SPECIAL REPORT: SCHOOL BUS SAFETY

Drivers delivering precious cargo

When it comes to student transportation, parents often have to juggle a great many mixed feelings.

There's the pride and anxiety on the first morning a tiny kindergartner climbs on to that enormous yellow bus all alone; righteous anger when a child comes home crying because another kid was mean at the bus stop; and confusion regarding the lack of seatbelts on the bus despite strict enforcement of such restraints in the family car.

And, at the very worst, there's the apprehension on hearing the tragic news about a child killed in a school bus accident.

Local school transportation officials were eager to put parents' minds at

ease about these and other questions, and explain just how safe our children are on school buses.

History of school busing

Student transportation began in the late 1800s, but it was not universally available. Students in rural areas rode to school in horse-drawn carts that were loaned by local farmers.

Once gas-powered vehicles were invented, trucks became the preferred method of student transportation.

The modern school bus industry appeared in the 1920s and '30s as the nation's roadways expanded.

With the increased amount of traffic, several serious disasters involving school buses led to the development of

the first safety standards in 1939.

This was followed by the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act of 1966 and the School Bus Safety Amendments of 1974.

According to the National Association of State Directors of Pupil Transportation Services, school buses are now required to meet or exceed all federal safety standards for any vehicle, in addition to many that are specific to school buses.

The school bus itself

Transportation administrators, drivers, and mechanics all agree on one thing: the school bus is the safest way

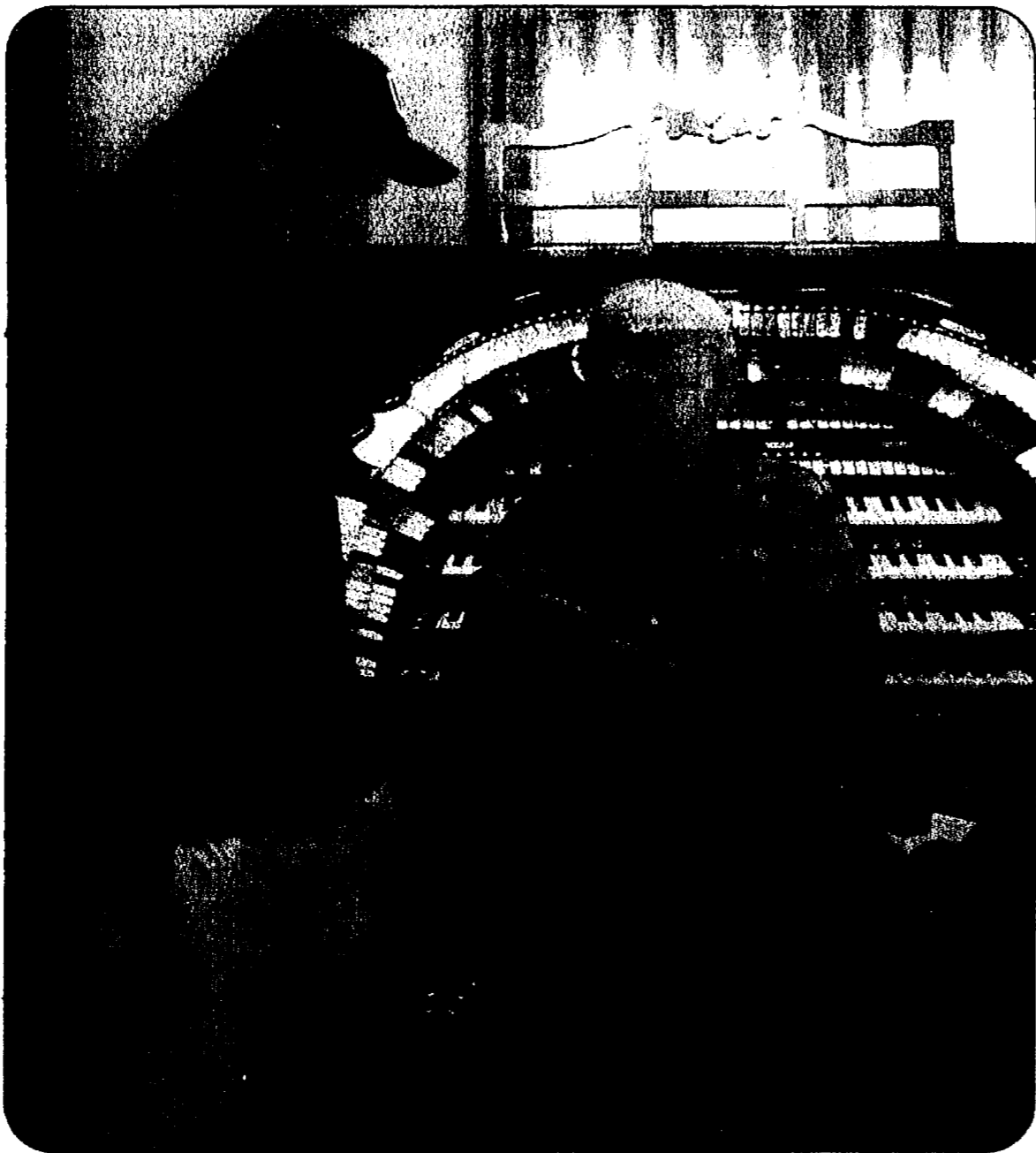

But Rupert felt what Donny did deserved more than a quick pat on the back. Rupert spent 51 years of his life as a teacher and administrator in public schools and he knows all too well how good kids can be. Still, he was impressed with how Donny responded to his misstep outside the Big Boy.

So Rupert wrote a letter to the school "officially" thanking Donny and the Chelsea baseball team.

"I didn't hear about this until we got back from Florida," said varsity baseball coach Wayne Welton. "None of the players ever

Young Beach scientists finish in the top half at state Science Olympiad

Following a third-place finish at a regional science competition in March, teams from Beach Middle School finished in the top half of the state finals on Saturday.

Beach made its third consecutive appearance at the state finals, which took place at Michigan State University.

The bright spot for Beach was the team of Sarah Conrad and Zoe Proegler, who repeated their second-place finish in the regionals with their food science project.

"We're simulating the

aging of a sliced apple," said Sarah, and Zoe explained that they used hydrogen peroxide and iodine to speed up the familiar browning and puckering of the apple flesh.

"Seventh grader Zoe Proegler and ninth grader Sarah Conrad won a silver medal for their outstanding performance in the Food Science Event," said Science teacher Dave Polley, head coach of the Beach Olympians.

"Coach Christine Forsch is quite pleased."

More than 40 events that took place in various locations on campus, including

Ottoman pleads guilty to federal charges

Dexter Township Trustee Marcia Ottoman, 44, pleaded guilty Tuesday to impersonating a federal prosecutor and wire fraud. U.S. Attorney Stephen J. Murphy announced.

Andrew G. Arena, FBI Special Agent in Charge, joined Murphy in Tuesday's announcement.

Ottoman was indicted by a federal grand jury on May 9, 2007.

The indictment charged that between Oct. 11 and Dec. 18, 2006, Ottoman created false documentation pretending to be Assistant U.S. Attorney Christopher Varner, a federal prosecutor in Detroit; and demanded control of real estate that belonged to her in-laws.

The indictment also charged Ottoman with fraudulently using e-mail messages to further her scheme.

Ottoman admitted her guilt at the plea hearing.

The indictment followed a criminal complaint filed against Ottoman on April 9, 2007.

The complaint alleged

Chelsea Rentals throws itself a party

The big party tent is up, just waiting for the big party to begin.

And that will happen Saturday, when Chelsea Party & Project Rentals opens up its one-year anniversary celebration to the public.

The event will take place from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. at 20401 Old US-12, just west of the Chelsea Fairgrounds.

The location will be hard to miss, though, with the massive white tent, the huge inflatable moonwalk, and the array of other equipment that owner Chris Livengood offers to the public.

Discount specials, food and door prizes will be available throughout the day. Visitors will be able to sample concession and food items prepared with rental equipment and view a variety of product demonstrations.

Chelsea Party & Project Rentals opened its doors in early May 2007, becoming Western Washtenaw and Eastern Jackson County's only full-service rental store.

Livengood said she opened the business to offer the community an option to having to drive to full-service rental stores in Ann Arbor or Jackson.

Besides, she already had the beginnings of her inventory on hand. She said she had a big party coming up, but had waited too long to rent a tent and had to buy a couple of them.

In addition, her middle son had been developing a landscape business when he was permanently disabled

in a freak accident.

"So here was his big barn and all this equipment, and I thought, 'I should start a rental store,'" Livengood said.

"I started researching and visited other stores, and found there wasn't one in Chelsea."

You can find a place to rent party supplies and a place to rent equipment, but none put the two together — until last May.

"This is the first complete rental store, we incorporated our son's equipment," she said.

"Business is great."

Livengood estimated that 60 percent of her business is party rental, which is just entering its busy season.

But her business plan also included a way to get her through the winter.

"Winter is a little slow, but we knew that going into it; that's why we're a dealer for Harman stoves," she said.

"The pellet stoves have been a great sell this winter."

That steady cash flow is important to pay down the enormous investment she

that Ottoman created an e-mail account in Varner's name and also authored a letter in Varner's name on forged U.S. Department of Justice letterhead.

Ottoman utilized e-mails and the letter to attempt to evict tenants from a Dexter Township home rented from her husband's parents, apparently so Ottoman and her husband could move in.

"Impersonating a federal official for the purpose of corruptly influencing another to give up property rights is a serious crime," Murphy said in his announcement.

"Such conduct can not only harm the victim, but also undermine the general public's trust in the integrity of public officials."

Wire fraud is punishable by up to 20 years in prison; impersonating a federal official is punishable by up to three years in prison. Each crime carries a maximum possible fine of \$250,000.

Sentencing is set for 1:30

p.m. July 14 before Judge Julian Abele Cook.

Attempts to reach Ottoman for comment on Tuesday were unsuccessful.

Her telephone number as listed on the township's Web site was "temporarily disconnected at the customer's request."

When contacted by cell phone she refused comment and hung up.

With the guilty plea, Ottoman's future on the township board remains unclear. "I'm not sure what that means; we are looking into it with the Michigan Townships Association," said Dexter Township Supervisor Pat Kelly.

Because the federal charges were unrelated to her actions as a township trustee, the governor would have to remove Ottoman from office, Kelly said.

"With a conviction on a felony, the governor would have to remove her; the board has no power to do that," Kelly said. "Should we as a board ask her to resign? We don't know."

Ottoman's term on the board expires on Nov. 20 this year.

EMU Women's Golf Team Runner-up at MAC Championship Eagles' led by Stephany Fleet

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. - For the second consecutive season, the Eastern Michigan University women's golf team equaled the school's best finish with a runner-up spot at the Mid-American Conference Women's Golf Championship Sunday afternoon, April 27, here at The Brickyard Crossing. The Eagles carded a three-day total of 1,228 (310-317-305-296) as Kent State rolled to its 10th consecutive championship with a 72-hole total of 1,177 (297-297-303-280).

EMU's second-place finish equaled the mark set by the 2003 and the 2007 squads. In 2003, the Green and White recorded a 925 at Walden Ponds Golf Course in Hamilton, Ohio. Meanwhile, the 2007 team posted a 1,252 at Longaberger Golf Club in Nashport, Ohio.


Individually, EMU junior Stephany Fleet (Dewitt, Mich.-Dewitt) finished in sixth place with a 302 (78-78-77-69) while senior Catherine Fortin (Beauveville, Canada-Polyvalente St. Francois) tied for seventh with a 304 (75-80-75-74). For their efforts throughout the season, Fortin was named to the All-MAC first team while Fleet garnered second team All-MAC honors.

Kent State's Kirby Dreher led from wire-to-wire to claim medalist honors with a seven-over par total of 291 (74-74-74-69). Dreher was followed by teammate Tara Delaney (74-75-75-70=294). Dreher's victory marked the ninth time in the 10-year history of the event a KSU player has won the individual title.


Conditions were near perfect as players enjoyed temperatures in the low-60s and light winds. Kent State shot 33-over par through the first 54 holes and followed that up by turning in an eight-under par performance in the final round. Toledo (1,232) placed third and Western Michigan finished fourth (1,272), while Ball State (1,277), Ohio (1,297), Northern Illinois (1,308) and Bowling Green (1,310) rounded out the team scores.

For the tournament, all five Eagles ranked in the top 25 including junior Courtney Aili (Chelsea, Mich.-Chelsea) who was ninth with a 308 (80-77-75-76). Freshman Darby Peters (Lake Orion, Mich.-Lake Orion) tied for 13th with a 314 (77-82-78-77) while sophomore Marjorie Thuot (Joliette, Quebec-Therese-Martin) rounded out the lineup with a 322 (81-83-79-79) to sit in a tie for 23rd place.

The affable legislator is an old high school journalist. When the kids at Battle Creek Lakeview High marched out in protest in 1968, Jones watched, but did not participate. Instead he and a pal invented a student underground newspaper that allowed kids to express themselves.

So Jones has a well-developed nose for news, which has produced stories on giving homeowners the right to shoot someone who is about to harm them. And under his "Castle Doctrine," homeowners could not be prosecuted. The story scored with national coverage.

Jones took on what he termed "crazy protesters" from out of state who disrupted a funeral for a local soldier. He got a bill to keep them 500 feet away in the future.

Remember during the last election cycle when politicians made those awful robot telephone calls just around dinnertime? Jones wants to ban them. He got flak from both political parties on that one.

And on and on it goes. Jones would permit concealed weapons permits for Taser gun owners; he outlawed machines that turned booze into vapor. College kids, when they are not rioting, love to get high on the "party fun time devices," as Jones puts it.

Some of his media ventures grabbed headlines, but that's all. Long after the state approved construction of a new state police headquarters, he was demanding a halt to the project. It was a waste of breath.

He joined two other colleagues and called for a roll-back of the recently enacted state income tax hike. He got the story in the paper, but his breath was wasted again.

Jones became the first lawmaker to utter something unkind about the embattled mayor of Detroit — nothing like kicking a guy when he's down. Jones complained about state revenue sharing bucks somehow finding their way into city coffers at a time when Kwame Kilpatrick spent almost \$9 million on a legal settlement with whistle-blower cops.

