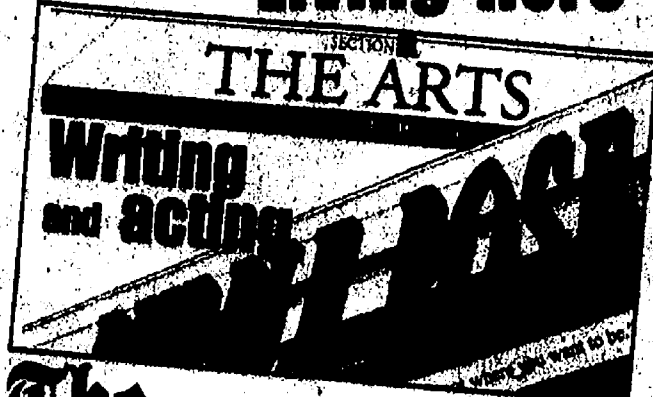

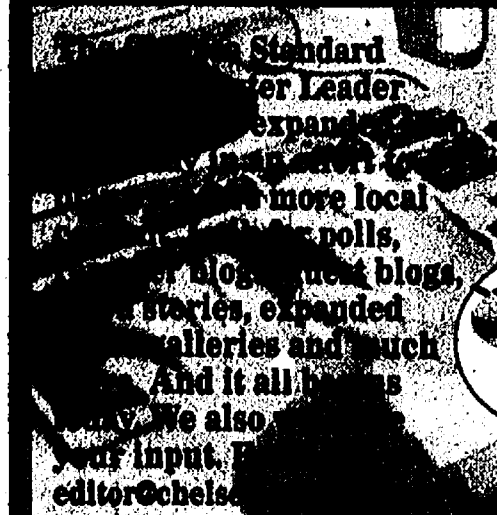

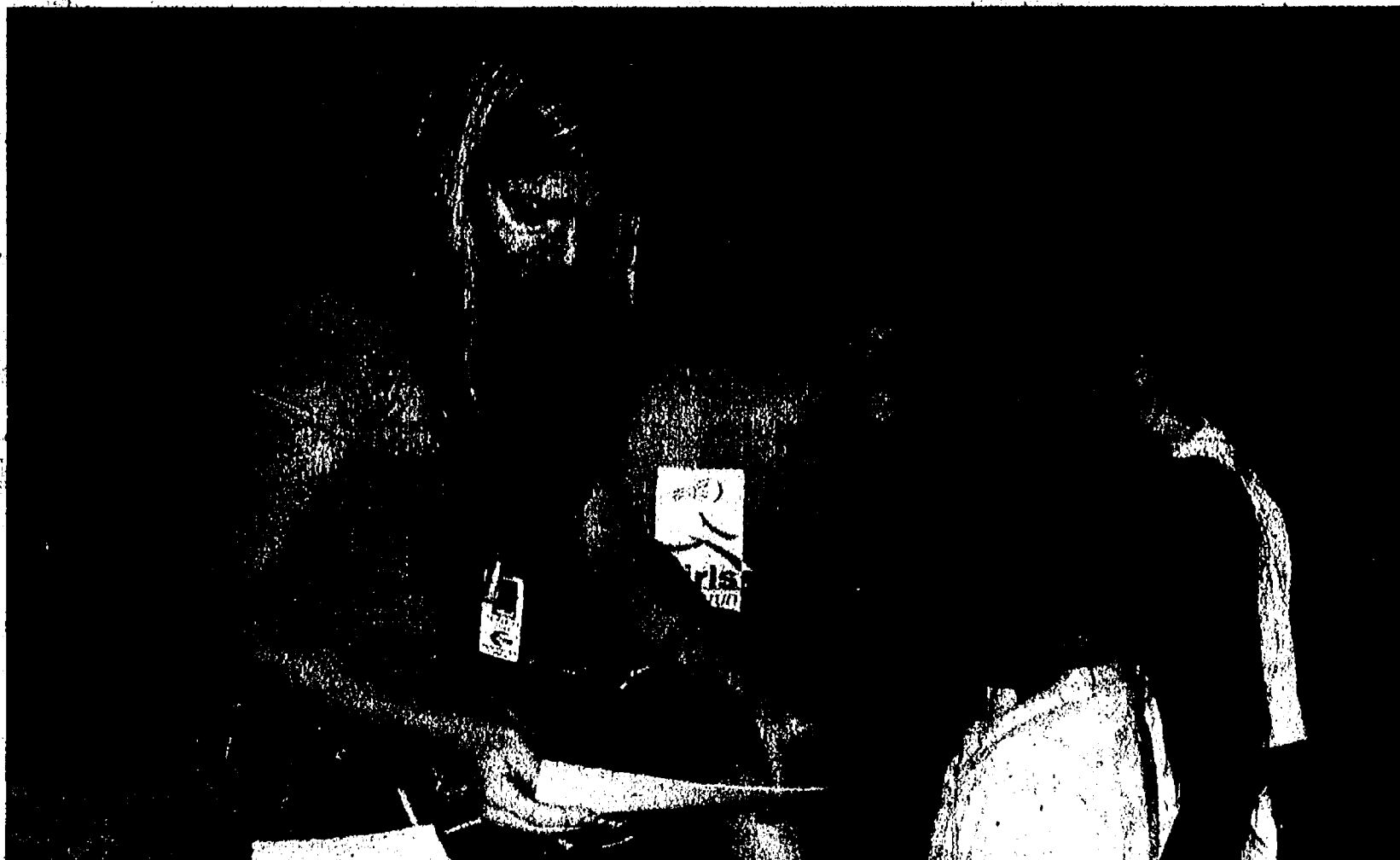

## Teaching is more a passion than a job

Budget cuts, layoffs, increasing class sizes, struggling test scores. Why would anyone want to become a teacher these days? The answer, according to some Chelsea School District teachers, is in the intangibles. In recognition of National Teacher Appreciation Week, the Chelsea Standard spoke with teachers in each of our local schools to discuss the people who made an impact on their own lives and the rewards of being a teacher.

Lonnie Mitchell, Chelsea High School

## Grades mixed on how profession has changed

Phil Jones began teaching in the fall of 1971 for a salary of \$6,700 a year. Thirty six years later he is making 10 times that amount — right around \$67,000.

Money isn't the only thing that has changed for teachers over the last 36 years. In fact, teaching is constantly changing — and not always for the better. "One of the biggest changes to the profession has been the attitudes from parents," Jones said. "Parents seem to be second-guessing teachers constantly on everything from materials taught to discipline issues. Teachers are expected to be sensitive to every student's needs while trying to teach a class full of media-crazed adolescents."

Jones says that an endless cycle of "better ideas" has left schools with different philosophies of what works best "that it seems we are going in circles trying to

## Dexter's Hanifan named Chelsea's new city manager

The Chelsea City Council conducted a national search to find a new city manager, but the candidate they chose was found right in their back yard.

On Tuesday the council officially offered a contract to John Hanifan, who has been Dexter's assistant village manager for the past three years.

"I've been in some form of municipal management for 10 years, and this was a natural, logical progression in my career," Hanifan said.

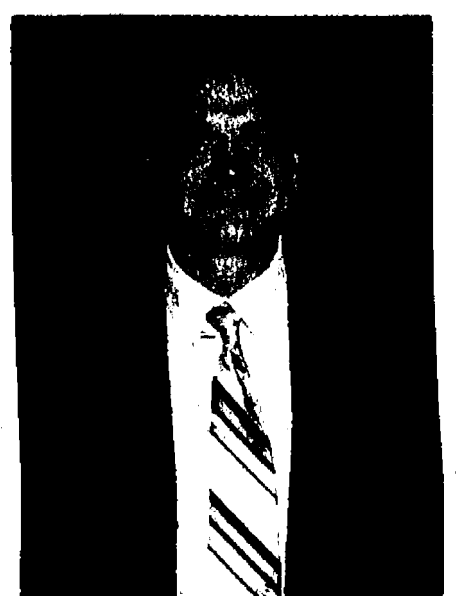
Interim City Manager John Hansen said the council voted unanimously to designate Hanifan as the "lead candidate."

The other candidates interviewed were Richard Downey, city administrator in Rock Falls, Ill.; Richard Dunnell, manager of Bridgeport Township near Saginaw; and Anthony Nowicki, Wixom's assistant city manager.

"(Hanifan) earned the nomination in the presence of others," Hansen said.

"He has the potential to provide very good, very long-term service to the city of Chelsea."

His contract calls for a starting salary of \$75,074, and a previously approved 2.5 percent increase for all department heads that goes

into effect on July 1 will boost that to \$76,940.

Hanifan said Chelsea and Dexter are more alike than different, which will make his job easier.

"There are a lot of similarities between the two communities; they're facing the same growth and development issues. But they are different enough," he said. "This is a humbling and tremendous opportunity."

Chelsea Mayor Ann Feeney said Hanifan's understanding of Chelsea would be a bonus.

"I consider Chelsea and Dexter to be really good

## Event showcases services for seniors

The organizations, products and services available to local seniors are seemingly unlimited, judging by the overwhelming response to "Chelsea Unlimited."

Last Thursday's free event, coordinated and hosted by the Chelsea Senior Center, drew an estimated several hundred to 1,000 visitors during its scheduled hours from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

It showcased nearly 80 local exhibitors from the private, public and nonprofit sectors, and almost a dozen presentations of Senior Center classes and programs.

"This is the first one we've done; we're very excited about it," said Senior Center Director Tina Patterson.

"We're focusing on businesses and nonprofits, and focusing on the wonderful community we have."

Booths were set up throughout the Washington Street Education Center: in the hallways, outside the cafeteria, in classrooms, and even in the parking lot.

Exhibitors ranged from health care, pet care, churches, city and county government, public safety, recreation and entertainment, arts and education, insurance and financial services, service clubs and more.

Those attending the expo expressed appreciation for the mountains of information that was provided, and called for the event to be repeated annually.

"I think it's wonderful; this should be done every year," said Sandy Zeeb, a longtime Chelsea resident whose husband Walter passed away in January. "You can learn so much from things like this — I learned that there are many people out there to help you."

Keith Bloomensaat and Dan Nutt, representing the Chelsea Lions Club, said they took it as a good sign when they found the center "already packed" when they arrived before 10 a.m.

"This is great — every organization in town should participate," said Bloomensaat. "This is fun, and we get to meet a lot of people."

With census figures showing that nearly a quarter of Chelsea residents are over 65, and with about four out of five of them living alone, the expo was reaching out to a large target audience.

"This is a display of opportunities for seniors to live fulfilling lives," said Chelsea Mayor Ann Feeney, who is herself a dynamic representative of that demographic.

"The new senior is not a helpless, needy person; it's someone who wants to live a fulfilling life, and live it on their own."

The event was underwritten by Chelsea Retirement Community, Silver Maples of Chelsea and Chelsea Milling.

Volunteers played a major role in the event, from filling hundreds of "goodie bags" for visitors to cooking and serving a free pancake brunch from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

Doris and Robert Butler were among about 400 people to take advantage of the brunch while taking a break from the expo.

"I thought this was very well organized, very informative," Doris Butler said. The couple, who said they had lived in Chelsea most of their

lives, recently returned here after moving away in 1992.

"This is very similar to what we've seen before, with the long-term care and so on, but there's a good variety of stuff here today," Robert Butler said.

"The pancakes are pretty good, too."

Bud Freysinger of Grass Lake was born here, but left in 1950.

"My roots are still in Chelsea, and we play euchre with friends here every week," he said.

"I think this is nice," he added. "Getting the business-

es together shows what the community can do, in a concerted effort to let the community know what's going on."

As the event wound down, Patterson said she was extremely pleased with the response from the community and the exhibitors.

"This far exceeded anything we could have hoped to do ... I think it's a good way to connect with seniors and others," she said.

"One thing I heard over and over was, 'I didn't know we had that in Chelsea.'"

