden chairs, a grey-painted wall as a backdrop containing a doorway and a door opening inward to show the address, 3A.

The scene changes are signaled only by subtle but effective changes in lighting while the table and chairs remain throughout.

"Apartment 3A" is furnished with plenty of laughter and adult dialogue, but upholstered in the deep, rich fabrics of faith, love and redemption.

Annie's emotional trauma of finding her husband in bed with another woman threatens to scar every conversation, but Donald's constant references to his love for his wife seems to soften her bit by bit, finally making her receptive to Elliot's respectful but repeated advances.

The frenzied and funny action between the three during lunch at a restaurant — where they debate the existence of God and miracles — is reminiscent of a scene from "Seinfeld."

"You're not weird," Elliot

insists after Annie's diatribe against his religion. "You're looking for answers but you haven't found any you like."

Annie tells Elliot she may be falling in love with Donald, yet all he can talk about is the love he has for his wife.

"Can you imagine being that much in love with anyone?" Annie asks, and Elliot replies quietly: "Yes, I can."

Act II delves deeper into the developing chemistry between Annie and Elliot, with Donald riding along as a punching bag for Annie's conscience.

"Why do you care about me?" Annie asks Donald through tears, and he replies simply: "Because you're worth it."

The emotionally gripping finale will cause people to leave the theater more or less silently: some in tears, others lost in thought.

Director Guy Sanville said the show carries a simple message: "That faith matters."

"Jeff uses humor as a way to look into the human heart," said Sanville.

"I hope people leave feeling good about being human," he added, and repeated one of Donald's lines:

"I believe that a little hope is better than no hope at all."

Although the play is a product of the mid-1990s, Sanville said it made sense to produce a revival for current audiences.

"Jeff wrote this 13 years ago and it's more relevant now than it was then," he said. "I love this play; it's a very brave play."

Audience member Rachel Sherwood Roberts of Auburn, Ind., said she has attended many Purple Rose performances.

"I am also a playwright, just not yet at this level," Roberts said.

"The writer is talented — it starts out with conflict, which is then resolved. He always writes an entertaining play."

There's nothing wrong with a little escapism, Roberts said, but this show gives you something more.

"You're actually transported to a different place," she said.

"The play is philosophical; it makes you think, and you take away something with you."

Sanville noted that, far from being dated, the script stands on its own with only minimal input from him.

"Directors help — good ones don't dictate, they help," Sanville said.

## Events coordinator helps bring the past to life

When Jennifer Kaiser heads to work, she has one foot in the past and the other planted firmly in the future.

Kaiser, private events coordinator for the Waterloo Area Historical Society, organizes events such as birthday parties, company picnics, reunions and weddings at the 19th century Waterloo Farm Museum near Chelsea, a living history museum that is a memorial to Michigan pioneer farmers.

"In Victorian times, when the Realy family's house was built, picnics were the height of fashion," Kaiser said.

"We can take people on a jour-

ney back in time to this era, or to a cowboy theme with a chuck wagon and stagecoach, or offer a contemporary ambiance in a rustic atmosphere."

Partygoers can select from a wide variety of caterers - from fine dining to home-cooked BBQ meals and boxed lunches. They can explore the farm museum and its grounds, play old-fashioned games like croquet, fry pan toss, scavenger hunts and kite flying, and enjoy music from period entertainers.

Kaiser, whose grandparents and parents have had a long history in volunteering with the Waterloo Area Historical Society, has two decades of experience with the museum. Over the years she has served as a guide,

Pioneer Day volunteer, finance committee member, Open Hearth cooking instructor, and currently serves as editor of the WAHS newsletter.

The museum lets visitors experience and begin to understand this way of life, Kaiser said.

"With our modern conveniences, I feel that we take for granted the sweat equity it took to put a simple meal on the table three times a day. For most people, our food comes from a supermarket. For the Realy family and other Michigan pioneer families, food came from many hours spent in the fields," she said.

"They call it simpler times but I don't see it as simple. It took a very strong back and a determined spirit to make a life for

yourself and your family in the 1800s. By recreating these experiences you may begin to look at our modern living with a new perspective and maybe it may not be as rough as you once thought it to be.

"I've done many difficult things in my 36 short years, but the life of the Michigan pioneer farmer was tougher. I would have had at least five children by now and the life expectancy in the late 1800s was 49 for women and 45 for men."

Kaiser, a Stockbridge High School graduate who lives on a horse farm near Waterloo, spent five years as an event photographer and also worked in conference and wedding planning and catering.