Despite some setbacks, Jones has gained a reputation with his colleagues. One of them confessed the other day, "Now I co-sponsor every bill that he introduces, even without reading the bill."

So how does he come up with all these tasty news morsels?

He heads to the local coffee shop every day and listens, and often somebody will ask: "Are you running for governor? We need someone with common sense."

Instead of the label "publicity hound," Jones says he is just keeping the public informed and promises always to cooperate with the media. With his track record, why quit now?

As for being Gov. Jones someday, it's not likely, but Sen. Jones might be next. Stop the presses!

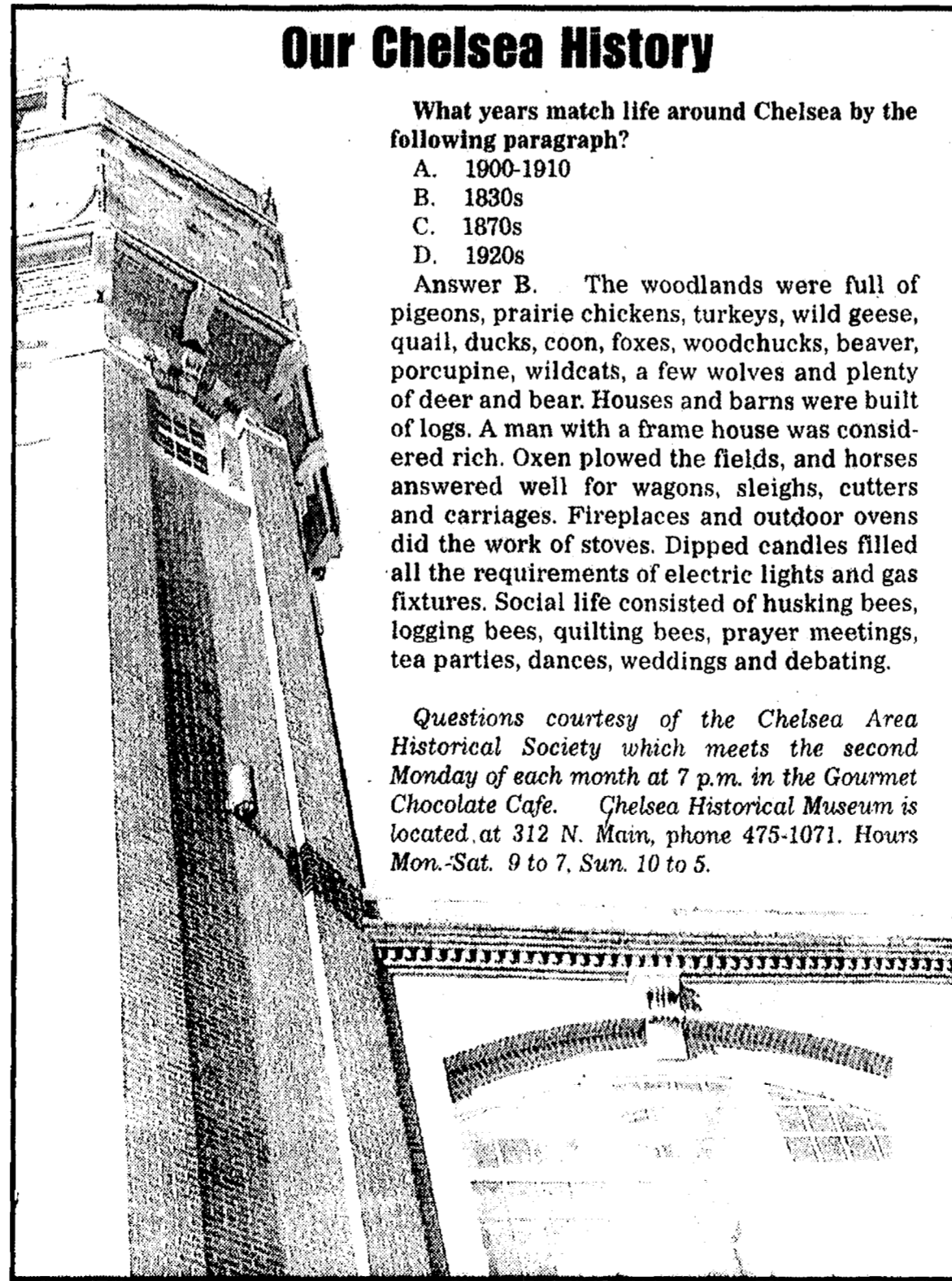

Answer B. The woodlands were full of pigeons, prairie chickens, turkeys, wild geese, quail, ducks, coon, foxes, woodchucks, beaver, porcupine, wildcats, a few wolves and plenty of deer and bear. Houses and barns were built of logs. A man with a frame house was considered rich. Oxen plowed the fields, and horses answered well for wagons, sleighs, cutters and carriages. Fireplaces and outdoor ovens did the work of stoves. Dipped candles filled all the requirements of electric lights and gas fixtures. Social life consisted of husking bees, logging bees, quilting bees, prayer meetings, tea parties, dances, weddings and debating.

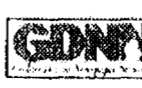

Chemistry of Food, Balloon Launch Glider, Robocross Challenge, and Scrambler.

"I am very proud of this team," said Polley. "They worked very hard. We dominated the Regionals and went on to face the best in the state."

Beach was among 48 middle schools and junior high schools across the state that advanced from regional competitions in February and March that drew hundreds of teams.

Events included experiments in life science, earth science, physical science, health science and technology.

"We have excellent quality students and excellent coaches," Polley said.

"We had more assistance from the community than ever this year. This is the best team Beach has ever had."

Beach competed in 23 events, some of which were more technology-based than purely science.

"Clearly a lot of the Olympians in the tech events are going to be engineers — you can already spot it in them," Polley said.

One of the tech events will actually provide a training ground for the robotics team at the high school level.

The "Robocross" team of seventh-graders Sam Christie and Shane McGrath took first place at the regionals with their unique design.

The challenge was to design a device to start in one corner of a tabletop playing field, pick up objects of varying sizes and weights in another corner, and drop them into a small plastic coffee can "goal" in the opposite corner.

The objects consisted of four ping pong balls, four Lego blocks, four D-cell batteries and a tennis ball.

A time limit of three minutes adds to the challenge.

With the help of adult advisers and some spare parts from the Chelsea High School robotics team, Sam and Shane looked at the problem from a completely different angle.

Instead of taking the objects to the goal, their robot picks up the goal and brings it to the objects.

"The robot chassis evolved from a remote-control truck," said team coach Sam Guysky.

Brian McGrath, the other coach and Shane's father, said the design resulted from a lot of brainstorming.

"This was idea No. 200," he said. "We had some stuff that was just off the charts, and ended up with 20 to 50 that we thought could work."

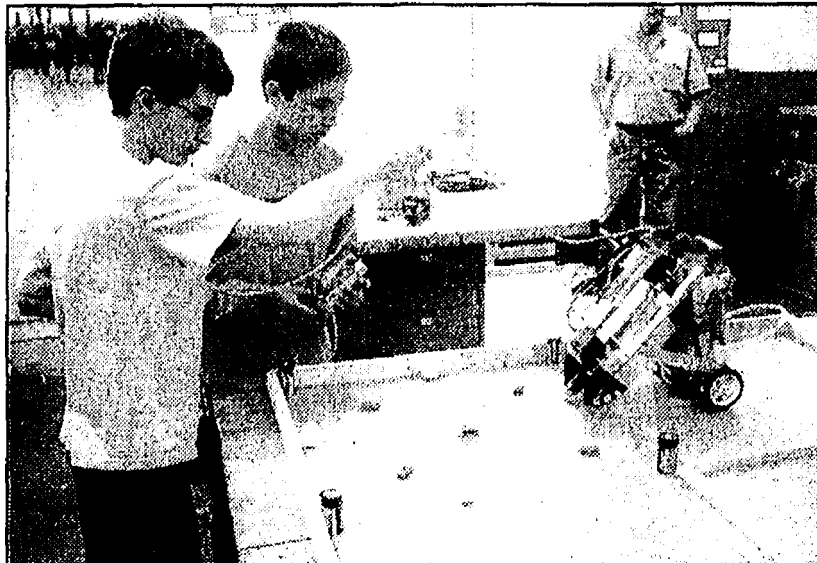
Unfortunately, the stellar showing at the regionals became a distant memory when a malfunction at the state event stalled their momentum.

"They knocked over the can in the first five seconds and never could get it going," Polley said. "Welcome to the world of engineering."

Dems making 'judgements'

Growing concerns over the Michigan Supreme Court and its "out of touch" Chief Justice Cliff Taylor, was the topic of a presentation by Ann Arbor attorney Mark Bernstein at last Wednesday's monthly meeting of the Western Washtenaw Democrats in Dexter.

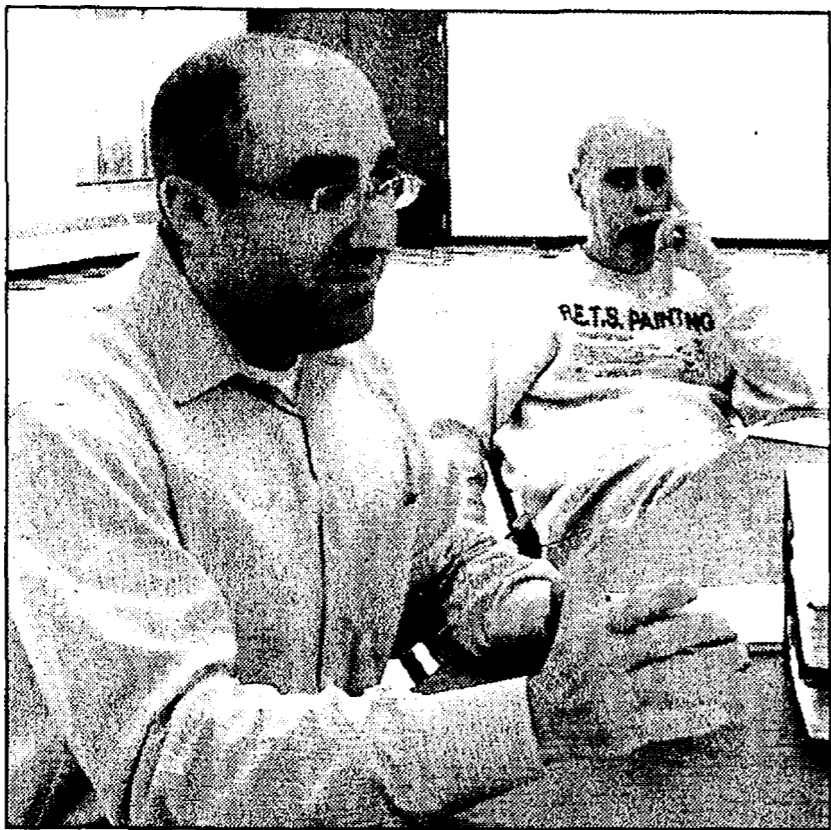
Bernstein cited several questionable rulings by the court and some that he labeled "ridiculous" that were causing a new wave of apprehension in the state's legal community. Bernstein, who currently serves on the Executive Board for the Michigan Association for Justice, said the court has been handing down "remarkable decisions, unhinged from precedent and historic jurisprudence."

"With many of these decisions, our court is so far out of where its sister courts are in the Great Lakes," Bernstein said.

As an example, Bernstein cited one of the many cases where the current court reinterpreted the long-standing legal definition regarding statutes of limitation. He spoke of a sexual harassment case that was thrown out of court because where the statute previously had begun at the time the complaint was filed, it was rewritten by this court to start whenever the first instance of harassment was initiated. This and numerous statute reinterpretations have affected hundreds of Michigan citizens.

"And this is at odds with every other of our neighboring states," he said. "The court seems to find a way to actually go beyond the law when it suits its benefactors - business and property interests."

Bernstein, who was the White House Director for

Press Pool operations during the Clinton Administration, said the Michigan Supreme Court, and its Chief Justice Cliff Taylor in particular, has rarely ruled in favor of the average citizen.

"I'm quite sure the Michigan Chamber of Commerce will spend whatever it takes to keep Cliff Taylor sitting on the bench," he said. "There needs to be a serious effort to replace him."

Bernstein concluded his comments with some observations on the role of regents at the University of Michigan. He has announced he is seeking the nomination to run for a seat on the U-M Board of Regents.

Fran Brennan, 7th District Director for the Justice Caucus, echoed Bernstein's comments about Justice Taylor and the state of the Michigan

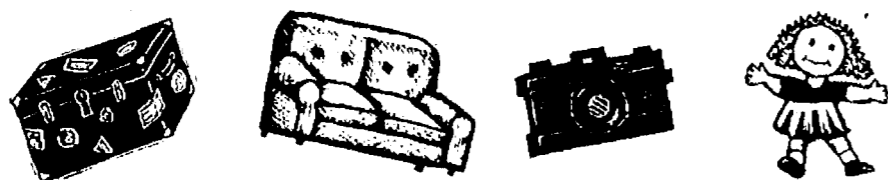

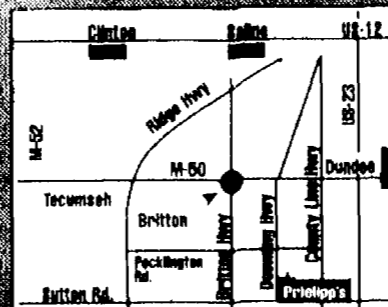

Government: Roundup**Walberg offers 'no more excuses' act**

The United States Department of Commerce recently announced that the U.S. trade deficit increased by \$4.1 billion between February 2007 and February 2008. Why is our country facing a rising trade deficit even though American-made exports grew by 12 percent in 2007?

"The number one reason for the growing trade deficit is our dependence on foreign energy, and this is why we need to provide incentives to increase America's investment in alternative energy and overall production of energy," says U.S. Representative Tim Walberg, R-District 7.

