

We Can Sell America to World If We Concentrate Our Skills

-With respect to our apparent inability to make ourselves understood to the world, to present our ideas and ideals effectively, in short to "sway the minds of men," Vice-President Lyndon Johnson has been widely quoted as saying that a nation that can popularize corn flakes should be able to tell the world about itself.

In answer to this, Charles H. Brower, president of Batten, Barton, Durstine & Osborn, Inc., declares that this nation can sell itself and its viewpoint to the world-if ituses the same concentrated methods and skilled effort that popularized corn flakes. And it had better start!

In an address before the Economic Club of Detroit, Brower urged an early meeting in Washington of "people who know how to sell" and the establishment of a "Department of World Affairs"—on a prestige level with the State Department which would "deal with the people of the world drain from their minds the poison of Soviet lies and tell them the truth about America."

He noted that corn flakes are not sold by the president with increasing speed in recent "It is said that in some cases of the cereal company, that "automobiles are not sold to the consumer by the presidents of Chrysler, Ford or General Motors" but by a sales stuff and an advertising staff at headquarters, "and a large staff in the field."

Brower admits that selling America to the world is a more complex job than selling it to Americans. find helpful in your furniture refinishing ventures.

Did you know - that those peaky white apots which appear on furniture surfaces can be polished away? A steel-wool pad of the finest grade dampened with linseed oil, a furniture polish, or a good paste wax will do the job on dull finishes.

For medium surfaces which are neither dull nor glossy try rubbing with your household scourng powder dampened to a pasteike texture with water.

If the whitened surface is high gloss, dampen your steel wool with the pre-wax cleaner you ise on your automobile.

Did you know - that white shellac is hard to work with and therefore, for most jobs it should be mixed with orange shellac? When you've once opened a can of any shellac, pour the unused portion into a glass jar for stor-age. Shellac will darken when kept in a once-opened can.

Dil you know - that by brushng over two or three coatings of shellac_with_a_coat_of_clear_varnish you can have a finish that has all the wearing quality and beauty of shellac plus the protection of varnish against alcohol stains, humidity and the like.

Did you know - that warped table leaves can be straightened? First, with a good semipaste remover, strip the finish off the leaves. Dampen a small portion of your lawn. Lay the leaves on the ground, concave side up near the lampened area and pour hot water

Then flip them over so that the vet, concave sides are face down on_the_dampened_earth_and_the sun can get at the dry, convex (humped) sides. A good hefty rock placed atop the hump should speed things up a bit. Depending upon the warp, the straightening process will take from a few hours

to a few days. Did you know - that tired old finish can be snapped up by good scrubbing with soap and water followed with several applications of a mixture of equal purts of turpentine and linseed . After the final application has been allowed to soak for an hour or so, wipe the surface dry Then go to work with a good canuba wax.