"Dexter did not have a match that night and some

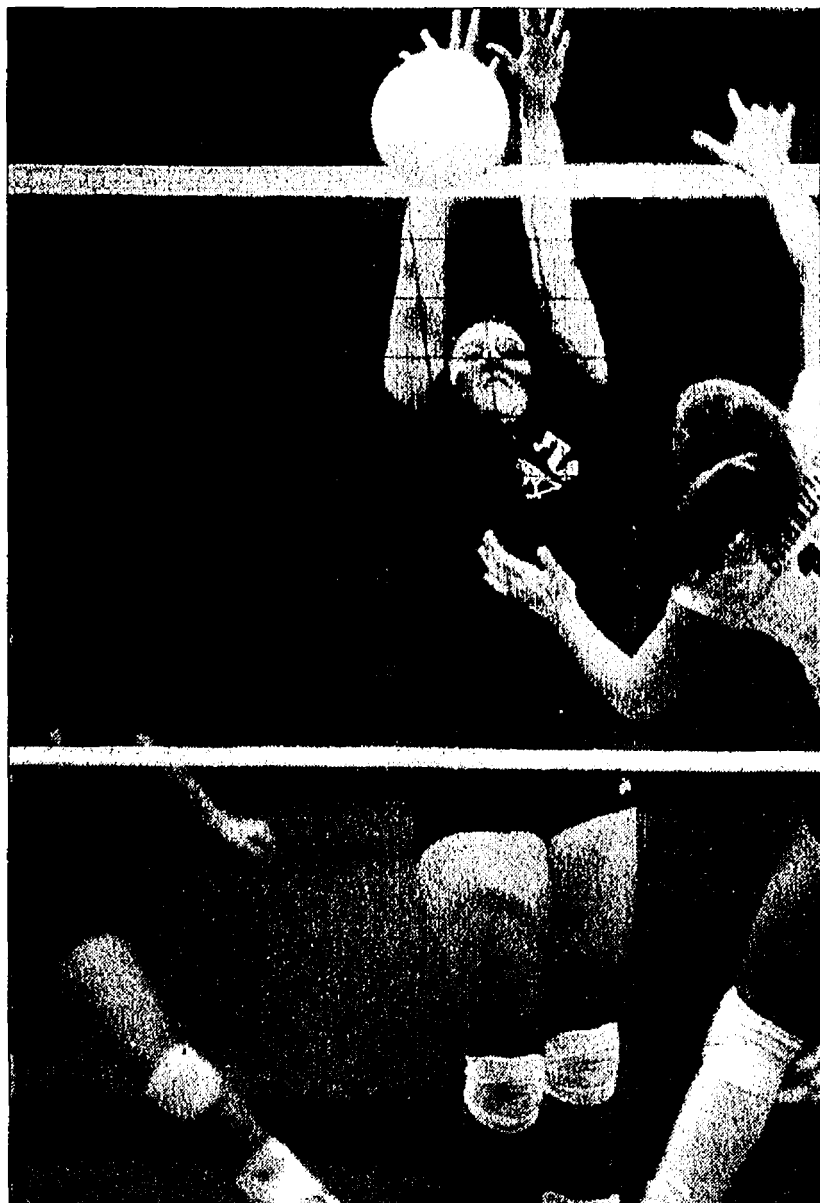

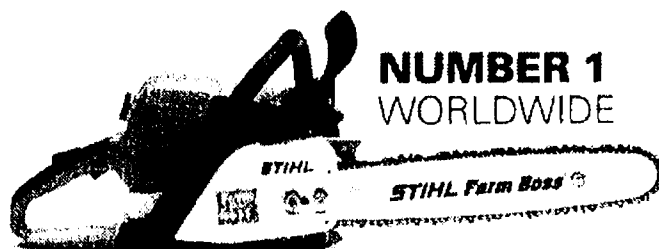

## Explosive Mason next for Chelsea

Up next for Chelsea in its quest for a Division 3 state football championship is Mason. The Bulldogs (9-1) are one of the Lansing area's best gridiron stories this season.

Last year, Mason was 1-8 overall, missing the playoffs for only the second time in the past seven seasons.

The Bulldogs have turned their fortunes around this year with a strong running game and steady quarterback play.

Leading Mason is senior quarterback Cody Morrison (6-foot 2, 200 pounds). This season, Morrison is 80-of-135 for 1,282 yards with 13 touchdowns. Last week, in the Bulldogs' 35-20 Division 3 pre-district victory over Adrian (7-3), Morrison was 9-of-18 for 176 yards with one touchdown and one interception.

Morrison's top receiver is senior Casey Kloeckner (5-10, 160). This year, Kloeckner has a team-high 28 receptions for 458 yards and four TDs. A returning All-Capital Area Activities Conference Red Division selection, Kloeckner last week threw for a 17-yard touchdown pass on a fake field goal attempt against Adrian.

Other quality receivers for the Bulldogs include senior tight end Caled Norgaard (6-3, 200) and senior wideout Sam Grantham (6-1, 160).

While Morrison drives the Mason offense, senior running back Zach Mellios (5-8, 185) is the team's big play performer. Last week against Adrian, Mellios ran for 154 yards on 30 carries scoring two touchdowns, including one on an 87-yard sprint. He also had two catches for 81 yards and one TD. For the season, Mellios has 965 yards on 150 attempts with 13 touchdowns.

Up front, the Bulldogs are anchored by senior tackle Jordan Couder (6-3, 265) and senior center Jake Evans (6-1, 215). Others seeing action in the trenches include sophomore Ethan Dunsmore (6-2, 210) and senior Kyle Russell (6-0, 280).

Another weapon for Mason is sophomore kicker

Jacob Derby (5-9, 160).

Defensively, the Bulldogs are strong in the secondary led by Josh Smith and Jacob Brrouillette. Smith was named first team All-CAAC Red Division last season.

Senior Dan Allen (6-2, 210) is a standout along the line of scrimmage at defensive end.

Jerry Van Havel is Mason head coach. Since 1991, he has recorded only four losing seasons.

This year, the Bulldogs' lone loss was against Grand Ledge 14-10 in Week 3. The Comets (10-0) are ranked No. 2 in the state in Division 1.

This season, Mason has scored 397 points for an average of 39 points per game. Defensively, the Bulldogs have allowed 114 points for an average of 11 points per outing.

Significant wins this year for Mason have come against playoff teams St. Johns 50-22 and Lansing Sexton 48-8.

Chelsea and Mason have a recent playoff history. In 2002, Mason defeated visit-

score. Chelsea (8-2) defeated Milan (8-2) 31-14 last Friday in its Division 3 state pre-district contest.

Chelsea travels to Mason for the Division 3 state district final Friday at 7 p.m.