"The United States imports around 12 million barrels of oil a day, and a barrel of oil has gone from \$70 to \$120 over the last year, dramatically increasing our trade deficit. Our reliance on imported oil and increased oil prices means we are sending even more money to foreign countries, many of whom do not share our interests."

For both economic and national security purposes, Walberg believes Congress needs to finally get serious about an energy plan that truly lowers prices at the pump, reduces our dependence on foreign oil and makes real progress towards

energy independence.

"Instead of increasing our dependence on OPEC, America needs to return energy production to the United States," he said. "Doing so will create American jobs and provide needed economic stability."

Walberg has co-sponsored legislation to provide incentives for solar, wind, cellulose ethanol, bio-diesel and other green alternatives.

"We must increase domestic energy production through carbon-free nuclear power and clean-coal technology," he said. "I am also co-sponsoring legislation that would encourage conservation with tax credits for green buildings and legislation that would spark a revolution in clean hydrogen technology. While some in Congress want to rely more on OPEC for America's energy needs, I firmly believe we must increase American energy production."

Walberg recently co-sponsored H.R. 3089, the No More Excuses Energy Act.

Walberg believes the act would impact the price at the pump, lower electric bills, encourage the construction of new refineries, boost alternative energy development by extending the Wind Production Tax Credit for 10 years, increase American oil production by

allowing environmentally sound drilling in Alaska, the Outer Continental Shelf and the Gulf of Mexico and help increase our supply of electricity by encouraging the construction of new nuclear power plants.

Protecting privacy

Residents who participated in Michigan's Jan. 15 presidential primary won't have their political party preferences revealed thanks to Secretary of State Terri Lynn Land's commitment to voter privacy.

Land is refusing to release information regarding which partisan ballot each voter selected in the Jan. 15 election. Public Act 52 of 2007, which set the Jan. 15 election date, required the Secretary of State to provide Michigan's Democratic and Republican parties with a list showing voters' party preferences. Voters had to request a Democratic or Republican ballot to vote for presidential candidates.

"The purpose of the Freedom of Information Act is to provide the public with insight on the inner-workings of government," said Land, who based her decision on a recent court ruling. "A voter's political preference is strictly his or her own business."

Supreme Court. She said Taylor's many unfair decisions ignore long-standing judicial precedents and statutes.

Brennan cited several reasons why Taylor is being targeted: the court nearly always favors insurance companies. It favors large corporations over victims of consumer fraud, workplace

injuries, health care malpractice and accidents. It refuses to allow citizens to enforce Michigan's environmental laws against major polluters. It allows foreign corporations to "steal" Michigan's most valuable natural resource, its water. It denies remedies to victims of discrimination and sexual harassment, and, in some instances, denies an accused due process of law in criminal cases.

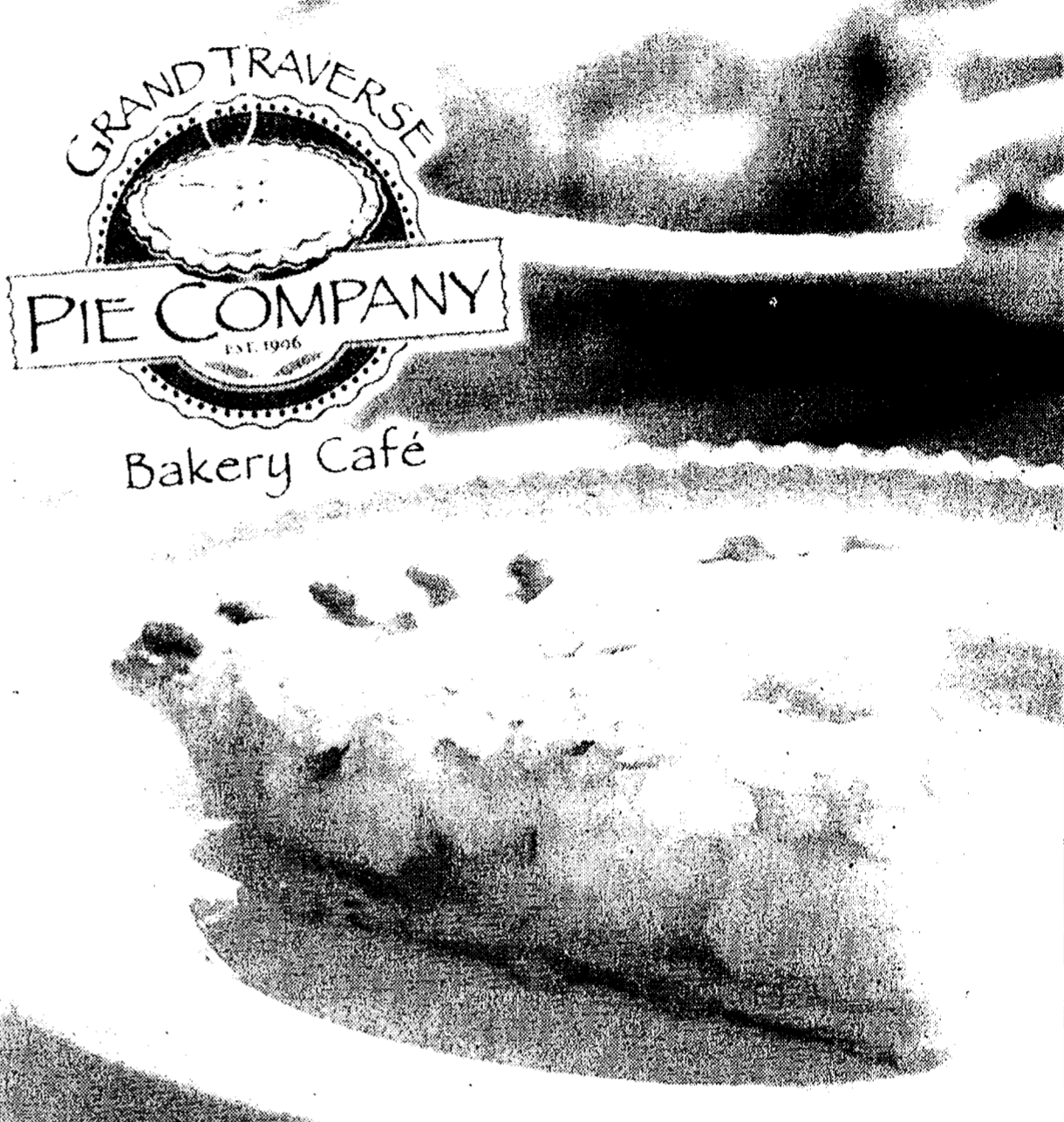

Cancer Declassified

Be prepared for an honest response

At the request of a reader, I am going to return to the topic of approaching and relating to cancer patients and their families. Simply asking an acquaintance or a friend how they are doing can be a complicated task when you consider the multitude of personalities and the fact that very often you want to respond, "Devastated!"

It's a good idea for caring individuals to consider the environment and activity when approaching a cancer patient or their caregivers. Speaking loudly in the aisle of a crowded local store is not the appropriate time or place to ask questions. Use your regular voice or a calm, quiet voice, although not hushed so as to imply that something is shameful.

Although I tend to feel better by talking about cancer, not everyone is like me. Take clues from the individual. Do they change the subject or welcome the topic? I believe that most people will appreciate being asked how they are doing, but there are also times when we have to take a break from thinking or talking about cancer so we don't overload.

Sometimes the person asking the cancer patient how he or she is doing isn't prepared for the answer. My advice is to be sure that you are willing to listen to words of despair when bringing up the topic. If you hope to hear a canned response or are emotionally unable to let, "I am so sad I can hardly move" sink in,

then it's best not to ask. Don't rattle off a list of all the people who you know who died from cancer. I can appreciate the camaraderie that cancer often creates, but leave the list at home. Try to stay in the here and now, rather than bring the conversation around to all of your own histories, unless they are somehow positive and relevant.

Some of the worst questions I was asked were, "What's the prognosis?" and "What are your chances?" Even if I had wanted to entertain such questions, I was usually asked in the middle of an event or when surrounded by children.

If I take the time to tell you that I have cancer, that action implies that I find you important and am interested in your support. It could signify warm feelings that I have for you, or it could be one of those moods when I feel the need to shout it from the mountaintops. Take it as a compliment, but not necessarily an obligation to cook me dinner or drive me to the hospital.

There are people who I chose not to tell of my cancer diagnosis. Perhaps they had their own burdens at the time and I didn't want to add to their stress. There are also individuals who have never been supportive and who I knew would be unmoved by the news.

I see no point in sharing such an important piece of personal information with self-centered or uncaring people. My body language and short response always made it clear when I was unwilling to talk about the disease. A cancer diagnosis is not the time to make issues or deal with old issues, as it adds more stress.

My husband knows a person who said not one word when I

was diagnosed with cancer. Although he knew of the diagnosis, he made no attempt to mention it, let alone provide any help. This is fine, of course, except for the fact that a few months later, he was diagnosed with a different form of cancer.


That person immediately came to my husband, asking non-stop questions about cancer, procedures, statistics, tests and fears. It's easy to understand why the individual was in a panicky state and seeking information. My husband gladly offered as much support and information about cancer as he could.

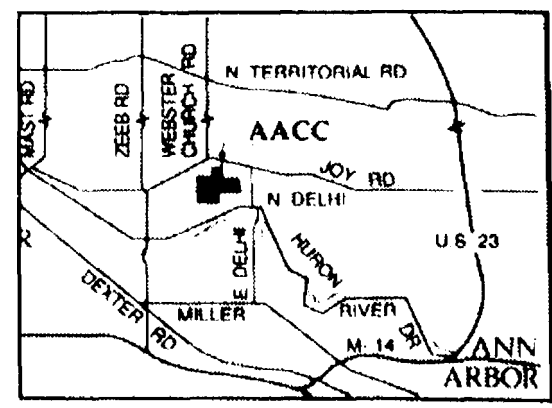

to transport a child. School buses afford a great deal of protection by size and weight alone.

Jim Zenz, the Chelsea School District's head mechanic, confirmed that a bus is built on a truck chassis and a bus body mounted on a frame of two I-beams.

The framing elements are made with heavy-gauge steel collision beams covered by heavy-gauge steel plates and set higher than most other vehicles on the road.

CSD mechanic Bob Ryan explained that instead of seat belts, students are protected by "compartmentalization," a passive restraint system.

This compartment is made by closely placed seats with energy-absorbent padding provided by the seat and back cushions.

According to the School Bus Information Council, school buses have additional safety features such as a braking system that allows a bus to stop in a shorter distance than other vehicles of similar size.

School buses are also equipped with rollover protection and fuel system protection to decrease the chance of a catastrophic outcome in the event of a severe crash.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration records impressive statistics when it comes to school buses.

Each year about 450,000 public school buses travel 4.3 billion miles to transport 23.5 million children in the United States, yet an average of only six children per year die in a school bus crash.

School buses are seven times safer than cars or light trucks (0.2 fatalities per 100 million vehicle miles traveled on buses, compared to 1.44 fatalities in cars or light trucks).

Inspections

The Chelsea School District has 39 buses that cover 120 square miles; Dexter Community Schools has 37 buses that cover 88 square miles. Each district has two mechanics to maintain the buses and provide routine inspections every 2,000 miles.

The Michigan State Police is the agency responsible for conducting annual bus inspections.

Sgt. Sharron VanCampen, head of the MSP school bus inspection program stationed in Lansing, said that the 198-point school bus inspections are done without prior notice in order to get a real picture of how a district functions on any given day.

She noted that both Chelsea and Dexter routinely earn the highest marks in their inspections.

School bus drivers

The safety of every child on a school bus is probably more dependent on the skills and judgment of the bus driver than any other factor in the transportation system.

"Safety is our number-one priority," said Chris Frayer,

transportation supervisor for Chelsea.

"Our bus drivers take personal pride in their profession. It's not just a job to them."

Dexter transportation chief Robert Poor is also very proud of his staff of drivers, their driving records and their relationship with the children they serve.

Chelsea bus drivers Roger DeLong and Connie Cook, and Deneen Smith, a driver and trainer for Dexter, talked openly about the many aspects of the work they do. In the wee hours of the morning, while children are still sleeping snug in their warm beds, the drivers are already at work.

They brave the cold, wind, rain, snow and fog in the early morning darkness to prepare the buses for the first route of the day.

In cold weather, the driver starts the bus's engine first, to warm up the interior or for the comfort of the precious cargo.

Each driver is responsible for performing his or her own 66-point pre-trip inspection of the bus.

Cook and Smith pointed out that the bus driver is the

first and last school representative with whom a student has contact each day.

Conceivably, a student could have the same bus driver for his or her entire school career, making the bus driver the one person who has the longest ongoing school relationship with the child.

Driver training is rigorous, both physically and mentally. A person interested in bus driving has to first apply through the school district's transportation department.

A candidate must be fingerprinted, pass a pre-employment drug screening and, of course, have a good driving record. Drivers also undergo annual physical exams as a condition of continuing employment.

Frayer, Cook and Smith described the numerous preparatory classes that drivers take.

First they must pass beginning bus driver training to receive a temporary permit. Drivers need several endorsements on their licenses, including Chauffeur's Class B, Passenger Bus, and an air brake endorsement.

They also take defensive driver training. In alternating years they maintain and improve their skills through courses in advanced bus training.

All drivers are certified in CPR and first aid, and random drug and alcohol testing is a federal requirement.

Road conditions, especially in rural areas, can be the bane of a bus driver's day. When asked about the challenges of driving on unpaved roads, the drivers groaned.

"Early spring can be the worst, with all the mud and holes," said DeLong. "Freezing rain on top of already slick roads just makes the ice even worse."

Added Cook: "Depending on the condition of the dirt road, we may have to avoid the sides of the road and make our stops in the middle due to ditches and piled snow."

Cook's opinion is that fog is the biggest weather-related issue besides snow and ice; and pre-dawn darkness

presents a daily visibility challenge.

Upon returning to the bus garage, drivers check the interior of the bus to make sure no child is left behind, and conduct a post-trip inspection of the vehicle.

If a driver finds lost possessions, they are either held for a few days in hopes that the owner will ask for them or they are taken to the lost-and-found box at the bus garage.

The drivers were unanimous on one drawback of the job.