## Timber Town fundraiser is on the menu

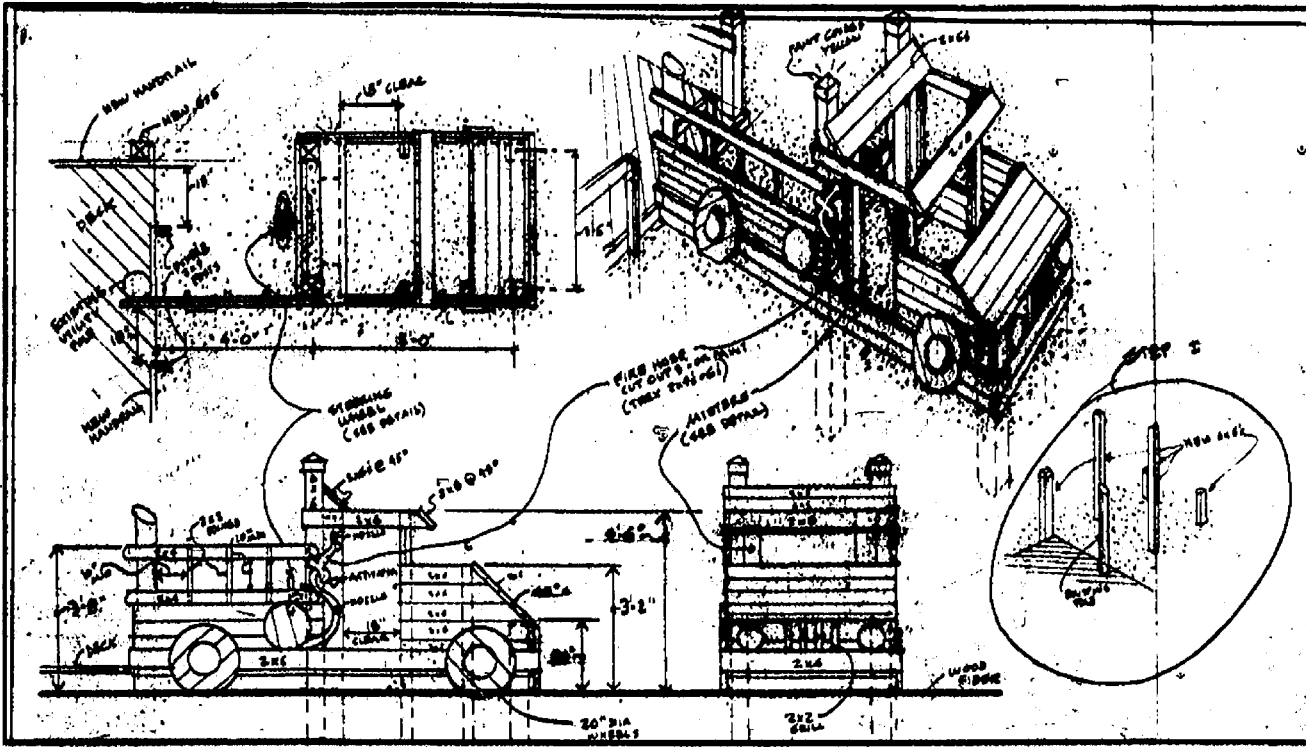
St. Mary Catholic Church will open its doors tomorrow night for a spaghetti dinner fundraiser benefiting Timber Town and hosted by Chelsea Boy Scout troops 425, 476 and the Knights of Columbus.

The team is hoping to raise over \$5,000 to cover the costs of a new fire engine and police car that will be built and installed at Timber Town. The two play items are being added to Timber Town in honor of Chelsea's fallen heroes Matt Tuttle and Scott Sumner.

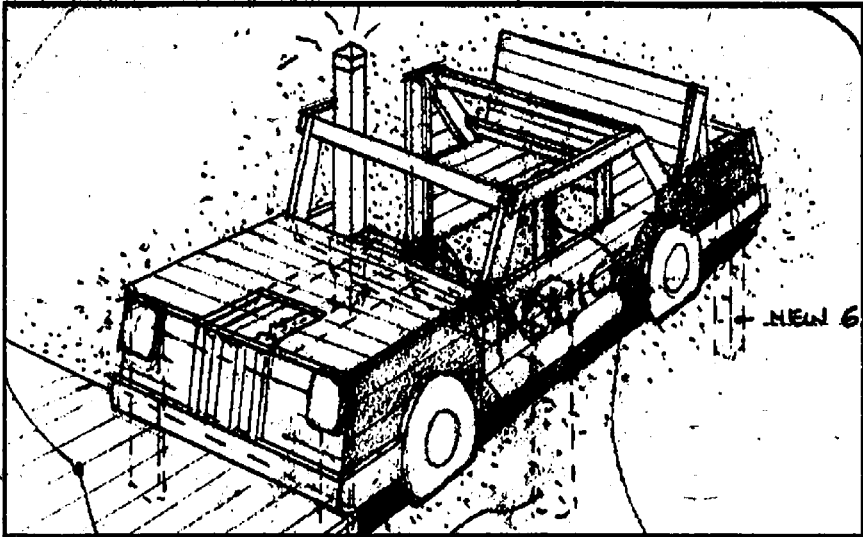
Once completed, the fire engine will be prominently located in the front of Timber Town, on the east side of the play structure, closest to the parking lot. Work will be done by Knight's Excavating to bump out the existing landscape timber perimeter approximately five feet to accommodate the new fire engine.

The fire engine also will include a mister station, with the hopes of keeping children cooled off during summer months. The fresh water will be re-directed from the drinking faucet and will be clean filtered water for the children to play in. Friends of Timber Town would like to thank the City of Chelsea for their work in accessing the water hook up for the mister station.

The police car also will be a wonderful addition to the Tot Lot section of Timber Town. Because of safety issues, the bucking bronco tire feature will be removed. In its place, a tot sized police car will be installed. The police car will include a real steering wheel and tunnel feature through the back end of the car. Both the fire engine and police car will be fabricated from pressure

treated lumber and Trex composite materials.

All materials used on the new features adhere to all playground safety codes and conditions. Further, the materials will maintain the integrity of the Timber Town feel.

Under the leadership of Chelsea resident Jack Long, the Boy Scout troops will begin construction of the police car and fire engine in the coming weeks off site. During the May 26 hardware restoration event the crew will be installing the new units at Timber Town.

Tickets are available at GiGi's Flowers, Crainesbill Books, the Tree House and Mission Market place. The tickets for the dinner are \$10

for adults, \$8 for students and seniors, children 4 and under eat free. The benefit dinner hours are 4:30 to 8:30 p.m.

neighbors, and his familiarity with Chelsea will be a real advantage," Feeney said.

"We're very excited about John coming here. He has demonstrated his skills on many projects."

That project-management skill will be missed in Dexter, according to Village Manager Donna Dettling.

"I'm going to miss him, but this was a great opportunity for him and I can understand," she said.

"He moved a lot of important projects along. He's a team player, which will be key for the city of Chelsea."

Hanifan will take over from Hansen, who was brought on board after previous City Manager Mike Steklac resigned in February.

"He'll be here full-time no later than June 11, and it may well be he and I do some dovetailing, in a gradual transition," Hansen said.

"He's very loyal to jobs he wants to finish in Dexter, and the city council is very tolerant of that."

Hanifan said he has been married to his "college

sweetheart," Dana, for 10 years, and they have three children: Chloe, 7; Ryan, 5; and Lucas, 2.

The family lives in Pinckney, but Hanifan said he intends to move to Chelsea at some point.

"Chelsea is a wonderful community," he said. "It's the kind of community I want to raise my family in."

### Trustee Ottoman

#### faces new court date

Dexter Township Trustee Marcia Ottoman is scheduled to appear May 14 in federal court in Detroit on one count of falsely assuming or pretending to be an assistant U.S. attorney.

She was arraigned on that charge on April 10 and released on a \$10,000 unsecured bond.

According to Gina Balaya, spokeswoman for the U.S. Attorney's office in Detroit, an "unsecured bond" means no cash was posted.

"No money is actually involved," Balaya said. "It's more like she promises to show up in court, and if she doesn't we can come after her."

Court documents allege that Ottoman used the name of Assistant U.S. Attorney Christopher Varner of the Detroit office late last year in letters and e-mail messages in an attempt to have tenants evicted from her in-laws' home.

Her preliminary exam was originally slated for April 30, but was moved to May 14.

If convicted on the charge, Balaya said, Ottoman faces three years in federal prison, and/or a \$250,000 fine.

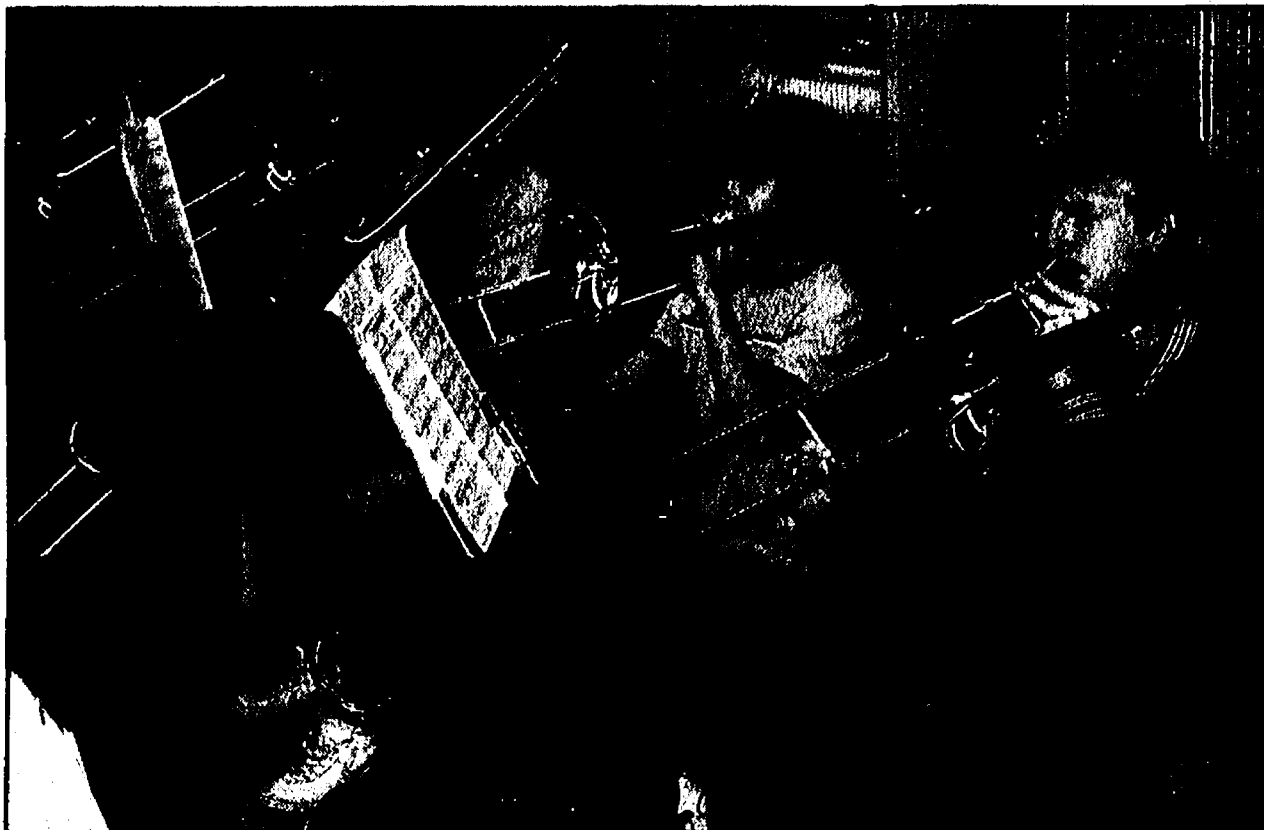

It's not often a high school band can brag about a direct connection to the composer of the music it plays.

But that's exactly the case with Chelsea High School's windy symphony and local resident Brian Brill.

Brill has written "The Clocktower Suite," which will be among many works on the playbill for a free concert set for 7:30 p.m. May 14.

"The opportunity of having a composer create a work for our own band is very unique," said CHS Director of Bands Rick Catherman.

"Having Mr. Brill in our community has made it even more unique in that he has been able to visit our classroom and share his creative as well as design processes with our students as an 'artist in residence.'"

Brill has another good reason to compose for the high school band: his daughter Margy, a trumpet player, is a senior this year.

"I spoke to him three or four years ago about doing a band piece, and mentioned it to him a couple times a year," Catherman said.

"Last year he finally agreed; we sketched out some ideas and talked about the creative ideas he had," he added. "He really tailored the piece to our group, as far as how high and how low they could play."

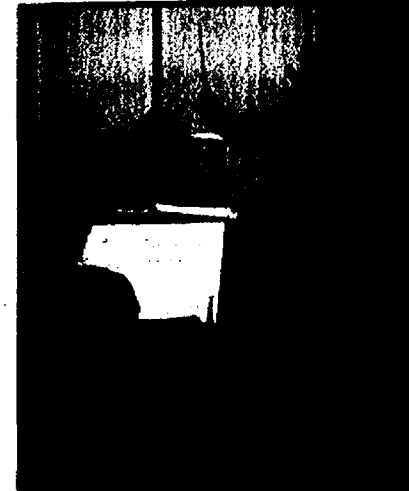
During a rehearsal last week, Margy Brill described what it was like to perform her father's music.

"It's been really nice growing up in that atmosphere," she said. "When he was writing, he'd ask me, 'Does this sound OK?' I think he likes the idea."

Margy said the band began rehearsing the four movements of "The Clocktower Suite" as her father completed it.

"We got the music at different times as he would finish it," she said. "We got the first movement right before spring break in March, and just got the fourth movement a couple of weeks ago."

Brill's music is not alone on the program, however. A couple of works by renowned composer John Moss will be featured,

including "Brookfield Fair," which Moss wrote in tribute to Brian Brill's father, himself a longtime band director.

When a composer writes music for a specific orchestra or event, it usually involves a commission, or direct payment.

"I asked him to do this as if it was a commission, but he wouldn't take any financial remuneration from us," Catherman said. "He said, 'No, I'd really just like to do this for the band program.'"

Brill has been making a living as a professional musician and composer for more than 25 years.

He graduated from Western Michigan University in 1981, followed by six years of playing throughout the Midwest in a jazz quartet and as a studio musician and music composer/arranger.

Since 1989 Brill has written and arranged music for documentaries and advertising jingles.

"We really enjoy the quality of life in Chelsea," he said. "It has been a great place for my daughter to grow up."