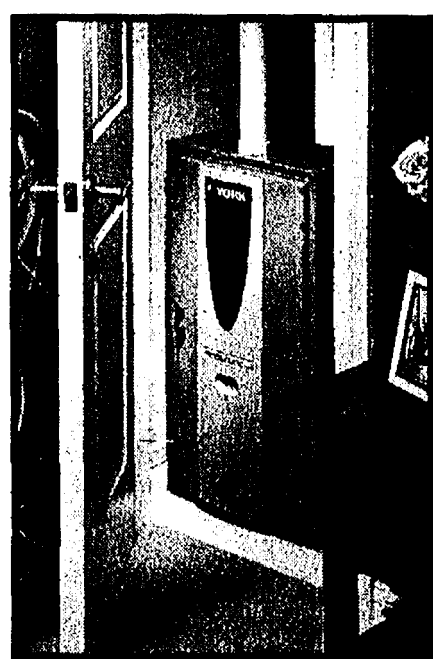

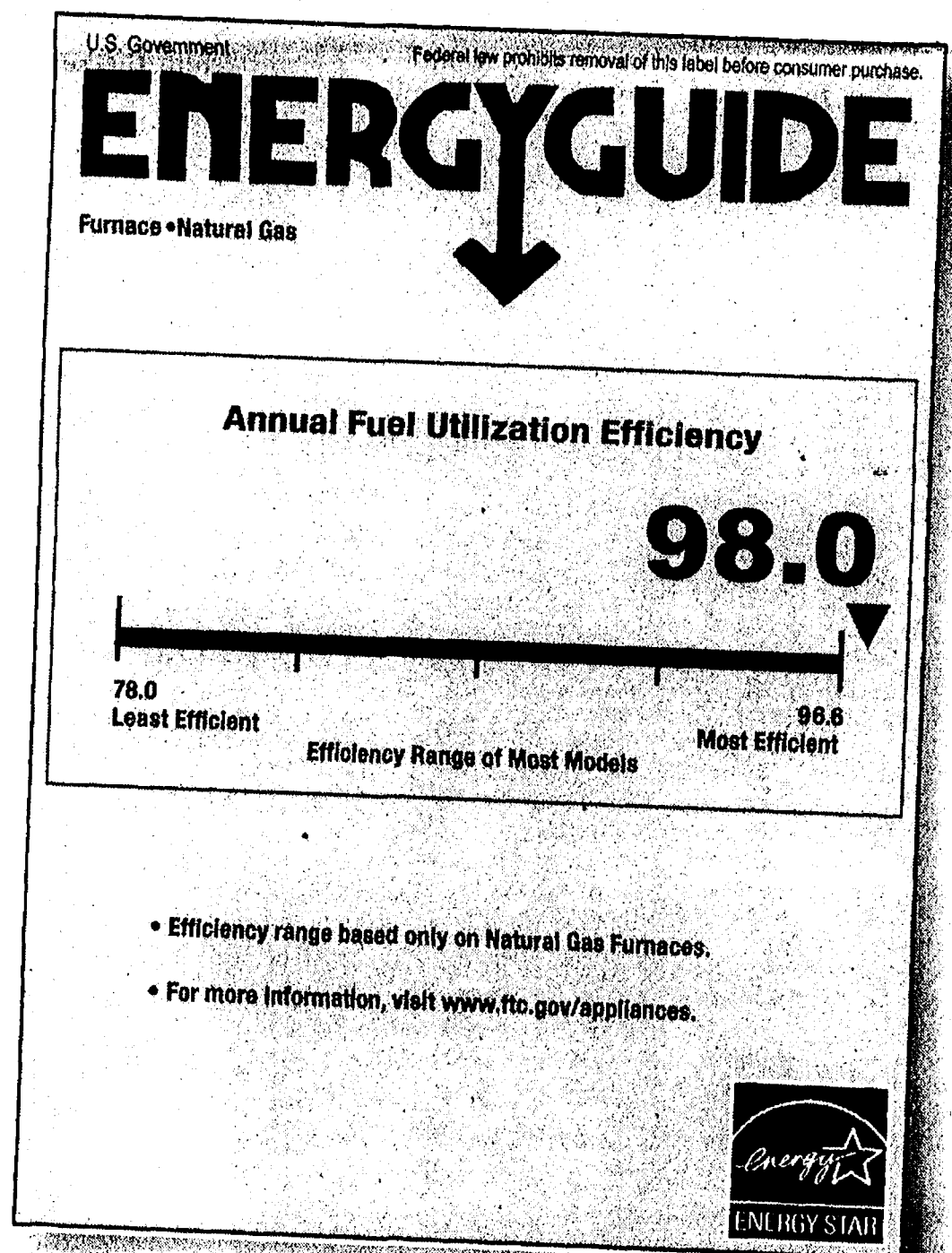

huge momentum lift," Bush said. "I knew he could make it. To run him out on the field with no timeouts and for him to make it, that's asking a lot. It'll be a record for a long time."

Roberts said trying to beat the clock actually helped him make the field goal.

"To run out there and kick it, it was almost easier because I didn't have to think about it," he said.

Because of the prior delay, halftime was only three minutes.

After a scoreless third quarter, Hill scored on a 33-yard run up the gut. Roberts booted the PAT giving Chelsea its first lead of the night 17-14 with 11:51 remaining in the fourth quarter.

Following a Big Red three and out punt, the Bulldogs needed only three plays to score as Roberts hooked up with senior Michael Lenneman on a 28-yard slant pass for a touchdown. Roberts' kick was good increasing Chelsea's advantage to 24-14 with 8:51 remaining in the game.

With 2:37 left on the clock, Hill scored touchdown No. 3 on a 9-yard run around left end. Roberts' PAT was successful for the contest's final 31-14 margin.

"Our defense turned the game around tonight," Hill said. "The defense gave us an opportunity to score. Also our offensive line

played well. They (Milan) were pretty big up front, but our offensive line was opening up holes."

Hill finished with 163 yards rushing on 27 carries. Love ended up with 100 yards on 16 attempts, while senior fullback David Box (6-2, 285) had 17 yards on seven carries for Milan. Box, also one of the state's best defensive tackles, will play college football at Western Michigan University next fall.

Roberts ended up 10-of-13 passing for 130 yards and one interception. Crump was 10-of-19 for 135 yards.

Senior Steve O'Keefe had four receptions for 69 yards, while Hill had three catches for 23 yards. Straub finished with four receptions for 35 yards and senior Paul Irwin two catches for 44 yards for Milan.

As a team, Chelsea finished with 310 yards of total offense, including 180 yards on the ground, while the Big Reds had 277 total yards, with 142 yards rushing.

Milan had the ball for 27:33, while the Bulldogs maintained possession for 20:27.

Chelsea was called for five penalties for 33 yards, while the Big Reds were whistled for three penalties for 24 yards.

# Adopting an alternate plan

Chelsea family adopts two daughters from Guatemala

Steve Hinz and his wife Lisa Hinz-Johnson have twice as much to be thankful for in National Adoption Month — their two daughters, Ava and Marina.

When the couple married in 1987, they planned to start a family within five years. But endometriosis put an end to those dreams, despite Lisa undergoing several surgeries to correct the condition.

"We tried to convince ourselves that this was just the way it was for us, and we continued to love and support each other," Lisa says.

The couple directed their energies into founding the Chelsea Center for the Arts, and kept busy with music and teaching — Steve as a choral director and general music teacher in the Chelsea schools and Lisa as a private voice teacher.

In 2003, Steve broached the idea of adoption. Lisa was hesitant. "After 16 years of marriage, I was getting used to the idea that we may well be one of those childless couples that consider themselves to be destined for other things in life besides children," she says.

"I think I had worked so hard to convince myself of this to avoid heartbreak. It was potentially far too devastating to contemplate the risk of an adoption not going through than to just dive in and trust that it will work out."

However, on a trip to visit family in Wisconsin, Lisa had a change of heart.

"After many tears, mostly of joy but some from fear, we committed to what was to be the most amazing and life-altering journey of our lives," she says.

The couple chose Hands Across the Water agency in Ann Arbor, and decided to adopt from Guatemala, a country that allows older couples to adopt, and where poverty, natural disasters, and crime created a high number of orphans. In addition, Lisa speaks fluent Spanish.

After wading through paperwork, the couple spent weeks anxiously waiting for the phone to ring. The much-anticipated call came while Lisa was at the arts center.

"Thank heavens I wasn't teaching at the time, because I think my student would either have had to pick me up from the floor or pull me off of the ceiling," she says.