"We don't have eyes in the back of our head," said Cook, bringing up the next factor in bus safety - the passengers.

While I agree that we are obligated to help others as much as possible, I found that individual's actions to be self-ish. Even after a lengthy conversation in which the person was able to express his fears and seek advice, not one word was mentioned about my condition.

There are times when we simply don't want to talk about how we are doing in regards to the disease. An acquaintance stopped by my house at a time when I was alone and not feeling well. My gruff statement that I wasn't in the mood to talk probably appeared pretty rude, but hopefully she understood that there are good days and bad days.

At another time, I was volunteering at a local event at which point people were required to lift and move heavy objects. I was physically unable to do so and felt pretty uncomfortable standing around while others worked. One woman finally made a comment to me about joining in, which forced me to state

my medical condition to avoid looking like a slacker.

Assisting families with chores or finances can be of huge importance. Even though the effort might be greatly appreciated, not everyone is comfortable accepting help or even acknowledging a gift. This area tends to be highly individualized, but keep in mind that these people are already feeling helpless and don't want to be pitied.

There were many people who made general offers of help, but I never took them up on it. Hopefully that didn't hurt any feelings. All of the offers were appreciated, but sometimes it's hard to verbalize a request.

Asking someone to pick up a special food I am craving,

requesting a precise item at a store or seeking help with a certain activity might not be what the friend had in mind when they said they would help out.

A specific offer to clean the house, pick up dinner, or take the kids to the movies can be easier to accept simply because it's so concrete. I also recommend proposing ways to help out the caregiver because a tired, overworked caregiver is less effective than one who has had some of the burdens lifted.

I recently took part in a group conversation in which one person was asking for quilt design plans because she was about to make one for a relative of hers with breast cancer. Originally, she was

going to make it pink with familiar patterns when she learned that the recipient didn't want the quilt to be cancer-themed. Although the recognizable pink ribbon goes a long way to spread awareness and raise funds, not everyone wants to be bombarded with these items. The quilter was told, "The last thing I want to think about is

cancer." She opted instead to make a quilt with butterflies in lavender and lime.

Although it may sound as if I've had nothing but negative experiences, quite the opposite is true. The less-than-helpful examples are simply better at highlighting the subtle details of handling difficult circumstances.

Communicating with a can-

cer patient and his or her family members can be complicated when both sides feel awkward and are dealing with complex emotions. However, sincere efforts on the part of family and friends, regardless of the delivery, are always appreciated.

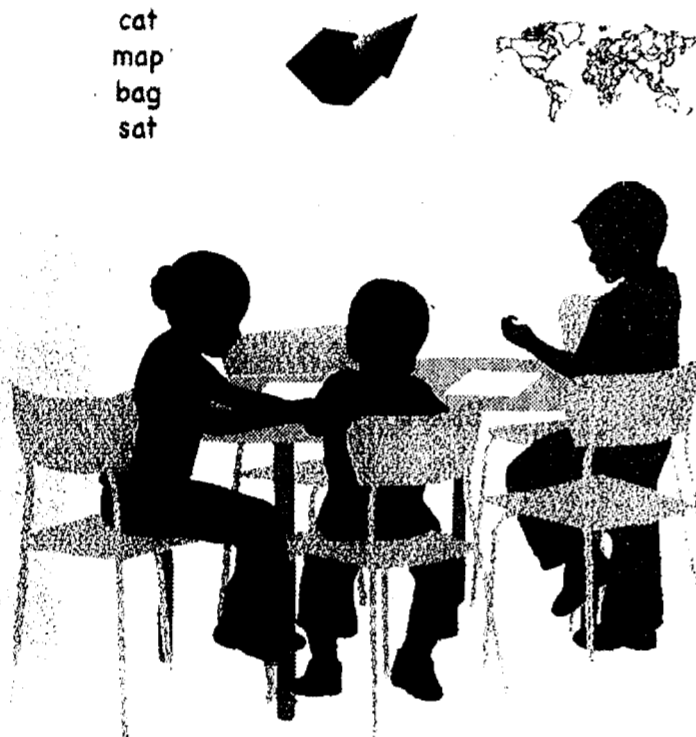

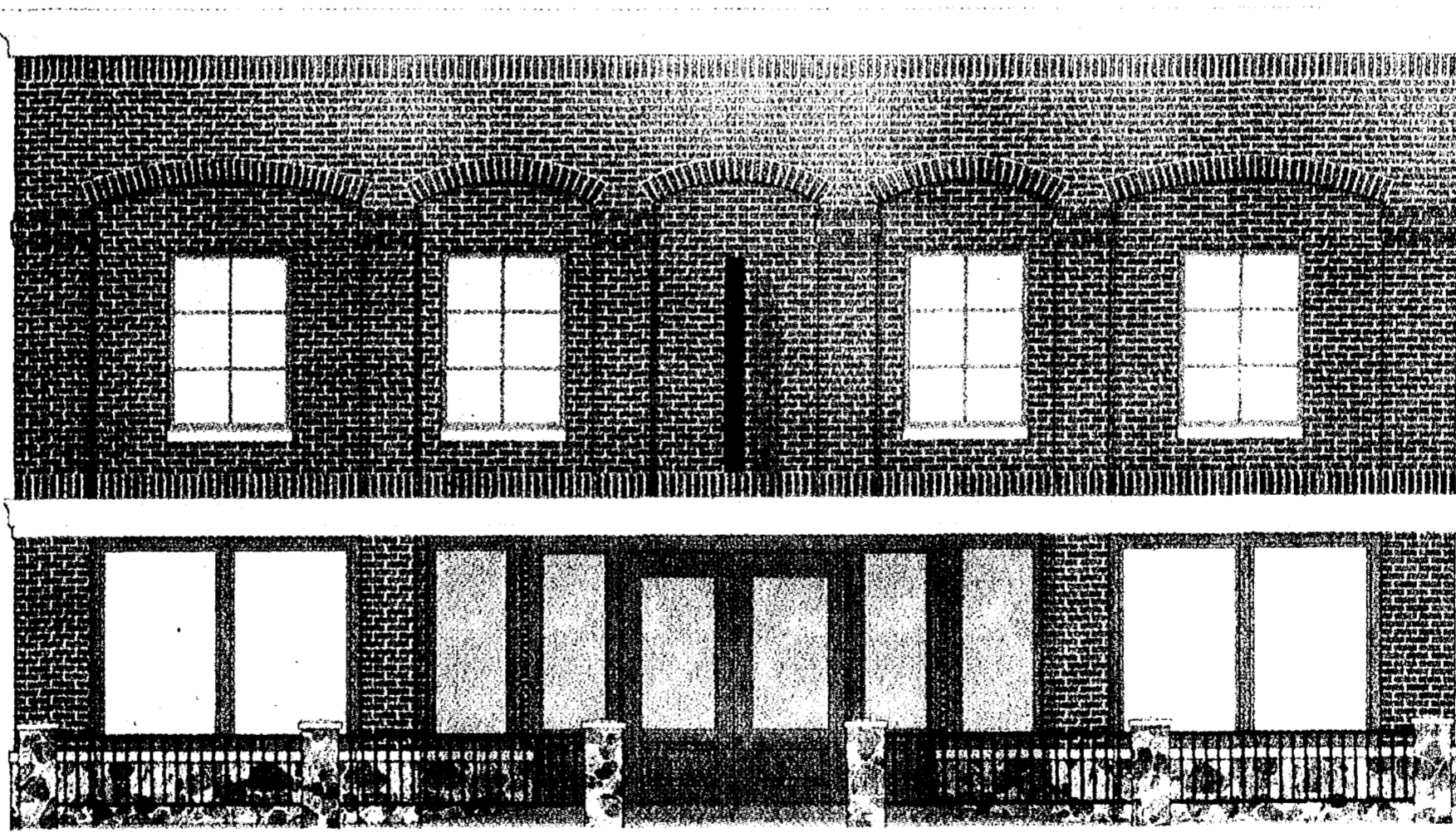

Students

Parents are universally familiar with children misbehaving in the back seat of the car, and its effect on the concentration needed to drive.

Now imagine what it would be like to wield a 10-ton, 40-foot-long school bus through heavy traffic or bad weather with about 70 children that you are responsible for.

That's what the drivers do every day, and to do it safely requires the cooperation of every passenger and parent.

Expected behavior on the way to school and back home is no different than the hours spent at school.

At the beginning of every school year, both school districts send home a written list of rules regarding appropriate behavior on the bus.

Parents are to review these rules with their children, and the students are expected to sign a statement that they both understand and agree to the rules.

Discipline is enforced in Chelsea first between the driver and the student. If the behavior recurs, a written form is sent home requiring a parent's signature. The school principal also receives a copy.

Three incidents results in the student being suspended from riding the bus. Because the suspension is not from school, it then becomes the parent's responsibility to provide transportation, according to Frayer.

Smith explained that Dexter has a similar system to enforce discipline, but a parent gets a "courtesy notice" for a first infraction.

This form spells out the misbehavior in hopes that the family will discuss it and there won't be any further problem.

A formal "bus misconduct notice" is sent home for a second incident. Specific misconduct lead to specific consequences. For example, littering results in a bus misconduct notice, with recurrences resulting in up to 10 days of bus suspension.

However, the first incident of bringing a weapon on the bus would result in suspension for the remainder of the year.

Drivers and administrators in both districts agree that middle school children represent the most difficult discipline issues.

"The older kids might use foul language, and can be disrespectful to the drivers," said DeLong.

Chelsea's school schedule puts children from kindergarten through grade 12 on the same bus; whereas Dexter's two-tiered system transports children in grades 5 through 12 on their first run, and children in grades 1 through 4 on their second run.

Both districts seat the youngest children in the front and the oldest in the back in order to keep some level of separation.

Good behavior on the bus is a safety requirement. Children who put themselves at risk by moving while the bus is in motion, or extending body parts out the window; or who put others at risk by bullying in any form are a distraction to the driver.

Michael Martin, Executive Director of the National Association for Pupil Transportation in New York, said local school districts are responsible for establishing the behavior guidelines for school bus passengers.

"The interior atmosphere of a school bus mirrors the changed and often challenging issues we face in society in general," Martin said.

"Incidents that require and receive the response of multiple community resources when they happen elsewhere also tend to show up at school bus stops and inside the bus.

"The burden of dealing with these issues cannot be laid entirely at the feet of a school bus driver just because they show up in the school transportation environment," he added.

"Remember, a school bus

A costly mistake

Cpl. Michael Williams of the Washtenaw County Sheriff's Department makes it his business to follow up on every reported stop arm violation. A "stop arm violation" is defined as a vehicle passing a stopped bus that has its red lights on and the stop sign extended.

The law states that a vehicle traveling in either direction must stop at least 20 feet away from a stopped bus.

Anyone can report this violation to local police. Bus drivers even have copies of the complaint form available to make it easier to report.

driver's primary job is driving the bus."

Chelsea and Dexter drivers agreed that school administrators are very supportive of them and help immensely with discipline problems.

Parents

"If we notify the parent of a behavior problem, and the parent doesn't support us, it really creates more of a problem," said DeLong.

Safety is heightened when parents reinforce the rules that are taught at school, such as staying at least 10 feet away from the bus on all

sides. Parents can help children to arrive at the bus stop at least five minutes ahead of the scheduled bus arrival time.

"Sometimes a child misses the bus and the parent will follow the bus to the next stop," Cook said. "If the parent allows a child to come up from behind the bus, we can't see them. If they have to go to a different stop, they should take a route that allows them to be in front of the bus so we can see them," said Cook.

Frayer had a few suggestions for other motorists who share the road with school

The basic information needed is the license plate number, a description of the vehicle and the driver, as well as the date and time.

Williams then checks the information to see if the report makes sense. For example, he will note whether the reported plate number matches the vehicle on record. "Throughout the county we average 75 to 80 complaints a year that have enough correct information to follow through, so you can imagine how many more there really are where the witness was unable to get the license plate number," said Williams.

Passing a stopped school bus is considered a civil infraction, and a first

offense carries a penalty of a \$280 fine and three points on the violator's driver's license.

Most violations occur in the morning when people heading to work and buses heading to school are sharing the road.

"I really believe that in most cases people don't intend to pass a stopped bus, or they just don't understand the potential for hitting a child if they do," Williams said. "People are just in a hurry, or thinking about other things - maybe fiddling with their stereo or talking on a cell phone.

"People just need to slow down and think about the consequences," he added.

buses. "When you're at a stop sign and a bus is coming the other way, don't try to beat the bus by turning out in front of it, or if you're behind a school bus and the amber lights come on, that means it's preparing to stop, so slow down," he said. "When parents are dropping off or picking up their children at school, they need to do so in the allocated areas only, staying away from the lots where the buses are," Frayer said.

Transportation staff unanimously stressed that parents and students need to remem-

ber that the ride to school on a bus will take longer than the same ride in a car.

The bus picks up many students at many locations, and the route is carefully planned to maximize child safety.

Even so, most students ride for less than an hour. Extended ride time is one of the most common reasons given by parents who choose not to transport their chil-

dren via the school bus.

"But to keep this in perspective, it is not unusual for students in the Upper Peninsula to ride the bus for two hours each way," said VanCampen.

"Thanks for the ride!"

Bus monitors are available on buses that transport children with special needs, an invaluable help to the driver.

Karen Knight of Chelsea and Hope LaCombe of Dexter are assistant transportation directors. They handle much of the day-to-day operations, assigning field trips, and working directly with the drivers.

"Hope is a very important person around here - we couldn't do it without her," said Poor.

What's the best part about the hard work done by members of the pupil transportation system, from the federal to the local levels? Knowing that each child is home, safe and sound, at the end of the school day.

Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi - India's "Father of the Nation" - dedicated his life to the philosophy of nonviolent action and to spreading the concept around the world.

The Michigan Friends Center on Clark Lake Road north of Chelsea will host a presentation about Gandhi from 1:30 to 3:30 p.m. Saturday by Rev. Robert L. S. Brown, retired pastor of The United Methodist Church.

