#### Plan Ahead for Needed Trucks. Railroad Cars

Farmers are being urged by Michigan Department of Agriculture officials to plan ahead for transportation of needed supplies and equipment.

"With the existing shortage of rail cars and trucks, combined with the fuel shortage and recent strike situation, heavy demands for transportation services, equipment and facilities could cause problems," according to Dean Pridgeon, MDA's director.

"During the first part of spring, there are many requests for these services and farmers may be caught short."

Pridgeon suggests farmers anticipate their requirements and remain in contact with their transportation firms and truck brokers to make certain supplies and equipment will be shipped on time.

"A similar situation occurs when harvest season arrives and transportation is needed to move products to market," Pridgeon said. "Advance planning can help to alleviate problems and reduce transportation costs."

#### Early Slave Laws Limited Bondage

The first laws issued in the New World regulating slavery set up strict time limitations. The laws, passed in Warwick, R. I., on May 18, 1652, limited bondage to no more than 10 years. Anyone found breaking that law was subject to heavy fine, but no imprisonment. It was many years later before slavery disappeared from the United States, as evidenced by the two c. 1845 brick slave huts from Hermitage Plantation near Savannah, Ga., which are now part of the historical groupings at Greenfield Village, Dearborn. Appropriately, the huts are now located near an Illinois courthouse where Abragam Lincoln had practiced law during that same period, 20 rears before he issued his famous Emancipation Proclamation.