"I remember not even being able to wrap my brain around the reality of hearing the words, 'There is a child available who was born in Guatemala two weeks ago — please consider carefully if you would like to accept this referral.' My brain was spinning and my heart was pounding so loudly I literally could not hear a thing that was said after that."

The baby girl, sole survivor of twin girls, weighed only 2 pounds at birth.

"Blind faith propelled us forward, along with the sheer, giddy joy of being parents for the first time,"

Lisa says. "Any health challenges that might be in her future seemed small to us and we felt equipped to handle whatever might be down the road."

The first referral picture was a sight to behold, she says. "Ava was the tiniest infant we had ever seen, swimming in the premie-sized sleeper that enveloped her fragile body."

"But her fists were clenched and her mouth wide open — we decided she was either singing or screaming for the world to hear that she would not give up and was bound and determined to be a fighter."

They chose Ava Emilia as their new daughter's name, only to learn that Emilia had been the name given to Ava's twin sister by the birth mother.

"Now Ava would always have a part of her sister with her, and her middle name seemed to be another sign — one of many — that this small child was to be our forever child," Lisa says.

The couple flew to Guatemala to spend 10 days with their daughter who was being cared for by a foster mother.

"Ava was 6 weeks old and was tiny, precious, and a true miracle," Lisa says. "She had wide open eyes and a face that seemed to suggest that she was a wise and old soul. We connected

to her immediately."

Steve and Lisa flew home loaded down with photos, Guatemalan fabrics to decorate the nursery, and memories to sustain them. The agency sent regular photos and updates.

Finally the couple signed the adoption papers in Guatemala on Flag Day, Ava's fifth month birthday, and Guatemalan Father's Day — so many reasons to celebrate, Lisa says.

Back in Chelsea, Steve and Lisa settled into their new life. "We were consumed with being new parents and loving this little girl. She became the center of our universe and we cherished every minute with her," Lisa says.

Because of her rough start at life, low birth weight, and poor prenatal nutrition and health of her birth mother, Ava was at risk for neurological and physical challenges. Dr. Mary Westhoff, of Chelsea Pediatrics provided the family with medical care and referred Ava to specialists for conditions needing further evaluation.

## CITY OF CHELSEA ORDINANCE NO. 158 ORDINANCE TO APPROVE AMENDMENT TO TAX INCREMENT FINANCING AND DEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR THE CITY OF CHELSEA DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Chelsea Downtown Development Authority (the "Authority") and the Village Council of the Village of Chelsea (the "Village") approved and adopted the original Tax Increment Financing and Development Plan (the "Original Plan") in 1987.

**WHEREAS**, in 1990 the Authority and the Village Council of the Village approved and adopted an Amendment to Tax Increment Financing and Development Plan (the "1990 Amendment"; the Original Plan as amended by the 1990 Amendment sometimes referred to herein as the "1990 Amended Plan").

**WHEREAS**, in 2000 the Authority and the Village Council of the Village approved and adopted an Amendment to Tax Increment Financing and Development Plan (the "2000 Amendment"; the 1990 Amended Plan as amended by the 2000 Amendment sometimes referred to herein as the "2000 Amended Plan"). And

**WHEREAS**, in 2004 the Village became the City of Chelsea (the "City") and the Authority began operating as the City of Chelsea Downtown Development Authority.

**WHEREAS**, the Authority has prepared and recommended for approval an amendment attached hereto as Exhibit A (the "2008 Amendment") to the Original Plan as previously amended by the 2008 Amendment for the Development Area in the Downtown District within the City; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council held a public hearing on October 14, 2008 on the 2008 Amendment for the Authority's Development Area in the Downtown District; and

**WHEREAS**, the primary purpose of the 2008 Amendment is to authorize additional improvements focused on rehabilitating the property located at 425 Congdon Street and known as "Federal Screw Works";

**WHEREAS**, the 2008 Amendment is an addition to the 2000 Amended Plan and must be read in concert with the 2000 Amended Plan. The 2008 Amendment refers to sections of the 2000 Amended Plan, but does not repeal or abrogate any provision of the 2000 Amended Plan unless expressly stated. (The 2000 Amended Plan as amended by the 2008 Amendment is referred to herein as the "2008 Amended Plan").

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has given the taxing jurisdictions in which the Development Area is located, an opportunity to meet with the City Council and to express their views and recommendations regarding the 2008 Amendment as required by the Act.

**WHEREAS:**

1. Findings:

a) The Plan as amended by the 2008 Amendment meets the requirements set forth in the Downtown Development Act.

b) The City of Chelsea determines that The Plan constitutes a public purpose; and

c) The proposed method of financing the development is feasible and that the DDA has the ability to arrange the financing.

d) The development is reasonable according with the master plan of the City of Chelsea.

e) The development is reasonable and necessary to carry out the purposes of the DDA Act.

f) Public services, such as fire and police protection and utilities, are or will be adequate to service the Development Area.

g) Changes in zoning, streets, street levels, intersections, and utilities to the extent required by the Plan as amended by the 2008 Amendment, are reasonably necessary for the Plan and for the City.

**WHEREAS**, the approval and adoption of the 2008 Amendment is hereby approved and adopted. A copy of the Plan, the 2008 Amendment and all later amendments thereto shall be maintained on file in the City Clerk's office; and

**WHEREAS**, amendment to Ordinance No. 103, Ordinance 106 and Ordinance 135 are hereby amended by this Ordinance No. 158. All ordinances, resolutions and orders or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of the Ordinance are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed, and each section of the Ordinance and each subdivision of any section thereof is hereby declared to be independent, and the finding of holding of any section or subdivision thereof to be invalid or void shall not be deemed or held to affect the validity of any other section or subdivision of the Ordinance.

**WHEREAS**, the Ordinance shall be published in full promptly after its adoption in The Chelsea Standard, a newspaper of general circulation in the City, qualified under State law to publish legal notices, and shall be recorded in the Ordinance book of the City, which recording shall be authenticated by the signature of the Mayor and City Clerk.

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF CHELSEA** declares this Ordinance is hereby determined by the City Council to be immediately necessary for the interests of the City and shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as required by law.

Passed and adopted by the City Council of the City of Chelsea, County of Washtenaw, State of Michigan, after its second reading, on October 28, 2008.