Brown, a resident of the Chelsea Retirement Community, will speak about his friendship with Arun Gandhi, the fifth grandson of Gandhi and founder of the M.K. Gandhi Institute for Nonviolence at the University of Rochester (N.Y.).

violence began in high school during World War II and continued as he prepared for ordained ministry in the Methodist Church, will discuss how people might move

toward a culture of nonviolence.

When Brown was a young man, Mohandas Gandhi, a major political and spiritual leader of India who was assassinated in 1948 at the age of 78, was at the climax of leading a nonviolent movement toward Indian independence from Great Britain.

Gandhi - a Hindu also known by the Sanskrit word Mahatma, meaning "Great Soul" - was a pioneer of Satyagraha, a philosophy that stresses resistance to evil through active, non-violent resistance.

In reading about Gandhi's life and work, Brown became convinced that nonviolent resistance was not only workable on an international scale, but was in keeping with his Christian faith. This conviction has guided him throughout 62 years of ministry and beyond.

In 2004 Brown attended a lecture by Arun Gandhi, who was born in South Africa and grew up under that country's discriminatory apartheid laws. According to the Web site of the M.K. Gandhi Institute for Nonviolence, Arun Gandhi learned from his parents and grandparents that justice does not mean revenge, it means transforming the opponent through love and suffering.

Brown and his daughter joined the Gandhian Legacy Tour and in 2005 spent 19 days in India under Arun Gandhi's leadership.

Since then, Brown has been in regular correspondence and had multiple meetings with Arun Gandhi, and enjoys sharing what he has learned with others.

"I was very inspired when I heard Bob Brown speak last year on his friendship with Arun

Gandhi and felt that it was important to bring his story to a wider audience," said Elaine Economou, executive director of MFC. "It's incredible that we have Bob living right here in Chelsea. He has a warm and engaging presence and a very powerful story to tell that will resonate with people of all faiths who are interested in Gandhian peace practices, something that he has been engaged in for much of his life.

"These stories resonated with me especially as a mother of three young boys. I was interested in how Arun Gandhi went to live with his grandfather as a boy and learned to become aware of his thoughts and actions. These were real lessons that I could translate into my parenting and they motivated me to work at this aspect of my children's development."

Within 48 hours, they found a building available for rent after the holidays - and Artistica was born.

These four artists have created a space where area artisans showcase their work, offering shoppers unique, locally handcrafted items. The gallery owners are banking on shoppers understanding the value and importance of "thinking local first."

Love is a photographic artist with a diverse background in commercial and fine art photography who now does portrait work as well at Jill Love Photography. A resident of Dexter for eight years, she is known for her work of local scenery and land-

marks in the area and specializes in infrared and sepia prints.

"What turns me on about what I do is that moment when I know as I look through the lens that I've connected," Love said.

Two of her photographs are currently featured at Daisy Lake Gallery, located upstairs from Artistica. Love volunteers for Women 4 Women International, Arts Alliance of Washtenaw County and The Dexter Area Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors.

Marlies "Lisa" Wandres is a glass mosaic artist who creates wall hangings and furniture as well as a knitter, fashioning one-of-a-kind scarves and blankets. She has sold her work to major hotel chains and cruise ships. Under the name "Lucky Penny," Wandres uses glass, exotic woods, metals and marble to form unique works of art.

Pam O'Hara grew up in Cincinnati, where as a child she gathered the natural clay from creek beds to form "objects d'art." After college she decided to take a pottery class at Oakland Community College and she caught the "bug" once again. A long time resident of Dexter, O'Hara has taught clay classes to both children and adults in the community. Using the trade name "Pine Hill Pottery" she has exhibited in galleries in Michigan and Ohio, and can be found at the Ann Arbor Art Fair and other local art shows, as well as at Artistica.

Cheryl Braun Fontana teaches basket weaving and creates heirloom baskets. She teaches at workshops all over the country, has won many awards, and her work will be featured on the

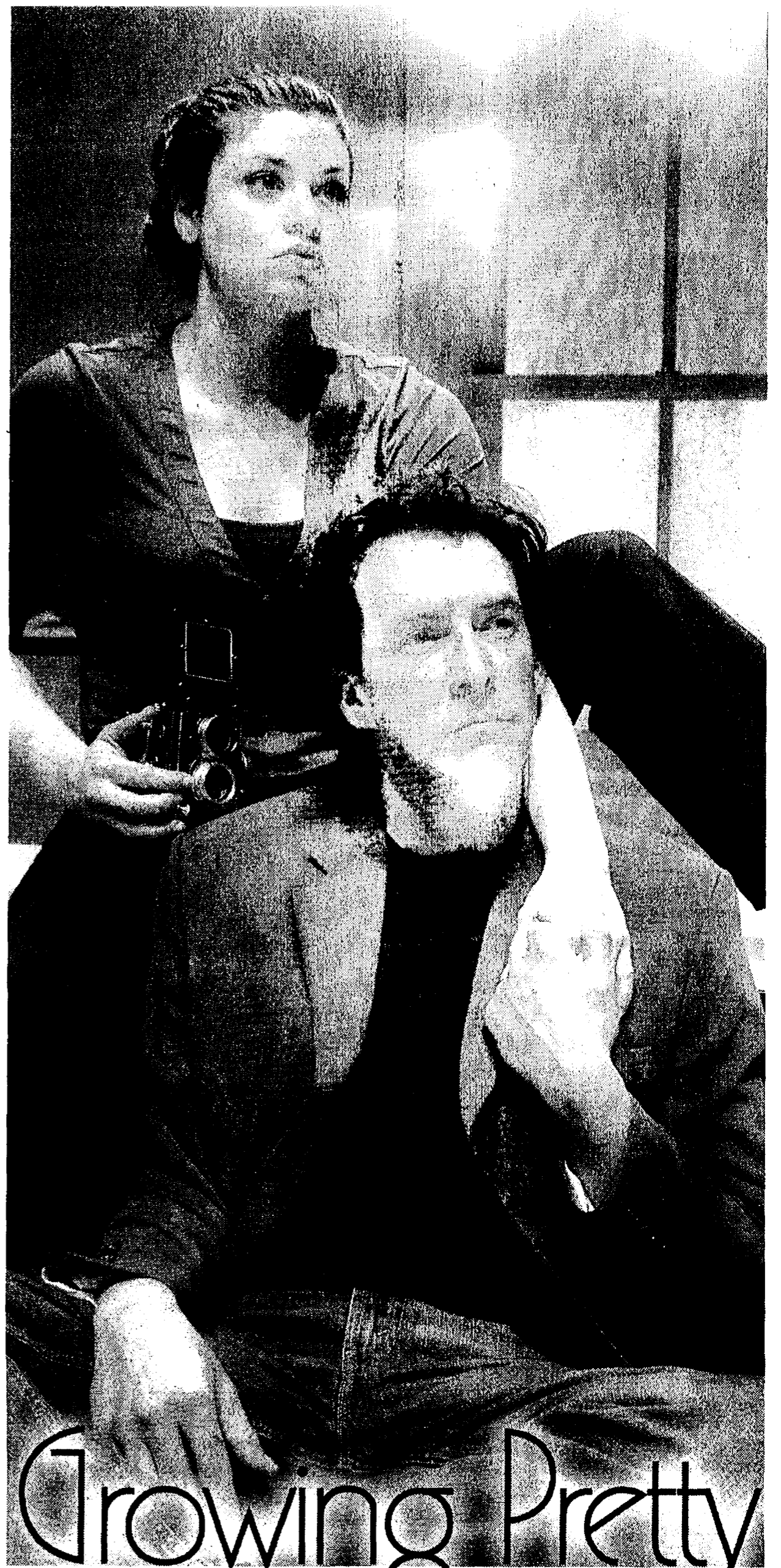
cover of Basket Bits Magazine in May.

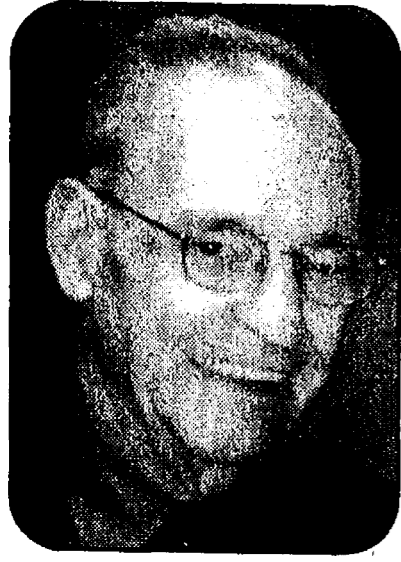

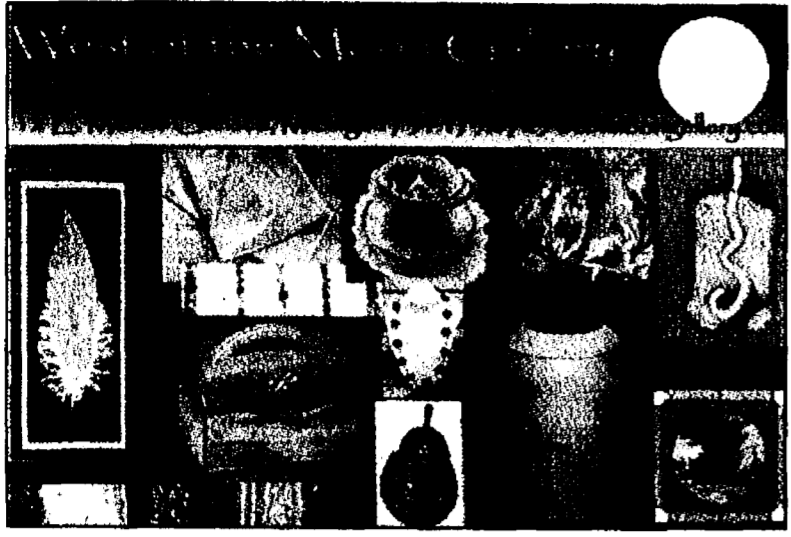

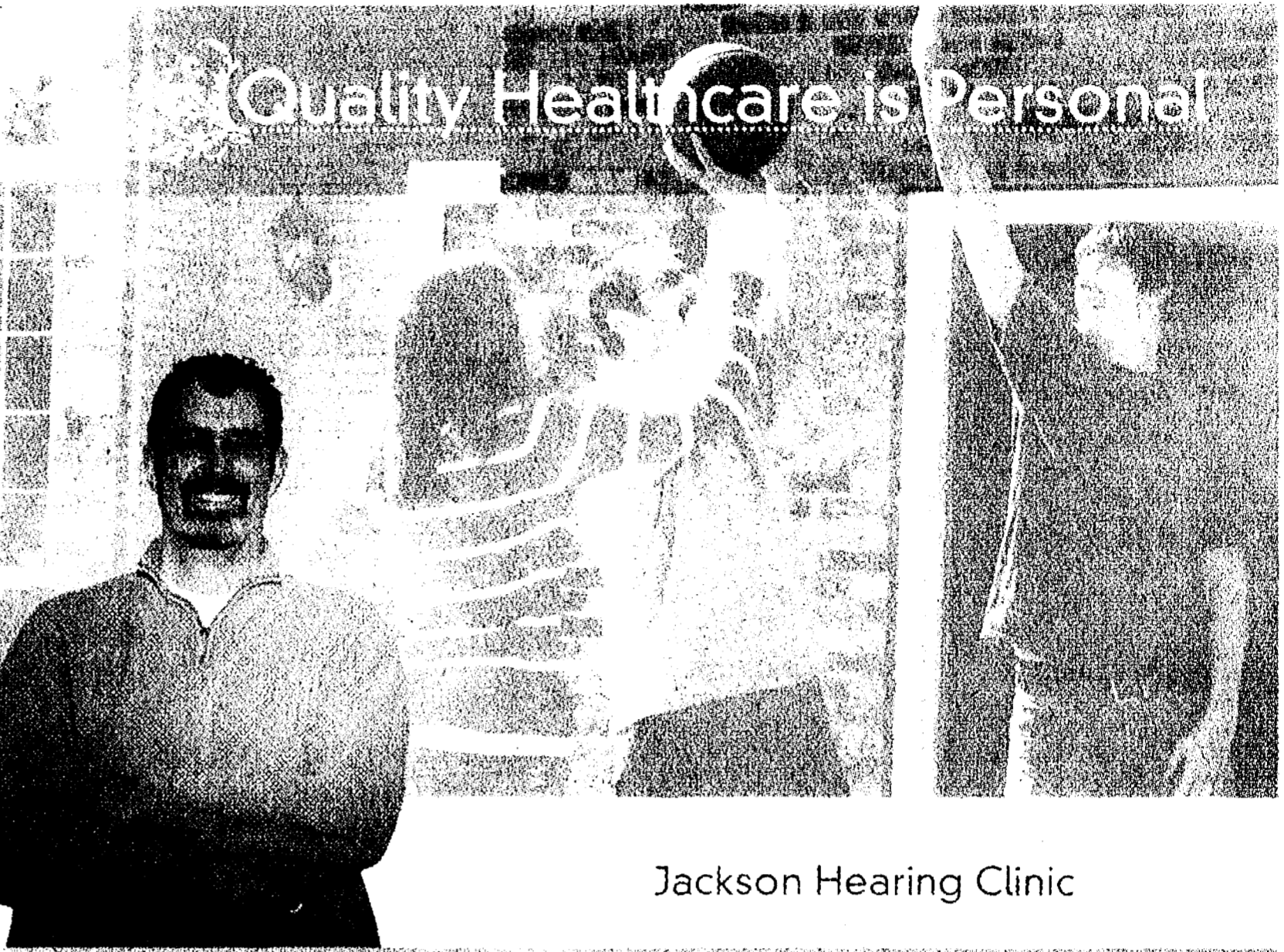

"Anytime you play on the road in the SEC, you have to bring you're A game," Raymond said. "The girls played well and consistent in both ball games."