Technology has allowed him to succeed in a traditionally East Coast- or West Coast-based career while maintaining a home and raising a family here in Chelsea.

"It's easier than you might think, especially with the advent of high-speed Internet," Brill said.

"During the 1990s I commuted a lot to Detroit and Chicago, but most of my work now is done from my home studio," he said. "Just today (Saturday) I sent music for two TV commercials to a studio in New York via the Internet."

"My math teacher at Troy Athens was very excited about math and wanted each student to try their absolute best."

"There are a lot of thankless jobs out there, but the teaching profession is not one of them. Former students continuously stop by and thank me for getting them ready for college and beyond. Parents are very grateful as well."

"Each year, the top students pick their most influential educator. There are times when I am picked and didn't even know I had that much influence on the particular student. It is a very humbling experience and I will never forget them. Each one of those students affects me."

"If you do not absolutely love the profession, then you need to get out. Some teachers who don't love their job stay on, when they should have gotten out and moved on to another profession. Don't think of it as a job just to earn a paycheck. You need to truly love and respect the profession."

**Marta Learman, Chelsea High School**  
Learman has been a teacher for 14 years, spending her entire career with Chelsea Schools in addition to her student teaching. Her subjects are primarily 11th- and 12th-grade Elective Studies and U.S. History.

"Mike Smith of Saline High School was very dynamic. All the kids liked him, and I think that was because he didn't favor any particular person or group. He definitely had an influence; I've tried to model the way I treat kids after the way he did things."

"I get kids interested in history; I'm preparing life-long learners. I love it when kids start a sentence with, 'I was watching the History Channel and...'"

"There was a student who graduated about five years ago who pushed me to do more for others in need, and we started the group Interact. He got me into volunteering, and I realized how addictive it is and how good it makes you feel."

"My advice? Do it! (Teaching) is the best job out there. It's rewarding and keeps you young."

**Dennis Strazewski, Beach Middle School**

Strazewski is in a unique position in his second year as a part-time teacher and part-time counselor, which gives him a slightly different perspective to both jobs.

"As a teacher you focus on curriculum; as a counselor you form a more personal connection with the kids, and become an advocate for students who need extra help," he said.

He has been a teacher for 12 years, spending nine of those in Chelsea. He currently teaches eighth-grade English, and also has taught seventh- and eighth-grade Social Studies.

"Mrs. Mayville, my second-grade teacher in Manistee, made all of us feel successful and important. Other educators and coaches influenced my decision to become a teacher. My chemistry teacher made it seem like a real rewarding job."

"(The reward is) the feeling that you're doing something for the betterment of others,

and seeing kids change. My favorite thing is to see them five years later and see what they've become. Another thing is, middle school kids make me laugh every day."

"Some students have so impressed as people, they seem to have developed the ability to lead and organize; they seem to have 'gotten it' a lot earlier than others. It makes you want to become a better person. At the same time, there are some kids you know are really struggling, and you do take that home with you. You want every kid to know you care."

"Teaching is a tremendously rewarding profession, as long as the economy allows us to have jobs for new teachers. You get out of it what you put into it. It can be dreary or it can be great. You have to remember it's not your whole life; don't let it consume you."

**Amy Doma, South Meadows Elementary School**  
Doma, a sixth-grade



teacher, is a Chelsea native, and has been with Chelsea Schools for six years.

"Mrs. Schlupe in second grade was my favorite teacher, because she made reading fun. She gave us apples and caramels while we were reading, and what's not to love about that? I think I knew I wanted to be a teacher by the fifth grade."

"I have a job that's fun, and I look forward to coming to work every day. It changes by the day, so it keeps it interesting."

"During my first year I had a student who was very challenging, mostly because I didn't know how to deal with

his home issues. I realized for the first time that students have a life outside of school, and we only see them for a very small part of that. You've got to take what you get and try to help them."

"Don't be afraid to admit when you've made a mistake, and try to have a sense of humor about everything."

**Tracy Heydlauff, Pierce Lake Elementary School**  
Heydlauff teaches the grade 3-4 multiage classroom. She also grew up here, and has spent her entire 18-year career with Chelsea Schools.

"Paul Terpstra, my CHS English teacher, was very challenging because he had high expectations and high

standards. I really learned critical and analytical thinking skills from him. He made an impact on my life, and I wanted to do the same for other children."

"We are so results-oriented and assessment-oriented, that if they do well on their test scores you feel rewarded. In my classroom I love it when I hear the kids talk to each other about what they're learning; and when they walk in with a smile on their face, that's rewarding too."

"I had a student in fourth grade a few years ago whose father was critically injured in a car crash; he called me on his own to let me know

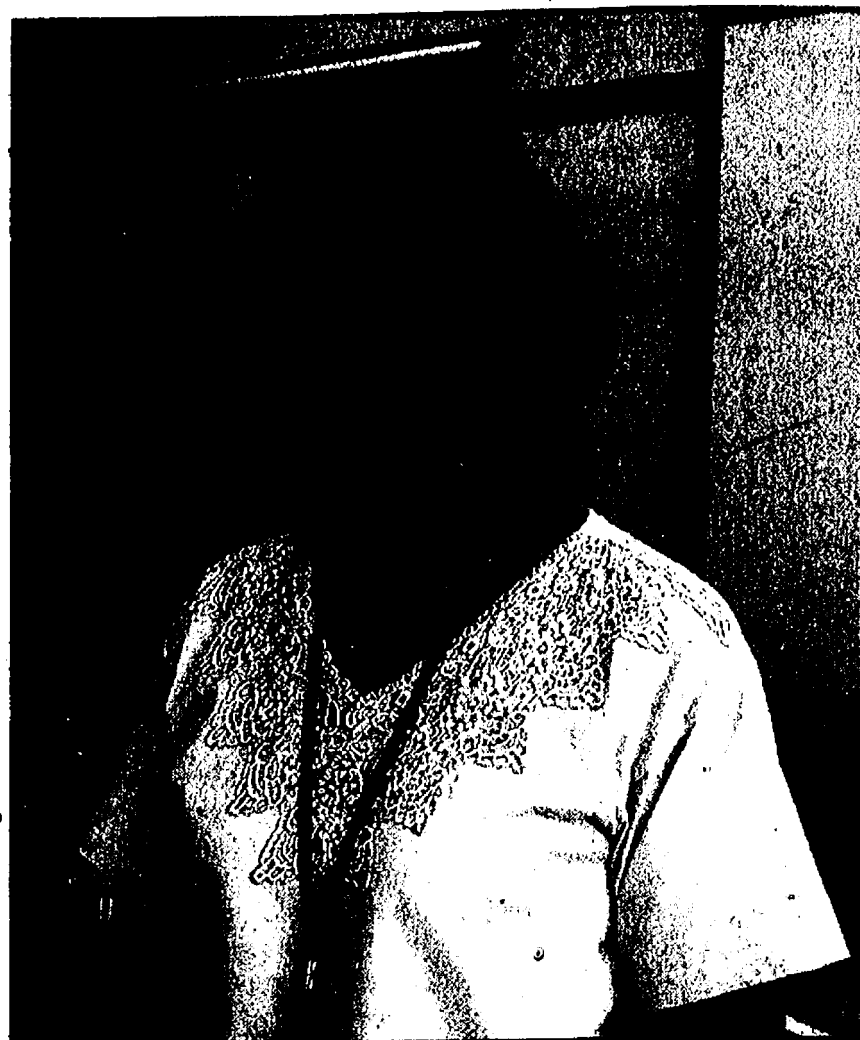

"You have to be willing to go anywhere in the country for a job in teaching, even overseas, but it's a great opportunity. It's always a good idea to get experience in other capacities, and experience working with other people in a variety of circumstances; it helps you mature. It's definitely not a summers-off job anymore, there's a lot of responsibility."

**Marcla Quilter, North Creek Elementary School**  
Quilter, a first-grade teacher, is in her 31st (and final) year in the profession, the past 29 of which have been in Chelsea.

"I learned a lot from my

high school English teacher in Sandusky, Ohio; she really guided me through. My decision to become a teacher just kind of evolved. I've always liked learning and I always liked school."

"It's rewarding to watch children learn and discover things; you can see the learning taking place. You can tell they are learning, because the children get excited about it. It's an intrinsic reward all the time."

"I think in general the students who show you they are making a connection to learning (make an impact on me). They show that by their work, and in their interactions with you and the other students. When you see students who work really hard and they don't give up, that persistence is so admirable in kids."

meet the special needs student's accommodations while challenging the average or gifted student."

Deborah Marsh, a teacher at Dexter High School, has seen some disturbing changes in the students during her career.

"Kids aren't as polite and/or respectful of their teachers and other adults in the building," says Marsh. "I think we've lost a lot of our basic manners in this new high tech world."

Increasing class sizes is another concern for many teachers.

"My classes are huge," Marsh said. "The best class size is around 20-24, any bigger and the kids get antsy and the teachers get overworked. Most of my classes are in the 30s and that's a lot of kids every day."

Marsh said she is at school from 7:15 a.m. to 5:15 p.m. everyday.

Marsh's first teaching experience, was when she was a junior in college, tutoring a Spanish speaking fourth-grader.

"Before my experiences working with him I thought I was going to be a translator, work in the business world and use my love of foreign languages, or be a lawyer," she said. "Instead I realized that no matter what else I did, I would always be a teacher."

And despite her concerns, Marsh still enjoys taking her place in front of the class.

"Every once in a while I lose hope for the future when a kid does something that is totally in appropriate or rude or mean, but luckily that doesn't happen too often," she says. "I wonder what I'll do in my next profession, but I don't see that starting anytime soon. I used to think I wanted to be a principal, but they don't get to interact with the kids and that's my favorite part of teaching."

Marianne Zubryckyj, a German teacher and chair of world languages at Dexter High School, had an interesting beginning to her teaching career.

"I went to an all girls' Catholic high school, and when one of the nuns was absent, there was no substitute teacher," she said. "I was asked a couple of times in my junior and senior years to teach some math and science classes, serving, in essence, as a substitute teacher for younger students and for my own classmates. I felt great when the students in the biology class where I taught a lesson on DNA said, 'We understand it!' I think that experience planted the seed that led to my teaching career."

It's a career that is drastically different because of technology and how that technology is used in the classroom.

"The biggest change has to be the technological tools that are available to us," she said. "Students and parents get ongoing feedback on performance through our web-based grading program. We have more and better communication with colleagues, parents and students."

"Also, we have a wealth of information and activities from the internet to supplement textbooks. We can provide varied instruction by using all the multi-media tools at our disposal."

Sandy Inman began teaching science at Chelsea High School in 1977. She has seen both positive and negative changes in the students but says her job as gotten easier because of both technology and cooperation.

"We all have our own teaching styles and can still use that but there is a lot more coordination of efforts among teachers," she said.

Inman says today's classroom is much more interactive.

"Teachers are more guides now," she said. "Students have taken on more responsibility for their own learning. We used to just lecture and kids would take notes. Now there is more emphasis on getting the students involved and it creates a more effective way of learning. And the resources students have today compared to 30 years ago is amazing."

Zubryckyj, who says many of her colleagues classes are "overloaded," agrees that teaching has become more

first started.

"I wouldn't say that the profession has changed for the worse, but I would say the job has become much more difficult," she said. "Ironically, the technology that makes the teaching more exciting and varied also creates more work. Teachers must now research topics online, read and write dozens of e-mails every day, etc."

"My only complaint is that the teaching profession has become much more complex over the 30 years I've been here in Dexter. Much more is expected of us teachers, and the extra pressure and extra time necessary take away from one's personal life."

But once a teacher, always a teacher.

"I still enjoy my relationships with students most of all," Zubryckyj said. "I am fortunate in that I sometimes have the same students for two, three or even four years. So I get to know many of them quite well. It is interesting to watch them grow emotionally and intellectually."

Cheryl Wells, a teacher at Dexter High School, remembers going to school with her grandmother and mixing paints and working on her paramedical science fair project with her grandfather.

"I would also play school in my basement with the neighbor kids and keep attendance," she said. "I detoured for a few years after college and worked for the Wayne State Medical school in laboratory animal research. After a while I realized that I loved the biology and chem in research, but wanted to be with students and not mice."

Wells has seen improvements over the years in both equipment and facilities.

"My longevity as a science teacher was extended when we moved into this new building," she said. "Better lab facilities and having all the science rooms in one wing has offered a greater collegial atmosphere."

An advisor for the National Honor Society for 28 years, Wells has kept busy with plenty of after-school activities and says she still enjoys teaching.

"I like being with the stu-

dents," she said. "I enjoy teaching science and advising the science clubs. I will continue to keep teaching as long as it is fun and at the same time productive learning time for the students."

Joe Romeo began his career as a substitute teacher when "computers needed a big room with air conditioning to hold them."

Romeo would like to see teachers given more freedom to do what they do best, teach. "The state keeps telling us what to teach, then takes away the funding to do it," he said. "They have set standards that kids have to meet to get a diploma, which they could not meet themselves. And we have had less money most years."

Romeo, who says he works about 60 hours a week and has seen class sizes increase over the past three years, still feels comfortable in front of a group of students.