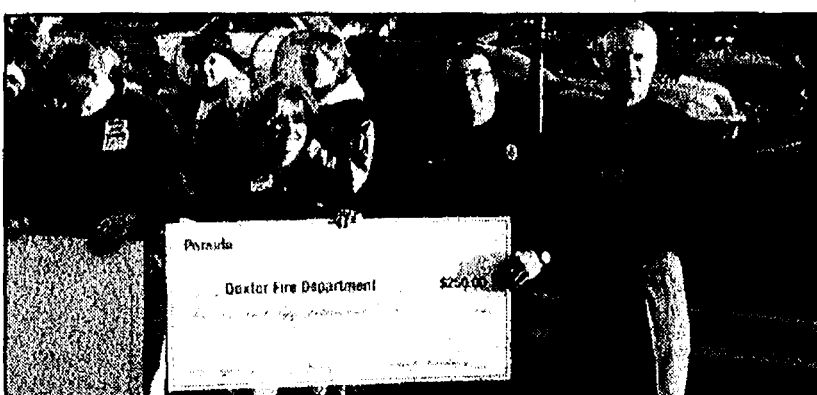
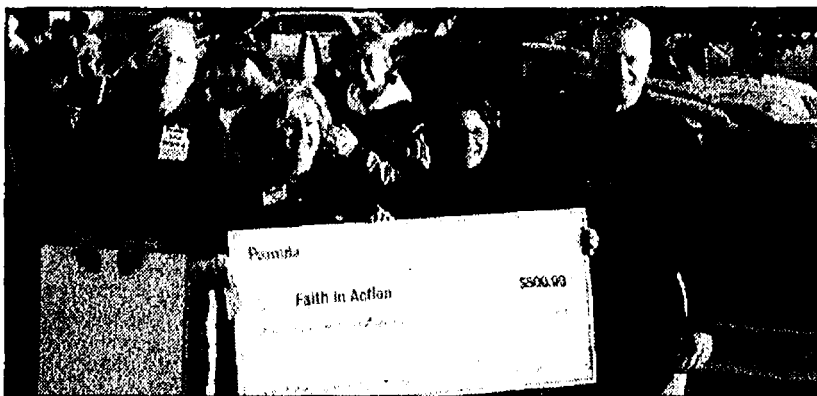
Pamida throws 'grand reopening' bash

The family got involved with the Early On program in Chelsea where Ava received physical, occupational therapy, and speech therapy.

Ava has grown into a strong, smart, and confident 4-year-old, with a love of life and strength to face whatever is ahead for her, her mother says. She has had a number of medical challenges, and was diagnosed with mild cerebral palsy. "But these have just been mild roadblocks for her," Lisa says. "She takes everything in stride and continues to amaze us with her perseverance and strength."

In 2005, Steve and Lisa decided it was time to welcome another child. They once again plowed through paperwork. Within five weeks, they traveled to Guatemala to spend two weeks with their second daughter, Marina.

"She was a happy, healthy

baby and we were overjoyed to meet her," Lisa says. "Ava took to being a big sister immediately, and those first photos and memories are among our most treasured."

The adoption hit a roadblock. Because of a few unscrupulous agencies and coordinators who were giving Guatemalan adoption a bad reputation, all adoptions between the United States and Guatemala ground to a halt. Steve and Lisa had to redo paperwork, resubmit much of their dossier, redo expired documents costing hundreds—even thousands—more dollars.

"We were at our wits' end," Lisa says. "The worst possible scenario was that we might not even be able to bring our precious daughter home at all."

The months dragged on. The family, enjoying support from the adoption agency and online groups, such as Guatadopt.org, made another trip to Guatemala spend time with Marina.

Finally, 17-month-old Marina came home to

Chelsea. "Although we had missed so many of those early milestones, nothing mattered to us except that she was finally coming home," Lisa says.

Separation from the foster family was difficult. "Poor Marina was bewildered and completely confused as to why the people most important to her were walking out of her life. We loved her and held her close those next few days as she tried to understand her new world at an age when such a transfer of trust and love can be so traumatic," Lisa says. "She gradually began to come around and her sunny disposition returned as she began to trust us and acclimate herself to a new life."

Marina has grown into a confident, loving, funny, and smart two-year-old, her mother says.

Achievements with Ava's developmental delays have made huge leaps and bounds as Ava now has a sister to challenge her each and every day.

The couple celebrates the girls' birth culture by keep-

ing their Latino heritage a part of their daily life.

"I speak Spanish as a second language in the home, Guatemalan fabrics and artwork are everywhere in our house, and we are very open about the wonderful journey that brought them to us," Lisa says. "We want them to understand that families come in every possible hue, size, and configuration, and that our family was destined to be together."

The family prays for the girls' birth families and foster families every day, and sponsors a Guatemalan child through World Vision as a way to keep mindful of the world that now seems so far removed from their experience.

"It is very clear to us that families come together in countless ways, and we are continually humbled by our girls," Lisa says.

"Our only regret is that we didn't do this sooner, but then again, we adopted when we were supposed to adopt and can't even envision another path other than the one that chose us."

MOVED Lindauer SECONDED Albertson to approve the regular agenda. All Ayes. Motion Carried.

#### Public Comments

Marjorie Daek asked Council to remove the penalty and interest charges that she received on her taxes due to being unable to pay taxes online. The 3% convenience fee would have been charged for paying online.

MOVED Albertson SECONDED Martinez-Kratz to reduce penalties and interest for taxes owing on 1241 Meadow Lane to \$65.55. Five Ayes, Two Nays (Hammer, Anderson). Motion Carried.

Jim Myles applauded Council for following through on the Videotaping of the City Council Meetings. However, he is unhappy with the content of the City Watch Show that Jim Machnik produces and airs on Channel 18.

Thomas Knox stated he has a property in the Downtown Development Authority area and would like to know if they are suppose to be paying the additional DDA tax since they are not a business. Mayor Feeney clarified the issue by assuring him that "yes", residents must pay the 1.6 mills levied in the DDA District.

#### Public Hearing

Mayor Feeney opened the Public Hearing at 7:25 p.m.

1. Amendment to the Tax Increment Financing and Development Plan of the DDA

2. First reading of Ordinance No. 158 DDAAmendment to Development and Tax Increment Finance Plan

#### Council Business

1. Joint DDA Discussion

Mike Jackson, Chairman of the Chelsea DDA, spoke to council about the 20 year Redevelopment Plan that the DDA has been working on. They have been holding visioning sessions with the public. The DDA would like to work with the City as they plan the Municipal Buildings.

Mark Heydlauff spoke regarding the funding that is available for the site development of the City Police Station, the need for more parking in the downtown area and the Post Office moving to the old Polly's Store. Discussion also included the need to look at general maintenance for sidewalks over the next ten to twenty years.

#### 2. Award Videographer Services Contract

The City advertised and received one bid for Videographer Services from RK Studios. The bid included a price per meeting of \$250.00, the price does increase by \$50. per 15 minutes if the meetings exceed one hour. For example, a two-hour meeting would cost \$450.00. The City has received very positive feedback from the production quality and consistency of the meetings recorded by RK Studios. Mr. Lee has indicated he will consult with the City on the appropriate video technology when a new council chamber is created.