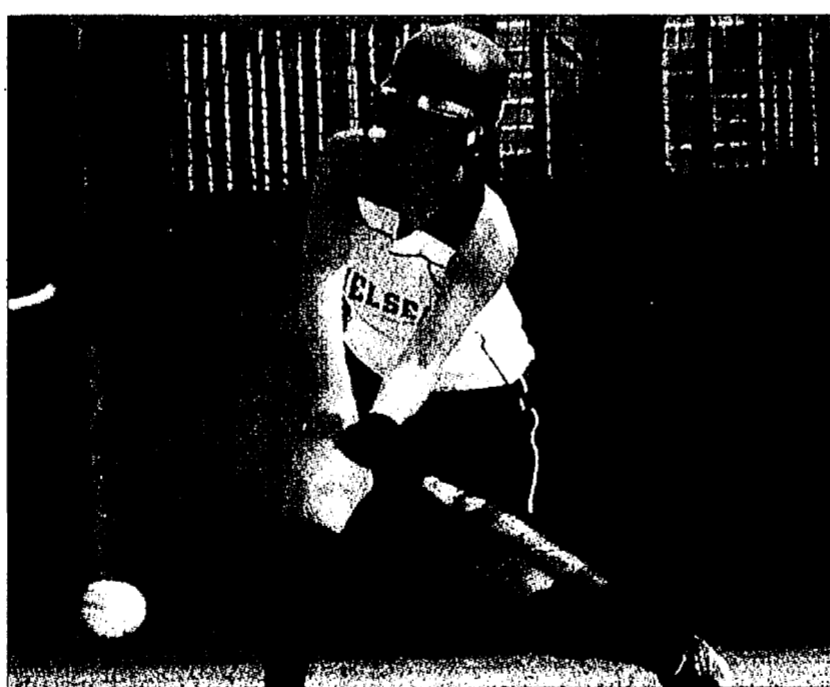
In the opener, the Bulldogs forced the mercy rule after six innings.

Chelsea girls' soccer team tied Ann Arbor Pioneer 3-3 last Thursday. The Pioneers entered the game ranked No. 4 in the state in Division 1.

The Bulldogs (3-0-2) rallied from a 2-0 deficit, scoring two goals in the last 3:35 of the game for the contest's final margin.

With 2:19 left on the clock, and the normally stoic Pioneer players scrambling for position, Ehman stole the ball and sprinted in alone for a breakaway game-tying goal.

In their third game of the invitational, the Bulldogs lost to Fowlerville 14-2.

Schwarz had an RBI double, while Schmelz had an RBI single for Chelsea.

In their last 12 innings of the tournament, the Bulldogs gave up an improbable 37 runs.

"We haven't gone through much of that over the years," Welton said. "It was a long day for everybody."

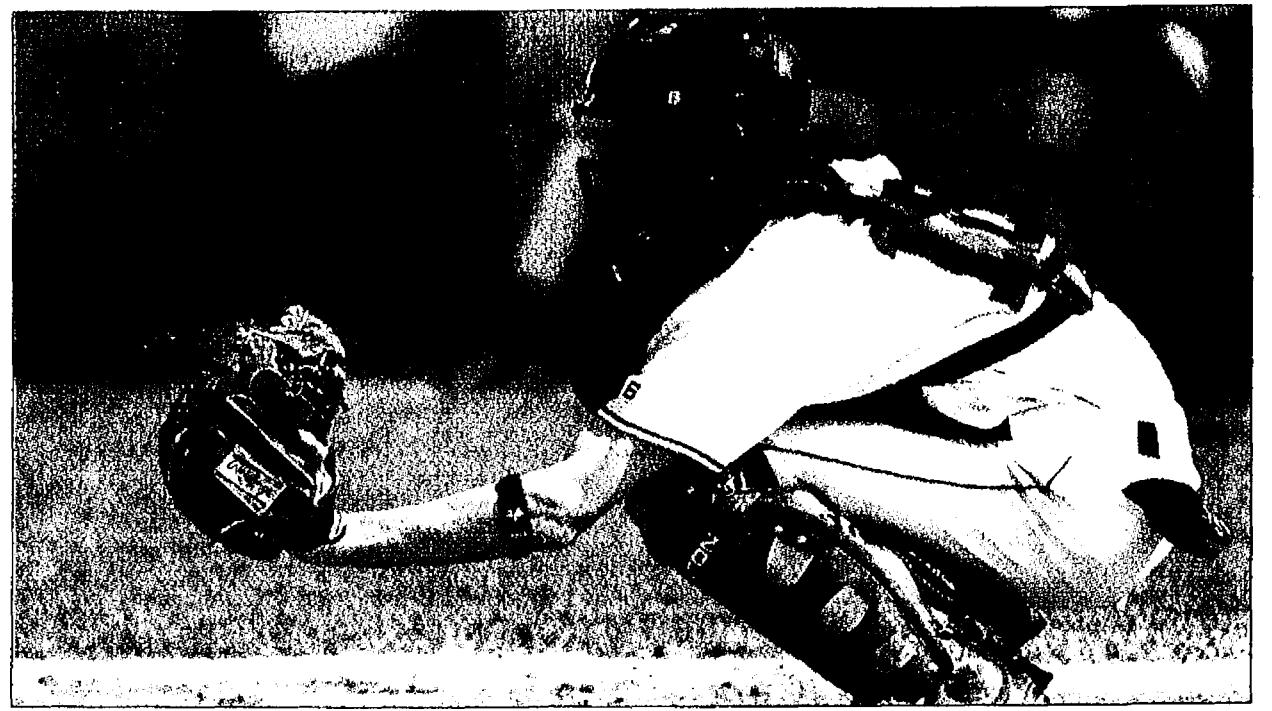

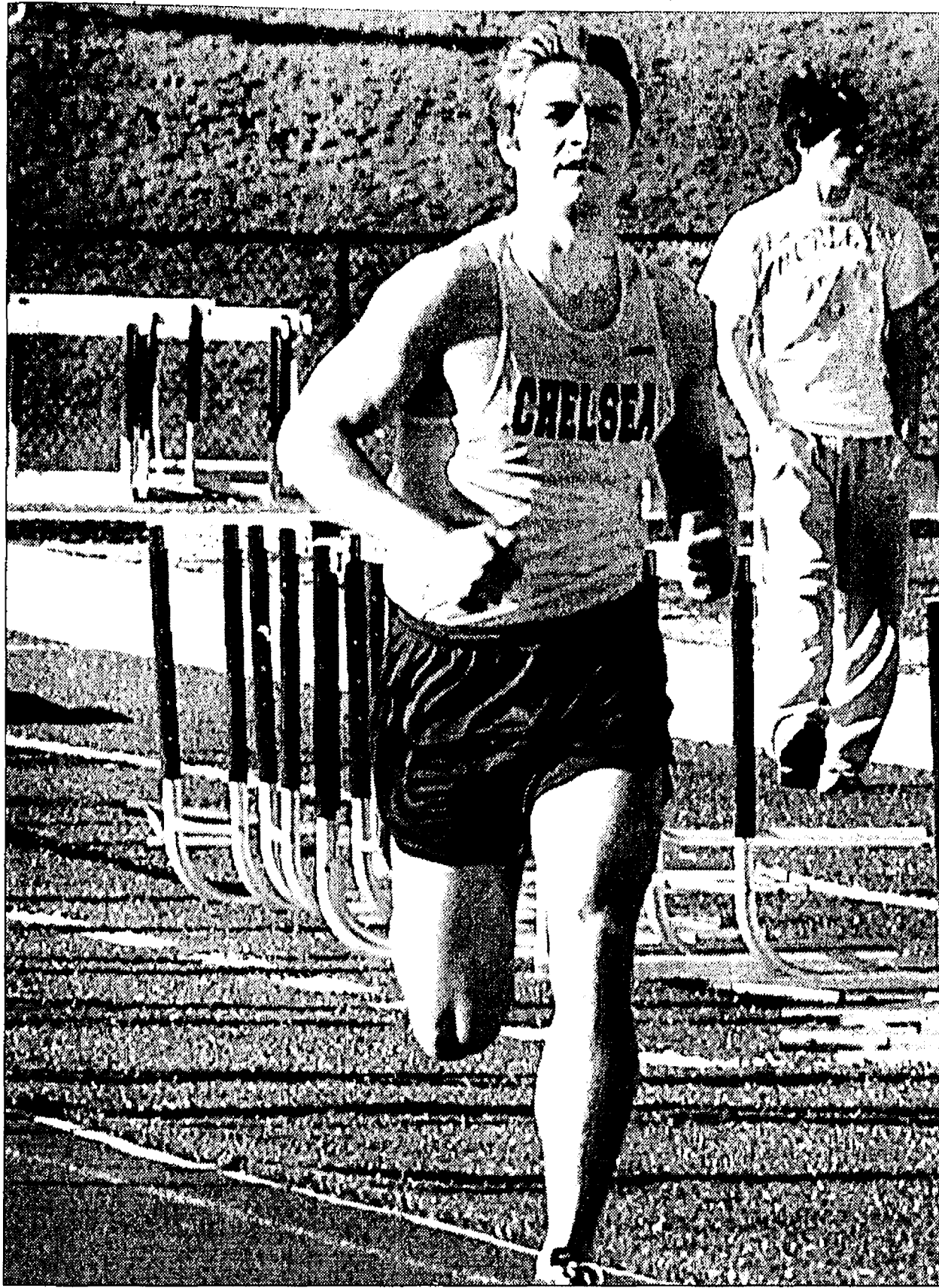

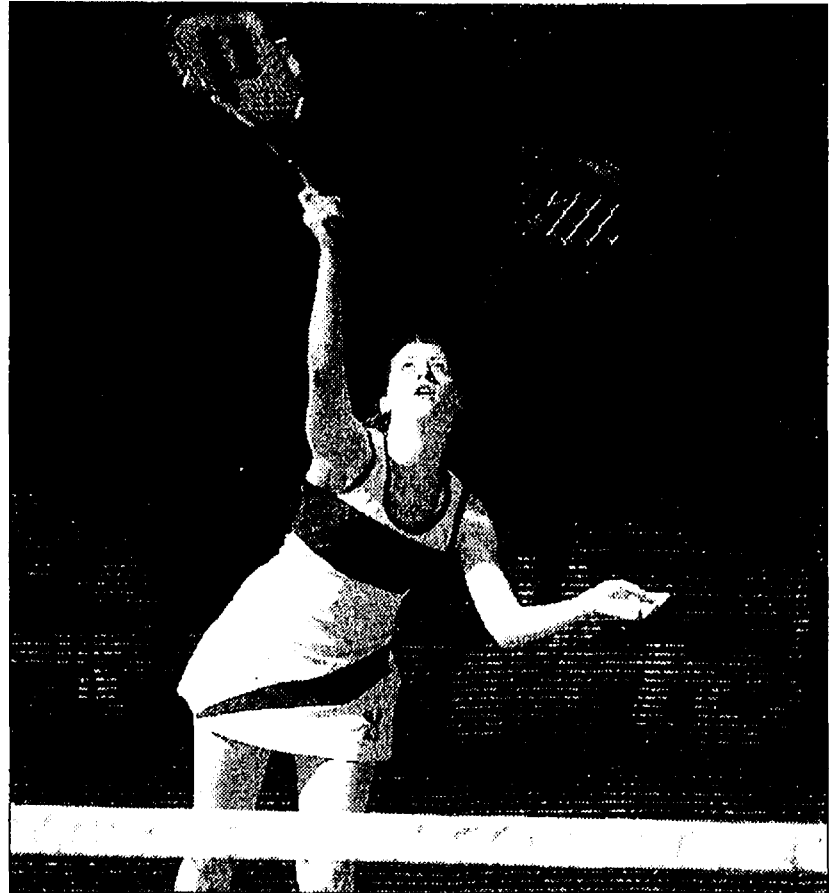

Farmers ready to plant - just hoping for more ideal weather

To look at them, the fields seem to be ready for farmers to get in there and start planting crops.

But you would be wrong. And to look at them, the farmers are anxious to do just that.

But they would be wrong. Farming is, more than anything else, a matter of proper preparation and timing.

"It's always hard," said Jerry Huehl of Huehl Acres, one of many Washtenaw County farmers who are simply waiting for the ground to firm up enough to support their tractors.

"You want to get going, but you have to wait until the ground is ready," Huehl added.

As hot and dry as it was last summer, this spring has turned out to be on the cool and wet side.

And just when things were looking good over the past couple of weeks, Mother Nature delivered a cold slap in the face with frost and freeze warnings this week.

"We're a little concerned right now, (this) week is supposed to be cold and wet," he said.

Unfortunately, farmers in this region are not alone. "My son down in

Indianapolis is just starting his corn, and they should already have it up by now," Huehl said.

Corn is a voracious feeder and needs a heavy supply of nutrients such as nitrogen.

Therefore, the first step in preparing a field is to spread fertilizer.

The most cost-effective way to do this is with nutrient-rich liquid manure, and the Huehls have a seemingly never-ending supply provided by their dairy herd.

"If you didn't have live-stock it might not be so hectic, but then you'd have to buy commercial fertilizer," Jerry Huehl said.

"Usually we spread it where we're going to put corn; it cuts down on the amount of nitrogen we buy."

The manure spreader apparatus operates on a type of creeper gear, and moves slowly through the field.

The rotating spray head works on the same principle as a regular irrigation unit, said older brother Denny Huehl, and spews out a 40-foot brown arc.

It is connected by a hose to a tank full of the liquid, which is refilled from a lagoon over by the dairy barns.

Farming can be a very rewarding career, but it is not without its thankless chores.

Going out in the field to start up the manure spreader pump is one of them, and on this particular day, Denny drew the short straw.

Once the spreading is finished, likely sometime next week, it's time to get growing.

Soil can be thought of as a living thing, and growing the same crop in the same place actually wears it out by depleting it of nutrients no matter how much fertilizer you use.

That's why crops are grown in rotation - some, like corn, use a lot of nitrogen; and some, like soybeans, actually attract and "fix" nitrogen into its root system to replenish the soil.

The Huehls' crop rotation is corn, soybeans, wheat, and sometimes alfalfa, Jerry said.

After corn is harvested the field lays fallow until the next spring to let the soil rest, but the other crops follow one after the other.

"We put the wheat in right after we harvest the beans, and it stays in all winter," Jerry said.

"When the wheat is harvested in July we'll put in alfalfa in August."