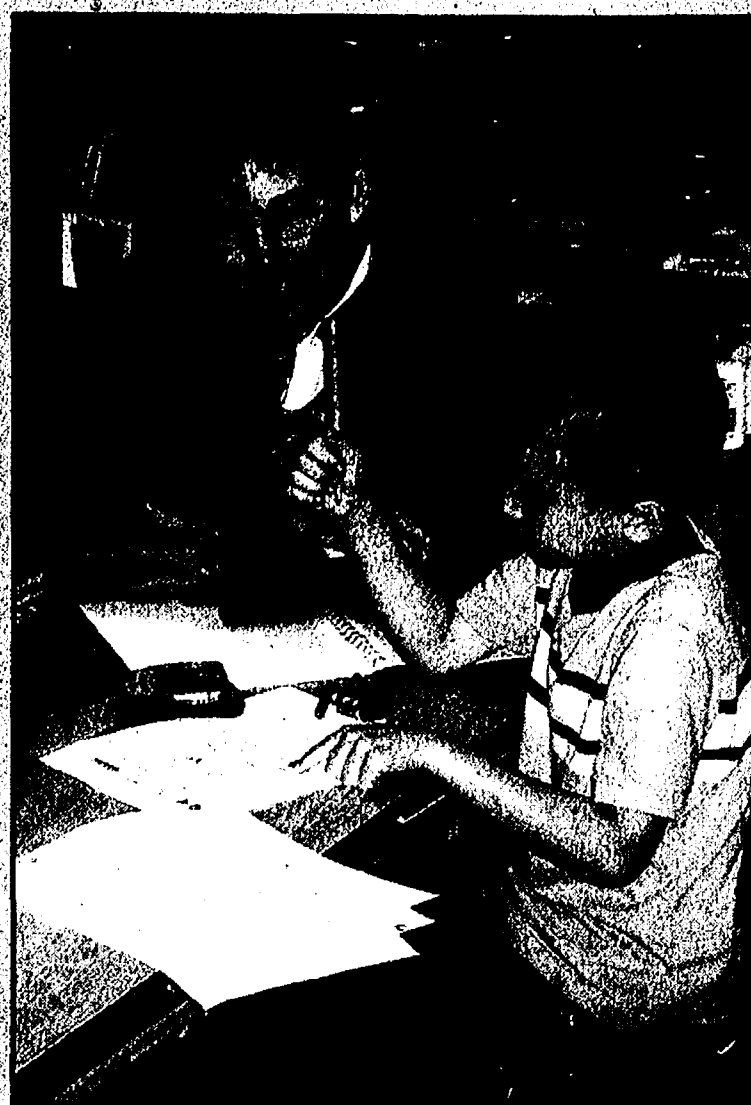
"Kids are funny still," he said. "And some of my students are children of former students of mine, so that con-

nection to parents makes it more interesting."

Most teachers would agree that some change is good and some not so good. But teaching is still the greatest job in the world.

"We get to teach a lot more interesting and authentic stuff now," Marsh said. "Making assignments link to the kids is what is fun. When I was in school and when I first started teaching there was still a lot of diagramming sentences and formulaic writing. Kids get to do some really interesting assignments these days."

Said Jones: "For me, the thing that keeps me pumped up to remain teaching is the friendship relationships that kids seem to be more open to these days. Not that they want to 'hang out' with teachers, but are looking for a smile and a hello as they come into the classroom. Most kids are seeking to have a personal interaction with teachers, not content to merely be another in the sea of faces in a classroom."

"We've been warmly received in Chelsea," Frahm said. "We're most excited about the opportunities for educating people

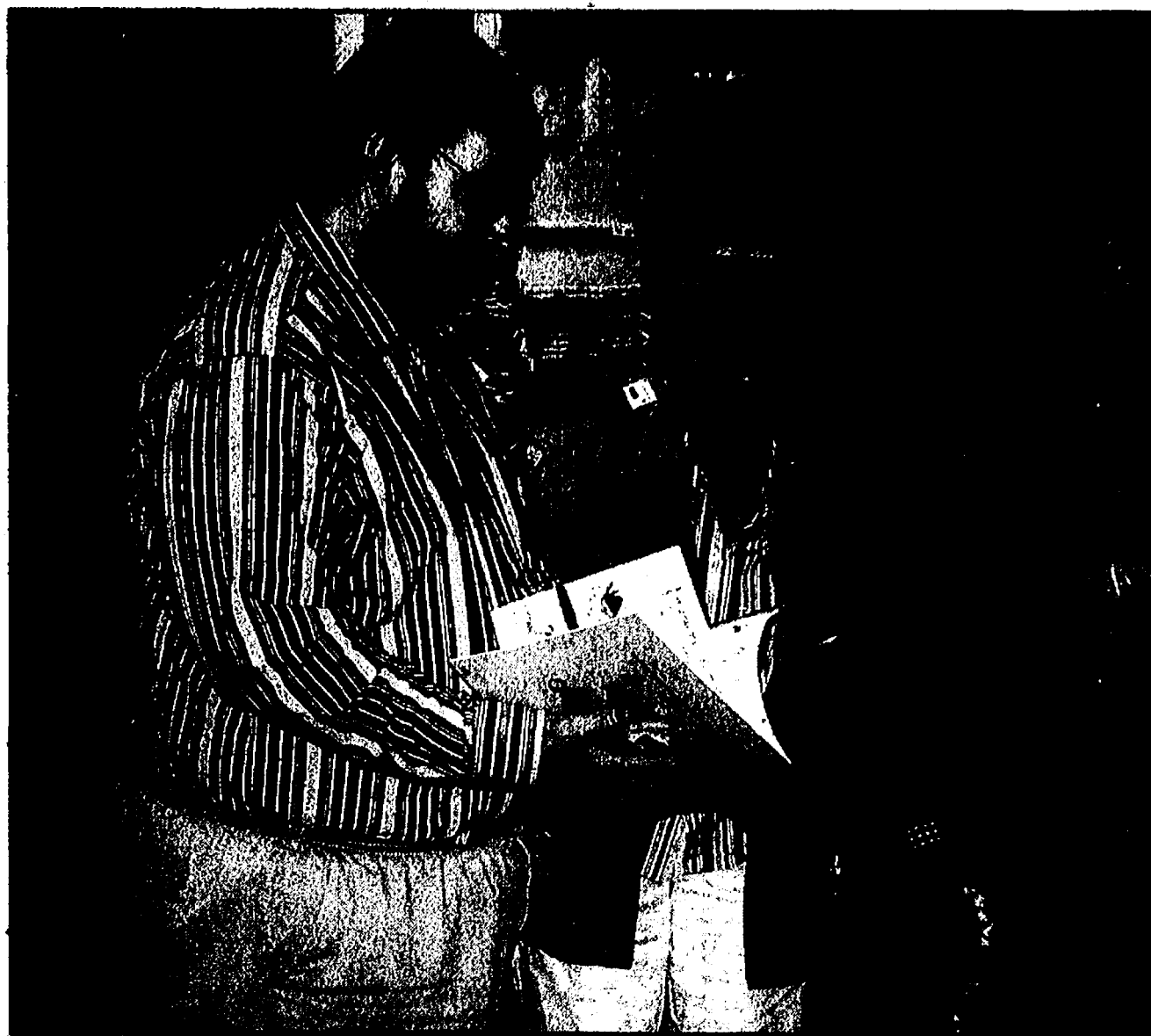
about fair trade and social investing."

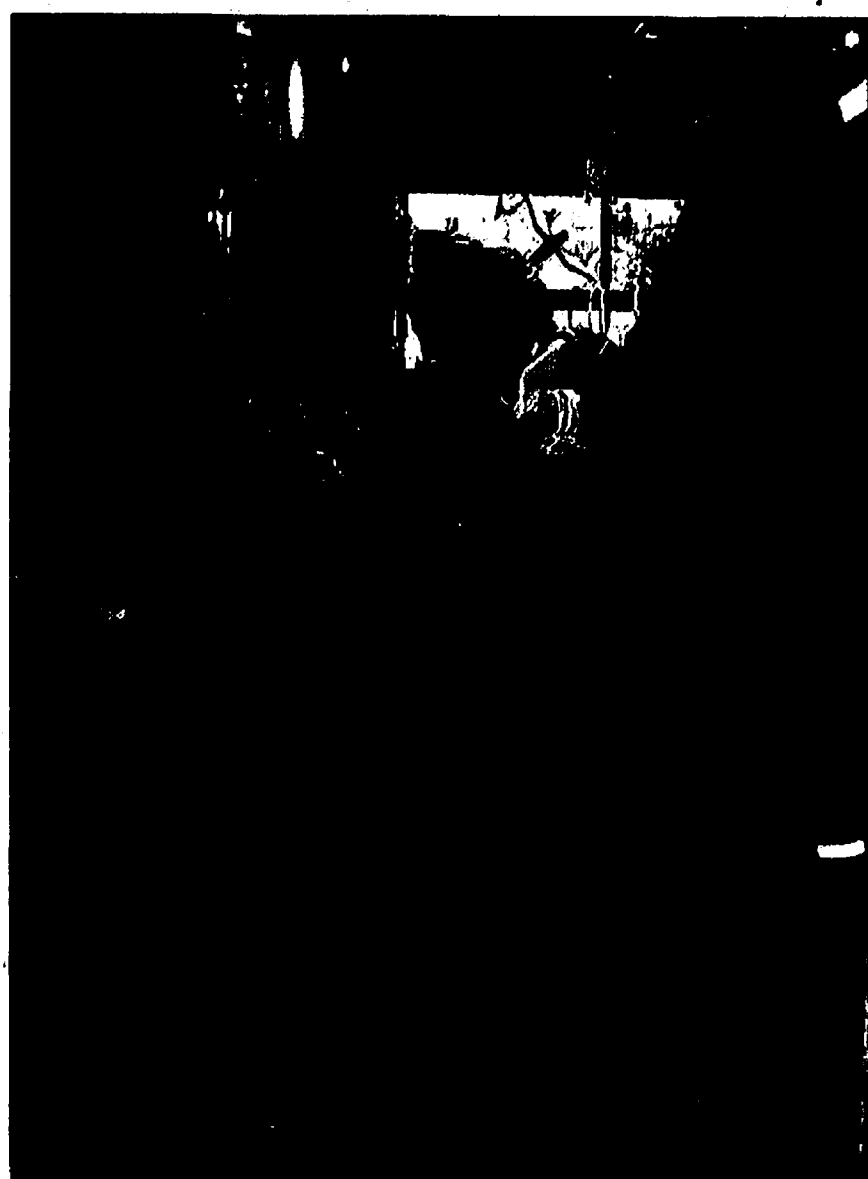
"We have had items in here from 49 different countries, including the United States," Frahm said. "You don't have to go outside our country to find people in need."

### State needs to ratify lake compact

Michigan markets itself as the Great Lakes State.

The lakes surround the state, carving out the unique mitten shape for the Lower Peninsula, and offering year-round recreational opportunities, as well as an economic engine worth tens of millions of tourism dollars annually.

So, Michiganders must wonder why it is that Minnesota, rather than the Great Lakes State, appears to be the first on the fast track to approving the Great Lakes-St. Lawrence River Basin Water Resources Compact to protect the precious resource.

The goal of the compact is fairly simple, despite its mouthful of a title. It seeks to protect the valuable water resources of the Great Lakes, and combat future efforts to siphon off that water by states or agencies outside the immediate region.

The Minnesota House approved a bill adopting the compact in early April, and after preliminary action April 30, the Senate was expected to do so. If the Senate approves the compact, Minnesota will become the first state to take this important step. No other compact member state, including Michigan, Wisconsin, Illinois, New York, Pennsylvania, Indiana and Ohio, has passed bills adopting the compact in both houses. Two Canadian provinces are also signatories to the compact.

The state legislatures have to ratify the compact before it can go to the U.S.

Congress for adoption consideration.

The Great Lakes are already victims of invasive foreign species like the zebra mussel and the goby. An Asian carp species is held at bay only by an electric barrier in southern Lake Michigan.

In recent years, we have seen water levels in the Great Lakes drop precipitously, wreaking economic havoc on the boating and recreation industries. Scientists and climatologists can debate the cyclical nature of those fluctuations, but the value of the Lakes to the state and the region is indisputable.

Michigan has lost a seat in Congress, and if population trends hold we stand to lose another in a few years. Simultaneously, populations and congressional representation in water-hungry states such as Arizona and Nevada continue to grow. The compact is essential because we may face a time when states in the Southwest seek diversion of Great Lakes water for drinking water or irrigation.

Only about 7 percent of Minnesota's land mass lies within the Lake Superior watershed. But 100 percent of Michigan's land mass lies within the Great Lakes watershed. If any state stands to lose the most from water diversion, it is Michigan. The state should be at the forefront of this effort, yet the Legislature let a bill adopting the compact die in 2006.

State Rep. Chris Kolb, D-Ann Arbor, along with Reps. Steve Bieda, D-Warren,

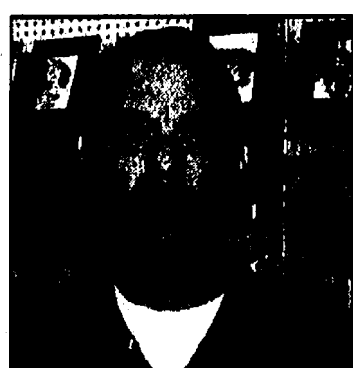

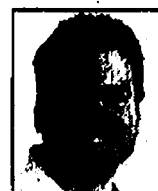

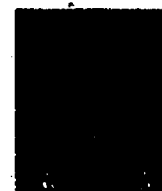

# Prescribed burning effective in restoring amazing habitats

A crackling sound resonates as high flames slither across the field. Small trees and bushes are quickly engulfed, providing more fuel for the fire.