#### 3. Award Electric Generators Roof Replacement

The City received bid proposals for the repair of the roofs on three electric generators located at the Industrial Substation. The bids ranged from \$6,000 to \$9,000.

MOVED Hammer SECONDED Albertson to accept the proposal from Bloom Roofing of Brighton, MI to repair the roofs on the three generators adjacent to the Industrial Park Substation at a cost not to exceed \$7,900.00. All Ayes. Motion Carried.

#### 4. Award Contract for Replacement of CT's at Industrial Substation

The current transformers (CT's) are in need of replacement at the Industrial Park Substation. Two proposals were received Consumers Energy Company and Kent Power, Inc.

MOVED Hammer SECONDED Anderson to award the contract for the current transformer testing at the Chelsea Industrial Substation to Consumers Energy Company at a price not to exceed \$13,950. All Ayes. Motion Carried.

#### 5. Award bid for Site Design Services

The City advertised and received seven (7) bids for Site Design Services. A.R. Brouwer was the low bidder at \$1,800.

MOVED Holmberg SECONDED Hammer to award a contract for Site Design Services for not to exceed \$ 1,800 to A.R. Brouwer. All Ayes. Motion Carried.

#### 6. Create Position of Operations Supervisor

City Manager Hanifan is requesting that the City Council approve the creation of the Operations Supervisor Position for the Electric Department.

A number of the duties that were traditionally addressed by the Superintendent position - contract administration, power purchasing and comprehensive system planning are now the responsibilities of our contracted Engineer, the Utilities Director and the City Manager.

The department does need a "front-line" supervisor to ensure that daily maintenance activities are performed, system upgrades are executed and emergency situations are dealt with. The Operations Supervisor will be responsible for the direct supervision of employees in the department.

The intent is to promote from within the department and not create a new full time equivalent position. The department will be adding an apprentice lineman at the end of October to bring the number of full time workers in the department to five.

MOVED Hammer SECONDED Albertson to create the position of Operations Supervisor in the Electrical Department. All Ayes. Motion Carried.

#### 7. Appointment of Interim Operations Supervisor

Utilities Director, Brad Roberts is requesting Council appoint Jeff Burns of the Electric Department as the Operations Supervisor in the Electric Department on an interim basis for the remainder of the Fiscal Year 2008-09. Mr. Burns is a journeyman lineman employed by the City of Chelsea since 1996.

Jeff Burns has served as the Interim foreman for the past two months and has done a good job of keeping the department operating. He has also been helping with the transition of the Electric Department as a unit of the Utilities Division. Mr. Burns has shown that he is capable of supervising the employees of the department during emergencies. Under his direction, the department finished much needed complex system upgrades that were critical for the long-term health of our electric system.

Mr. Burns will be evaluated prior to the end of the current fiscal year for consideration of permanent appointment to the position.

MOVED Lindauer SECONDED Hammer to appoint Jeff Burns as the Interim Operations Supervisor for the Electric Department. All Ayes. Motion Carried.

#### 8. Award Tree Trimming Contract

The City is in need of having tree-trimming work completed along electrical lines. The City received three proposals. Wright Tree Service low bid was \$102.66 per hour. (\$32,851.20 for two months)

Ordinance No. 79-2008-02 is an ordinance amendment to allow one tier, an aisle and two rows of parking in front of the principal building in the Gateway Overlay District, which encompasses the intersection of Old U.S. 12 and M-52. In the current ordinance, parking in front of the principal building is prohibited in all commercial districts north of U.S. 12 except the C-6 district.

MOVED Martinez-Kratz SECONDED Lindauer to accept Ordinance No 79-2008-02 and place it on the October 28, 2008 Council agenda for the second reading. All Ayes. Motion Carried.

Council member Lindauer reported on the Chelsea School Board Meeting where Andy Ingall gave a report on the MEAP test and what it is designed to assess. There was also the acknowledgment of accepting a \$25,000 donation from Chrysler for the Robotic Competition.

Council member Albertson reported on the Planning Commission work session where they discussed the Walgreen site plan since there has been an addition of a second building on the site.

Mayor Feeney reported that the Chelsea Lanes will host a Texas Hold'em tournament every Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday. The proceeds will go to local charities. There will be an Eagle Scout ceremony on Sunday at Inverness Country Club for Nathan Vicek.

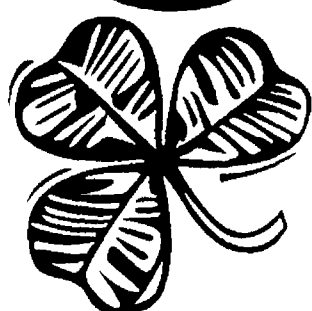

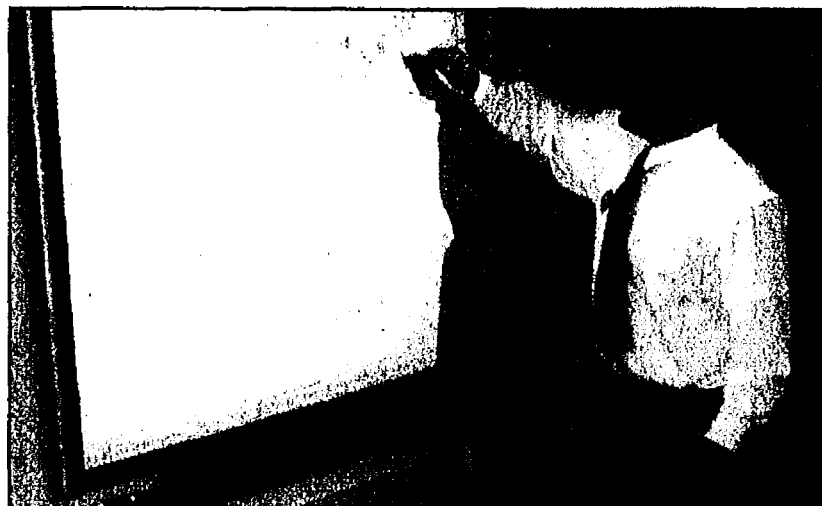

Start class at 8:05 a.m. Teach, teach, teach until 2:58.