The fast-growing alfalfa, or hay, is used as feed for the dairy herd, and is cut three to four times a season, depending on growing conditions.

"Our first alfalfa cutting is usually the last week of May, we want to get that cut before it blossoms," Jerry said.

"We won't be done planting beans and we'll have to stop and make the first cutting of hay."

Another decision that is made before getting out in the field is how much of what crop to plant.

Many times that depends

This year the girls will complete a service

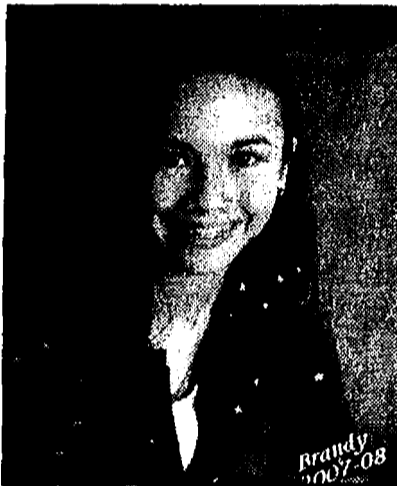

on market conditions and crop prices.

"We're doing more beans and less corn this year," Jerry noted.

The Huehls plant about 1,000 acres of the various crops each year, and Denny looked up the figures on what's going in the ground this year:

- Soybeans 383 acres
- Corn 346 acres
- Wheat 144 acres
- Alfalfa 101 acres

"That's what we have planned for now, anyway," Denny said. "That could always change."

Project RED

Even though they can't get out in the field yet, Jerry noted that there's never a shortage of things to take care of on a farm.

"There's still plenty to do," he said. "We have quite a bit of seed to deliver yet, and there's barns to clean out."

And there's also Rural Education Days, or Project RED, a partnership between the Washtenaw County Farm Bureau, MSU Extension and the Washtenaw Farm Council.

The three days of educational presentations for schoolchildren and the public to learn more about agriculture took place last week.

Huehl Acres has been an integral part of the project since its inception some 20 years ago.

In fact, Jerry's wife Sue was instrumental in getting it started.

"My wife, Nancy Thelen and Holly Porter came up with the idea," Jerry said.

And after being presented at a national Farm Bureau conference, the project real-

ly took off.

"I can't tell you how many Farm Bureaus have something similar now," he added.

One of their large tractors was prominently featured in the Project RED corn presentation, and the brothers continue to donate equipment, supplies and time.

Both brothers have been involved in the county Farm Bureau for decades.

Denny was on the board of directors from 1983 to 1995; and Jerry, the current Farm Bureau vice president, was president the past seven years, and a director "for six or eight years before that."

How now, red cow?

The Huehl farm was the site of a very uncommon event last month, when a rare Red Holstein calf was born on March 31.

"It's kind of odd - the cow she came from was black and white and the bull was black and white," said dairy specialist Rachel Girbach.

"The gene is recessive, and the only red carrier I found was her grandfather."

As rare as those are, Girbach noted, having twin calves is more common than having a red one.

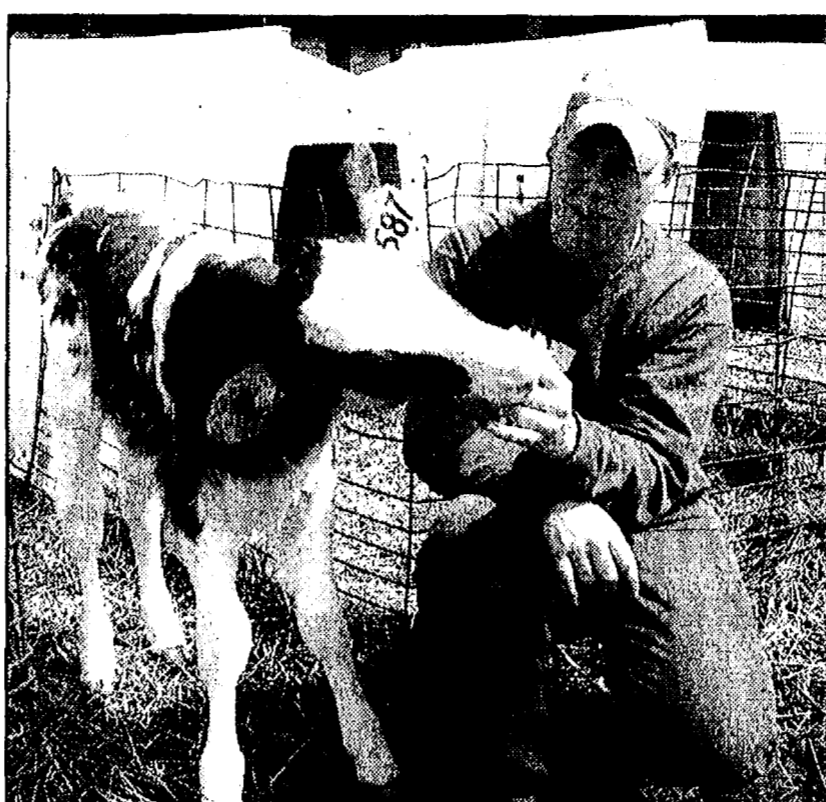
The "red" is actually more of a reddish-brown color, sharing space on the cowhide with the white just like a common Holstein.

"And no, they don't give chocolate milk," Girbach said.

All the Huehl calves are bred from the same bull, Girbach said, and it was "just luck" they ended up with a red one.

"I named her Brownie," Girbach said.

"She was born on opening day for the Tigers and the guys wanted to name her Homer, but I wouldn't let them."

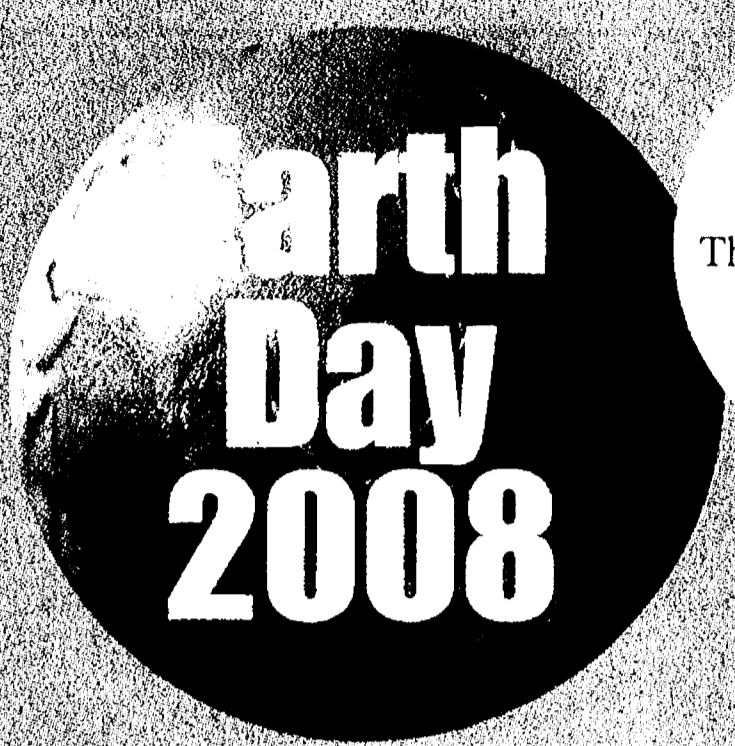

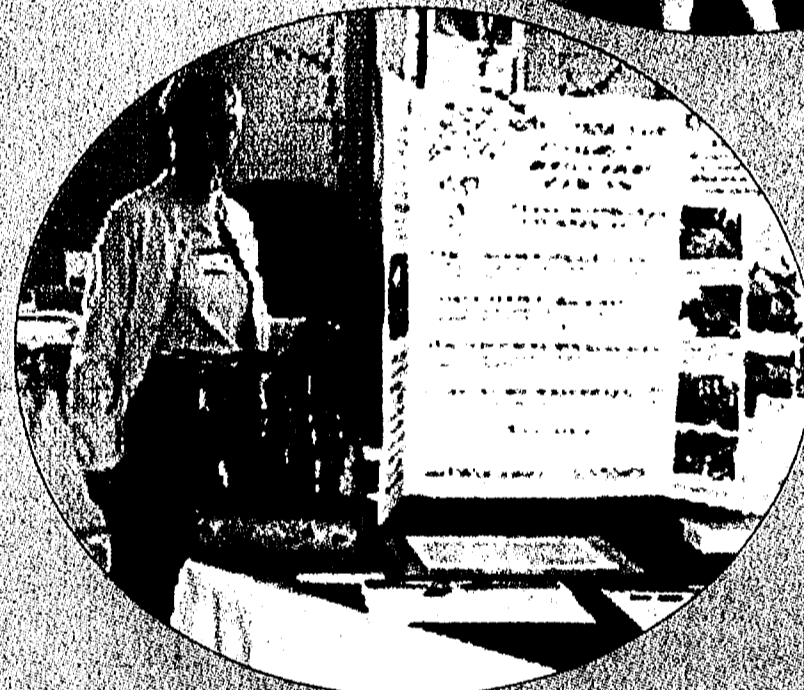

It's rough...but they're ready

Play like the pros: Amateurs to take shot at toughened-up Torrey Pines

Tiger Woods is wrong. That's what more than 56,000 people say.

Or maybe they just wanted an all-expenses-paid summer trip to San Diego.

Late last year, Golf Digest asked readers to write an essay about why they thought they could break 100 on the Torrey Pines South Course a week before this June's U.S. Open.

It was Woods who made an off-the-cuff comment last year at Oakmont that the average golfer couldn't best three figures in a battle with a brutal Open setup.

More than 56,000 golfers, their spouses and their friends responded with nominations. The prospects

were cut to 2,500 and then to 11 who were interviewed and played golf together in Dallas.

On March 29, the final five were announced, along with the three celebrities the winner will play alongside, from the pro tees, on June 6 - Cowboys quarterback Tony Romo, singer Justin Timberlake and NBC "Today" host Matt Lauer.

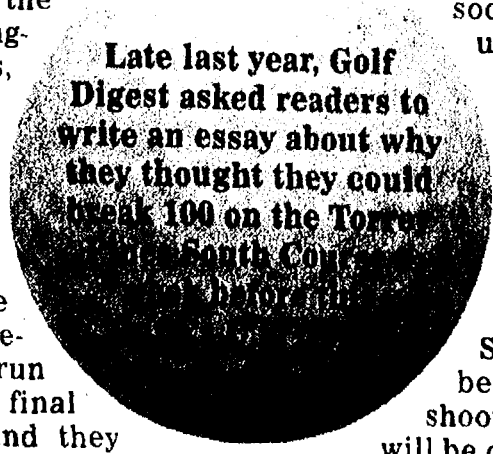
The round will be taped by NBC for a one-hour special that will run immediately before the final round of the Open, and they certainly cast it with characters, like any other reality show.

There is a father of three battling inoperable lung cancer, a former

member of the infamous MIT Blackjack Team, a retired Navy pilot, an L.A. cop, and a guy who

went to Augusta State - not for golf, but for soccer - whose wife urged him to take up golf in 2001 because "it's what old guys do."

Four of them are already guaranteed to play Torrey South the day before the big TV shoot, but the winner will be chosen by online voting on gdopencontest.com that runs through the month of

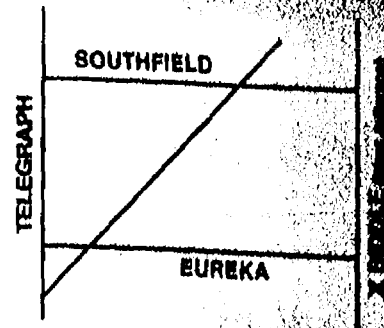

April. Readers can vote only once a day, but can earn prizes for doing so, including a trip to the 2009 U.S. Open at Bethpage Black.

A look at perhaps two of the more interesting members of the cast:

John Atkinson, cancer fighter

Atkinson, 38, experienced every young, healthy person's worst nightmare a year ago, March 29. The medical supplies salesman went to the doctor with an achy shoulder, got a CT scan, and received the horrifying news that he had Stage IV inoperable lung cancer. He's never smoked.

"It's the reason I'm doing this," Atkinson explained on the phone from his home in Omaha, Neb. "If you saw me, you'd never guess in a million years I had Stage IV lung cancer. I'm the guy on the street next to you. The normal guy.

"When I was diagnosed, my life was turned upside down. And you can give up or you can fight. From Day One, I've been committed to beating this thing. I want to prove to people you need to continue to live your life. Cancer doesn't control you."

After his first double dose of chemotherapy, Atkinson played golf with his dad, toted his bag and shot 82. Atkinson said statistics show that 60 percent of patients with his form of lung cancer die within the first year; 98 percent die within five years.

However, his outlook is considerably brighter at the moment. Atkinson, whose three children are under the age of 11, joined a clinical study that has combined two powerful cancer drugs, and so far, the cancer is status quo. It has not advanced.

"That's good news in the world of lung cancer," he said.

An 8-handicapper, Atkinson shot 94 at a major championship course, Hazeltine National in Minnesota, last year. He has never seen Torrey Pines in person, but is hoping for a bogey-round of 89 on the par-71 Open setup.

Professional Golf Tips *With Tina Mickelson*

Don't peek when chipping

It's no secret that it is imperative to keep your head down throughout the putting stroke, not looking up until you hear the ball hit the bottom of the cup. It is just as imperative to keep your head down throughout the entire chipping stroke, making sure your head stays down and still until you hear the ball land on the green.

Many players lift their heads too fast because they are eager to see where the ball is going, or they try to help the ball into the air, which causes them to look up too soon. This leads to very inconsistent contact.

Address the ball with your regular set-up: hands forward just a bit, weight slightly forward and ball back in stance. Make your chipping stroke, keeping your head down until you hear the ball hit the green. This leads to much more consistent contact and much better chipping overall.

Erik Norton, MIT whiz

Norton, 38, has played for high stakes much larger than whether his 4-handicapper pride will take a beating at Torrey Pines.

In the early '90s, he was part of the ring of MIT math geniuses who used card counting at casinos in Las Vegas and New Jersey to make a fortune. Norton was a spotter on the team, tracking cards before signaling the top guns to come in for the big take.