Nearby a small group of highly trained fire officers with the Michigan Department of Natural Resources are moving with the fire in protective clothing, hard hats and firefighting equipment.

This is not a wild fire; it is a prescribed burn, which has been deliberately ignited to restore a natural ecosystem.

Prescribed fire is increasingly being used by the DNR and other public-land managers and private landown-

ers to manage vegetation. If implemented when conditions are just right and in an appropriate environment, prescribed fire is a valuable, safe, critical tool for restoring and maintaining important wildlife habitats such as prairies and savannas, oak barrens, jack pine forests and wetlands.

"Prescribed fire is a misunderstood management technique," said Mark Sargent, Private Lands coordinator in the DNR's Wildlife Division. "We understand that it can appear frightening to have a fire racing across a landscape, but we do not light them unless conditions are perfect. Prescribed

burns are very effective in restoring some amazing habitats."

Michigan often is thought of as a state historically dominated by its forests. However, when the Europeans first settled here, a significant component of the landscape consisted of more open communities such as prairies and barrens. Most of these grassland sites occurred where trees and shrubs had difficulty growing because of the droughty and infertile soils.

Frequent wildfires (often set by Native Americans or lightning) kept these areas open by killing or stunting shrubs and trees. Wildfires occurred irregularly across

the landscape. Fire frequency varied greatly depending on vegetation type, fuel load and flammability, soil moisture, weather and topography.

It is estimated that of the 11 million to 13 million acres of savanna found in the Midwest in the early 1800s, less than 0.02 percent remain. In addition, invasive species, such as spotted knapweed, autumn olive and common buckthorn, are crowding out and killing the little bits of remaining

prairie and savannas that exist.

Modern-day fire suppression has transformed prairies and savannas into brush land and young forests because grasses and flowers that cannot grow in shade are unable to thrive under the tall shrubs and trees.

"Since we can no longer allow wildfires to do their job naturally, the DNR uses prescribed burns to mimic those effects because fire is extremely beneficial to a

variety of plants and animals," Sargent said. "Without the use of fire, we may lose biological diversity."

So, this spring or fall, if you see or hear a familiar crackling or see contained flames in the distance, a crew of natural resource professionals may be restoring lost habitat.

The DNR recommends returning to that same area next year to see the beautiful grasses and wildflower that may reappear.

and Paula Zelenko, D-Burton, introduced a bill last year to have Michigan adopt the compact. That bill was referred to the House Committee on Natural Resources, Great Lakes, Land Use and Environment, where it died quietly at the

conclusion of last year's legislative session.

It is crucial for the state that Bieda re-introduce the legislation, and Washtenaw County's contingent — both Democrat and Republican — get firmly behind its passage.

The state relies upon the Great Lakes. The recreational opportunities offered by Lake St. Clair and the others bring millions of dollars and

support thousands of jobs. Any potential damage to the Great Lakes will strike a blow to our economy.

At some future point, the state may decide that it wants to sell water to other states and regions. For the resource to remain plentiful, and a potential future viable commodity, Michigan needs to ratify the compact this year.



This is the second in a series of articles that will run throughout the year on the Purple Rose Theatre Co. The first feature, "Setting the Stage," appeared Feb. 15 and focused on the process of how a play goes from the drawing board to the stage. The second feature, "Writing and Acting," is a look at Brian Letscher, a Michigan native who wrote and stars in "When the Lights Come On," now playing at the Purple Rose. The play is Letscher's first as a writer and is based on his highly personal experience as a college football coach trying to decide exactly what his priorities are in life.

## Michigan actor finds a place to stand

There are motivational sayings written on the walls surrounding the set of "When the Lights Come On," the latest play to hit the stage at Chelsea's Purple Rose Theatre. Many of the sayings were taken right off the walls from the University of Michigan, while others are more well known, such as "no retreat, no surrender."

There is one quote that is a little more meaningful for Brian Letscher, who not only stars in "When the Lights Come On," but also wrote it. That saying, "give me a place to stand," is as much about Brian Letscher as it is about Tommy Leonard, the character Brian plays.

"It means I don't have to play quarterback, I don't have to be the running back, I just want to be on the team so just give me a place to stand and tell me what to do," Brian says. "It's about being part of something bigger than yourself."

There isn't much of a difference between Brian and Tommy. Brian decided to use this opportunity to write his first play on a subject he knew very well — and we aren't talking about football. We are talking about Brian.

"When I was younger I wanted it to be true, but it was more about me and I just didn't know that," he says. "But as I get older being a part of something is much more how I feel about things. I am much happier to be a part of something."

His play is a testament to that belief. "It took more than 30 people to make this play happen," he says. "I am just happy to be a part of it."

Many actors and playwrights and people who dream never get to experience that feeling of teamwork and fulfillment and satisfaction. But Brian's road from Grosse Pointe to Chelsea wasn't exactly a straight shot down I-94.

## Sipowicz and Speedos

Brian's occasional acting jobs landed him on a few soap operas, including All My Children, where he played "Dennis the security guard" on several episodes in 2006. He also played an ad executive on Kate & Leopold (2001), Slippery Slope (2006), Law & Order (2006) and Law & Order: Special Victims Unit (2003, 2005).

But his most "revealing" appearance came on the Emmy-Award winning series NYPD Blue. Brian played "Wally" in an episode in 2003 during the show's 11th season and also starred Mark-Paul Gosselaar. But it was the show's biggest star, Dennis Franz, who got to see Brian up close and personal.

"I played this guy who was swimming around in the Hudson River training for this swim and I found a dead body," Brian explains. "So (the detectives) come down to the seaport to interview me and all I am wearing is a Speedo and goggles on my head."

Detective Sipowicz (played by the popular wisecracking Dennis Franz) attempts to get some information from the thin suited Wally.

"I tell him how I found the body, but at the end of the scene I drop my keys and bend over to pick them up (in full view of

the camera and Sipowicz) and Franz yells, 'uncle' and walks away," Brian says laughing as if he just watched the scene.

"But while we were shooting the scene, tour buses would come by and all these tourists are shooting pictures of me standing there in a Speedo. To this day my dad still never mentions that show."

The episode certainly helped give Brian plenty of exposure — just not the kind he was looking for.

## Remember who you are

On a trip to New York City, Purple Rose Artistic Director Guy Sanville saw Brian in an off-Broadway play ("Burning Blue") and offered him the part of Bo Decker in "Bus Stop," a play Sanville would earn best director for and the show would earn best play from the Detroit Free Press.

"Burning Blue" was a play about four Navy fighter pilots and two pilots that fall in love.

"I auditioned for every one of the four roles," Brian said. "I went in for the lead guy, then they brought me in for the next guy and brought me in again and again. At the

end of it all my agent calls and said you didn't get any of the parts but they want to offer you the understudy for all four leads. My agent said I should do it so I did."

Brian had to learn all four parts and show up each day of the performance prepared to do any of them in front of a live audience.

"About two weeks into the show one of the guys ends up getting fired and I got his job," he said. "I never even got a rehearsal. This guy that got fired had an incident the night before at the show and they fired him the next morning. They called me at about 11:30 in the morning and said I was going on and that I had to be there by 4 o'clock. They couldn't get the cast together so all I got was a walk-through with some cast members and I went on that night."

While Brian knew Sanville before he offered him the role in "Bus Stop," he was about to get to know him a lot better.

"I knew him a little through my brother Matt and I had taken an acting class that he taught so I knew him a little," Brian said. "He was in New York for something else and I asked him to come down and see the play. Afterwards, he said he was looking for a Bo Decker for "Bus Stop" and offered it to me."

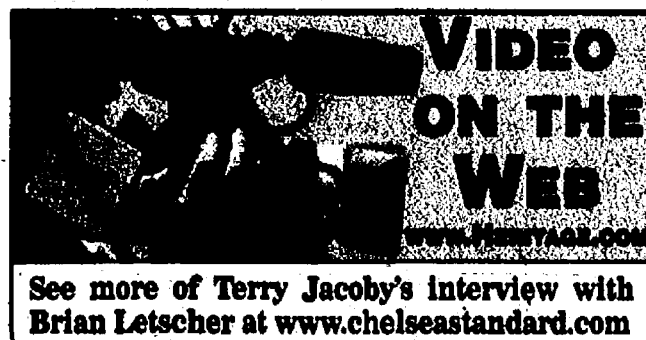

## What are you willing to do to win

While Brian was playing Bo Decker a story more along the lines of another Bo was starting to form in his mind.

"We were talking football and Guy said he would love to do a football play and I told him I was putting together something based on my football experiences and he said well then write it," said Brian, still shaking his head at how easily and innocently it all started.

But there was nothing easy or innocent about the process. Then again, it never is.

"We could not be more delighted to present Brian Letscher's first play," Sanville said. "Brian is a wonderful actor and writer who knows the life of a coach first-hand. 'When the Lights Come On' is a funny and moving new play about major college coaches and the women in their lives, focusing on loyalty, commitment and the escalating price of winning at all costs."

Brian summed up Sanville in one word, "amazing."

And while Brian knew football, Sanville knew how to put together a play that not

only tells a story, but also entertains an audience. There wasn't always perfect harmony between writer and director, but give and take is always part of the process. It's all part of moving the ball down the field.

"The first draft was 148 pages," Brian said. "But a lot of what's in the play was in that first draft. We had two workshops of it and we rewrote after those workshops."

Since it was Brian's first time through the process, he doesn't have anyone to compare Sanville with, but ... "Guy is just a master at getting to the heart of the play," he says. "So all the stuff around it that I liked that I thought was interesting and built characters he would just get rid of. He would cut, cut and cut. The first workshop we went from 148 pages to 120 in about two hours. He was just crossing off stuff. He was crossing off entire pages and I was like 'what are you doing?'"

### Build from the ground up

In the beginning, Brian gave ground and let Sanville do his thing. After all, he was the veteran and Brian was the rookie.

"I always had a sense that I knew what he was doing was right," Brian said. "He was a very easy guy to put your trust in. And even though it's my name next to writer, about 20 people helped write this."

After the first workshop and the cutting and rewriting, Brian thought they were close. But as it turned out they were nowhere near the end zone.

"For the next three weeks it was rewriting and shuffling around," Brian says. "Then I went in and said to Guy that we have to move this scene up 30 pages. He looked at me and said that's brilliant. We're done."

"But it was constant changing. But it was beautiful."

The end result was a play that will leave many looking back at some of the choices they made playing in their own "game." Work, whether it's coaching football, writing software, teaching children or building bridges, can be demanding. What are your priorities? And are they the right priorities?

### Family, trust, respect

Born and raised in Grosse Pointe, Brian was a three-sport athlete in high school - and still looks like he could play three sports. After spending a semester at Miami of Ohio, where he was just starting to impress the football coaches after practicing with the varsity as a walk-on, Brian transferred to the University of Michigan.

"I would love to say it had everything to do with football, but there was a girl involved also," he says. "But a lot of it was football. I was doing well at Miami but I always had my heart set on Michigan."

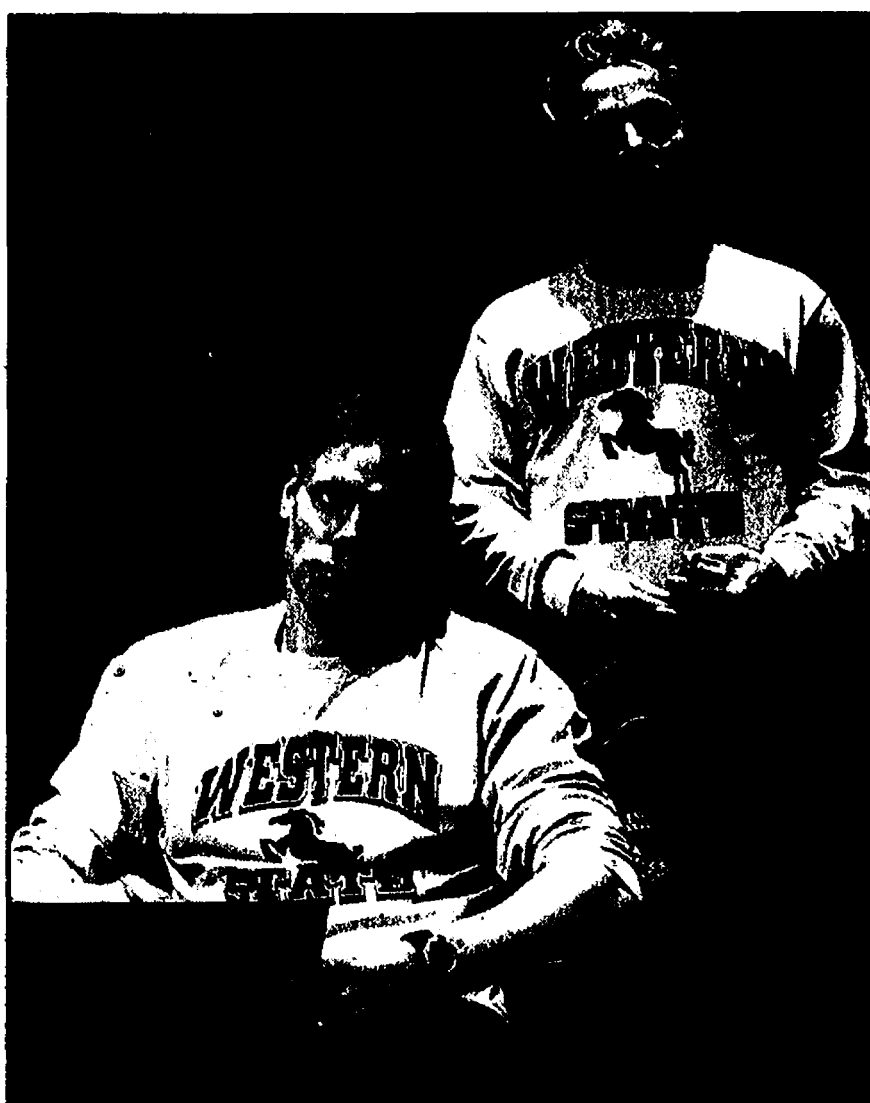
So Brian followed his heart.