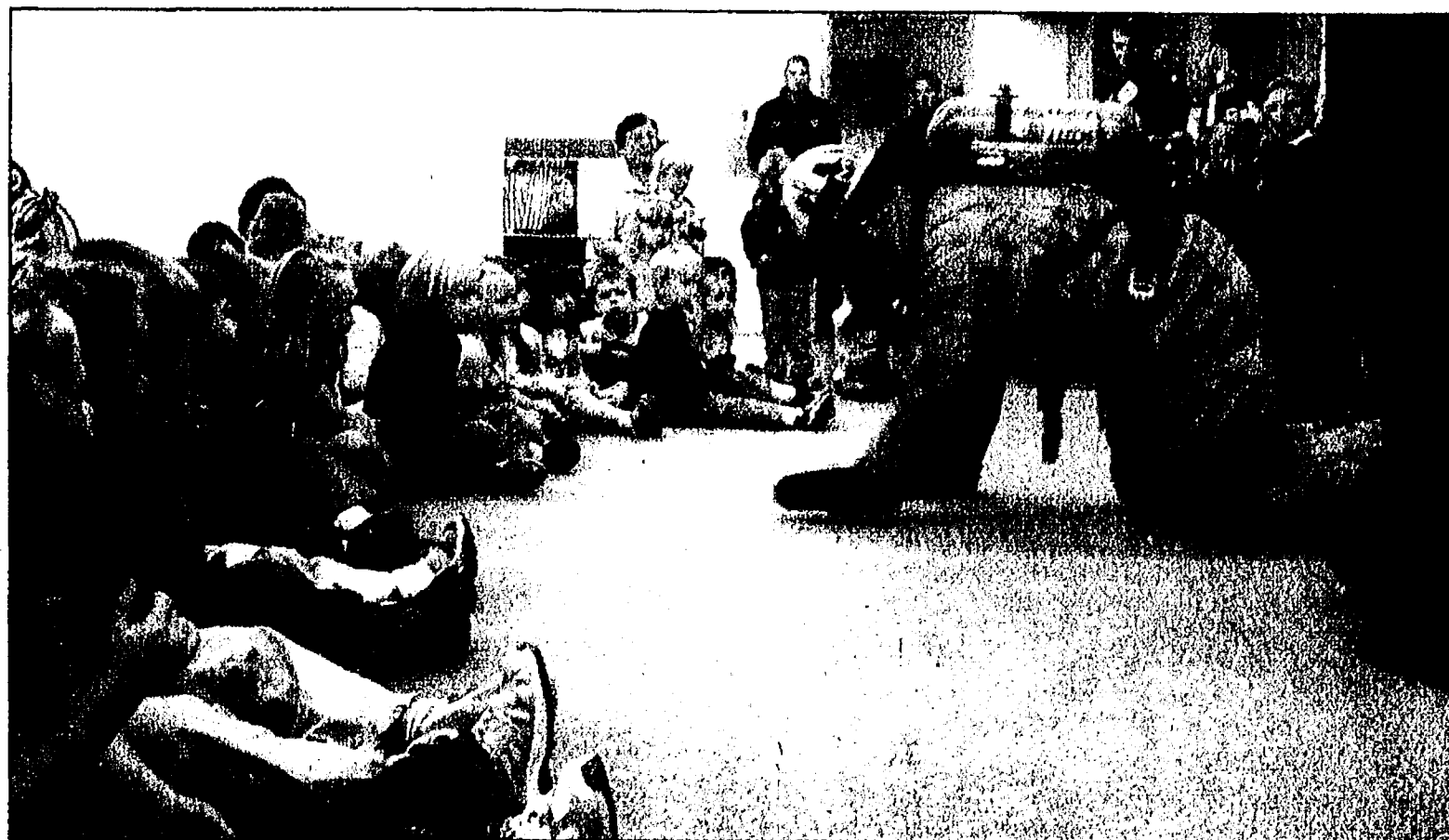

## Youth to take lead at SRSly meeting

SRSly, the community coalition dedicated to the prevention of destructive behavior in Chelsea youth, needs the Chelsea youth to stand and be heard.

SRSly is holding a youth-only meeting from 6:30 to 8 p.m. on Thursday, Nov. 13, at the Beach Middle School library. Attendees will learn about SRSly, share their ideas for the program, and work on upcoming projects and activities.

SRSly Program Director Reiley Lewis has been attending lunches at Chelsea schools over the past few weeks, talking with Chelsea's youth and signing them up for the coalition.

"I am often asked, 'What are we going to do in SRSly?' I turn that question around to the kids and say, 'What do you want to do with SRSly?' How do you think we can prevent underage drinking and drug use here in Chelsea?" Lewis said. "Kids are full of great ideas, and we need to hear them."

"We have made great progress in terms of building excitement about

SRSly, spreading the word about our mission, and getting people to join the coalition. But adults can only go so far. Now we need youth to get involved, and really lead the entire coalition."

The goal of the meeting is to get kids to work with their peers to brainstorm ways to promote good decisions among young people and their parents. They will also be asked to sign up for an activity. The meeting is open to all youth between the ages of 10-18. Current membership in the SRSly coalition is not required. Membership sign-up and t-shirts will be available.

"Youth can lead activities, as well as learn behind-the-scenes skills like marketing, and data collection and analysis," said SRSly steering committee member, Angela O'Neill.

"We are really excited about partnering with youth on projects and activities," said Lewis. "Kids can literally run the show."

## When the truth is hard to get at

Have you ever been involved in a situation where two parties are having a dispute, and you listen to each of them, and both of their stories seem believable? Sometimes, even when you sit them down together, it's still virtually impossible to determine the truth. People can distort the facts, or even lie through their teeth. Or sometimes people really are convinced of what they're saying, but their perception is clearly off. Because determining the truth is often such a difficult job, it must be tough to be a judge in a courtroom.

The Bible says, "The first to present his case seems right, till another comes forward and questions him" (Proverbs 18:17). For

this reason, it is important to hear both sides of the story, and to try to keep an open mind.

It's interesting that, in a presidential or vice-presidential debate, almost invariably both sides claim that their candidate

won the debate. I think each political party honestly believes that, because they had already made up their mind that their candidate was in the right, and they don't even consider what the opponent is saying.

It's important to listen to both sides in the political realm; electing the wrong person can lead to unpleasant consequences in this life. It's far more important, in the spiritual realm, to evaluate the teachings of the various religions and denominations, because there are eternal consequences - even

though it might be more comfortable for a person to stick with the beliefs they've been brought up with.

And it's important to keep an open mind every time we hear differences of opinion, and not side with one party just because they happen to be the first one to present their case to us, or because they happen to be a family member or a close personal friend.

Still, there will be times when we honestly can't decide. There will be times when we have to say, "Look, at least one of you has to have it wrong. God knows the truth. You can fool me, but you can't fool Him."