The teams were immortalized in the bestseller "Bringing Down the House," which was made into the movie "21."

"It was a pretty neat way to spend a couple of years of college," Norton said.

What's that got to do with golf? Nothing, really, except that the personable Norton has a go-for-broke style when he's on the course.

"One of my best shots in my bag is hitting the driver off the deck," he said. "If I get on the show and I've got 240 (yards) to the green, I'm going to hit driver. That's going to look funny on camera. People are going to be going, 'What is that idiot doing?'"

Norton maintains that he's a normal, nice guy, but he's also "fiercely competitive."

"Nerves are definitely part of the equation, and I think I have that to draw on more than the other guys," he said.

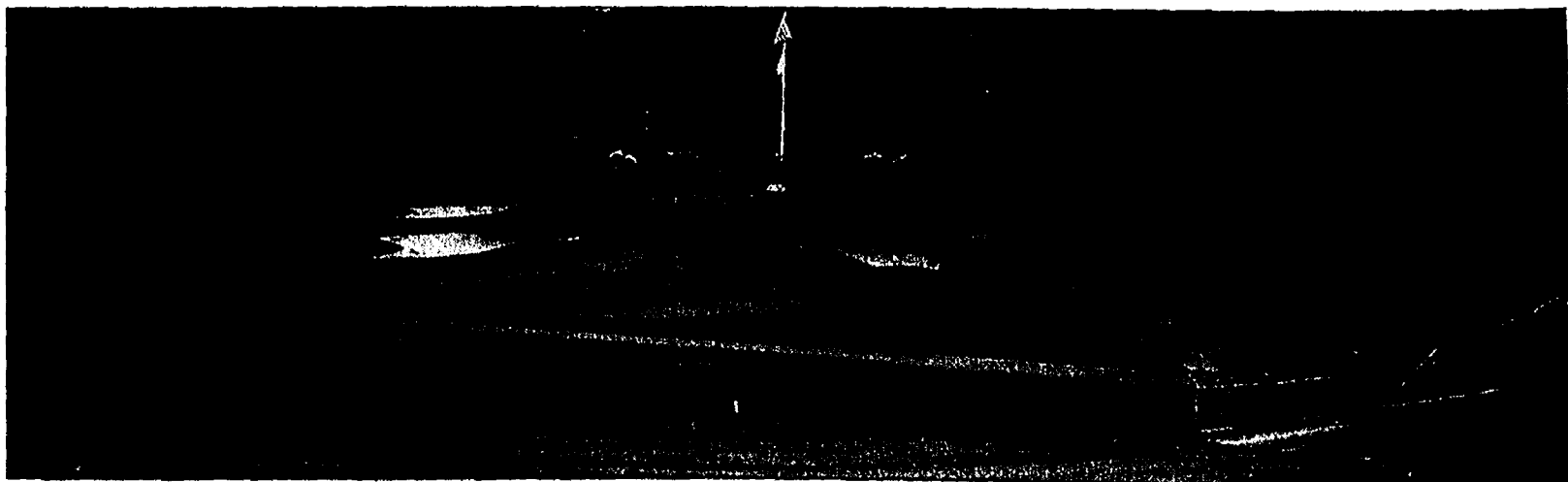

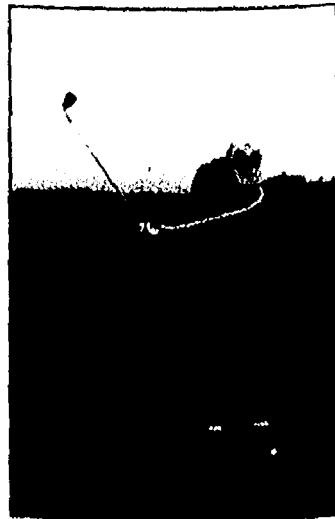
Chipping drill to improve strength and timing

If you find that your chipping is inconsistent, in most cases it means the arms, wrists and hands are too active throughout your swing. It can also mean that the two arms, wrists and hands are at odds with each other throughout the swing. The left arm should dominate and lead the chipping stroke, doing most of the work. The right arm remains quiet, going along for the ride.

So if you are experiencing some inconsistency in your chipping, try making some chip shots using just your left hand. It's a regular chipping stroke, however, your right hand does not grip the club.

Your right arm hangs down to your side as you make regular chip shots with your left arm. Those first few shots, or maybe even every shot during the entire practice session, will likely not be very good ones, especially if you have arms, wrists and hands that are typically too active throughout your swing. Keep it up though.

Continue hitting those shots with just your left hand. You will find that you do eventually develop very consistent rhythm, timing and tempo and you will start hitting your shots much better. Once you start hitting some good chip shots with that left hand, go ahead and make some chip shots with both hands gripping the club. You will notice that you now are aware of what it feels like to let the left side do most of the work and your consistency will be much improved.

Professional Golf Tips *With Tina Mickelson*

Prepare for par-3s during warm up

When you are warming up before your round of golf, one of the most effective things you can do is prepare for the different yardages on each par-3 and anticipate which club you plan on using on each of those holes. Once you have determined which clubs you plan to use on each par-3, get very comfortable with those clubs as you warm up on the practice tee before you get out onto the golf course.

It is difficult to anticipate which clubs you will be using the most when you get out onto the golf course, with the exception of the par-3s. So take advantage of having the ability to prepare for those holes. Get as comfortable as you can with those clubs you plan to use on those holes. You will be able to step onto the tee box feeling more comfortable knowing that on the practice tee you hit that club well, you feel good about it, and you can be a lot more confident when you set up to your ball.

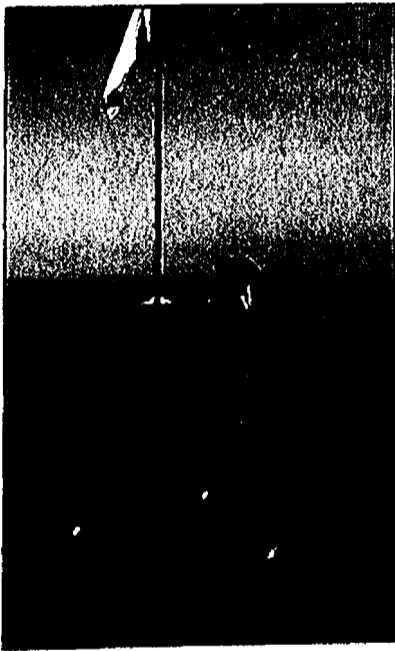
Improve feel and distance with your chipping

When chipping around the green, distance control is critical. The following drill will help you sharpen your feel for distance.

- Place a club on the ground, about 18 inches behind the hole. Place another club on the ground in front of the hole about 18 inches, making sure it is slightly off to the side in order to allow the ball to roll up to the hole.

- Your main focus now is to have your ball come to rest in between those two clubs. This will ensure that your remaining putt is a relatively easy one, giving yourself a better chance of getting up and down.

As a result of focusing solely on distance, your direction will improve as well. You will find that the more you practice this drill the more comfortable you become with your chipping out on the golf course, resulting in getting the ball up and down a lot more often.

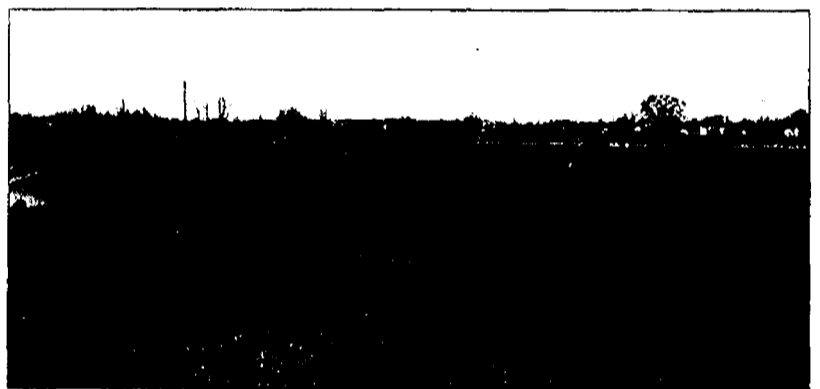



Since then, thousands of golfers have put themselves in Haase's capable hands for their own instruction.

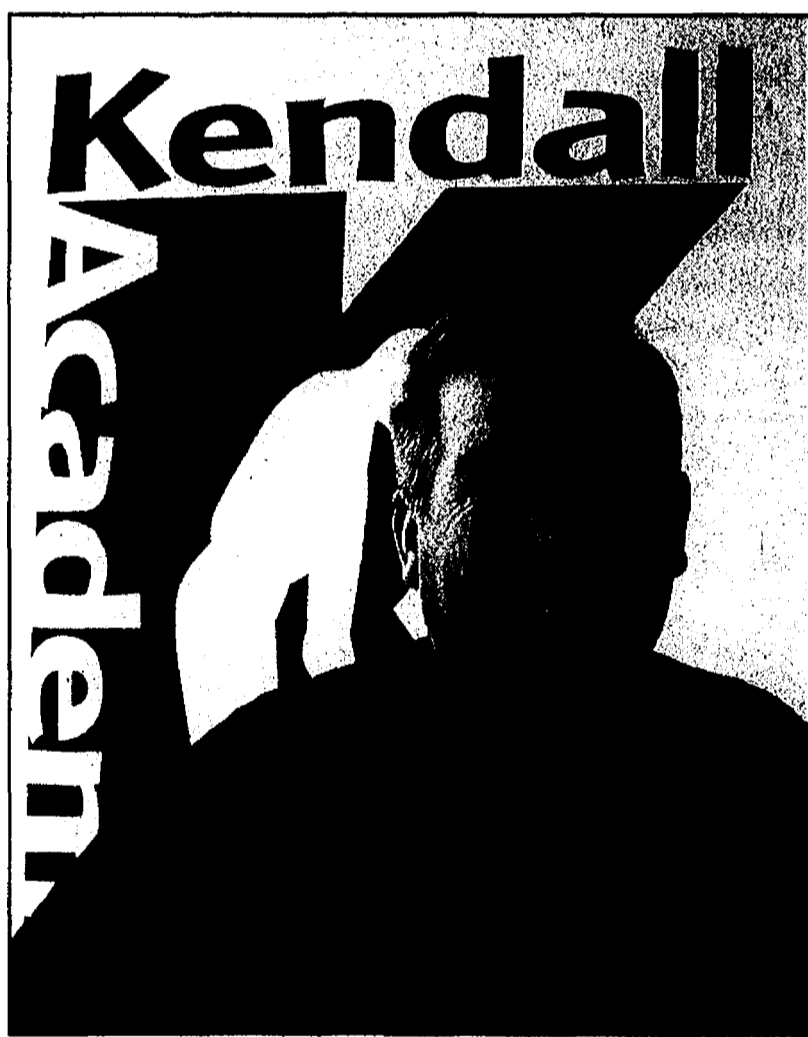
The veteran professional has long been one of Michigan's most successful and popular instructors at the Kendall Golf Academy, located at Miles of Golf near Ann Arbor.

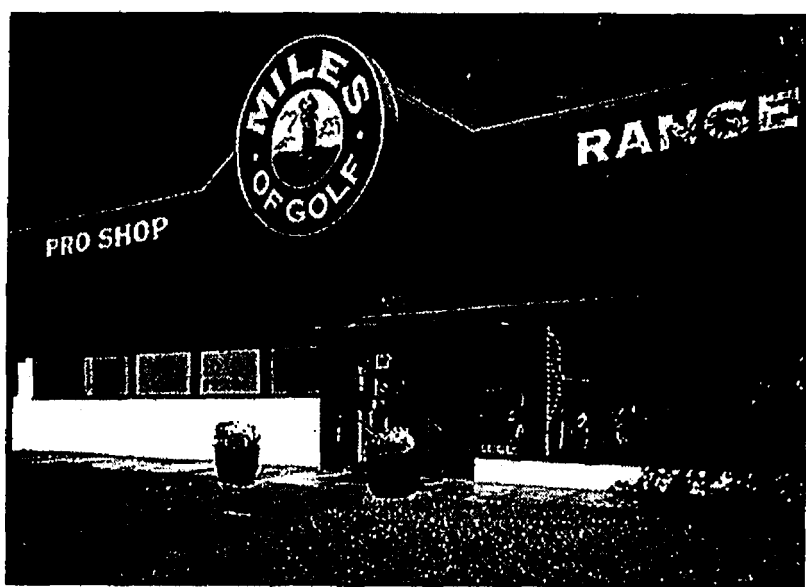

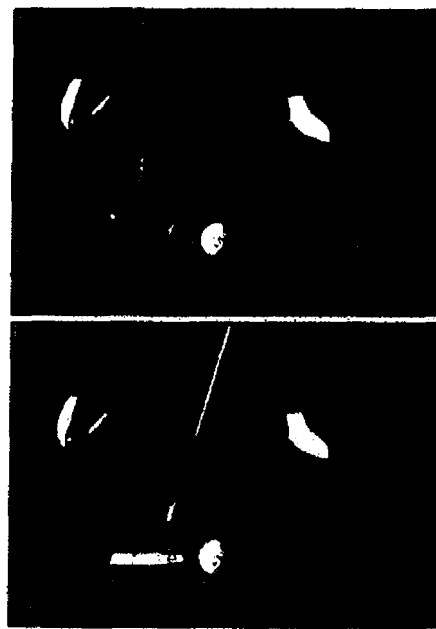

Professional Golf Tips *With Tina Mickelson*

Change it up to get back on track

If you find yourself faltering on the putting green, many times it can simply be a result of not having a clear understanding of what position your putter is in at impact. To gain a sharper awareness of what your putter head is doing at impact, try a few putts hitting the ball with the toe of your putter. After you hit some putts like this, try a few putts hitting the ball with the heel of your putter. It doesn't matter if you make the putts. Your goal is to concentrate on what the head of the putter is doing at impact. It will sharpen your awareness of exactly what position your putter head is in at impact. So when you go back to your standard putting stroke, hitting the ball in the center of the face of the putter, you are much more tuned in to the position of your putter head at impact. That will greatly improve your feel, which results in making more putts.