His playing career never resulted in any playing time for the Wolverines but he certainly discovered a new love along the way.

"After I graduated I went and worked for my dad's manufacturing company for two months but I found out pretty quickly that that wasn't for me," he said. "I really missed football. I called Coach (Lloyd) Carr and told him I really wanted to be a football coach and he helped get me a job at Wayne State."

Brian began a very quick climb up the coaching ladder.

After Wayne State came Eastern Michigan (graduate assistant), then Indiana (graduate assistant) followed by a return to Ypsilanti where he was named recruiting coordinator and tight ends coach at

Eastern Michigan.

"It was probably too fast," Brian says. "Coach (Cam) Cameron at Indiana tried to talk me out of the EMU job because he thought it was too much too soon. He wanted me to stay at Indiana."

But Brian again followed his heart - a full-time paying job as a college football coach. It was all he ever wanted. And he was just 24 years old.

After three years at EMU, the entire staff was let go and Brian was left to ponder his future. In those three years he got enough of a taste of college football to learn just how demanding the job is. It's relentless. It's cut-throat. It's pressure. It's 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

It's also not for everyone. "I got a call from Canisius College (in Buffalo, N.Y.) interested in interviewing me for their head-coaching job and I told them that I appreciated the call but I didn't want

to coach anymore," Brian said. "And that was all I had worked for up to that point. But I knew that moment that I was never going to coach again."

### Blame no one

So now what?

While Brian had eliminated coaching from his list of interests, he wasn't sure what he wanted to do next. That list wasn't very long, but acting was certainly on it - even if it wasn't at the top.

"In college I decided to audition for a sketch comedy show and to this day I have no idea why," he says, letting out a boisterous laugh that fills up the room. "I ended up getting cast and did the show my final semester at Michigan. I really enjoyed it and ended up taking three acting classes at U-M."

"Sure the acting bug was still there, but it wasn't like I quit coaching to become an actor," he said.

It was 1999 and Brian,



now 27, had been married for a year. With coaching behind him and acting still hanging around, Brian took a job in New York City selling advertising for an internet company. While living in Brooklyn, Brian was still taking acting classes and getting small parts - just enough to keep his toe in the water - when he was offered a part alongside Kathie-Lee Gifford in a play called "Thumbs."

"This was a full-time job, it wasn't something I could just do in the evenings so I had to quit my job," he said. "I was awful in it and I think they tried to get rid of me but I hung around until the end."

After "Thumbs" went thumbs down, Brian spent the next five years doing what most actors in New York do. "I was working a bunch of different jobs and making money at acting

here and there. My acting income went up steadily each year but never enough to make a living at."

### Touchdown

Brian surrounds himself with a simply spectacular

cast. Jim Porterfield (Rolly Jones) and Purple Rose regular Wayne David Parker (Frank Harley) grab your attention from the first whistle and never let go. They play their parts as

If they've been playing them their whole life.

Rhiannon R. Ragland, a newcomer to the Purple Rose, is as spectacular as she is beautiful. If the program didn't say it, no one would believe she was making her professional acting debut.

The concept of the opening scene is brilliant - as is the execution. It's a difficult scene to pull off and even a bit risky, but this cast performs it flawlessly. The scene alone is worth the price of admission.

"When the Lights Come On" is a play about choices, priorities, family and love more than it is about running, passing and converting on third down. The subject might be football, but the message isn't about winning and losing. It's about the cost of winning and losing. It's about deciding not

only what you want to do with your life, but how you want to live that life.

And it's about what kind of person you want to truly be.

"Entertainment is very important, but if people don't walk out of here thinking a little bit then we didn't do our job," Brian says. "We have this singular

obsession in this country with winning. And sometimes that gets in our way more than it helps us."

There is a line in the play that really sums up Brian at this stage of his life: "Just enjoy where you are and not where you want to be."

In the end, Tommy is where he wants to be. And so is Brian.





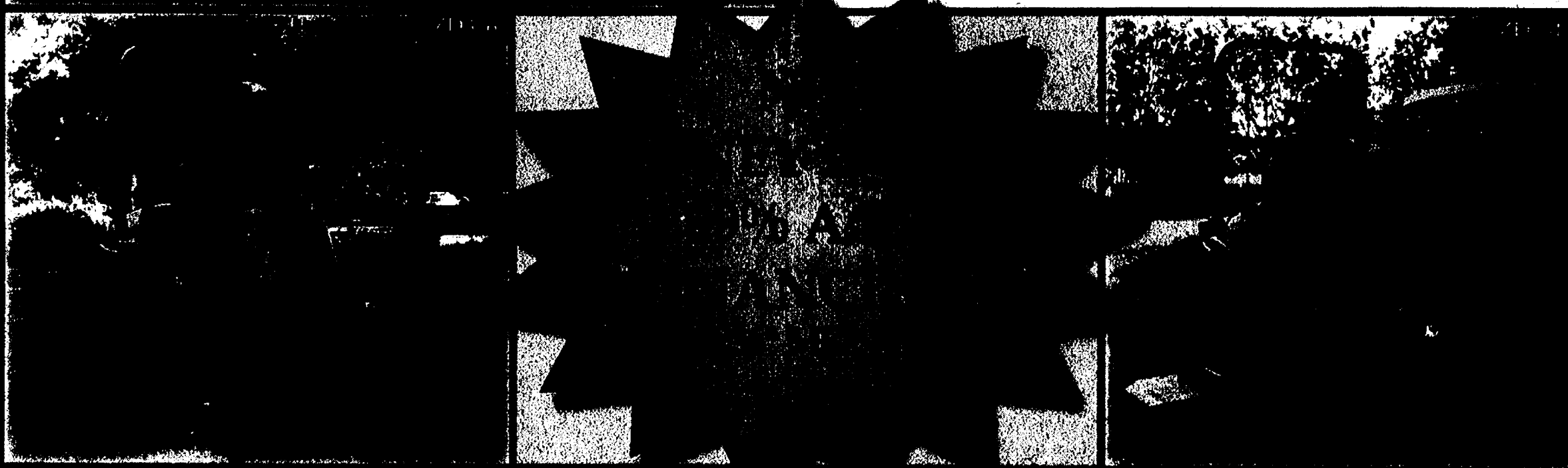

# Celebrate Teacher Appreciation Week

This is a wonderful opportunity to recognize and thank teachers for the role they play in the lives of children. Each teacher is an important part of our nation's educational system.

The origins of National Teacher Day are murky. Around 1944 Kansas teacher Mattye Whyte Woodbridge began corresponding with political and education leaders about the need for a national day to honor teachers. Woodbridge wrote to Eleanor Roosevelt, who in 1953 persuaded the 81st Congress to proclaim National Teacher Day.

Along with its origins in Kansas and Indiana state legislatures and the Dodge County (Kan.) Local, lobbying led Congress to create a national day celebrating teachers. Congress passed March 7, 1980, National Teacher Day that year only.

And its affiliates continued to observe National Teacher Day the first Tuesday in March until 1985, when the National Education Association established Teacher Appreciation Week as the first full week of May. The Representative Assembly then voted to make the Tuesday of that week National Teacher Day.

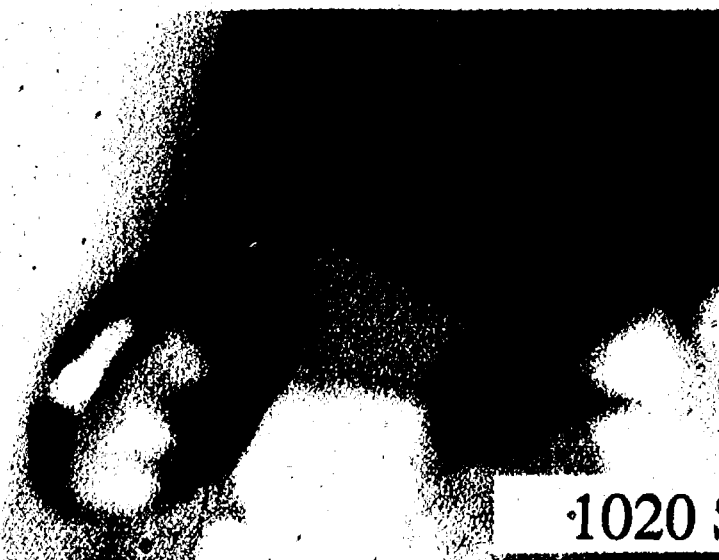

## Teachers who coach a special breed

They yell.  
They inspire.  
They strategize.  
They plan.  
And that's just in the classroom.

Teachers, who also double as coaches, are special individuals, indeed.

They spend most of their time at school, in their classrooms and either on the field, at the rink or in the gym. They have dedicated a large portion of their lives to their students.

And they wouldn't have it any other way.

"Coaching and teaching are very demanding professions, much more than most people can imagine, that require great commitment of time and energy, but the

opportunity to help young people develop as students, athletes and people can be a great reward," said Dexter's Randy Swoverland, who's doubled as a math teacher and boys' basketball coach for the past 31 years. "I have always enjoyed athletics and coaching/teaching allows me to remain in that arena."

"I love coaching," he said. "I love the thrill of competition. I love working with kids both inside and outside of the school setting. Anyone who says they can handle everything without it getting crazy is a miracle worker. I feel like I'm scrambling to survive all of the time. Dealing with teaching, coaching, church responsibilities, family responsibilities is so challenging."

Orlandi said being a

teacher and a coach are both quite similar.

"Coaching is similar to teaching in that organization and leadership are vital to the group's success," he said. "The major difference between the responsibilities is that the kids I coach are motivated to be out there with me so I have a more captive audience."

Jaime Dudash has been a Dexter teacher and Dreadnaught boys' cross country coach since 1998.

"It can be a challenge to effectively balance both assignments," he said. "It is important to remember that the primary commitment is to the students in your classroom. But for so many students it is the extra curriculum."

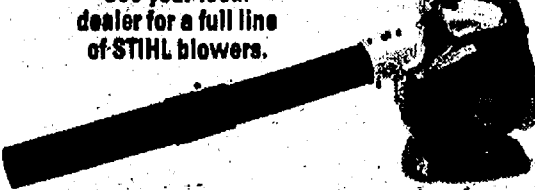

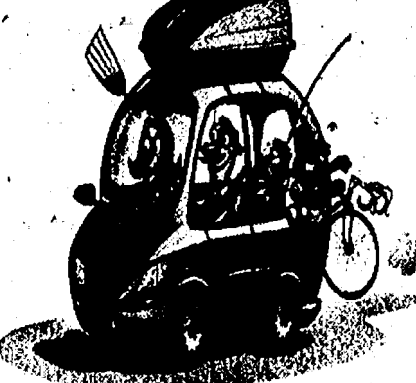

lars in life that can be the motivating factors to keep them excited about academics."

Dudash, who's led Dexter to five straight Division II boys' cross country state championships, said the key to being a successful teacher and coach is balance and perspective.

"I try to do as many things as I can that matter," he said. "And I've tried to learn how to leave some of the things that won't matter out. What I find the more I teach is that you actually become a better educator when you learn to balance the two."

Dexter Athletic Director John Robinson said having

teachers in the building that also coach is a benefit to his program.

"Absolutely," he said. "As a teacher you're better equipped to coach. They already know how to work with kids. Just because you were a good athlete, doesn't mean you can always teach someone. Also, the teacher/coach is more adept working with and communicating with parents."

"It's a benefit having the coach in the (school) building. They're able to see the athlete every day. Academic and discipline issues get addressed better. It's also much easier to communicate with a coach who's in the building."

Chelsea Athletic Director Wayne Welton said over 80 percent of Bulldog coaches

are also teachers.

"Our percentage of teacher/coaches is uniquely high in the state," he said. "I think that helps with our success. The coach sees the athlete in the hallways and in class. The athlete also knows the coach."

Dudash summed up the teacher/coach reward best.

"When that lightbulb goes on and a student begins to make that conscious decision to do well in school and give their best, or the athlete that presses through one threshold of pain to breakthrough and compete at the next level, it's tremendously rewarding," he said. "Few professions offer the opportunity to be a part of these magical moments in a young person's life."