And we all need to evaluate our

own situations, and to ask ourselves, "Am I really presenting the facts, or am I distorting things?" If we've been deceptive, whether intentionally or unintentionally, we need to remember that we can't deceive God. If we've tried, it's time to turn to Him for forgiveness. This sin, too, had to be paid for by our Savior Jesus Christ on the cross.

Once we receive His forgiveness, we will resolve, with His help, to present the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth.

## CCA makes improvements to building

Heating and air conditioning work finished in upper level, work begins on Window Renovation

Thanks to state funding from the Michigan Council for Arts & Cultural Affairs, plus donations from many generous donors, the Chelsea Center for the Arts is moving towards a more comfortable and energy efficient building.

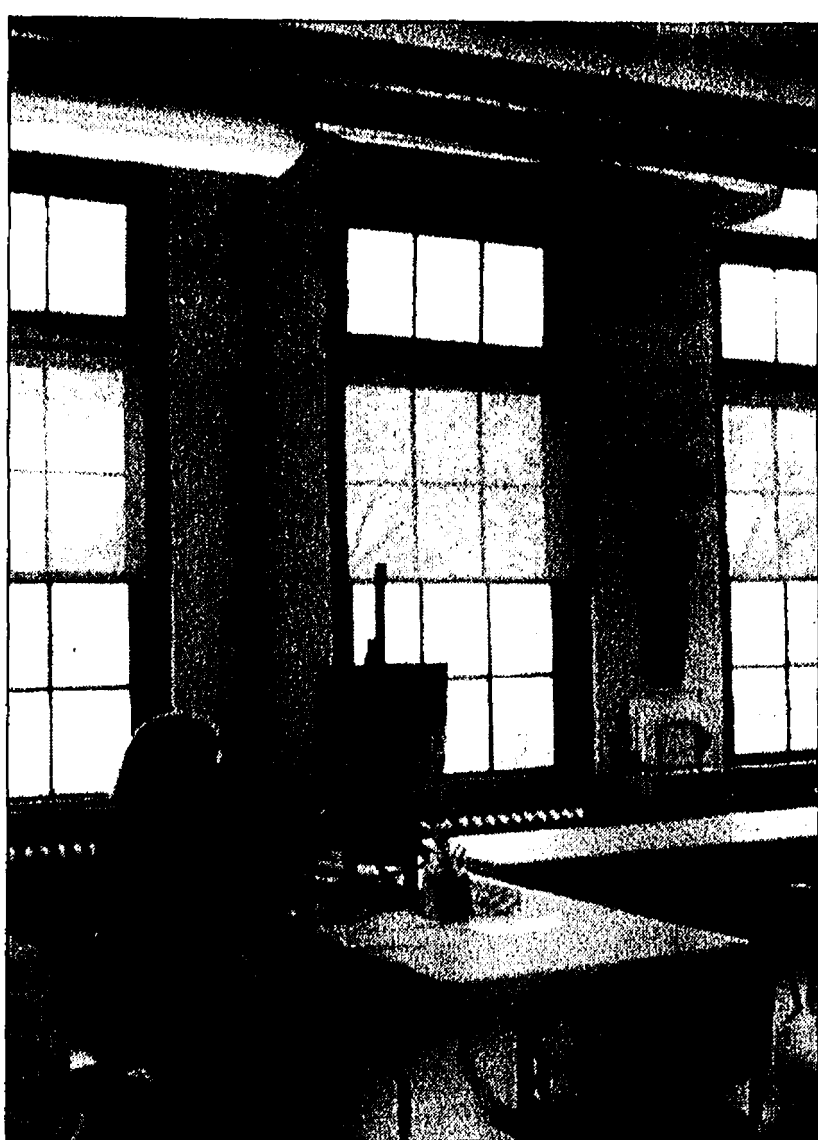
This spring, bids were taken for improvements to the heating and cooling system. Grant funding provided enough money to make improvements to the upper level of the building. The location for the heating units proved to be challenging.

"It would have added cost to install the heating system in the attic space, and it would have been a challenging installation - there's not a lot of support for anything to sit on the ceiling," Executive Director Aubrey Martinson said.

"The building committee decided to build two platforms at either end of the hallway to house two heating units. Air conditioning units have been placed outside of the building in two locations. It's exciting to tell our longtime watercolor painters and students that they no longer have to freeze in the winter. Each classroom has its own thermostat, so we can really customize each classroom."

The contract was awarded to Indoor Comfort, owned by Mike Martin.

"It was a pleasure to work with CCA," Martin said. "The personnel was great. We had a few challenges with the attic: the ceiling support trusses

were every sixteen feet, so maneuvering in the attic in order to hang the duct work, had to be done very carefully. Thankfully, none of our technicians fell through the plaster. We were happy to do the job at a special reduced rate in order to support such an worthwhile community organization."

Richard Fry, of Fry & Partners Architects, worked closely with Martin and the CCA to ensure the project came off without a hitch.

"The cast iron radiators were difficult to control so at best our heating system

was never balanced," Fry said. "Repairs were getting incredibly expensive and we were wasting valuable gas fuel. Our existing system had two controls, one for the large gymnasium and one for the rest of the 10,000sq class room building."

The boiler system still heats the lower level and the great hall, the area where the Purple Rose Theatre Company rehearses.

"It was a great project - we did need to build some new platforms, but we were also able to use some

of the existing infrastructure," Martinson said.

Lisa Hinz-Johnson, CCA director of music and voice instructor, said she is thrilled with the new heating/cooling system.

"It has been so wonderful to have a reliable

heating/cooling system in place this fall," she said. "On those winter-like days in October, we were able to stay toasty warm in the voice studio, and my students didn't have to bundle up in scarves and hats! I still have memories of a particularly cold day in my studio when my master class students were all huddled together, bundled up in the blankets I had

brought from home. I can't say that I miss those days."

The next project is a window-improvement project. Grant funding was announced late summer, the CCA is to receive \$23,500 for restoring and weather-sealing the historic wood windows. The grant application requested \$50,000 which would have also allowed for installation of storm win-

dows. The work will again focus on the upper floor of the building.

"The goals of the window improvement project are economic, environmental, and aesthetic," Martinson said. "Our heating bills can be anywhere in the neighborhood of \$2,000 per month throughout the fall and winter. We need to seal the windows so that we're not wasting resources - both

money and energy. The window improvements, when coupled with our new upper-level heating system should realize great cost savings."

Martinson also speaks to the environmentally friendly and historic preservation of the window project.

"We're reusing the original windows, so there's less waste heading to landfills," she said. "Plus, we are pre-

serving a historic asset, which many in the community recognize as demonstrating leadership in the area of historic preservation."