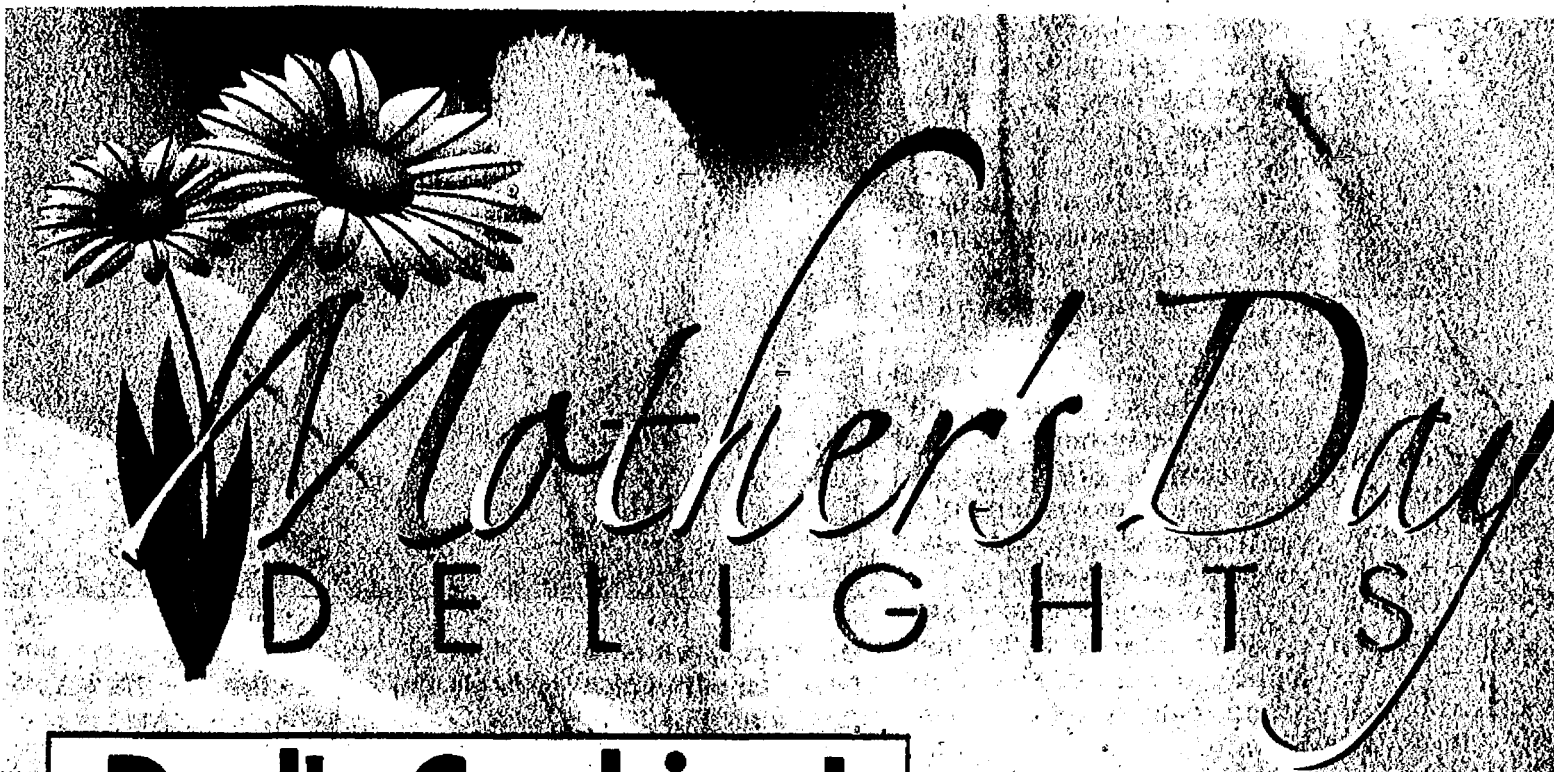

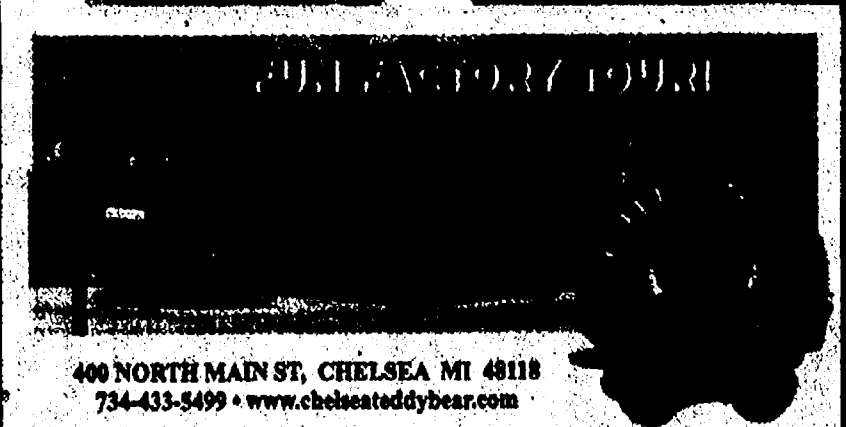

## Can you benefit from Municipal Bonds?

You've made it through another tax season. If you got a refund, you might be pretty satisfied with how things turned out. But if you'd like to see a somewhat different outcome in 2008, you may want to review all areas of your tax return, including your investment-related taxes.

As you may know, some investments are more "tax-friendly" than others are - and municipal bonds might be some of the friendliest ones of all.

If you aren't that familiar with municipal bonds, here are the basics: Municipal bonds, or "munis," are issued in two main categories: general obligation bonds and revenue bonds. General obligation bonds finance the activities of state and local governments, while revenue bonds pay for specific projects, such as airports, hospitals and other civic institutions.

So, when you purchase a muni, you're supporting a project or service, possibly in your state or community. And you will be rewarded for your civic-mindedness - through tax breaks. Specifically, your interest payments will be free from federal taxes; if the municipality that issues the bond is in your state, your interest payments also may be exempt from state and local taxes.

Municipal bond interest is free from federal taxes, but some munis - particularly airport and housing bonds - might be subject to the alternative minimum tax (AMT). If you think you may have to pay the AMT - and a lot more people are subject to this tax now than in years past - you might want to avoid these types of bonds.

Conversely, if you know you won't be assessed the AMT even if you bought some AMT-subject munis, you might be especially interested in these bonds, because their yields are typically higher than the yields on regular municipal bonds.

In any case, municipal bonds offer some benefits beyond tax-free interest. For one thing, munis can help you diversify a portfolio heavily weighted with stocks.

Municipal bonds may not be affected by many of the factors - such as poor corporate earnings reports - that cause volatility in the price of stocks. So, municipal bond prices generally do not

## Changing hands

New owner taking over Atkinson Chiropractic

After almost 30 years in business, a local chiropractic practice is in the process of changing hands.

Dr. Marc Kramer said he is working on the transition with Letha Atkinson, office manager of the practice and wife of original owner, Dr. Warren Atkinson, who passed away in 1998.

"I think Letha is ready to see this practice be doctor-owned again," Kramer said, noting that the Atkinsons opened the clinic in 1978.

Like most new owners, Kramer sees a few things he wants to change, and some he won't.

"One of my roles is to get this office more up to date, and I'm in the process of setting up a Web site," he said, "but I'm going to keep the Atkinson name."

The typical session costs \$45 to \$65, and the clinic accepts Medicare, Medicaid and most private health insurance plans.

Originally from Des Plaines, Ill., Kramer worked as a mental health profes-



sional and as a personal trainer before deciding on a career in chiropractic.

"As a trainer I met a lot of clients who saw chiropractors, and became curious about what they did," he said, and after four years of classes was licensed in December 2004.

He moved to Michigan last year with his wife and 2-year-old daughter, and was licensed to practice in the

state in January.

"My wife, Melia, is from Novi, and we came to Michigan to be closer to her family," Kramer said.

"When we heard of this opportunity in Chelsea my wife was very excited."

Kramer said mistaken ideas persist about the differences between chiropractors and medical doctors.

"Chiropractors have more anatomy training than M.D.s, and M.D.s have more pharmacology due to prescriptions," he said.

"One of the criticisms is that chiropractors aren't 'real doctors,' but we are licensed as doctors in all 50 states."

Kramer said he takes a "conservative approach" because everyone's medical condition is different, and there are times when intervention, medication or even surgery are necessary.

"The ones who come to see us don't want to go on medication, or they're already on it and want to get off them," he said.

"If I don't have to adjust an area, I won't."

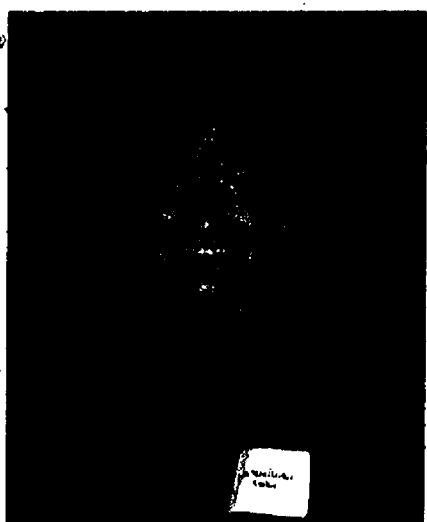
Chelsea children are in for a literary treat this month when the McKune Memorial Library hosts visits from two well-known children's authors.

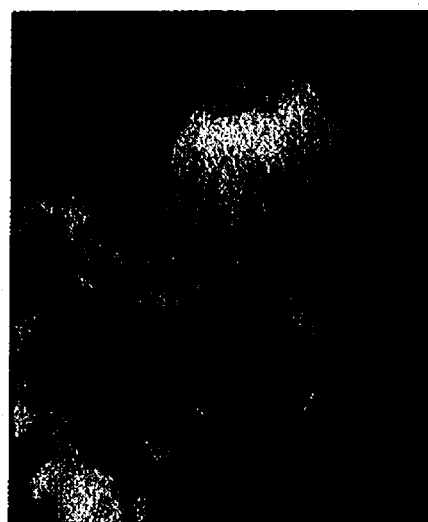
Stauffer's visit is set for 7 p.m. May 22 in the McKune Room of the library, located at 221 S. Main St. in Chelsea.

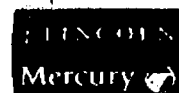

# Stop looking for excuses to get lazy

## Tips to sticking with a fitness plan

You start every year the same way - gung ho about a new fitness plan that will make you slim, trim and toned. But in just a few months, your enthusiasm fizzles and you're back to your old, inactive self.

It's common to "fall off the wagon" when you're trying to make a major change like getting active, quitting cigarettes or eating healthier. That's because it's easier and more comfortable to go back to the old, familiar way of doing things. But sticking with a healthy change is well worth the effort.

### Tips for sticking with it

**Face yourself.** If you go at it full guns, you'll burn out. Or you'll hurt yourself, get discouraged and quit. Prepare yourself for the long haul, start out gradually and build up by adding small challenges as you go along.

**Be flexible.** If your busy schedule means you can't manage a half-hour walk, break your workout into three, 10-minute walks. You'll be more likely to keep it up if you feel less pressured.

Track our progress. You can see how far you've come and motivate yourself to keep going by recording your progress with a log, chart or journal.

**Don't make excuses.** Make physical activity part of your regular routine, just like going to work or brushing your teeth. Set aside time to do it. If it's raining, have a routine you can do inside - walk at the mall or work out to an exercise video. On your business trip, do calisthenics and stretching exercises in your hotel room or take walks between meetings.

**Spice it up.** Make your routine more interesting by adding some lively music or a book on tape.

**Find daily opportunities for fitness.** Use your legs more and the elevator and car less. Rake your leaves, wash your car, walk your dog. Doing these things yourself will add small spurts of activity to your day but also keep being active front and center in your mind.

**Make a lifetime commitment.** Get married to fitness. Don't approach your routine as something you'll

do until you lose 20 pounds or flatten your stomach. Tell yourself that fitness is now a permanent part of your life. Quitting isn't an option.

**Remind yourself of the benefits of being fit.** Make a list and review it every time you start to lose your motivation.

**Remember that to stay fit, you have to stick with it.** You don't want to lose the benefits you've gained. And it doesn't take long. Within four weeks of stopping exercise, highly trained athletes are likely to suffer a quick decline in aerobic endurance. This decline, though more moderate, also occurs in the average exerciser, according to Richard Cotton, chief exercise physiologist at the American Council on Exercise. And muscle size will begin to decrease within less than four weeks of inactivity.

move together with stock prices.

Furthermore, municipal bonds are among the most secure investments you can own. The default rate on munis - especially general obligation bonds - is typically quite low.

Which types of municipal bonds are right for you? Your choice depends, to a great extent, on your goals and investment personality. For example, longer-term munis - those bonds that mature in 10 years or more - will generally pay a higher interest rate than shorter-term bonds. Yet, prices of the longer-term offerings also may fluctuate more.

You may want to consider owning a variety of short-, intermediate- and long-term munis. This type of portfolio - known as a bond "ladder" - can help you in all types of interest-rate environments. When market rates are down, you'll benefit by owning long-term bonds, which generally pay higher rates than short-term bonds. But if market rates are up, you can use the proceeds of your maturing short-term bonds to reinvest in issues with higher rates.

Finally, when you're shopping for municipal bonds, look for quality - those bonds that are rated at least "A" or higher by the major rating agencies.

Municipal bonds occupy their own special niche in the investment world - and it's a niche that you may want to explore further.

### Latest releases aimed at keeping kids active

Since its first success with "The Legend of Sleeping Bear" (official Children's Book of Michigan) in 1998, Sleeping Bear Press has impressed young readers, parents, teachers and booksellers with high-quality, beautifully illustrated picture books. #### "Lazy Days of Summer" By Judy Young Illustration by Kathy O'Malley

Parents will be instantly taken back to their childhood and kids will discover new ways to have fun with Judy Young's "Lazy Days of Summer."

You can almost hear the laughter and screams of joy as you turn the pages from jumping rope to hopscotch to tag to marbles to kick the can and so on. Parents can find great comfort in knowing that none of the games in the book have anything to do with Playstation or Nintendo or Game Cube. These games are about having fun and challenging oneself and allowing parents to share with their children many of the games and activities they grew up on.

And there are plenty of games to choose from (maybe capture the flag and Marco Polo will make the second volume) that even parents can join in on.

Each game begins with the same catchy rhyme. And even though

the rhyme is in cursive type and not easy for young kids to read, they catch on pretty quickly and will have it memorized by the third or fourth game.

Each game includes information on things such as the history, the rules and variations of how the game is played. It will make kids want to run right outside and start playing.

The chapters are designed in a similar way and include wonderful drawings of youngsters showing how it's done. The cliché of "a picture is worth a thousand words" couldn't be more true in "Lazy Days of Summer."

#### "S is for S'mores: A Camping Alphabet" By Helen Foster James Illustrated by Lita Judge

"S is for S'mores: A Camping Alphabet" is the perfect book for parents to snuggle up on the couch (or by the campfire) with their young children. It's an enjoyable hike through camping using the alphabet as a guide to adventure, beauty and knowledge.

Like all Sleeping Bear publications, the illustrations are striking and are sure to leave a lasting impression on readers both young and old. The color and uniqueness

to detail found in each picture helps create a feeling of innocence, companionship and nature.

Sleeping Bear has created a template for these style of books in which the reader begins and ends with the pictures. It's hard not to be captured by the pictures as soon as you turn the page. The illustrations alone would make a special book.

In "S is for S'mores: A Camping Alphabet," Helen Foster James provides some simple text that goes perfectly with each picture. For "W," she writes, "W is for camping in Winter for those who are willing to go and follow a path through the forest on snowshoes or skis over snow." For "F" she writes, "F is for Foliage with changing looks in every season (spring and summer, fall and winter). Would you like to know the reason?"

But Foster James, herself a veteran camper, doesn't stop there. Next to each picture is additional information that parents certainly will enjoy. Why limit the learning process to just the children?

"P" is for parks and Foster James goes into more detail on the subject. For example, readers will learn that "Acadia National Park was the first national park estab-

lished east of the Mississippi River. Banff National Park was Canada's first and the world's third national park. The United States has over 50 national parks."

Readers also learn information on campsites located in many of the national parks. And for the letter "S," Foster James provides a recipe for S'mores.

#### Other popular titles from Sleeping Bear Press

"My Momma Likes to Say," written by Denise Brennan-Nelson, is a story about how a child interprets statements said by his mother. From the author of "Buzzy the Bumblebee" comes a child's hilarious visual interpretation of such parental idioms and witticisms as "Hold your horses," "Money doesn't grow on trees" and "I have eyes in the back of my head."

Here is an example: "Cat got your tongue?" My momma likes to say. I'm not sure what she means but I like it anyway.

"Black Beauty's Early Days in the Meadow," by Jane Monroe Donovan, is one of the most popular animal stories of all time; Anna Sewall's "Black Beauty" was first published in 1877. Drawn from the original text and intended for even the youngest of horse lovers, "Black Beauty's Early Days in the Meadow" depicts the first few months of the horse's life as a foal frolicking in the meadow.

Monroe Donovan renders the classic story in lush oil paintings that convey a pastoral world of green fields and shady trees, while tenderly capturing the special love between mare and foal.

# Step back in time

## Architectural walking tour shows Chelsea's historical side

Guest teacher Grace Shackman brought her adult education class to Chelsea on April 23 for an architectural walking tour. The seven-week Washtenaw Community College course taught the "History of Washtenaw County." Classes convened in the main Gordon Hall parlor of former Judge Samuel Dexter, who was Dexter's founder and Washtenaw County's first judge.

Starting out in the Chelsea Train Depot, Grace's class learned about the Clock Tower, Glazier's Stove factory, Farmer Supply, Longworth Plating and Chelsea Milling. A walk down Main Street revealed many examples of commercial Italianate, Victorian and Romanesque brick buildings.

Grace, with input from local Chelsea architectural expert John Frank, pointed out brick buildings possessing elements like Chicago windows, dentils, corbelled arches, parapets and soldiered bricks.

Stopping at the Post Office erected in 1936, a WPA-funded standard government issue of the period, most went inside to find the symbolic "The Way of Life" mural. A few from Dexter saw the mural for the first time. Walking past Palmer Ford, Michigan's oldest car dealership, they stopped to look east on M-52 at a good example of a two-story Bungalow with Tudor exterior.

Turning onto Summit Street, a Dutch Colonial, once the home of dentist A. L. Steger, was seen. The roof has two bends for more head space. Across the street Fred Hoffman waved the group in to see an original 1913 interior and learn about early owners Dr. Woods and Ferd Merkel. Hoffman in turn found out his home was a Colonial Revival with the triangle roof designs and Greek influenced pillars on the front porch.

Walking west to the Center for the Arts, which was once Chelsea's St. Mary's Catholic School, Grace pointed out, "It was unusual for Catholics to have a school in a town the size of Chelsea."

The nuns convent and the priest rectory are now private dwellings. Local people remember the tall steeple dominating the landscape until the church burned. A few Victorian homes were noticed on Congdon Street, exteriors laden with gingerbread, ornamental towers and lath-turned porch railings.

Lately the buzz around town has been, "Have you seen what they are doing to the Glazier house?"

Grace's class walked up South Street to observe the Glazier mansion under final renovation. It was found by contractors that two Queen Anne houses were moved together to make one grand mansion. The wraparound front porch, corner turrets and deeply shadowed entrances are features of a Queen Anne.

A few houses past the Glazier home, at the corner of South and Main streets, is Frank Glazier's 1902 memorial bank for his father, George. The Beaux Arts Classical is now the 14th District Courthouse. After looking closely at the cut rock-faced exterior with limestone pillars and terra cotta roof, students were able to walk inside to admire the domed ceiling and other wood and marble features in the court rooms.

In the first block of E. Middle Street, local professionals built large homes in the late 1800s. Dr. Avery's home near the Congregational Church is "eclectic" with 18 porch columns. Senator Frank Gorman's Queen Anne house is now "Chelsea House" bed and breakfast. A "twin" to Gorman's built by Dr. Palmer is just three doors down.

Another twin set in the same block are Greek Revivals on opposite sides of the street.

Viewed from the side yard of John Frank's "Palmer House" are the last vestiges of life with wells and no sewer system - a windmill and an outhouse which may be the last ones left within the City of Chelsea. The closed in windmill tower served as an attached Summer "sleeping porch" according to the Frank's neighbors.

Around the corner on East Street is a Claire Allen 1907 Arts and Crafts home. Frank explained its streamlined diversity from the Victorian era.

"It is set back from the road," he said.

"There is no front porch and no front door. Main entrance is on the side porch, another porch is built on the back."

Two doors down is a fine example of a Sears Catalog Home with a rock-faced concrete block exterior. All the materials were shipped for customer assembly first by rail-

road, then by truck.

The tour ended admiring the Romanesque structure of the Methodist Church with its cut rock, stepped parapets and recent matching additions. Grace talked about the old Princess and Sylvan theaters and the Boyd Hotel. It was a short walk back to the depot.

## Is there a Sea in your life?

The Bible uses the word "sea" in a number of contexts.

In the vast majority of cases it is used in its literal sense, referring to a great body of water. In Luke 21:25 Jesus predicts that the roaring and tossing of the sea will throw nations into turmoil in the last days. Revelation 13:1-2 refers to the sea as the origin of anti-Christian forces.

One interesting reference is in Revelation 21:1, the first verse of the second last chapter in the Bible, where St. John begins his description of eternity. One thing John notices in his vision is, "There was no longer any sea."

This undoubtedly had

special significance for John and his readers. St. John, when he received his Revelation, had been exiled on the small, lonely island of Patmos off the coast of what is now Turkey. He was separated from those he loved - his friends and his fellow Christians. Although the island wasn't far from the coast, the sea served as an effective barrier. It's quite likely that he and his beloved readers found great comfort in knowing that there would come a time, in the next life, when there would be no more separation, no more parting.

"There was no longer any sea."

The sea is still a great obstacle. My wife and I have

been, to Europe twice, and hope to make that three times soon, since, as of this month, we have a son living there. The trip would be so much more pleasant, though, if we didn't have

## Superior Ford

Dealership's loyal customer base, new products keep sales healthy

**FLAT ROCK** — Many dealerships promise great customer service, but Superior Ford lives up to its name every day with superior service, according to General Manager Dan Miller.

"Everybody promises the golden rule, everybody says it and everybody quotes it, but if you really want to experience it, come to Superior Ford," Miller said. "We treat everybody like family, and as a result we have as many friends as we do customers."

"Everything about this operation is straight forward. We cater to our customers on a personal level. We're large enough to have all the state-of-the-art equipment to service your car, but small enough to give our customers personal service."

The dealership, which opened in 1994, is conveniently located just off I-75 at 22675 Gibraltar Road, just south of the AutoAlliance International plant.

That proximity to the home of the Ford Mustang certainly helps, but it's the dealership's loyal customer base that has helped it thrive in a tough economic climate, according to Miller.

"We sold cars to customers from 80 different cities last year, and 99 per-

cent of those sales were from referrals, because I don't advertise in 80 different cities," Miller said. "Our success is due to the fact that we have one of the largest, loyal customer bases around."

Miller said that, according to industry reports, most dealerships have a customer loyalty base of about 40 percent. However, he said Superior Ford's loyalty base is almost 70 percent.

"I think that is a result of having very little turnover amongst our employees, which I think is an indication that this is a pretty good place to work," Miller said. "So we must have pretty

good people, and the fact that customers are coming back again and again must be an indication of how well they are being treated. We've been holding our own here thanks to those returning customers, so we must be doing something right."

Superior Ford, which is situated on nine acres, typically has 400 to 500 new vehicles in stock and about 50 used cars. The dealership employs 50 people, including 10 sales representatives, eight of whom have been with Superior Ford since it opened in 1994.

"The key to our success is our customer base keeps coming back and we get a

tremendous amount of referral business," Miller said. "To have somebody recommend you to their friends and family, you have to treat them pretty well and you have to have some familiar faces in your sales department."

Three key ingredients to Superior Ford's winning recipe are price, product and service, according to Miller.

"To make a sale, you have to have a great price, you have to have a great product and you have to provide great service and we have all of those things here at Superior Ford," Miller said. "Face it, if you don't have

those three things, customers won't come back."

Miller said the dealership still sells a lot of Ford F-150 pickup trucks, but more customers are gravitating toward cars and crossover vehicles. In fact, the Ford Edge and the Ford Fusion have been the dealership's best sellers lately.

"Though we know the truck market is still strong, we're seeing more and more people moving to crossovers and cars," he said. "The truck will never be replaced, because people need trucks."

"But the Ford Fusion has more conquest sales than any other vehicle we've seen

in the last two or three years. In other words, the Fusion is not just selling to Ford owners, but we're seeing people trade in other brands to get a Fusion, and that's exciting."

Miller also is excited about the local economy showing signs of a turnaround, which translates into more customers looking for new cars.

"With all of the different possible layoffs, rumors of plant closings, buyouts, retirement packages, there were a lot of people that did not know where they were going to be in the future and they pulled in their spending," Miller added. "Now that everybody knows where their future is going to be and where they are going to be working, there definitely is a stronger feel that those people are coming back into the marketplace."

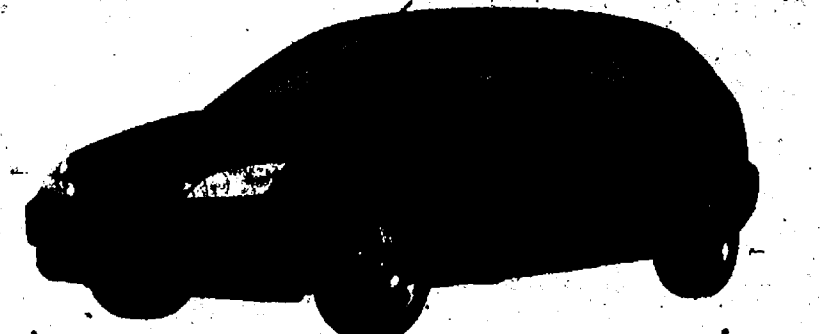
"There's been a little more traffic and more people buying cars. I think it's an indication that things are turning around."
